**BIG BATS AT THE BIG A:** The Royals began this 7-game, West Coast trip with a 10-4 win over the Angels last night, improving to a season-high-tying 7 games over .500 (23-16)...**Dairon Blanco** stole the show by filling the box score with 3 hits—including a 2-run HR, a bunt single and a double—a walk, 4 runs and 2 stolen bases...he became the second player in franchise history with 3 hits, 4 runs, a HR and 2 steals in a game, following Royals Hall of Famer **Frank White** on April 27, 1979...the last three players to do this for any team include **Ronald Acuña Jr.** on Aug. 28, 2023, **Manny Machado** on April 14, 2022 and **Trea Turner** on June 30, 2021...**Maikel Garcia** also had 3 hits and **Vinnie Pasquantino** had a 442-ft. HR—the longest of his career—as the Royals pounded out 7 extra-base hits and went 6-for-14 in scoring situations.

**TRANSACTION ACTION:** The Royals announced today that right-handed pitcher **Alec Marsh** has been recalled from his rehab assignment and reinstated from the Injured List to start tonight’s game in Anaheim...Marsh missed the minimum 15 days after suffering a right elbow contusion on April 24 vs. Toronto, when he was struck by a comebacker from **Addison Barger**...in a rehab start on Sunday at Iowa, Marsh allowed 1 hit in 4.0 scoreless innings, with 6 strikeouts.

- Marsh has not allowed a run since the 3rd inning on April 13 at New York on a solo home run by **Pete Alonso**...including the final 2.0 innings of that outing and his last 2 starts, Marsh enters tonight with a career-best 12.0-inning scoreless streak that is tied for the 4th-longest active run in the American League among those who’ve appeared this season, trailing **Cole Irvin** (20.2 IP), **Mason Miller** (15.1 IP) and **Luke Weaver** (12.2 IP).
- Daniel Lynch IV** was optioned to Triple-A Omaha after pitching 2.0 scoreless innings last night in his 1st career relief outing...including his start in place of Marsh last Sunday, he pitched 7.0 scoreless innings with the Royals.

**HBD, SALVY!:** Royals Captain **Salvador Perez** is celebrating his 34th birthday today, and shares this date of birth with former Royals **George Kottaras** (41) and **Craig Brazell** (44)...other May 10 birthdays include *Saturday Night Live*’s **Kenan Thompson**, who turns 46 today, and ESPN sportscaster **Chris “Boomer” Berman**, who is 69...former NFL kicker **Pat Summerall**, who was better known for being a broadcaster, was born on this date in 1930 but passed away in 2013.

- He has homered on his birthday once before, and it was a grand slam in 2018 in Baltimore, where he became the second Royal to hit a grand slam on his birthday, joining Royals Hall of Famer **Mike Sweeney**, who did it in 2004.
- He has a hit in 6 of his previous 8 birthday games, including 2 doubles in a 9-1 win last season vs. the White Sox.

**ROYAL RUNDOWN:** At 23-16 (.590), the Royals are tied for 2nd place in the American League Central, and their 23 wins are bested by only three of the other 14 American League teams, including New York (25-14), Baltimore (24-12) and Cleveland (24-14)...they’re 11 games ahead of their 12-27 record through 39 games last year, when they clinched their second series win...this matches the 5th-best start in the 56-season history of the franchise, 2 games behind 2015 and 1989 (25-14) and 1 game behind 2003 and 1976 (24-15)...tonight marks the Royals 40th game of the season—the unofficial quarter pole—as 24.7% of the season will be complete after tonight...with a win, the Royals would match their 3rd-best 40-game start in franchise history and would trail only 2015 (26-14) and 1989 (25-15).

- The Royals are 7 games over .500 and 6-6 in series play...in 11 of their 12 sets, they’ve clinched the series or have been in position to win it going into the final game...the only series they didn’t have a chance to win going into the finale was the first set of the season vs. Minnesota, when they lost the 1st 2 games before winning the finale.
- With a win tonight, the Royals would improve to 8 games over .500 for the first time since June 1, 2016 (30-22).

**WHAT’S THE DIFFERENCE?:** The Royals have allowed 133 runs through 39 games, 3rd fewest in the Majors to Boston (130) and Atlanta (131)...on offense, they’ve scored 185 runs, 4th most in the American League...that makes for a +52 run differential that is tied with Philadelphia for the 4th best in the Majors, trailing the Dodgers (+74), Yankees (+53) and Orioles (+53)...this is the 3rd-best run differential through 39 games in franchise history, trailing only the 1976 Royals, who outscored opponents by 60 runs during their 24-15 start en route to a 90-win season and the first division title in club history, and the 2015 Royals, who were +58 and 25-14 at this point on their way to 95 wins and a World Series title.

