STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (3-0), and Athletics (1-0, two to play) tonight at Sutter Health Park...are a season-high 26 games above .500, the sixth season in 29 campaigns they have reached that mark (also: 2023, 2021, 2019, 2010, 2008)...reached 26 games over on Aug. 10, third earliest in club history behind 2023 (June 7) and 2010 (July 30)...have won seven straight contests and are a majors'-best 16-4 in their last 20 games (July 20–pres.) on the heels of a five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...have spent 86 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 45 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...the 86 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (133), Braves (131), Brewers (101), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 84 of those days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106, per Stats Perform)...hold a season-high 6.0-game lead in the AL East, their largest in August or later since winning the division by 8.0 games in 2021...marks the fifth season they have led the division by 6.0 games or more, joining 2023 (largest lead: 6.5), 2021 (largest lead: 9.5), 2020 (largest lead: 7.0), and 2010 (largest lead: 6.0)...their 72-46 record is tied with 2010 for the best in team history through 118 games.

- ✦ An eight-run 8th inning in which the Rays sent 12 men to the plate powered last night's 10-6, come-from-behind, series-opening win to remain undefeated on the current road trip (7-0)...see more in the "Rally Rays" and "Road Reversal" notes below.
- ✦ During the Rays MLB-best 16-4 run since July 20, the pitching staff leads the majors in ERA (2.69/181.0IP, 54ER); opp. average (.199), on-base pct. (.256), and OPS (.593); WHIP (0.96), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.40), walk rate (5.6%), and fewest pitches per IP (14.9).
- ✦ The Rays have been successful on 18 of their last 19 stolen bases attempts (July 30–pres.) to surpass the Guardians (116SB) for the AL lead with 119 SB...Chandler Simpson, whose 32 SB pace the AL, has been successful on a career-high 14 straight attempts.
- ✦ The club has won eight of its first nine games to open August for the first time and needs to go 7-12 or better over the next 19 games to secure a winning month...the Rays are attempting to complete a season without recording a losing month in a non-shortened season for the first time in team history...they did not tally a losing month during the 60-game 2020 campaign.
- ✦ With a win tonight, the Rays would claim four straight road series victories for the first time since April 22–May 15, 2025, win three straight road series on the same road trip for the first time since July 28–Aug. 6, 2023 (at HOU/NYY/DET); earn their sixth series win in their last seven sets overall (July 20–pres.), and improve to 10-3-2 in their last 15 series (June 19–pres.)...they would also keep pace with the 2010 team for the best record in club history through 119 games (73-46).
- ✦ Paired with their nine-game streak from June 24–July 3, the Rays are attempting to record multiple winning streaks of eight games or more in a season for the third time, joining 2021 and 2018...as it stands, they have the majors' most winning streaks of five games or more (6), six games or more (5), and seven games or more (3)...only the Red Sox (2) have multiple eight-game streaks this season.

RALLY RAYS—Last night marked the Rays seventh victory when trailing by four runs or more entering the 8th inning and first on the road since Sept. 27, 2009 at TEX (see table on the right)...it was the majors' ninth instance this season of a team winning such a game, first since the Athletics overcame an 11-7, 8th-inning deficit to win, 12-11, on June 19 vs. LAA in 10 innings...the eight-run frame was Rays largest since the 3rd inning on April 14, 2025 vs. BOS (9) and largest on the road since the 8th inning on Aug. 30, 2023 at SEA (8)...it marked the fifth time the Rays have recorded an eight-run frame in the 8th or later and third when trailing entering the inning, joining Aug. 22, 2023 vs. COL (trailed 4-3, 9 runs in 8th) and Aug. 28, 2007 at BAL (trailed 6-3, 11 runs in 8th)...it was the third time in team history the Rays scored eight runs in an inning without tallying a double or triple, joining Sept. 4, 2024 vs. MIN (8 runs in 4th) and Sept. 5, 2007 vs. BAL (8 runs in 4th).

✦ The victory marked their 31st comeback win, surpassing the White Sox (30) for the AL lead...the Rays recorded 27 comeback wins all of last season...they have recorded come-from-behind wins in three straight games for the second time in 2026, joining May 19-22...their last longer streak was five straight comeback wins from Aug. 4-10, 2021 (Elias).

