WASHINGTON NATIONALS (7-8) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (9-6) April 13, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #16/Home #7 RHP Cade Cavalli (0-0, 2.51 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (2-1, 5.25 ERA)

THE PIRATES: fell to the Cubs, 7-6, on Sunday afternoon at Wrigley Field, but won two of three games during their brief, weekend trip to Chicago...Have won eight of their last 11 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati)...Will begin a seven-game homestand vs. Washington (Monday-Thursday) and Tampa Bay (Friday-Sunday) with tonight's series opener against the Nationals...Went 4-2 on their first homestand of the season from April 3-8 vs. Baltimore (3-0) and San Diego (1-2)...Have not lost back-to-back games since dropping their first two games of the season from March 26-28 at New York (NL).

A NATIONAL MATTER: Pittsburgh is hosting Washington for a four-game series at PNC Park for the fifth straight season...The Pirates won three of four games from April 14-17, 2022, won three of four games from September 11-14, 2023, split four games from September 5-8, 2024 and won three of four games last year from April 14-17...Pittsburgh has gone 40-28 vs. Washington at PNC Park since the Nationals moved from Montréal in 2005 (the team's last series loss here against Washington was in 2019).

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: This week's series between Pittsburgh and Washington at PNC Park marks the first of six four-game series for the Pirates during the 2026 season...They will also host St. Louis (April 27-30) and Chicago-NL (May 25-28), while heading on the road for series against Philadelphia (June 29-July 2), Cincinnati (July 30-August 2) and Milwaukee (August 3-6)...Pittsburgh went 1-2-3 in its six four-game series during the 2025 season...The Pirates lost three of four games at Miami (March 27-30), won three of four games vs. Washington (April 14-17), split four games vs. Milwaukee (May 22-25), lost three of four games at Chicago-NL (June 12-15), split four games vs. Cincinnati (August 7-10) and split four games at St. Louis (August 25-28).

STRIKEOUT KING: Paul Skenes has 398 strikeouts through his first 58 Major League starts...He would become the first Pirates pitcher and one of 20 Major Leaguers in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 400 strikeouts across his first 59 career starts.

BEASTS OF THE EAST: This week's series marks Pittsburgh's first series against the National League East this season...The Pirates went 13-3 at PNC Park against the division during 2025 (the team went 3-1 vs. Washington, 2-1 vs. Atlanta, 3-0 vs. Philadelphia, 2-1 vs. Miami and 3-0 vs. New York).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz extended his hitting streak to a career-high-tying 11 straight games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) with his fifth career leadoff home run on Sunday at Wrigley Field...His other 11-game hitting streak came from August 20-31, 2024...Cruz is hitting .400 (18-for-45) with three doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, four walks, six stolen bases and nine runs during the streak (longest-active streak in MLB)...The Pirates' longest hitting streak last year was from Ke'Bryan Hayes (12 games, June 19-July 4).

THE OUTFIELD: Pittsburgh outfielders have hit 10 home runs this season, the most in Major League Baseball (Colorado, Los Angeles-NL, St. Louis and Washington rank second with eight apiece)...Oneil Cruz' five home runs as an outfielder are tied with Colorado's Mickey Moniak and Washington's James Wood for the second-most in MLB, behind only St. Louis' Jordan Walker (seven)...The Pirates' 50 home runs from outfielders last year ranked 22nd in MLB.

SECOND OPINION: Brandon Lowe hit two home runs and had five RBI on Sunday at Wrigley Field (first five-RBI game by a Pirates second baseman since Neil Walker had six on Sept. 23, 2015 at Colorado)...His five homers as a second baseman are first in MLB.

THE TIME IS LOWE: Brandon Lowe hit his sixth career grand slam (his first since last year on August 31 with Tampa Bay at Washington, off Brad Lord), as part of his 10th career multi-homer game (his first since March 26 at New York-NL), on Sunday at Chicago (NL)...He became the first Pirate to hit a grand slam as part of a multi-homer game since Bryan Reynolds and Rowdy Tellez both did that on July 5, 2024 vs. New York (NL)...Lowe joined Dino Restelli (1949, seven), Shawon Dunston (1997, five), Reggie Sanders (2003, five), Daryle Ward (2004, six), Garrett Jones (2009, seven), Rodolfo Castro (2021, five) and Yoshi Tsutsugo (2021, five) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least five home runs through their first 13 games with the team (Restelli, Castro and Lowe are the only ones with two multi-homer games through their first 13 games with the team).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 13, 1926: Paul Waner pinch hit and drew a walk in the seventh inning of his Major League debut, which came on Opening Day at Sportsman's Park in St. Louis. He went on to win the 1927 National League Most Valuable Player Award and three N.L. batting titles with the Pirates. Waner was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1952 and had his No. 11 retired by Pittsburgh in 2007.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes won a 7-1 decision after allowing one run (came on a home run from Xander Bogaerts) and striking out six batters in his 6.1 innings of work on April 7 vs. San Diego.

AGAINST THE NATIONALS: Skenes won a 10-3 decision after allowing two runs (one earned) in 6.0 innings during his lone start against Washington (came last year on April 14 at PNC Park)... He has a 1.35 ERA (26.2ip/4er) and 30 strikeouts in four career home starts against the N.L. East.

REPRESENTING THE USA: The 23-year-old Skenes represented the United States during this year's World Baseball Classic...He went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (8.1ip/1er), nine strikeouts and a 0.96 WHIP...Skenes struck out seven batters and allowed just one hit and one walk over 4.0 scoreless innings on March 9 vs. Mexico, while also giving up one run in 4.1 innings on March 15 at the Dominican Republic...He also pitched 3.0 innings in a March 3 exhibition at San Francisco.

HOME SWEET HOME: This is Skenes' second straight start at PNC Park after facing San Diego on April 7...His 1.77 ERA (91.1ip/18er) in 15 starts along the banks of the Allegheny River in 2025 was the second-lowest home ERA in Major League Baseball (Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta, 1.77).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes took home National League Cy Young Award honors in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) and Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates pitchers to ever win the Cy Young Award.

ELITE COMPANY: Skenes has posted a 2.08 ERA (332.2ip/77er) through the first 58 starts of his Major League career...The only other Major League pitcher in the Live Ball Era (since 1920) with ERA of 2.08 or lower through his first 58 starts was St. Louis' Howie Pollet (2.08, 1941-46).

FIRING BLANKS: Skenes struck out seven batters over his 6.0 scoreless innings on September 24 at Cincinnati (his final start of the 2025 season)...He did not allow a run in three of his final four starts...Skenes made a total of 12 scoreless starts in 2025, surpassing Trevor Williams (11) in 2018 for the most scoreless starts by a Pirates pitcher in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

IN THE CONVERSATION: Skenes finished tied for sixth in National League MVP Award voting in 2025...He and Arizona's Corbin Carroll each received a total of 83 points...The only players with more points were Los Angeles' Shohei Ohtani (420), Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (260), New York's Juan Soto (231), Arizona's Geraldo Perdomo (196) and Philadelphia's Trea Turner (102).

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy before transferring to LSU (2023), raised \$500,000 for the foundation at a Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, on Veterans Day.

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes started for the National League in last season's All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park after also starting for the National League on July 16, 2024 at Texas' Globe Life Field...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57)...Skenes also joined Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Bob Veale (1965-66) as the only starting pitchers in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in at least two straight seasons (there was no All-Star Game in 1945)...He also became the first player in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in each of his first two Major League seasons.