- The Royals 23-16 record puts them on pace for 95 wins, but their pythagorean record—which is based on run differential—is 25-14, which suggests a 103-win pace over 162 games...the Royals haven’t finished a season with a winning record or positive run differential since 2015, when they went 95-67, were +83 and won the World Series.
- The Royals have been tied, led or within 2 runs in the final inning in 35 of 39 games...they’ve played 349 innings and have led or been tied at the end of 248 of them (71.1%) and have trailed for only 101 innings (28.9%)...only the Phillies (75), Orioles (95), Braves (98) and Dodgers (98) have trailed for fewer innings than the Royals this season.
- The Royals have trailed for only 8 of 46 innings in the last 5 games (17.4%), but have blown a 9th-inning lead twice.

**TIMELY HITTING:** The Royals rank 13th in the Majors with a .243 batting average but they rank 8th out of 30 with 185 runs, a discrepancy that can be credited to their aptitude for timely hitting...for example, the Royals rank 29th with a .207 average with the bases empty, but they rank 1st in the Majors with a .299 average with runners on base and they rank 2nd with a .302 average with runners in scoring position...they’ve been especially good since the start of the last trip, batting .379 (39-for-103) with runners in scoring position over the last 13 games...this is a significant improvement from last year, when they hit .246 in scoring situations, which ranked 23rd in the Majors.

- Their 67 runs in the 7th or later are the 4th most in the Majors behind the Twins (79), Braves (71) and O’s (69).

**ROAD WORK:** The Royals are tied with the Phillies and Dodgers for the most home wins (15), but this week they’re on a 7-game trip on the road, where they are 8-8 this season despite outscoring opponents 70-52 (+18), and 5 of their 8 road losses have been by 1 run...their 3.35 ERA (51 ER in 137.0 IP) on the road ranks 8th in the Majors and they’ve held opponents to 2 runs or fewer in 8 of 16 road games...after losing 2 of 3 games on their first road trip at Baltimore from April 1-3, they Royals have split each of their last two trips at the Mets and White Sox from April 12-17 (3-3) and at the Tigers and Blue Jays from April 26-May 1 (3-3)...it’s been almost two years since the Royals last had a winning road trip and it came out here on the West Coast, when they went 5-4 at the Giants, Athletics and Angels from June 13-22, 2022.

**PITCHING PROPS:** Royals starting pitchers rank 4th in the Majors with a 3.14 ERA (76 ER in 218.0 IP), a mark that’s nearly 2 runs lower than last season, when their starters ranked 27th with a 5.12 ERA (447 ER in 785.2 IP)...**Michael Wacha** last night recorded Kansas City’s 19th quality start, 3rd most in the Majors behind the Phillies and Mariners (22 each), and it’s already more than half their total of 32 quality starts from 2023, when they tied with the A’s for the fewest in the Majors...the starters have been especially good of late, allowing 1 run or fewer in 9 of the last 15 games.

- The Royals have allowed 3 runs or fewer in 22 of 39 games (56.4%), 3rd most in the Majors behind the Dodgers (25) and Yankees (24)...they’re 19-3 in those games and their 19 such wins trail only the Dodgers, who are 22-3.

**BOBBY BASEBALL:** **Bobby Witt Jr.** went 0-for-4 last night but walked for the 6th straight game, the longest such streak of his career and the longest active streak in the Majors...he’s reached safely in 13 straight, tied for the 3rd-longest streak of his career and 5 games shy of his career-best 18-game on-base streak from Sept. 16, 2022-March 30, 2023.

- Bobby made a highlight-reel defensive play in the 1st inning last night, when he ran 129 ft. from shortstop to the left field foul line to rob **Nolan Schanuel** of a leadoff hit...Witt Jr. has been among the best defenders in baseball this season, as his 7 Outs Above Average lead all shortstops and are tied for 2nd most among all players.
- Witt Jr., who will turn 24 next month, ranks 2nd in the Majors with a 2.7 fWAR, trailing only **Mookie Betts** (3.0).
- Bobby leads the Majors with 36 runs, 4 more than Betts, **Shohei Ohtani** and **William Contreras** (32 each)...he’s on pace for 149 runs, a total that hasn’t been reached by an AL player since **Ted Williams** had 150 runs in 1949.
- He leads the American League with 21 extra-base hits, which trails only Ohtani (26) for the Major League lead...Bobby is on pace for 87 extra-base hits, 1 more than **Hal McRae**’s single-season club record of 86 set in 1977.
- Witt Jr. has 9 stolen bases in his last 16 games and his 13 for the year are 1 behind **José Caballero** for the AL lead.
- His current pace of 87 extra-base hits and 54 steals has never been matched in a single season in MLB history.