ROAD REVERSAL—The Rays have won a season-high seven straight road games, their longest streak since an eight-game stretch from April 19–May 7, 2022, to improve to 31-28 away from home, the first time they have been three games over .500 in road affairs since May 25 (15-12)...this marks the 10th time they have recorded a winning streak of seven consecutive road games or more, and the club record is nine straight (3x, last: May 9-31, 2021)...they have won 10 of their last 11 road games following a six-game skid that capped a 6-17 stretch away from home (May 24–July 19)...the 10-1 run ties their best 11-game span on the road in team history (23x, last: Aug. 15–Sept. 2, 2020)...this is the third time the Rays have won the first seven games of a road trip, joining a 7-0 trip from May 18-24, 2021 (at BAL/TOR) and a seven-game streak from April 12-19, 2010, when they went 7-0 to open a 9-1 trip (at BAL/BOS/CWS)...they have never won the first eight games of a trip and have never gone undefeated on a three-series (or more) road trip...however, they have finished with one loss on three separate occasions: Aug. 10-20, 2020 (9-1: BOS/TOR/NYY); the aforementioned trip from April 12-22, 2010 (9-1: BAL/BOS/CWS); and June 15-24, 2004 (8-1: SD/AZ/TOR).

✦ **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 14 of his last 17 road games since the beginning of July, batting an MLB-best .433 (29-for-67) in road affairs over that timeframe (min. 50AB).

HIT MACHINE—Yandy Díaz collected three hits last night to tie Ben Zobrist (1,016) for third most in Rays history...he became the fourth active player to rank among his current franchise's top-three all-time leaders in hits, along with HOU Jose Altuve (2nd, 2,477), AZ Ketel Marte (2nd, 1,211), and LAA Mike Trout (2nd, 1,839)...additionally, despite no longer being with the club, NYY Paul Goldschmidt has the third-most hits in Diamondbacks history (1,182), and SD Manny Machado (1,110) is only 24 hits shy of entering the Padres top three...Díaz's leadoff homer on the first pitch of the game last night marked his 115th long ball as a Ray, surpassing Zobrist (114HR) for sole possession of sixth on the Rays all-time list.

✦ Díaz has tallied back-to-back games with three hits or more for the seventh time in his career (last: June 5-6, 2026)...he has never turned the trick in three straight games, and only seven players in Rays history have accomplished the feat, most recently Kevin Kiermaier from May 17-21, 2022.

✦ His 81 career three-hit games with the Rays rank third in franchise history, trailing Carl Crawford (124G) and Eyan Longoria (92G)...12 of those efforts have come this season, second most in the AL to HOU Yordan Alvarez's 13 three-hit games...his 27 three-hit performances since the start of last season pace the Junior Circuit, six more than any other AL hitter in that span.

ALL HEART, ALL HUSTLE—Since his average dipped to a season-low .259 entering play on June 19, Rays Heart & Hustle Award winner Chandler Simpson has batted an MLB-best .380 (60-for-158) over his last 42 games, pacing the majors in stolen bases (19) over that span while tying COL Jake McCarthy for the major league lead in hits and tying for second in multi-hit efforts (19G) behind PIT Nick Gonzales (20G)...Simpson has struck out only nine times in that timeframe, becoming the second AL hitter in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to hit .380 or better with 19 SB or more and fewer than 10 SO over a 42-game span, joining HOU Jose Altuve from May 22–July 8, 2014 (.380/26SB/8SO).

THE BAKE SHOW—Bryan Baker has converted a franchise-record 23 consecutive save opportunities, the majors longest active streak and the third longest by any pitcher this season, trailing stretches by SD Mason Miller (28) and TOR Louis Varland (24)...with an MLB-most 34 saves, Baker would need 14 saves over the Rays final 44 games to match Fernando Rodney's club record set in 2012 (48).

RAYS AND A'S—The Rays and Athletics continue a six-game season series tonight, with the clubs reconvening next month from Sept. 15-17 at Tropicana Field in the Rays penultimate home series...the clubs split, 3-3, last season, with both sides earning road series victories...the Rays took two of three games in their first series at this venue last August, a set in which they scored seven of their 15 runs (46.7%) via 5 HR and the bullpen yielded only one run in 6.2 IP (1.35 ERA)...they are 4-1-2 in their last seven series against the A's (May 2, 2022–pres.), going 2-0-2 on the road in that stretch since their last series road loss to the Athletics from May 7-9, 2021 at Oakland Coliseum...since registering consecutive 11-0 victories over the A's from April 8-9, 2023, which was the third instance in the modern era (since 1900) of a club recording back-to-back shutout wins by 11 runs or more, the Rays are 10-8 in the last 18 matchups, with 15 of those games being decided by three runs or fewer (June 12, 2023–pres.), including eight one-run affairs.

✦ Their .436 (96-124) all-time winning pct. against the A's is their second lowest vs. any AL opponent, better than only their .433 (210-275) mark vs. the Yankees...however, they are 39-31 vs. the club under Kevin Cash (since 2015) compared to 57-93 before Cash took the helm (1998–2014).

