### BAUER, AQUINO JOIN TEAM

The Reds today added to the roster **RHP Trevor Bauer** (#27), acquired from the Indians yesterday, and selected from Louisville the contract of **OF Aristides Aquino** (#44).

### 2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs are **9-10**, lead the National League in **batting average** (.296) and **slugging percentage** (.502) while ranking second in **on-base percentage** (.356)...rank second in the NL and fourth in the majors in **second-half runs scored** (109, 5.74 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 14th in the NL in **second-half ERA** (5.16; Col 15th, 6.78).

### FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (86), **HR** (31), **RBI** (83), **batting average** (.308), **slugging percentage** (.586) and **on-base percentage** (.370)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **86-53**, and are **26-8** when leading after the first inning...**5 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.337** in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with **10 HR** that inning.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 1** (0-0) of a 4-game series vs **Franco Garcia's Braves**...the Reds are coming off a **4-2 homestand** that included a **2-1 series win** vs the **Rockies** and a **2-1 series win** vs the **Pirates**... Cin has won each of its last **3 series** (also: **2-1 at Mil**) and **7** of its last **11 games**...following Sunday's game here at **SunTrust Park**, the Reds will return home to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Redlegs lead the season series, 2-1 (4/23-4/25 at GABP)...haven't lost a season series to the Braves since **2014** (2-5) and since then are **4-0-1 in 5 season series** and **17-13 in 30 games**...the Reds went **2-1** in both of their series in Atlanta at **SunTrust Park**, including a 5-3 win on **8/18/17** in their inaugural game at the new park...from **1997-2016** Cin went **27-42 at Turner Field** and didn't win a series there after **9/4-9/6, 2009 (0-3-4 in 7 series, 8-14 in 22 games)**...in the final 2 exhibition games of 2019 spring training, the Braves earned 8-5 and 7-5 wins at **SunTrust Park**.

**ANGELS UP NEXT:** The upcoming series will be the Redlegs' sixth overall series vs LAA, the second of the season and their first meeting at **Great American Ball Park** since the **2013 season-opening series**...the **Reds are 4-10 all-time** vs the **Angels**, including **1-2 in 2002, 0-3 in 2016 & 0-2 in 2019** in **Anaheim** and **1-2 in 2007 & 2-1 in 2013** at **Great American Ball Park**... in **2013** the **Reds** and **Angels** played the **first interleague Opening Day game** in **Major League history**, a 3-1 Angels win in **13 innings** in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opening game (Cin pitchers 17, LAA pitchers 13).

**DEADLINE DEALS:** The Reds yesterday made the following transactions:

- Acquired from the Cleveland Indians **RHP Trevor Bauer** as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the San Diego Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**...the Padres received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell**.
- Acquired from the Oakland Athletics minor league **OF Jameson Hannah** for **RHP Tanner Roark**.
- Acquired from the San Francisco Giants a player to be named for **2B Scooter Gennett** and cash.
- The Reds also yesterday reinstated from the 10-day injured list **RHP David Hernandez**.

**CATCH A BREAK:** The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart**, **Curt Casali**, **Kyle Farmer**, **Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarney**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster** - **Barnhart** (IL), **Casali** (IL) & **Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days (7/18-7/25)** until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to Fri night's game...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...**Barnhart** on Fri filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list prior to Sun's game...he relaced **Lavarney**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)**...also used **6 catchers** in **1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth)**.

**2-WAY PLAYER:** **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 66 of the Reds' 106 games so far this season, including 44 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), once as a **P/R/F** (yesterday vs Pit), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**.9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...**5 times** in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (382.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

**BLACK & BLUE:** **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23** and was hit by a pitch **4 times** in the 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch 3 times** in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times in his career**...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