**ALEC MARSH** is making the 14th start (23rd appearance) of his career, and 6th of the season tonight vs. the Los Angeles Angels...he was selected by the Royals in the 2nd round of the 2019 Draft out of Arizona State University, and debuted with Kansas City last season.

- Marsh missed the last 14 games due to a right elbow contusion suffered on a comebacker that occurred during his last start on April 24 vs. the Blue Jays.

**REHAB RECAP:** Alec’s stay on the Injured List was brief as he was sidelined the minimum 15 days, and he needed just 1 rehab appearance with Triple-A Omaha last Sunday, during which he looked perfectly healthy with 4.0 shutout innings with 6 strikeouts, 1 hit and 1 walk.

**STRONG START CUT SHORT:** Marsh last pitched in the big leagues on April 24 at Kauffman Stadium vs. the Blue Jays, and he was excellent, allowing just 2 hits and 2 walks across 4.1 innings pitched in a no-decision...after a 1-2-3 1st, he worked around a leadoff walk in the 2nd inning and stranded men on second and third in the 4th...**Addison Barger** led off the 5th inning with a 91.2-mph liner that struck Marsh on his pitching elbow, but he was able to recover and register a 1-3 putout...out of an abundance of caution, Manager **Matt Quatraro** removed Alec from the game in favor of **Angel Zerpa**, and the combo of Zerpa (1.2 IP), **John Schreiber** (W, 1.0 IP), **Chris Stratton** (1.0 IP) and **James McArthur** (SV, 1.0 IP) combined for 4.2 innings of 2-run ball, guiding KC to a 4-3 victory.

- Despite the early exit, Alec is in the midst of a career-best 12.0-inning scoreless streak that dates back to the last run he yielded in the 3rd inning on April 13 at the Mets.

**STRIKEOUT SURGE:** Alec reached 100 career strikeouts on April 19 vs. the Orioles...he now has 102 strikeouts in 101.0 innings to start his career (9.1 K/9, 22.7 K%), which are 8 shy of the most by a Royal through 22 career appearances, trailing teammate **Brady Singer**, who recorded 110 strikeouts in his 1st 22 outings from 2020-21, but unlike Marsh’s 9 relief appearances and 13 starts, Singer’s 1st 22 outings were all starts.

- Marsh’s 10.3 K/9 last season marked the 2nd highest single-season rate by a rookie in Royals history (min. 70.0 IP), behind only **Scott Barlow’s** 11.8 K/9 during his rookie season in 2019...his 24.9% strikeout rate was the 3rd best by a rookie in club history, trailing Barlow’s 29.7% in 2019 and **Jim York’s** 25.8% in 1971.

**WHIFF MACHINE:** In just 17 outings (8 starts) in 2023, Marsh recorded 180 swings and misses (according to *Baseball Savant*), including 5 outings with at least 15 whiffs...from July 1 through the end of the season, he induced 172 swings and misses, which accounted for 13.8% of his 1,247 total pitches and was tied for the 17th highest rate in the AL in that span (min. 1,000 pitches)...he induced 51 swings and misses in July alone, accounting for 11.3% of his total pitches thrown (450)...his 11.3% rate of pitches whiffed on led the Majors in July (min. 400 total pitches), ahead of Cleveland’s **Gavin Williams** (9.8%).

- Alec induced 10 swings-and-misses in his 1st start of the season vs. Baltimore and a season-high 12 on April 19 vs. them again, but got just 5 in his start vs. the White Sox on April 7, 7 whiffs on April 13 at Citi Field and 4 on April 24 vs. Toronto.

**AYE AYE, CAPTAIN!:** Marsh has been tasked tonight with reversing an ugly trend, as since Royals captain **Salvador Perez**—who is celebrating his 34th birthday this evening—made his debut in 2011, he has been the starting catcher for seven of his birthdays, but the Royals have gone 2-5 in those games and starting pitchers have posted an unsightly 7.64 ERA (30 ER in 35.1 IP)...last year, however, **Brad Keller** weaved 5.0 frames of 1-run ball as Kansas City triumphed, 9-1, over the Chicago White Sox at The K.

**HOLLYWEIRD:** Marsh takes the hill vs. the Angels tonight, his 1st career appearance against them...it marks just his 2nd outing in the state of California, after he pitched 5.2 innings of 3-run ball last Aug. 21 at the Oakland Coliseum in an eventual 6-4 loss as the bulk pitcher.

