TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME! With anticipated high attendance figures for all three games this weekend, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 10-4, last night...New York is 15-3-2 in 20 series this year...The Mets continue a seven-game homestand (3-1) against the Brewers (2-1) and Marlins (1-0).

JOY DIVISION: The Mets are 20-7 against the National League East this year...Their .741 winning percentage is the best intradivisional record in baseball...Only the Brewers (also 20 wins) have 20+ wins against their own division in the NL...New York has posted a 3.23 ERA (86 earned runs/240.0 innings) with 79 walks and 239 strikeouts against the East this year...They are hitting .268/.352/.402 with 26 home runs and 138 RBI against the division...They have outscored their NL East rivals 146-90 in this span.

20/20 VISION: The Mets are a season-high 20 games over .500...The last time the team was 20 games above .500 was on September 30, 2015 when they were 89-69...This is the third-fastest the team has reached the 20-games over .500 mark...The 1986 team got there in 42 games (31-11) and the 1988 team reached the mark in 54 games (37-17)...The last time the team was 21 games over .500 was on September 29, 2015 (89-68).

1010 WINS: The Mets have scored 10 or more runs in nine games this year...That is the second-most in the majors, behind only the Yankees (11 games)...The Mets are 8-1 in such games...In 2021, the Mets scored 10 or more runs in only nine games...The Mets have recorded at least 10 hits in 23 games this season...The Mets are 19-4 when collecting at least 10 hits in a contest...Their 19 wins when recording 10 hits are tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

THREE-PETE: Pete Alonso finished 2-4 with a run, a home run, a walk and four RBI last night...He now has 63 RBI so far this season...He became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

125TH STREET: Pete Alonso hit his 125th career home run in his 435th career game...He became the second fastest player to hit 125 homers in MLB history...Ryan Howard achieved the total in 405 career games...Aaron Judge is the third-fastest, getting there in 447 games.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso has homered six times in his last 12 games...He has recorded 16 RBI in that span...He is batting .311 (14-45) with 12 runs, a double, five walks with a .392 OBP and a .733 SLG in that span...Alonso leads the majors with 63 RBI...He is tied for second in the majors and leads the National League with 19 home runs.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last five games...He is batting .350 (7-20) in that span with four runs, a double, a triple, a 4.09 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .909 OPS...He has posted a .375 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 43 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .652 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 43-23 record through the team's first 66 games...Only the 1986 (46-20) team posted a better record through the first 66 games of the season...The 1988 team also went 43-23.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets were plunked four times last night...That tied a team record for the third time...The Mets were previously plunked four times in a game on April 7, 2019 vs. Washington and September 25, 2016 vs. Philadelphia...The team has been plunked a major league leading 48 times this year...The Mets have been hit 283 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 62 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 43 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 37 HBP.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Marlins for the first time this season...The Mets have won seven of their last eight contests against the Fish in New York.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader having been hit by 50 pitches in his career.

HIGH FIVE: Jeff McNeil is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .471 (8-17) with three runs, a double, a home run, four RBI, two walks with a .500 OBP and a .706 SLG in that span...He ranks eighth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a .324 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...Over his last 14 games, McNeil is batting .380 (19-50) with seven runs, two doubles, six RBI, three walks with a .436 OBP, a .480 SLG and a .916 OPS.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has 23 multi-hit games this year, tied for the third-most in the majors...He has collected 133 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 34th in franchise history...Jeff Kent is next with 136 multi-hit games...McNeil has collected 32 games with three or more hits...That is tied for 28th in team history...Pete Alonso has recorded 109 career multi-hit games, placing him 51st in team history...Cliff Floyd is 50th with 114 multi-hit games.

GONE FISHIN': J.D. Davis is a .343 (34-99) lifetime hitter against the Fish with 18 runs, eight doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 20 walks with a .451 OBP and a .545 SLG...He has safely reached base in each of his last 18 games against the Marlins, owning a .485 OBP in the streak that dates to August 7, 2020...He ranks second in average, fourth in OBP and seventh in SLG and fifth in OPS vs. MIA since 2019 (min. 100 PA)...Over his last 19 games, J.D. Davis is batting .338 (22-65) with 12 runs, four doubles, one home run, eight RBI, four walks with a .380 OBP, a .446 SLG and an .826 OPS in that span...Over his last 28 games, Davis is batting .283/.333/.391 with seven extra-base hits and 12 RBI.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 13 saves this season, tied for the seventh-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 50 strikeouts...His 17.09 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 50 of the 104 batters he faced, good for 48.1%...He is 2-1 with 13 saves, a 2.05 ERA (six earned runs/26.1 innings), allowing 18 hits and 11 walks...The Mets are 25-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

STRIKE THAT: Mets hurlers have fanned 611 batters with the hitters striking out just 497 times...That differential (plus-114) is the largest in the majors...The Mets batters have struck out 497 times this year...That is the sixth-fewest strikeouts in MLB and the second-fewest in the NL...They have a 19.7% strikeout rate this year...The Mets are one of five teams who have struck out less than 20% this season...Their 19.7% strikeout rate is fourth in the majors and third in the NL.

