METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 4-1, last night...The Mets are 71-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-10-3 in 45 series this year...The Mets continue a seven game homestand (0-2) against the Cubs (0-2) and Pirates (four games).

ISLES NIGHT: The Mets will host Islanders Night at Citi Field tonight...Several players will be in attendance for tonight's game including Josh Bailey, Adam Pelech, Scott Mayfield, Ryan Pulock, Anthony Beauvillier and Ross Johnston...In addition, Islanders s mascot Sparky will be in attendance as well...Bailey will throw out a first pitch prior to the game.

MINDFULNESS WITH THE METS WITH EDWIN DÍAZ: To complement the Mets' Health & Wellness programming, the Mets have launched Mindfulness with the Mets, presented by Empire BlueCross BlueShield...The program encourages young students to learn about the importance of mental health and positive thinking. Ahead of tonight's game, Mets closer and NL reliever of the month, Edwin Díaz, visited Longwood Preparatory Academy in the Bronx...Díaz spoke to the students about the importance of staying mentally strong on the mound and shared tips for how he prepares to pitch under pressure...The students received Mindfulness with the Mets stress balls and mini trumpets.

COOKIE'S KIDS PROGRAM: Throughout this season, Carlos Carrasco is partnering with Northwell Health to meet with pediatric cancer patients and their families and share his inspiring story of overcoming cancer...Earlier today, Carlos joined patients in the game room at Cohen Children's Medical Center where he played video games on brand-new Nintendo Switches donated by the Starlight Children's Foundation as part of MLB's Childhood Cancer Awareness Month programming...Mets Owner and President of the Amazon' Mets Foundation, Alex Cohen, also joined Carrasco to visit patients and their families and gifted them with Mets swag and Cookie's Kids T-shirts.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost back-to-back games...The team is looking to avoid a three-game losing streak, which would match their longest of the season...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games...The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)... Courtesy of Elias.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 46-25 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are fourth in the NL...They are third in National League with a .657 winning percentage at home...The team's .648 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.11 ERA with 200 walks and 701 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 701 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the sixth-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

NO MINOR THING: Two Mets minor league affiliates began their playoff run last night...The Brooklyn Cyclones defeated the Aberdeen IronBirds, an affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, 8-1, in Brooklyn last night...Second baseman José Peroza led the offense, going 3-3 with a run, three RBI, a walk and a home run...RHP Luis Moreno earned the win, allowing a run on five hits with a walk and struck out seven in 6.0 innings of work...The two teams continue their best-of-three series tomorrow in Brooklyn...The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Palm Beach Cardinals, 6-1, in Jupiter last night...Second baseman D'Andre Smith, SS Junior Tilién and LF Kevin Kendall all collected two hits in the victory...RHP Blade Tidwell made the start and tossed 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing two hits and striking out six...The two teams continue their best-of-three series tomorrow night in St. Lucie.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 105 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Díaz has posted a 0.79 ERA (three earned runs/34.1 innings) with 17 hits, seven walks and 67 strikeouts in 34 appearances since the start of June.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

HERE'S THE CATCH: As a team, Mets catchers are batting .350/.413/.550 in 12 games this month...Their .350 batting average is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors...Tomás Nido is batting .286 (22-77) with 12 runs, nine doubles, a home run, nine RBI, five walks with a .325 OBP and a .442 SLG in 28 games since the All-Star Break...He is 6-12 (.500) with four runs, three doubles, a home run, three RBI, a walk with a .538 OBP and a 1.000 SLG over his last three games...James McCann is batting .300 (10-32) with six runs, two doubles, an RBI, four walks, a steal with a .389 OBP over his last 11 games.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their first season series victory over the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

WINNING! The Mets are seeking their 90th win today...It would be their most wins since they also recorded 90 in 2015...The Mets have clinched a winning record both at home and on the road...It is the first time the team has posted record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Francisco Lindor has recorded 92 RBI this season...That is tied for his career-high of 92 set with Cleveland in 2018...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 110 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has hit 23 home runs this season...He is tied with Asdrubal Cabrera for most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season, which was accomplished in 2018...He is batting .305/.384/.474 with 33 runs, nine doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 26 RBI, 22 walks with an .858 OPS in 53 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.1 fWAR this season.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 60-82 Cubs today...Each of their next five games and 13 of the their 19 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 50-24 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .676 winning percentage...Their .676 winning percentage is the fifth-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .364 (16-44) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, four walks, two steals with a .404 OBP in 12 games in September...He is slashing .357/.389/.500 in 48 games following the All-Star break...His .357 average is second in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 96 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.2 percent strikeout rate.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is second in the majors and in the National League with a .323 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.329) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 94 times this year...The team's 94 HBP is tied for the second-highest total in franchise history with the 2021 team...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 19 times this year, which is tied for second in the majors...His 19 hit by pitches are the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

