METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Pirates, 3-1, last night in Queens...The Amazins' earned their fourth straight series victory of the season...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 9-3...New York finishes their second homestand (4-1) of the season, a six-game stand against the Royals (2-1) and Pirates (2-0)...New York is off on Thursday before they hit the road for their second trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-NL (three games) and San Francisco (three games).

THIS IS .500: The Mets moved above .500 for the first time since June 3, 2023 when they owned 30-29 record...A win would mark the first time the Mets would be .500 at home in 2024.

SWEEP TOOTH: The Mets are looking for their first sweep of the season...The last time the Mets earned a sweep was July 4-6 at Arizona...The last sweep at home was May 30-June 1 vs. Philadelphia...The last time the Mets swept the Pirates was a four game series from September 15-18, 2022 at Citi Field.

REEDING RAINBOW: Last night, Reed Garrett struck out six batters in 2.0 innings of work...He joined Alejandro Peña (June 30, 1991) as the only other Mets relief pitcher ever to record six strikeouts in a 2.0-inning appearance...In four games this year, he has struck out 17 of the 31 batters he has faced (55%)...His 17 strikeouts as reliever are tied for the major league lead...His 17 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first four appearances of a season... He has yet to allow a run in a career-high 8.2 innings this year.

IN A PINCH: Joey Wendle recorded a pinch-hit RBI double yesterday...Overall, Mets pinch-hitters are 5-12 this season...Their .417 average ranks fourth in the major leagues.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 10 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .291/.365/.446 with 62 runs, 19 doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 36 walks with an .811 OPS...Their .365 OBP is the second-best in the majors, while their .291 average and .811 OPS is third-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 62-44 in that span...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

HERE'S THE PITCH: New York owns the lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.33 (57 ER/154.0 IP) mark...Their 169 strikeouts are third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.10 ERA (24 ER/69.2 IP) with 28 walks and 87 strikeouts...Their 3.10 ERA is second in the Senior Circuit...The pen's 87 strikeouts are the most in the major leagues.

FRANKLY SPEAKING: Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in nine straight games...He has posted a .326 OBP in that span...He is batting .316 (6-19) against left-handed pitchers in 2024...This includes a .579 SLG.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: As a team, the Mets are batting .292/.357/.470 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .292 average is third in the major leagues, while their .470 SLG ranks second...This compares to a .222/.316/.335 slashline against righties.

HEY BABY: Harrison Bader has safely hit in eight of his last 10 games...Bader is batting 12-36 (.333) over that span with seven runs, one double, three RBI, two walks with a .385 OBP.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is one home run shy for 150 in his career...He is three RBI away from 600...Marte has stolen 341 bases in his career...That is the most among active players.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won 11 of their last 14 games against the Pirates.

SWING AND NO MISS: Mets batters have struck out 124 times this year...That is the second-fewest in the major leagues...Overall, the team has posted an 18.9 strikeout percentage, which ranks third in the majors and second in the National League...Jeff McNeil ranks sixth in the majors, striking out only 9.8% of the time, while Francisco Lindor places 11th at 11.1%.

SAVE ME: Edwin Diaz has recorded 100 saves as a member of the Mets...He is the sixth player in franchise history to record at least 100 saves with the Club...His current save streak of 26 games is the longest active in the majors...It is his second-longest of his career... Diaz career-best is a 28 save streak from June 2-August 15, 2018.

BROOKS IS OFF AND RUNNING: Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run in seven games (6.1 IP) this season...He has surrendered one hit, walked three and struck out eight.

IN THE CITY: The Mets are 5-6 at Citi Field this year...New York earned a winning season at Citi Field in 2023, going 44-37 at home last season...The Mets have earned a winning season at Citi Field in each of the last three seasons...The Mets have smashed 115 home runs at Citi Field in 2023...That is the second-most home runs at home in team history...Only the 2019 team (126) hit more at home.

FORPETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso, the reigning National League Player of the Week, is batting .440 (11-25) with eight runs, two doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, five walks with a .533 OBP and a 1.000 SLG over his last seven games.

