PITTSBURGH PIRATES (45-45) vs. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (46-44)
July 5, 2026 - Nationals Park - Washington, D.C. - 1:00 EDT - Game #91/Road #46
RHP Bubba Chandler (3-8, 4.62 ERA) vs. RHP Cade Cavalli (5-4, 3.69 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won three of the first six games on this seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (2-2, June 29-July 2) and Washington (1-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 7-1 win on Saturday at Nationals Park...Will host Atlanta (Tuesday-Thursday) and Milwaukee (July 10-12) for six games during their final homestand prior to the All-Star break...Have the most hits (818) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (464) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Los Angeles-NL (481) and Washington (480)...Have struck out the third-most batters (825) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Philadelphia (864) and Milwaukee (859)...Have won or split eight of their first 14 road series this season (they won or split only seven of their 26 road series during the 2025 campaign)...Are in the 13th game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone, a stretch that began on June 23 vs. Seattle and will end on August 2 at Cincinnati (their next game not played in the Eastern Time Zone will be on August 3 at Milwaukee).

NATIONAL MATTER: Pittsburgh has gone 20-14 (.588) against Washington since the start of the 2022 season, winning each of the four season series in that stretch...The winner of today's rubber match will win this year's season series (the Pirates and Nationals split a four-game series from April 13-16 at PNC Park)...Pittsburgh has won at least five straight season series against the Montréal/Washington franchise (since 1969) just one other time, coming from 1975-80 (six straight season series victories).

SMALL BALL: The Pirates scored seven runs without an extra-base hit on Saturday at Washington (11 singles)...It was the fifth time they did that in a game in the 21st century, joining April 20, 2003 vs. Chicago-NL (8-2 win, 10 hits), May 26, 2003 at Chicago-NL (10-0 win, eight hits), April 16, 2004 at New York-NL (7-6 win, eight hits) and May 31, 2019 vs. Milwaukee (9-4 win, 13 hits)...They were the first Major League team to do it since Miami had nine singles in a 7-4 win last season on August 28 at New York (NL).

PAUL-STAR GAME: Paul Skenes was named to the National League All-Star team for the third straight year on Saturday...Per Sarah Langs, he is one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star game in at least each of his first three seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) & Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)...Skenes is the first Buc to make three straight All-Star teams since Andrew McCutchen (five straight, 2011-15).

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe had a two-run single in Saturday's 7-1 win at Washington and now has 60 RBI this season...His 60 RBI are tied with three others (including Washington's CJ Abrams) for the seventh-most throughout Major League Baseball...Lowe has become one of nine Pirates (10 instances) in the 21st century with at least 60 RBI prior to the All-Star break...He joined Brian Giles (72) in 2000, Aramis Ramirez (62) in 2003, Jason Bay (66) in 2006, Nate McLouth (65) in 2008, Andrew McCutchen (60) in 2012, Pedro Álvarez (62) in 2013, McCutchen (61) in 2014, Josh Bell (84) in 2019 and Bryan Reynolds (61) in 2024 on that list.

A PIRATE'S LIFE FOR ME: Pittsburgh had four stolen bases on Saturday at Washington, marking its second straight game with four steals...The Pirates last did that in back-to-back games (prior to Saturday) from May 17-18, 1987...Pittsburgh has stolen at least four bases in at least three straight games three times in the Modern Era (since 1901), coming from July 31-August 6, 1904 (five straight), May 11-14, 1907 (three straight) and May 9-11, 1915 (three straight)...The Pirates' 85 steals rank fifth in Major League Baseball, behind Miami (96), New York-AL (92), Washington (92) and San Diego (87)...Their 85 steals are tied with 1986 for their seventh-most in a season prior to the All-Star break (since 1933), trailing 1977 (133), 1978 (112), 1980 (102), 1982 (92), 1987 (88) & 1979 (86).

RAPID ROOKIE: Konnor Griffin posted his second multi-steal game (also May 29 vs. Minnesota), including a steal of home, on Saturday at Washington...He became the first Pirate to steal home since Andrew McCutchen (April 14, 2024 at Philadelphia) and the first to do it as part of a multi-steal game since Ryan Doumit (June 17, 2005 at Boston)...Griffin has 19 stolen bases in his first 58 Major League games...The only Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 20 stolen bases in his first 60 MLB games was Doug Baird (20) in 1915.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 5, 2024: The Pirates hit a club-record-tying seven home runs, in front of a sellout crowd of 37,037 fans, during their 14-2 win over the Mets at PNC Park. Bryan Reynolds and Rowdy Tellez became the first pair of Major League teammates to each hit multiple home runs, including a grand slam, in the same game. Paul Skenes improved to 5-0 after striking out eight batters in his 7.0 innings of work.

LAST TIME OUT: Chandler lost an 8-0 decision after allowing five runs over a career-high 6.1 innings of work on June 30 at Philadelphia...The 6.1 innings pitched were his most since also tossing 6.1 innings on May 24, 2025 w/Triple-A Indianapolis at Toledo.

RIGHT ON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .206 batting average against (32-for-155) and a .609 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)'s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco's Heliot Ramos (May 10).

AGAINST THE NATIONALS: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing just one run on two hits and striking out seven batters over 6.0 innings of work in his only career appearance/start against Washington, which came last season on September 13 here at Nationals Park (the Pirates won, 5-1)...He had a perfect game through 5.0 innings before allowing a leadoff single to the Nationals' Dylan Crews in the sixth inning... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Chandler was the fourth Pittsburgh rookie in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have a bid for a perfect game of at least 5.0 innings...He joined Nick Kingham (6.2ip) on April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis, Bruce Kison (5.2ip) on July 23, 1971 at San Diego & Max Kranick (5.0ip) on June 27, 2021 at St. Louis on that list.

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodriguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

 Is 11-for-34 (.324) out of the No. 7 spot of the lineup...Posted his first MLB hit on 5/3/25 w/Cincinnati vs. Washington (RBI single, off Trevor Williams).
 Has gone 6-for-19 (.316) with a 1.206 OPS with RISP this season...Has appeared at pitcher, first base, second base, third base, left field and right field.

 Is hitting .322 (73-for-227) with 15 extra-base hits against right-handed pitchers...Has gone 52-for-150 (.347) with 39 RBI with runners on this year.

 His nine hits since being reinstated from the injured list on 6/26 are tied for the sixth-most among NL rookies (teammate Esmerlyn Valdez, 17, is first).
 Has gone 48-for-155 (.310) with 14 extra-base hits, 15 RBI, 11 walks, 15 stolen bases & 27 runs scored in his last 39 games (since 4/24 at Milwaukeee).

 His 19 home runs as a second baseman this season are tied w/Bill Mazeroski (1958) for the second-most by a Bucs second baseman in a single season.
