IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marked just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Logan Henderson (right elbow), RHP Shelby Miller (right elbow), **DF Garrett Mitchell** (left oblique), **LHP Jordan Montgomery** (left elbow) and **LHP Connor Thomas** (left elbow) are on the 60-day injured list.

IN THE STANDINGS [195 days]: The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: <u>FIRST</u>: 81, <u>SECOND</u>: 57, <u>THIRD</u>: 43, <u>FOURTH</u>: 11, <u>FIFTH</u>: 3.....the team finished in first place, ahead of the second-place Cubs by 5.0 games, third-place Reds by 14.0 games, fourth-place Cardinals by 19.0 games and fifth-place Pirates by 26.0 games.....the Brewers spent the last 63 days of the season [7/28-9/28] in sole possession of first place, clinching a postseason berth on September 13 and the NL Central on September 21.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and in three straight seasons.....the team has won the NL Central four times in the last five seasons and three years in a row....Milwaukee was just two games away from qualifying for the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers have produced 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25), including a franchise-record 97 this season....this does not include 2020....the Brewers (8), Astros (8) and Dodgers (13) are the only teams with 86+ wins in at least each of the last eight full seasons.....the Brewers have 763 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

TEAM STREAK: The Brewers had a pair of double-digit winning streaks this season.. the team won 11 consecutive games from 7/6-7/21 and a franchise-record 14 in a row from 8/1-8/16.....the Brewers were the first team in the Major Leagues since the 2015 Blue Jays (11 games twice) to have multiple winning streaks of 11+ games in a season and the first National League team to do it since the 1935 Cubs (11 and 21 games).

AT HOME: The Brewers went 52-29 at home this season, tying the Dodgers and Padres for the third-best record in the Major Leagues.....the team was 17-8-1 in series play..... Milwaukee won 50+ home games for the eighth time and first time since going 51-30 in 2018....the team had a season-high 7-game home winning streak from 8/8-8/22.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 45-36 on the road this season, posting the best record in the Major Leagues....the team was 13-11-2 in series play.....Milwaukee had a franchise-record-tying 9-game road winning streak from 7/23-8/16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy completed in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

ALSO IN THE BULLPEN: #32 - RHP JACOB MISIOROWSKI (15g, 14gs, 5-3, 4.36) - 2025 ALL-STAR 2025 Arsenal: 4-Seam Fastball (55.2%) - Slider (24.3%) - Curveball (14.6%) - Changeup (5.9%)

MISIOROWSKI AT A GLANCE: Jacob Misiorowski, 23, went 5-3 with a 4.36 ERA in 15 games/14 starts this season.....the team went 9-5 in his starts.....he had 3 quality starts..... opponents batted .213 [51-for-239, 8hr].....his 202 pitches of 100+ MPH ranked fifth in the Major Leagues....he was on the 15-day injured list from 8/3-8/14 with a left tibia contusion, retroactive to 7/31.....Misiorowski was selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft from Crowder [MO] College, where he pitched one season (2022) and became the highest drafted player in school history.....name is pronounced "miz-uh-RAO-skee."

POSTSEASON: Misiorowski appeared in 2 games in the NLDS vs. Chicago, going 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (7ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 7k, 1hr).....both outings came out of the bullpen.

AWESOME!: Misiorowski became the first pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have more wins (2) than hits allowed (1) after his first two career starts and as many wins (3) as hits allowed (3) after three starts....he joined Logan Henderson (also 2025) as the only pitchers in franchise history to win each of their first three career Major League games.....he became the ninth pitcher - sixth starter - in the Modern Era to throw at least 5.0 hitless innings in a Major League debut as he earned a 6-0 win on 6/12 vs. St. Louis (5ip, 0h, 4bb, 5k, 81 pitches).....Misiorowski followed that performance with a 17-6 win on 6/20 at Minnesota as he took a perfect game into the seventh inning (6ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 6k, 1hr, 86 pitches).....he produced the longest hitless innings streak (11.0 IP) in the Modern Era by a starting pitcher to begin a career.....the hat he wore in his second career outing went to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY.....he picked up a 3-0 win against Paul Skenes on 6/25 vs. Pittsburgh (5ip, 2h, 2bb, 8k, 74 pitches).....he was named NL Rookie of the Month for June, joining Ben Sheets (June 2001) as the only Brewers pitchers ever to take home the honors.....he notched the first double-digit strikeout game of his career in a 3-1 win over Clayton Kershaw on 7/8 vs. Los Angeles-NL (6ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 12k, 1hr, 91 pitches).....Misiorowski had just five Major League games under his belt when he was named an All-Star, the fewest in Major League history.....he tossed a scoreless eighth inning in the All-Star Game in Atlanta (1ip, 1h).