**150th CELEBRATION:** During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...on **Sun, 8/11 vs Cubs** will wear replica uniforms from **1969**...the Reds are **3-7** wearing **throwback uniforms**...already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961 and 1967**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary** of the **first professional game**.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Anthony DeSclafani's** last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his **98th career start**...in his career is **33-33, 4.18 in 105 apps**...beginning, **6/6**, in his **last 9 starts** is **4-2, 2.94**...is making his first career appearance at **SunTrust Park**...his **strikeout of Trevor Story** to end the fifth inning of Sat's 3-1 win vs Col was the **500th strikeout** of his career...has allowed **3 leadoff HR** (Pit's **Adam Frazier**, Chi's **Kyle Schwarber**, Cle's **Francisco Lindor**)...in the 7-5 loss on 6/23 at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record **9 strikeouts** through his first **3 innings** (Mil's **Corbin Burnes**, 3/31 vs StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available...retired his first 6 batters via **strikeout**, tying the **franchise record** for strikeouts to begin a game (**Robert Stephenson**, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by **Travis Shaw's** HR leading off the third inning...struck out the side in the third inning but in between strikeouts allowed 6 hits and 5 runs, tying his career high for runs allowed in an inning (9/20/15 at Mil, 5th)...missed the entire 2017 season with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 41 starts since he returned from those injuries is 13-13, 4.49.

- Last started on 7/17 at Wrigley Field, played LF...left that game in the top of the fifth inning after he was hit on his right knee by a Yu Darvish pitch.
- Leads the team with 40 starts at 2B (last, 7/16 at Chi)...also made 9 starts at 1B (last, 7/14 at Col), 7 starts in LF (last, 7/17 at Chi) and 2 starts at DH...has made 1 appearance at 3B (4/28 at StL, 8th inning).
- Despite making just 58 starts still ranks third on the team in both HR (19, career high) and RBI (43)...is 10 RBI shy of his single-season career high (53, 2017)...produced his last HR and RBI on 7/13 at Col (3-run HR off Chad Bettis).
- Has been hit by a pitch 22 times, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Jason LaRue, 24, 2004 & Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013)...while with the Marlins, established franchise records for HBP in a season (24, 2016) and in a career (93, 2013-2018)...in his career has been hit by a pitch 115 times.
- Is 1 of 15 players this season to hit 3 HR in a game (5/28 vs Pit).
- On 5/9 at Oak hit his 10th HR of the season in his 90th plate appearance to become only the fourth batter in Reds history to produce in a season 10 HR in fewer than 100 plate apps (Wally Post in 1956 & 1960, Tony Perez in 1970).
- On 5/28/night vs Pit hit his 17th HR in his 118th at bat of the season...is the fewest number of at bats by any player in Reds history to reach 17 HR.
- On 5/28/night vs Pit (3-4, 3hr, 6rbi) became the 28th Reds batter to hit at least 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 36th time...also has a pair of 2-homer games, on 4/7 at Pit (4rbi) and 5/3 vs SF (6rbi)...his 6 RBI on 5/3 vs SF and 5/28 vs Pit tie Ryan Lavarnway (7/19 vs StL) for the most by a Reds batter in a game this season.
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month for May...with 12 HR in May, tied for the Major League lead with Hou's Alex Bregman & Pit's Josh Bell...last month led the majors in slugging percentage (.841) while ranking second in the National League in OPS (1.241) and T7th in the NL in RBI (22).
- On 2/19/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp.
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (SS José Iglesias).

### 6 PHILLIP ERVIN, of 2nd Half: 17g, 6gs in LF, 16-36 (.444), 2 2b, 3 3b, 1hr, 7rbi

- Has hit safely in 10 of his 17 apps in the second half.
- Has made 16 starts (12gs in LF, 3gs in CF, 1gs in RF), most recently 7/24 at Mil (CF).
- On 6/15 was recalled to replace injured LHP Wandy Peralta...is his fourth stint with the Reds this season.
- Made his first apps for the Reds on 4/13 & 4/14, as the 26th player appeared in both games vs the Cardinals in Monterrey...from 4/23-4/30 made 5 apps and 2 starts...in his third stint, from 5/18-5/23 made 3 apps and 1 start.
- In the 17-9 win on 7/13 at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on 7/6/1949 vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- Is 1 of 4 first-round or supplemental first-round draft picks to play CF for the Reds this season (Michael Lorenzen, Jesse Winker, Nick Senzel).
- In 40 apps for Louisville hit .290 (8 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10g in LF, 25g in CF).
- Was the International League's Batter of the Week for 5/27-6/2 (.423, 2 2b, 5hr, 10rbi, .516obp, 1.593ops).

