METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets defeated the A's, 13-4, in Oakland to win the series...The Mets have won eight of their last 10 games...The Mets are 78-14 when scoring first this season...New York is 35-10-3 in 48 series this year...The Mets are coming off a seven-day, six-game road trip (4-2) to Milwaukee (2-1) and Oakland (2-1)...Tonight, New York returns to Citi Field for a two-game series against the Marlins...Following this series, the Mets will head to Atlanta for a three-game weekend series against the Braves.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Luis Guillorme celebrates his 28th birthday today...Guillorme has appeared in 96 games this year and is batting .278 (78-281) with a career-high 11 doubles, a triple, two home runs, 15 RBI with a .356 OBP.

CH-CH-CHANGES: Major League Baseball has made the following scoring change to the game on September 23 at Oakland...In the top of the fifth inning, with a runner on first base and two outs, Mark Vientos reached second base on what was originally scored an double...He was credited with an RBI after Jeff McNeil scored from first base...That has been since been changed to a double and a fielding error on centerfielder Seth Brown allowing McNeil to score...The RBI has been removed.

PETE OF THE WEEK: Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named the National League Co-Player of the Week by Major League Baseball with Albert Pujols...The two-time All-Star posted a .333/.407/.917 slash line to go along with nine runs, eight hits, two doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI across six games last week...On Sunday, he went 4-5 with a pair of doubles, one home run and five RBI, marking his second consecutive game with a home run and multiple RBI...This is the second time in his career that Alonso was awarded the weekly honor, previously accomplishing the feat in June 2019...He is the Mets' second winner this campaign (also Francisco Lindor).

ROBERTO CLEMENTE NOMINEE: Prior to tonight's game, James McCann will be honored as the New York's Roberto Clemente Award nominee in an on-field ceremony starting at 6:50 p.m...The Roberto Clemente Award presented by Capital One, is baseball's most prestigious individual honor for major leaguers...McCann, a first-time Roberto Clemente Award nominee, has been a prominent figure in the New York City community during his two seasons with the Mets...McCann is passionate about helping families with children receiving care in the Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU), sharing stories of his personal experiences as a parent of twin boys who spent their first seven weeks in the NICU...McCann and his wife, Jessica, often visit local hospitals, spending time with families whose children are receiving care in NICUs and donating gift cards to families to help ease some financial burden.

NO MINOR THING: Congrats to Syracuse's RHP José Butto, who was named the International League's Minor League Pitcher of the Week for September 19-25...Butto made one start last week, appearing against the Worcester Red Sox on September 21...He tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits, walking one and striking out 11...In seven starts at Triple-A this year, Butto is 1-1 with a 2.34 ERA (nine earned runs/34.2 innings) with nine walks and 28 strikeouts...He has appeared in 20 games (18 starts) between Double-A and Triple-A and is 6-5 with a 4.00 ERA (41 earned runs/92.1 innings) with 35 walks and 108 strikeouts...Butto made his major league debut this year in a start at Philadelphia on August 21.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter owns a 1,648-1,574 (.511) career record as a manager...His 1,648 wins place him 20th all-time in major league history...Mike Scioscia ranks 19th with 1,650 career wins...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)...With three more victories, Showalter would be the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 46-22 against the East this year...They have lost only two series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18 and Washington, September 2-4) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.35 ERA against the East, while hitting .262/.337/.424...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 343-244.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 40 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is their most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for that year...The last time the Mets were 41 games over .500 was when they were 54-games (108-54) above .500 on October 6, 1986, the final day of the season...The team's 97 wins are tied for the fifth-most in franchise history.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 97 games...That is the third-most in the major leagues...The last time they won 97 games was in 2006...The last time the team recorded more than 97 wins was in 1988 when they won 100...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets are 97-57 through 154 games...That is the second-best mark in Mets history...Only the 1986 team (101-53) posted a better record.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 110 strikeouts...That is 18 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.72 ERA (three earned runs/37.1 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 72 strikeouts in 36 appearances since the start of June.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso has hit 39 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the first player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs...Only two players this season have recorded 40 or more home runs - Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber...Alonso has 21 career homers vs. the Marlins, tied for fourth-most among active players and tied for 19th all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more.

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: On Sunday, Pete Alonso collected five RBI on the day to give him 128 RBI for the season...That is a new franchise single-season RBI record...He ranks second in the majors and tops the National League with 128 RBI this season...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He has 27 game-winning RBI this season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

PETE & PETE: Pete Alonso has recorded 16 home runs with runners in scoring position...His 16 home runs lead the major leagues and sets a new franchise record, previously held by Todd Hundley (15) in 1996...Alonso has surpassed his home run total from 2021 with 39 home runs...The only Mets to have 37 or more home runs in consecutive seasons are Alonso, Darryl Strawberry (1987-88) and Mike Piazza (1999-2000)...Alonso and Strawberry are the only two Mets to reach 37 home runs in year three times.

CONNECT FOUR: Pete Alonso has nine games with at least four RBI this season, the most in Mets history and most by any player since José Bautista had 10 such games in 2010...Had just three games with four or more RBI from 2019-2021...Alonso ranks tied for second in the majors with 32 multi-RBI games this season.