AT NASHVILLE: Misiorowski, who entered the season as the third-best prospect in the organization according to *Baseball America*, joined the team from Triple-A Nashville, where he was 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA in 13 games/12 starts.....he was International League Pitcher of the Week twice and Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for May..... the team went 6-6 in his starts.....he made 4 quality starts.....opponents batted .175 (38-for-217, 4hr).....he produced 80 strikeouts in just 63.1 innings pitched (11.37 K/9IP).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Misiorowski has gone 11-9 with a 3.04 ERA and 1 save in 68 games/55 starts in the Brewers farm system (2022-25).....opponents have batted .170 and he has produced 320 strikeouts in just 233.2 innings pitched (12.33 K/9IP).....he pitched in the 2023 All-Star Futures Game at T-Mobile Park in Seattle.

AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Went 3-0 with a 3.44 ERA in 8 games/7 starts (36.2ip, 14er).....DN THE ROAD: Went 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in 7 starts (29.1ip, 18er).

vs. DODGERS: Misiorowski earned a 3-1 win over Clayton Kershaw and the Dodgers on 7/8 at American Family Field (6ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 12k, 1hr, 91 pitches).....his only run allowed came on a leadoff homer by Shohei Ohtani.

ALSO IN THE BULLPEN: #62 - LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (24gs, 11-7, 3.96) 2025 Arsenal: Sinker (44.0%) - Changeup (22.1%) - Curveball (14.5%) - 4-Seam Fastball (11.7%) - Slurve (7.7%)

QUINTANA AT A GLANCE: José Quintana, 36, went 11-7 with a 3.96 ERA in 24 starts during his first season with Milwaukee.....the team went 15-9 in his starts.....he had 8 quality starts.....opponents batted .241 (120-for-497, 18hr).....he was on the 15-day injured list from 5/14-5/31 with a left shoulder impingement, retroactive to 5/11, and returned to the 15-day injured list from 9/17-9/30 with a left calf strain, retroactive to 9/15.....Quintana signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on March 5.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.....name is pronounced "keen-TAH-nuh."

POSTSEASON: Quintana is 0-2 with a 3.25 ERA in 9 games/7 starts (36ip, 26h, 15r, 13er, 14bb, 30k, 2hr)....he has pitched in the postseason with Chicago-AL (2017), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2024) and Milwaukee (2025)....he pitched in relief in Game 3 of the NLDS at Chicago, tossing 3.0 scoreless innings (2h, 1bb, 2k, 49 pitches).

MR. COLOMBIA: Quintana, born in Arjona, Colombia, is his country's all-time leader in nearly every statistical category in the Major Leagues, including games (383), starts (357), wins (113), innings pitched (2101.1) and strikeouts (1,816).....he pitched for Colombia in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: Quintana has made 357 starts since 2012 - his first season - trailing only Max Scherzer (373).....this includes nine seasons of 30+ starts.

CAREER: Is 113-110 with a 3.76 ERA in 383 games/357 starts (2101.1ip, 877er).....is in his 14th Major League season while pitching for Chicago-AL (2012-17), Chicago-NL (2017-20), Los Angeles-AL (2021), San Francisco (2021), Pittsburgh (2022), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2025).....was an All-Star in 2016 as he finished 10th in American League Cy Young Award voting.....Quintana was originally signed by the Mets as a non-drafted free agent on 4/26/06.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 9-9 with a 4.47 ERA in 24 starts (129ip, 64er).....went 4-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 12 starts this season (62ip, 35er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: IS 57-57 with a 3.74 ERA in 193 games/181 starts (1058.0 ip, 440 er).....went 7-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 12 starts this season (69.2 ip, 23 er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Is 4-2 with a 2.32 ERA in 15 games/12 starts against Los Angeles (73.2ip, 59h, 24h, 19er, 27bb, 61k, 6hr), including 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA in 2 starts this season (12ip, 6h, 5r, 5er, 4bb, 9k, 2hr).