M-V-P-ETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 31 second-half wins.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,359 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,371 have struck out more...The team's 1,359 strikeouts are already the sixth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.62 K/9 IP, a rate... Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.8 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in nine straight games... Over his last 26 games, Canha is batting .287 (25-87) with 14 runs, 11 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, seven walks with a .374 OBP, a .586 SLG and a .960 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 45 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games...Canha slugging .479 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Suffered the loss against the Marlins on September 9 after allowing three earned runs on five hits, two walks and seven strikeouts. over 3.2 innings... Was tied for his shortest start of the season (Also: 6/4 @ LAD & 7/6 @ CIN).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson has struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts since June 20, the second-longest such streak by a left-handed starter this season and tied for third-longest active such streak...It is the sixth-longest such streak by a Mets starter in franchise history...He has 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings since then (13 G/11 GS) for a 12.58 K/9 ratio, a mark that ranks third in the majors in that span (min. 50.0 IP)...His 80 strikeouts over his last 11 starts are the most by a Mets left-handed starter over an 11-game span since Johan Santana punched out 84 batters in 11 starts from April 12-June 9, 2009.

THE RUN DOWN: Peterson has allowed four or fewer earned runs in each of his 18 starts this season...Currently, his 18-game streak allowing four or fewer runs in a start is the fourth-longest active streak by a left-handed starter...The last left-handed Mets starter with an 18-game streak without allowing more than four earned runs over a single season was Jerry Koosman from June 29 - September 18, 1968...Only two other lefty starters have had a longer such streak across a single season in franchise history Mickey Lolich (20, 1976), Johan Santana (19, 2008)...Peterson has not allowed more than three earned runs in his last 11 straight starts owning a 2.98 ERA (19 earned runs/57.1 innings) in that span.

SHINING AGAINST CHI-TOWN: In three career starts against the Cubs, Peterson is 1-1 with a 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP)...In his last two starts against the Cubs, Peterson has allowed one unearned run over 11.0 innings on four hits with 11 strikeouts.

PETERED INTO THE CITI: In 11 home games (nine starts) Peterson is 5-1 with a 3.80 ERA (20 ER/47.1 IP)...Over his last five starts at Citi Field, Peterson is 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA (6 ER/28.0 IP) with an 11.25 K/9 rate...Four of those six starts have been scoreless starts.

LETHAL LEFTY: This season, Peterson has limited lefties to a .197 (15-76) average...Among left-handed hurlers, it is the ninth-best opponents' average in the National League (min. 75 LHB faced).

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson has held batters to a .180 (24-133) average with his slider this season and 75 of his 117 strikeouts have come on the pitch...His 51.4 slider-strikeout percentage is the second-highest in MLB (min. 100 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.0).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts this season and in 15 of his 22 total games...In his career, he has allowed four or fewer hits in 33 of 47 career games (188 career hits)...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (157 hits) allowed less hits in their first 47 major league games (min. 200.0 IP).

200 KLUB: Struck out the 200th batter of his career on August 6 vs. Atlanta when he punched out Matt Olson swinging in the sixth frame...Is the 10th pitcher in Mets history to reach 200 strikeouts in their first 43 career games...He was the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz recorded his 200th strikeout in his 39th career game in 2017.

ON THE FARM AND IN THE ARM BARN: Peterson has made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season...He has gone 2-3 and has posted a 4.85 ERA (14 earned runs/26.0 innings) with 10 walks against 34 strikeouts...In four outings out of the bullpen this year, Peterson has gone 1-0, posting a 4.50 ERA (four earned runs/8.0 innings)...This compares to a 3.32 ERA (45 earned runs/95.0 innings) while going 7-3 in 17 starts.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (14-6, 3.80 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his team-leading 14th win on September 10th against the Marlins at Marlins Park...Allowed one earned run in 6.0 innings on four hits and six strikeouts without issuing a walk.

QUALITY CONTROL: Has 10 quality starts this season after notching just two such starts last year...Registered three straight quality starts from July 30-August 9 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Has made seven starts with more than 6.0 innings this year, the third-most on the club.