LET'S GO FISHING: Francisco Lindor has seven home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.117 OPS in 17 games against Miami this year...Robin Ventura (21 in 1999) is the only Met ever with more RBI in a season against the Marlins...Pete Alonso and Michael Conforto (eight each) are the only Mets with more home runs in a year vs. Miami...Lindor has nine homers and 29 RBI in his last 25 games against the Fish.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Francisco Lindor is on an 11-game hitting streak, batting .354 (17-48) with eight runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, a walk, a steal with a .923 OPS over that span...His career-high is 15 games, accomplished from April 29-May 14, 2018...He has reached base safely in 17 straight games...He is batting .361 (26-72) with 14 runs, five doubles, a triple, four home runs, 17 RBI, four walks with a .397 OBP and a .625 SLG in the streak that started on September 7...He has hit 25 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 home runs in 2018 for the most by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .315/.380/.492 with 41 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 37 RBI, 23 walks with an .871 OPS in 61 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 6.8 fWAR this season.

CANHA GET AN ICEPACK?: Mark Canha leads the majors with a Mets-record 26 HBP...He has been hit by five pitches in his last five games, has seven HBP in his last nine games, nine HBP in his last 17 games and 12 HBP in his last 28 games...He is the 11th player in the modern era to be plunked at least 12 times in a 28-game span and the 10th player to endure nine or more HBP in a 17-game stretch...Seven HBP in a nine-game span ties an MLB record, shared with five others: Derek Dietrich, Brandon Guyer, Jon Jay, Damion Easley and Minnie Miñoso.

HIT THE ESC. KEY: Eduardo Escobar is batting .329 (28-85) with 15 runs, three doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 19 RBI, eight walks with a .383 OBP and a .635 SLG...He ranks among NL leaders in September in average (fourth), SLG (second), OBP (sixth), OPS (1.018, second), hits (t-fifth) and home runs (seven, t-third).

BACH IN A NEW YORK GROOVE: Daniel Vogelbach has reached base in 14 of his last 22 plate appearances...Since his Mets debut on July 24, is tied for fifth in the NL with 31 walks and ranks fourth with a .399 OBP.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .639 winning percentage (39-22) following the All-Star break...That is the third-best winning percentage in franchise in franchise history, right below the 1969 team (.671) and the 1988 squad (.644)...The team's 39 wins are the fifth-most in the majors since the break...The Mets are batting .269/.346/.432 with 67 home runs in 61 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets lead the majors in average and OBP and are fifth in SLG following the break.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Did not factor in the decision on September 20 at Milwaukee... Allowed three runs on five hits and two walks with four strikeouts through 4.0 innings of work...Punched out Keston Hiura in the second inning for his 1,500th career strikeout.

DOUBLE-DIGITS: Recorded 11 strikeouts on September 15 vs. Pittsburgh, the 28th such outing of his career and second of the season (10 Ks on June 6 at San Diego)...It was his most punchouts in a game since also striking out 11 on September 20, 2020 at Detroit while with Cleveland.

GOTTA EARN 'EM: Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 12 straight starts since July 3, the longest such streak of his career...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in 14 straight appearances (five starts) from September 6, 2019-August 18, 2020 and in 32 straight games (six starts) from April 30-September 7, 2014... Has given up just two earned runs or fewer in 17 starts this season, tied with Max Scherzer for the second-most such starts on the club, behind 18 from Chris Bassitt.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Has earned 15 wins in a season for the third time in his career...Is tied for the seventh-most wins in the majors...He is the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joins Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017.

VS. MIAMI: Will be facing the Marlins for the fifth time this season...Tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball with four hits and six strikeouts on September 10 at Miami...Is 5-0 with a 2.09 ERA (12 earned runs/51.2 innings), nine walks and 54 strikeouts in nine career starts against the division rivals, his best mark against any National League East foe...His 3.16 career ERA against the NL East is his lowest mark against any division in the majors (min. 15 games)...This season, his eight wins against the NL East are tied for the most in the majors with Sandy Alcantara.

QUALITY CONTROL: Has 11 quality starts this season after notching just two such starts last year...Has double-digit quality starts in a single season for the first time since doing so in four straight seasons from 2015-2018...Registered three straight quality starts from July 30-August 9 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Has made seven starts with more than 6.0 innings this year, tied for the third-most on the club.

CLUTCH COOKIE: Did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings are tied for seventh-most in the National League.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,500th batter of his career on September 20 at Milwaukee, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego... Is the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat when he did so in his 274th career game on July 30 at Miami.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER [12-5, 3.53]

LAST TIME OUT: Faced the Brewers for the first time in his career, taking the loss on September 21 at Milwaukee...Allowed four runs on six hits (one home run) and a season-high-tying three walks with three strikeouts through 6.0 innings.

GOT 'EM: Walker's five pickoffs this season are a career-high and the second-most in the majors behind six from Robbie Ray (SEA)...Previously had four pickoffs during the 2021 and 2015 seasons...Since 2021, his nine pickoffs are tied for the second-most in MLB behind Max Fried's (ATL) 10.

- Named the Co-NL Player of the Week after he became the first Met ever to reach the 125-RBI threshold with a season-high-tying five RBI performance (fourth time) on September 25 at Oakland...In that game, hit a two-run shot to break the Mets RBI record, then added another three RBI with a bases-clearing double.
- Has nine games with at least four RBI this season, the most in Mets history and most by any player since José Bautista had 10 such games in 2010...Had just three games with four or more RBI from 2019-2021...Alonso ranks tied for second in the majors with 32 multi-RBI games this season.
- Has 22 RBI in his last 16 games...Had an RBI in eight straight games, the longest streak of his career, from September 13-20.
- Has tied his career-high (also, 2019) and ranks 11th in the NL with 155 hits this season...His 41 multi-hit games are one shy of tying his career high set in 2019.