**FORKS UP:** Alec is an Arizona State University alumnus, as he was a Sun Devil from 2017-19, and while he was there, went 12-7 with a 4.13 ERA (89 ER in 194.0 IP)...*Baseball Reference* lists 143 ASU alumni in their system, as Marsh is joined by an illustrious group that includes Major League home run king **Barry Bonds** (1983-85), Hall of Famer **Reggie Jackson** (1964-66), All-Stars **Sal Bando** (1964-65), **Ian Kinsler** (2002) and 2008 American League MVP **Dustin Pedroia** (2002-04), as well as **Rick Monday** (1965), who not only was the first player ever selected in the Major League Draft in 1965, but also was on the mic for the Dodgers radio broadcast for Marsh’s Major League debut on June 30, 2023 at Kauffman Stadium.

**ROAD TRIPPIN’:** In his debut season, Marsh pitched in 10 games (5 starts) away from Kauffman Stadium, and he went 2-5 with a 5.17 ERA (27 ER in 47.0 IP), 53 strikeouts (25.2 K%, 10.2 K/9) and 22 walks (10.5 BB%, 4.1 BB/9)...as a starter, he was 0-4 with a 6.75 ERA (17 ER in 22.2 IP) and an opponents’ slashline of .276/.400/.563 (24-for-87, .963 OPS), whereas in relief, he was 2-1 with a 3.70 ERA (10 ER in 24.1 IP) and a .222/.311/.433 (20-for-90, .744 OPS) slashline.

- Alec was excellent in his 2024 season/road debut in Baltimore on April 2, spinning 7.0 innings of 1-run ball on 2 hits, 1 walk and 5 strikeouts en route to his 1st win of the year...he earned his 2nd win in his next road start on April 13 at Citi Field, when he held the Mets to 4 runs over 5.0 IP in an 11-7 triumph.

TOMORROW NIGHT’S STARTER: LHP COLE RAGANS (2-2, 3.38)

- Cole is scheduled to make his 9th start of the season and 30th of his career in the 3rd game of the series vs. the Angels at Angel Stadium tomorrow night.
- He recorded his 5th quality start of the season in his most recent start on Monday vs. the Brewers but did not factor in the decision after tossing 6.0 innings of 2-run ball on 2 hits with 8 strikeouts...Cole has tallied 143 strikeouts in his 1st 20 starts with KC, which are the most strikeouts through 20 starts as a Royal.
- Ragans made his 1st Opening Day start with Kansas City this season after he was acquired via trade from the Texas Rangers on June 30, 2023 for left-handed pitcher **Aroldis Chapman**...since his Royals debut on July 15, 2023, Cole has a 2.91 ERA (37 ER in 114.1 IP) and is 7-4 in 20 games started.
- In 4 career games (2 starts) vs. the Angels, Ragans is 0-1 with a 3.95 ERA (6 ER in 13.2 IP) but has allowed 2 earned runs or fewer in both of his starts vs. LAA.
- Cole is 4-4 with a 3.09 ERA (29 ER in 84.1 IP) in 21 career road games (13 starts) and is 1-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER in 19.0 IP) in 3 road starts this season.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- Quatraro was named the 18th full-time Manager in Royals history on Oct. 30, 2022 and this year marks his 29th in pro baseball, 11th on a Major League staff and second in his current role...the 2023 Royals improved their win percentage by .137 points from the 1st half to the 2nd, the highest jump in the Majors.
- Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash’s** staff in Tampa Bay, including one season as the Third Base Coach in 2018 and four years as the Bench Coach from 2019-22...the Rays reached the postseason in four of those five seasons, including a World Series appearance in 2020...during his four years as Bench Coach with Tampa Bay from 2019-22, the Rays 322-224 (.590) record ranked 4th in the Majors behind only the Dodgers, Astros and Yankees.
- He was the Assistant Hitting Coach on **Terry Francona’s** staff in Cleveland from 2014-17, including a World Series appearance in 2016...during his four-year tenure, the Guardians offense ranked 1st in the Majors in doubles, 4th in walks and 5th in OPS...his tenure in Cleveland overlapped with Royals Chairman and CEO **John Sherman**, who at the time was Vice Chairman of the Guardians...Q worked with four Silver Slugger Award winners during his four seasons as Cleveland’s Asst. Hitting Coach, including **Michael Brantley** (2014), **Yan Gomes** (2014), **Francisco Lindor** (2017) and **José Ramírez** (2017).
- During his 1st 10 seasons on a Major League coaching staff from 2014-23, Quatraro’s teams have reached the postseason six times...in the last eight years, he’s been a part of five teams that have won at least 90 games, including Cleveland’s 102-win team in the 2017 season and the 100-win Rays in 2021.
- Quatraro was selected by the Rays in the 8th round of the 1996 Draft and played seven seasons in the Rays organization from 1996-02, topping out at Triple-A Durham in his final year...he primarily played catcher, but also saw time at first base, third base and the corner outfield positions.
