- Fans can secure their DBACKS.TV direct-to-consumer streaming subscription with no blackouts for \$99.99 annually for the 2025 season by visiting dbacks.com/tv.

D-BACKS AND 12NEWS TO BROADCAST 10 GAMES OVER-THE-AIR: The D-backs and 12News, which reaches approximately 1.59 million television households, will simulcast 10 games over-the-air this season, kicking off April 25.

- Marks the first time the D-backs will be televised on a local network affiliate.
- 12News will extend coverage to surrounding regions, including all of Arizona, New Mexico, Utah and parts of Nevada.

TODAY'S GAME ON TBS NATIONALLY: Arizona residents can get today's game via DBACKS.TV and other viewing platforms (TBS will be blacked out) while the rest of the nation will see today's matchup @ Yankees on TBS and streamed on Max, opening their 12-week slate of coverage.

D-BACKS ALUM CHRIS OWINGS DONATES TO LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL: Yesterday, former D-backs utility player **Chris Owings** met with the South Mountain High School baseball program to donate bats, batting gloves, cleats and other equipment used during his 11-year Major League career and also presented a \$1,000 grant as part of the Play Ball Fund, presented by Arizona Complete Health.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 10-6 vs. Cubs on Sunday @ Chase Field after overcoming a 4-run, eighth-inning deficit with 8 unanswered runs.

- Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (2-for-5, HR, 2 RBI) evened the game in the bottom of the eighth inning with a 2-run home run before **Josh Naylor** (2-for-2, 2B, RBI, 3 BB) doubled to plate the go-ahead run.
- Reliever **Ryne Nelson** (PH, 1-1, H, RBI) became the second D-back pitcher all-time to record a pinch-hit RBI in a game (also: Micah Owings on April 30, 2008 vs. Astros) and first D-backs pitcher to record a hit and RBI in a game since **Zac Gallen** on Oct. 2, 2021.

BURNES TO MAKE D-BACKS DEBUT: Tonight, **Corbin Burnes** makes his D-backs debut, marking his 200th career game (139th career start) in Arizona's first road game of the season.

- In 2024, the AL's All-Star starting pitcher was named All-MLB First Team after going 15-9 with a 2.92 ERA (63 ER in 194.1 IP), opponent .226 AVG, 48 walks and 181 strikeouts in 32 starts with the Orioles.

SUÁREZ NABS FIRST CAREER NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Yesterday, **Eugenio Suárez** was named NL Player of the Week for the first time in his career after hitting .286 (4-for-14)/.412 OBP/1.143 SLG/1.555 OPS with 4 homers, 7 RBI, 2 walks, 5 runs scored, 1 stolen base over 4 games.

- It marked the second consecutive season (and second occurrence all-time) a D-back was selected in the opening week of the season (also: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., March 28-31, 2024).
- He joined Eddie Mathews (4 HR, '58 Milwaukee Braves) as the only third basemen in MLB history to reach 4+ homers in the team's first 3 games.

SUÁREZ JOINS ELITE LIST IN BASEBALL HISTORY: In the expansion era (since 1961), **Eugenio Suárez** became the fourth player in MLB history whose first 4+ hits within the player's first 4 games of the season were all home runs, joining Willie Mays (1964/SF), Robinson Cano (2016/SEA) and Trevor Story (2016/COL).

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK FACING OFF: **Eugenio Suárez** along with the first 2025 AL Player of the Week winner, Aaron Judge, became the 12th and 13th players respectively in Major League history with 4+ home runs in their club's first 3 games of a season [joining Adrián González (5 HR in 2015/LAD); Robinson Canó (4 HR in 2016/SEA); Trevor Story (4 HR in 2016/COL); Vernon Wells (4 HR in 2010/TOR); Chris Shelton (4 HR in 2006/DET); Barry Bonds (4 HR in 2002/SF); Frank Howard (4 HR in 1969/WSA); Hall of Famer Eddie Mathews (4 HR in 1958/MLN); Carl Furillo (4 HR in 1955/BRO); Hall of Famer Bobby Doerr (4 HR in 1941/BOS); and Dolph Camilli (4 HR in 1935/PHI)].

SCORING RUNS: Among teams with 4 or fewer games played this season, the Yankees (36 in 3 G) and D-backs (27 in 4 G) rank first and second respectively.

- Last season, Arizona led the Majors with a franchise second-best 886 runs (behind 1999/908 runs), ahead of the Dodgers (842) and Yankees (815).

FACING THE YANKEES: Since 2019, the D-backs have gone 5-5 vs. Yankees (2-3 on the road).

- Randal Grichuk's** 18 homers vs. Yankees since 2015 rank fourth most among active players, behind Rafael Devers/BOS (28), Manny Machado/SD (20) and Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR (20).
- Gabriel Moreno**, in 7 career games vs. Yankees, is batting .364 (8-for-22)/.962 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 5 RBI and 3 walks.
- Corbin Carroll**, in 5 career games vs. Yankees, is batting .304 (7-for-23) with 2 doubles, 2 RBI and 1 stolen base.
- Ketel Marte**, in his last 5 games vs. Yankees, is batting .313 (5-for-16)/.975 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 homer, 3 RBI and 2 walks.

