TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Brian Bartow's Cardinals** and the eighth game (5-2) of Cin's longest road trip of the 2026 season, a 10-day/9-game journey that includes a pair of 3-game series victories at **Col** (2-1, 7/17-7/19) and **Sea** (2-1, Mon-Wed).

- Cin has won back-to-back road series for the first time since 4/17-4/22 (3-0 at **Min**, 2-1 at **TB**)...hasn't won 3 or more consecutive sets away from home since a streak of 7 road series victories from 5/26-7/6, 2023.
- Following tomorrow's series finale, the Reds return home to **Great American Ball Park** to begin an 11-day/10-game homestand against the **Guardians** (7/27-7/29), **Pirates** (7/30-8/2), and **Athletics** (8/4-8/6).

GENO MACHINO: DH **Eugenio Suárez** hit his 203rd career homer as a member of the Reds in Friday's win at **StL**, moving into a tie with **Eric Davis** for 10th place on the club's all-time list (see chart below).

- Suárez** has hit 6 home runs in his last 12 games (since 7/7 vs **Phi**), tied for second-most among all Major League batters during that time, behind only **Pit's Esmerlyn Valdez** (7hr).
- Suárez'** homer on Fri at **StL** also marked his 32nd career go-ahead home run in the 6th inning or later...those 32-such HR are the most by any Major Leaguer since his debut season of 2014.

SALUTATIONS: INF **Sal Stewart** delivered a go-ahead, 3-run homer in the 7th inning of Wed's 5-3 win at **Sea**...marked his team-leading 21st home run of the season, tied for fourth-most by a rookie in Reds history (see chart below).

- Was also his Major League-leading 11th opposite-field HR of the season, the most by a Red in a single campaign since **Joey Votto** (13) in 2013.
- Stewart's** 75 RBI on the year rank fourth in MLB, behind **StL's Jordan Walker** (77), **Hou's Yordan Alvarez** (77), and **Wsh's CJ Abrams** (76). His 75 RBI are also eighth-most by a Reds rookie in a single season since the stat became official in 1920.
- Is on pace to set a new Reds rookie record with 119 RBI, which would surpass the previous mark of 100 set by **Jim Greengrass** in 1953... would be the most by *any* Red since **Dave Parker** (125) in 1985.
- Stewart** is aiming to become the fourth Major League rookie since 1920 to lead his team in home runs, RBI, walks, and hits...would join teammate **Spencer Steer** (2023), **Don Lenhardt** (1950 w/**St. Louis Browns**), and **Wally Berger** (1930 w/**Boston Braves**).

FOLLOW MY LEAD: SS **Elly De La Cruz** opened Tue's 4-2 win at **Sea** with his third career leadoff homer (last: 8/3/23 at **Chc**)...was the first leadoff home run by a Red this season and first since teammate **TJ Friedl** on 9/8/25 at **SD**.

- De La Cruz** has served as the Reds' leadoff hitter in each of the club's last 22 games (since 6/27 at **Pit**)...during that time, he has slashed .284/.382/.523 (25-for-88) with 5 homers and 8 stolen bases...the Reds have hit 37 home runs in that stretch, second-most in MLB (**Wsh**, 42).
- De La Cruz** posted his 26th career game with multiple stolen bases on Fri at **StL**...leads MLB with 8 steals in July...is 2 stolen bases and 3 home runs shy of joining **Eric Davis** and **Brandon Phillips** as the only players in Reds history with 20+ homers and 20+ steals in 3 straight seasons.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and **Cardinals** are meeting for the third time this season...the **Cardinals** swept the **Reds** in 3 games in their last encounter from 6/5-6/7 here at **Busch Stadium**...it was the **Cards'** first sweep of the **Redlegs** since 7/15-7/16, 2022 (2 games)...it was their first sweep in a 3-game series since 4/23-4/25, 2021 in **St. Louis**.

- The 2 teams were rained out at **Great American Ball Park** on 5/22, split a doubleheader the next day (5/23) and were rained out again on 5/24... will play a 5-game series at **GABP** from 8/17-8/20, including a day/night doubleheader on 8/17 to account for the 5/24 postponement.
- The Reds are 1,129-1,242 vs the **Cardinals** since 1892, including 2-4 in 2026 and 6-7 in 2025 (1-2 at **StL** 6/20-6/22; 2-2 at **Cin** 4/28-5/1; 1-2 at **Cin** 8/29-8/31; 2-1 at **StL** 9/15-9/17).
- StL** has won or split 6 of the last 7 series and 10 of the last 12 dating back to September 2023...the Reds have dropped 10 of the last 12 season series entering 2026 (86-115, .428).

POWER SURGE: The Reds rank T5th in MLB with 135 homers this season...only **Wsh** (151), **NYN** (148), **Hou** (143), and **Atl** (138) have more.

- The Reds have scored 50.4% of their 427 runs via the HR (215), the highest rate among all Major League clubs this season.
- Rank third among all Major League teams with 33 home runs in July, behind only the **Nationals** (37) and **Braves** (35).
- The Reds lead MLB this season with 9 sets of back-to-back home runs (the **Athletics** and **Astros** rank T2nd with 8 each).
- Are on pace to hit 214 homers this season, which would mark the 10th time in club history reaching 200 HR.
- Have hit a Major League-leading 29 homers to the opposite field this year, 6 more than the next closest team (**Phi**).
- Are 1 of 6 MLB teams this season to have at least 4 players with 15+ HR.

ROAD WARRIORS: With a win today, the Reds can secure their 10th road series victory of the season, which would tie the **Brewers** and **Phillies** for fourth-most in MLB...only the **Nationals** (13), **Dodgers** (12), and **Yankees** (11) have more series wins away from home in 2026.

WINNING WAYS: RHP **Julian Garcia** earned his first career win on Fri at **StL**, becoming the 19th different Reds pitcher with a win this season...Cin's 19 different pitchers with at least 1 win are tied with the **Padres** for most in MLB.

STRUGGLING AGAINST PEERS: The Reds are 7-22 (.241) vs their NL Central counterparts and 26-40 (.394) against all National League opponents.

- With a win today, the Reds can capture their second series victory against an NL Central opponent this season (also: 2-1, 6/26-6/28 at **Pit**).
- The Reds own the lowest winning pct (.241) of any Major League team within its own division.
- Conversely, Cin owns the majors' fifth-best record vs American League teams (22-14, .611).