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Luis Severino earned his first win as a Met on April 12 vs. Kansas City...He allowed one run on one hit with four walks with four strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

NEW STARTER IN THE CITI: Severino made his Citi Field debut in his Mets debut, recording 5.0 IP with a 5.40 ERA (3 ER/5.0 IP)...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks while pitching at home.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 805 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1,174) has recorded more.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

STRONG START IN SPRING: In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.

- Was named NL Player of the Week for the period ending April 14...Batted .429 (9-21) with four homers, seven RBI, eight runs and seven walks during the week...Was his fourth career NL player of the week selection (Also: 6/24/19, 9/26/22 and 7/31/23).
- Is batting .440/.533/1.000 with four home runs, two doubles, seven RBI, eight runs and five walks over his last seven games.
- Went 3-3 with a two homers and three RBI on April 13 vs. Kansas City...Was his 20th career multi-homer game, the third most such games in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21)...Are the second most such games since 2019 behind only Aaron Judge.
- Is two homers shy from 200 for his career...Would join Darryl Strawberry (252), David Wright (242) and Mike Piazza as the only Mets with 200 or more homers.
- Lined a solo homer in the eighth on April 12 vs. Kansas City...All four of his home runs this season have come in the eighth inning or later.
- Is tied with Mookie Betts, Michael Busch and Taylor Ward for fourth in the majors with six home runs.
- Hit a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning in the second game of a doubleheader on April 4 vs. Detroit...Was his 500th career RBL...Became the 10th Met to reach the 500-career RBI mark...José Reyes and Cleon Jones are next (521)...Is the third player in major league history to record 194 or more home runs and 500 or more RBI within their first 690 games joining Ralph Kiner and Ryan Howard...Courtesy of Matthew Brownstein...His 196 home runs and 505 RBI are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

- Slugged 25 home runs in 2023, the third-most by a Mets rookie in a single season behind Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 2019)...Became the ninth rookie catcher in major league history with 20 or more homers in a season (Min. 60% games at C)...Was tied for second among MLB rookies in homers and ninth in RBI (63)...Were the second-most in a single season by a catcher prior to turning 22...Only Johnny Bench (26, 1969) had more by a catcher in a single season before the age of 22.
- Had four multi-homer games in 2023, tied with Darryl Strawberry and Pete Alonso for the Mets rookie record.

- Became the fourth Met ever to join the 30-30 club (Also: Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991), Darryl Strawberry (1987) and David Wright (2007))...Joined Barry Larkin (1996), Alex Rodriguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007), Hanley Ramirez (2008) and Bobby Witt Jr. (2023) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...Joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramírez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.
- Became the first Met to reach the 30+ stolen base mark since Eric Young Jr. (30 in 2014).
- Has four seasons of at least 30 home runs, tied with Miguel Tejada and Ernie Banks for the second-most such seasons by a shortstop in major league history...Only Alex Rodriguez (seven) has had more 30+ home run seasons as a shortstop.
- Is one of seven active players with at least 200+ career home runs and 150+ career stolen bases.

- Spent his first eight major league seasons with the Pirates...Batted .287 (1047-3647) with 106 home runs and 239 stolen bases with the club...Won two NL Gold Gloves (2015, 2016) and was named a National League All-Star in 2016...Ranks eighth in Pirates history in stolen bases.
- Is batting .318 (14-44) with a .375 OBP over his last 10 games.
- Went 2-4 with a run, a walk and two stolen bases on April 6 vs. Cincinnati...Was his 40th career game with multiple stolen bases, the third-most such games in the majors since 2012.
- Lined a solo home run in his first at-bat of the season on March 29 vs. Milwaukee...Has homered in each of his three home openers as a Met.
- Appeared in 86 games, his fewest since 2017 when he played in 77 contests...Only appeared in four games after the All-Star Game, including his final contest on August 5...Was on the IL from July 20 - August 4 with migraines and again from August 7 (retroactive to August 6) - end of season with a right groin strain.
- Finished tied for 16th in the National League with 24 stolen bases in 2023...Ranks first among active players with 341 stolen bases...Posted his ninth season with 20 or more stolen bases...Only 35 players in the Integration Era (since 1947) have had more 20-steal seasons...He has swiped 20 or more bags in nine of 11 seasons since 2013...No other player in the majors has done so more than seven times during that span.