OFFENSE MOMENTUM CARRIED OVER: Since July 1, 2024, the D-backs lead the Majors in AVG (.279), OBP (.356), SLG (.487), OPS (.843), runs (519), runs per game (6.33), extra-base hits (299), home runs (136) and hits (791).

NEXT STARTER: ZAC GALLEN (0-1, 9.00)

- Became the fifth D-back to start 3 consecutive season-openers and first right-hander to start consecutive Opening Days since Zack Greinke in 2016-17.
- In his seventh season with Arizona, tied for most tenured pitcher on the team with Merrill Kelly.
- In 2024, posted his third straight season of 12+ wins... went 14-6 with a 3.65 ERA over 28 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: First season with the D-backs...agreed to terms on a 6-year contract through 2030 on Dec. 30, 2024.

- **Today marks his 200th career game** (139th career start).
- Entering 2025, among pitchers through their first 138 career starts since 1998, ranks in ERA (6th, 3.03) and strikeouts (9th, 952).
- 2021 NL Cy Young winner...has finished Top 10 in Cy Young voting each season since 2020 (6th in NL 2020; 1st in NL 2021; 7th in NL 2022; 8th in NL 2023; 5th in AL 2024).
- 4-time All-Star (2021-24) and 2024 AL All-Star Starting Pitcher.
- 2-time All-MLB First Team (2021, '24).
- 2022 NL Strikeout Leader and NL Gold Glove Finalist.
- 2-time Pitcher of the Month (July '23, Sept. '24).

2024 RECAP: Named to All-MLB First Team after going 15-9 with a 2.92 ERA (63 ER in 194.1 IP), opponent .226 AVG, 48 walks and 181 strikeouts in 32 starts with the Orioles.

- Tallied career bests in wins (15) and quality starts (22).
- 2024 AL All-Star Starting Pitcher (first start and fourth consecutive)
- Marked his third consecutive 30+-start season.

- Has allowed 1 or no runs in 6 of his 7 career starts vs. AL East opponents on the road (3-1, 1.15 ERA; 6 ER in 47.0 IP).

- Is 1 of 6 starting pitchers since 2021 to post 3+ 200-strikeout seasons, along with Dylan Cease/SD (4x), Zack Wheeler/PHI (3x), Gerrit Cole/NYY (3x), Kevin Gausman/TOR (3x) and Aaron Nola/PHI (3x).
- Is 1 of 3 starting pitchers since 2020 with 4 seasons of a sub-3.00 ERA, along with Zack Wheeler/PHI and Jacob DeGrom/TEX.

AMONG 2024 LEAGUE LEADERS: Ranked among 2024 MLB leaders in quality starts (T-2nd, 22), innings (6th, 194.1) and ERA (7th, 2.92).

- His 97.0 average fastball/sinker velocity ranked fastest among MLB starting pitching leaders, ahead of Dylan Cease/SD (96.9), Tarik Skubal/DET (96.8) and Logan Gilbert/SEA (96.5).
- His 31.7 pct. hard-hit rate (95.0+ MPH Exit Velo) ranked fourth lowest in MLB, behind Hunter Brown/HOU (30.3), Michael King/SD (30.5) and Chris Sale/ATL (31.4).
- His 32.9 pct. chase rate was the sixth-best MLB mark, behind Christopher Sánchez/PHI (36.2), Shota Imanaga/CHC (34.7), Chris Sale/ATL (33.3), Zack Wheeler/PHI (33.2) and Bailey Ober/MIN (33.0).
- His 27 Pitching Run Value (the run impact of an event based on the runners on base, outs, ball and strike count) ranked ninth in the Majors.

1,000 STRIKEOUT CLUB: Tallied the fourth-fewest innings (850.2) to reach the 1,000 strikeout mark by a starting pitcher (min. 50 pct. games started), behind Robbie Ray (810.0), Yu Darvish (812.0) and Blake Snell (820.2) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

THE SIGNATURE CUTTER: In 2024, his 20 Pitching Run Value on his cutter tied for the fourth-best pitch (second-best cutter) in MLB with Hunter Greene/CIN (20 on 4-seamer), behind Cade Smith/CLE (28 on 4-seamer), Chris Sale/ATL (24 on slider) and Emmanuel Clase/CLE (23 on cutter).

- Developed his cutter in 2020 with the support of Brewers' pitching coach Chris Hook, but mastered the pitch during the pandemic lockdown.

"COVID was kind of a blessing in disguise for him a little bit. It allowed him to kind of master a pitch that I don't think he would have been able to get there without that two months or whatever it was. He was able to master it and have a really good feel. We unlocked a little bit (in spring) and then he went home and unlocked it totally."

WORKHORSE: His 590.0 innings logged from 2022-24 are the third most by a starting pitcher, behind Logan Webb/SF (613.0) and Aaron Nola/PHI (598.0).

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Has made 9 Postseason appearances (3 starts) with the Brewers (2018, '21, '23) and Orioles (2024), going 1-2 with a 2.33 ERA (7 ER in 27.0 IP), 0.85 WHIP, opponent .178 AVG, 7 walks and 25 strikeouts.

HOW HE STARTED: Brewers' fourth-round pick in the 2016 draft.

- Played 8 seasons with the Brewers organization (2016-23).