STRIKE THAT AGAIN: Mets pitchers rank third in the majors with 611 strikeouts this season...Only the Milwaukee Brewers (617) and Atlanta Braves (612) have struck out more batters this year...New York owns a 3.13 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is fifth in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit...Only the Dodgers (3.46) have a better ratio.

CITI SLICKERS: Overall, the Mets are 22-9 at home this year...They are second in the majors and top the National League with a .710 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.38 ERA with 106 walks and 297 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...The Mets own the fourth-best home ERA in the National League...The team is hitting .266/.344/.409 at home...Their .266 batting average is fourth in the majors and third in the National League.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Luis Guillorme is one of 10 players in the majors with more walks than strikeouts this year (min. 100 PA)...He has 18 walks and 17 strikeouts this season...After batting .071 (1-14) in his first eight games, Guillorme is batting .351 (39-111) with 21 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 15 walks, a steal with a .429 OBP, a .423 SLG and an .852 OPS over his last 37 games...Among players with 100 or more plate appearances, Guillorme's .406 OBP is seventh in the majors and third in the NL.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a .290 average with runners in scoring position...They rank second in MLB with a .360 OBP and sixth with a .455 SLG in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .400 (22-55), Tomás Nido - .364 (12-33), Pete Alonso - .361 (22-61), J.D. Davis - .346 (9-26) and Mark Canha - .340 (17-50) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the NL and is second in the major leagues with 48 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .400 average with RISP is tied for ninth in the majors and fourth in the NL.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte is batting .312 (44-141) with 30 runs, nine doubles, two triples, five home runs, 20 RBI, seven walks, four steals with a .349 OBP, a .511 SLG and an .860 OPS in 35 games since May 1...He is batting .313/.358/.525 with 11 extra-base hits and 17 RBI in 25 games at Citi Field in 2022.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win of the season after allowing one earned run in 6.0 innings on June 12 against the Angels at Angel Stadium... Struck out a season-high 10 batters for his first 10-strikeout game this season...Was the 10th time in his career striking out at least 10 batters in a game and the first time since he struck out a career-high 12 batters against the Cubs on June 15, 2021.

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just three home runs in 52.2 innings this season, good for a 0.51 HR/9 ratio...That ranks 13th in the majors and seventh in the NL among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings...In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

VS. MIAMI: Walker has made five appearances (four starts) in his career against the Marlins and is 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA (14 earned runs/27.1 innings)... Last season, Walker faced the Marlins three times and went 0-1 with a 3.50 ERA (seven earned runs/18.0 innings) in those outings.

FEW KS, THAT'S OK: Through 10 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 5.98 and an ERA of 3.08...That is the lowest ERA among starting pitchers that have had at least 10 starts and a K/9 rate less than 6.00.

SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS: In 10 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just over 30 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .173 (14-81) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...25 of Walker's 35 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

JOYFUL IN JUNE: In 22 June starts, Walker is 12-6 with a 3.17 ERA (47 earned runs/133.1 innings) and 130 strikeouts, his best totals for any month... Last season, Walker went 2-2 with a 3.26 ERA (11 earned runs/30.0 innings) in five June starts...His 33 strikeouts last season in June were the most in any month.

CITI SLICKER: In three starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (five earned runs/15.0 innings)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 5-4 with a 3.40 ERA (40 earned runs/106.0 innings) in 19 games (18 starts).

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .204 (69-337) average, the 10th-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 300 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .232 (336-1454) average, 12th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS: Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth-most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers that year...The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists, which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts, which tied for 10th in the NL...This season, Walker is tied for the major league-lead with two pickoffs and is one of four right-handed pitchers with that amount.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (5-4, 4.01)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings, struck out seven batters and allowed only one free pass with three hits on June 14 vs. Milwaukee... Bassitt also induced a career-high three doubles plays.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Bassitt threw 8.0 scoreless innings in his last start for the third time in his career...It was also the fourth career start in which he went at least 8.0 innings...Bassitt and Carrasco are the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings this season.