### 52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c 2nd Half: 6g, 3gs, 4-14 (.286), 1 2b, 2rbi

- This season has made 7 apps and 5 starts at C...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at C (3g in 2017, 1g in 2018)...this spring training caught 36.0 innings.
- On Sun came off the 7-day concussion list, pinch hit and played 2B in the ninth inning...was his first appearance for the Reds since a start at C on 7/16 at Cubs.
- Leads Reds pinch hitters in at bats, hits, total bases, doubles and RBI (9-32, .281, 3 2b, 1hr, 6rbi, 15tb)...hit his only career pinch-hit HR on 5/5 vs SF (solo off Will Smith).
- Has 6 HR and 22 RBI...are the first home runs of his career...entered the season with 11 career RBI in 59 apps.
- Has made 23 starts (10gs at 2B, 5gs at 1B, 5gs at C, 3gs at 3B).
- In his career has played 1B (12g, 6gs), 2B (30g, 10gs), 3B (31g, 17gs) & C (11g, 5gs).

### 4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss 2nd Half: 19g, 16gs, 15-59 (.254), 2 2b, 2hr, 7rbi, 2sb

- Is hitting .325 with RISP (27-83).
- Has hit safely in 12 of his 19 apps in the second half, including three 2-hit games.
- With 93 hits is just 7 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
- With 7 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau).
- After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving to 2B.

- On 2/23/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp.
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF/OF Derek Dietrich).
- Is the Reds' recipient of the 2019 Heart and Hustle Award, given to each team's player who best embodies the passion, values, spirit and traditions of the game.

### 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss 2nd Half: 16g, 6gs, 12-37 (.324), 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 9rbi

- On Tue vs Pit made the first pitching appearance of his career after Amir Garrett, along with 5 other players, was ejected with 2 outs in the top of the ninth inning...threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8.
- In 44 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .292 (31-106, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 17rbi, 1sb).
- Made 37 starts at 2B (last, 7/22 at Mil), second-most on the team (Derek Dietrich, 40gs)...made 14 starts at SS (last, Sat vs Col), also second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 92gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on 7/23 at Mil.
- Because of Scooter Gennett injury, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the starting SS.

### 15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 15g, 12gs, 19-50 (.380), 5 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Hit safely in 10 of his 15 second-half apps.
- In 7 apps beginning 7/22 is hitting .417 (10-24) to lift his season avg from .272 to .285.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

### 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 19g, 20-66 (.303), 9hr, 17rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.758) while ranking among the NL's second-half leaders in HR (9, T1st), BA (.303, 13th), RBI (17, 4th) and extra-base hits (11, T6th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 10 HR while ranking T2nd with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 13th in the National League in hitting .337 (28-83).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 11 of his last 26 apps (13hr, 26rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Joins Tony Pérez as the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...his 12 HR this July were the most by a Reds batter in July since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

### 17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 13g, 8gs, 14-32 (.438), 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi

- In his last 12 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .452 (14-31, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .903slg, .528obp)...from last Wed-Sat homered in 3 straight apps, a streak snapped in Sun's 3-2 win vs Col...was the third Reds player to homer in 3 straight games this season (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez twice).
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 13 apps (14-32, .438, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .875slg, .526obp), including 6 starts in LF, 1 start at 2B and 1 start at 3B.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 14 starts for the Reds (10gs in LF, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at 2B, 1gs at DH).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 19g, 19-79 (.241), 4 2b, 2hr, 11rbi

- For the fifth straight season, was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Has at least 1 RBI in 6 of his last 9 apps (8rbi) and in 8 of his last 13 apps (10rbi).
- In his last 54 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .305, raising his season BA from .208 (64-210, 14 2b, 6hr, 25rbi, .372obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 64 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

### 33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 19g, 19-54 (.352), 3 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 9rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks third in on-base percentage (.462) and fifth in batting average (.352).
- In his last 13 apps is hitting .390 (16-41, 3 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, .610slg, .490obp).
- Hit safely in 11 of his 14 starts and in 12 of his 19 apps in the second half.
- In yesterday's 4-1 win vs Pit, belted his third career leadoff HR (off Dario Agrazal)...was his second leadoff HR of the season (also: 6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander).
- Has 15 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 79 starts, including a team-high 53 starts in LF (15gs in CF, 10gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