✦ The Rays have won six straight games vs. AL West foes (July 29–pres.), their longest streak since June 1–Aug. 25, 2022 (6G), on the heels of a 6-7 start against the division.

✦ **Chandler Simpson** has gone 8-for-15 (.533) in four games at Sutter Health Park dating back to last season...he has reached base safely in 10 of his 17 PA (8H, 2BB)...he is 11-for-22 (.500) with 5 SB in seven career games against the Athletics, reaching base safely in all six games with a PA.

✦ **Yandy Díaz** has a 15-game on-base streak against the Athletics (June 14, 2023–pres.), batting .351 (20-for-57) with 6 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, and 9 BB during the streak...it ties Randy Winn (May 26, 1998–May 30, 2001) for the longest streak vs. the A's in franchise history.

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 23rd start of the season and 11th on the road...marks his 152nd career start (303G) and 12th start (17G) opposite the Athletics...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

★ Ranks fourth among AL qualifiers with a 2.65 ERA (129.0IP, 38ER) behind NYY **Cam Schittler** (2.21), TOR **Dylan Cease** (2.28), and CLE **Parker Messick** (2.57), and is ninth in the majors...his .786 winning pct. this year is fifth among MLB qualifiers and second in the AL behind BOS **Sonny Gray** (.824).

★ 11 of his 22 starts this season have been quality...with a quality start tonight, he would surpass his second most in a single season, behind 2015 (13QS).

★ Is one of six AL pitchers with double-digit wins this season, alongside Gray (14), CLE **Gavin Williams** (11), TB **Drew Rasmussen** (10), TEX **Nathan Eovaldi** (10), and Schittler (10).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned the win on his birthday in his last start on Aug. 5 at COL after going 5.2 scoreless innings with six hits allowed and four strikeouts...the Rockies went 0-for-4 against Martinez with runners in scoring position...he exited with two outs in the 6th inning and runners on first and third.

★ He became the 16th Rays pitcher (18x) to start on his birthday and the fifth pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to have four wins or more on their birthday, joining **Bobo Newsom** (5), **Tim Wakefield** (4), **Jerry Reuss** (4), **Jack Powell** (4).

★ Marked his 20th start of the season with three runs or fewer allowed and his fourth scoreless start...he has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his 10 starts away from Tropicana Field this season.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'—The veteran right-hander is slated to make his 12th career start (17G) against the Athletics, his first start since Sept. 17, 2023 at OAK (3.0IP, H, OR, 5SO)...in his 11 career starts, he has gone 3-4 with a 3.23 ERA (61.1IP, 22ER), 36 strikeouts, and 16 walks...he has made one career appearance at Sutter Health Park, going 2.2 innings in relief with two hits, one run, one walk, and three strikeouts on Sept. 13, 2025.

★ Martinez is 13-17 with a 3.38 ERA (263.1IP, 99ER) and 165 strikeouts in 59 career appearances (39 starts) vs. AL West foes...is 10-15 with a 3.71 ERA (218.1IP, 90ER) and 130 strikeouts as a starter...is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (17.2IP, 5ER) in three starts against the division this season, allowing three runs or fewer in all three outings.

★ Martinez has fashioned a 2.89 ERA (81.0IP, 26ER) in games against AL opponents this season, the fourth-lowest mark among AL pitchers in 2026 (min. 100.0IP).

OUT ON TOUR—In 10 starts on the road this season, Martinez has gone 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA (58.1IP, 12ER), 31 strikeouts, a 1.08 WHIP, and a .243 (54-for-222) opp. average...min. 50.0 IP, his road ERA ranks fourth among major league pitchers...he has surrendered one or zero runs in seven of the 10 outings and in six of his last seven, pitching to a 1.54 ERA (41.0IP, 7ER) in that span (April 28–pres.).

★ His 1.85 ERA away from Tropicana Field is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell's** (2.45, 2018) franchise record for the lowest single-season road ERA in team history (min. 81.0IP)...it is also on pace to be the sixth lowest by an AL pitcher since 1970, trailing NYY **Cam Schittler** (2026, 1.10), BOS **Pedro Martinez** (2003, 1.57 & 2000, 1.66), DET **Joe Coleman** (1972, 1.68), and NYY **Ron Guidry** (1978, 1.69).

START ME UP—When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has logged a 1.23 ERA (22.0IP, 3ER) with 14 strikeouts and a .190 opp. average (15-for-79)...his ERA in the opening frame is tied for the third-lowest mark in the AL (min. 20.0IP).

★ In his career, he has turned in a 3.15 ERA (151.1IP, 53ER) with 110 strikeouts and a .232 opp. average (133-for-573) in the 1st inning...marks his lowest ERA and opp. batting average of any of the first seven frames.

HE'S A SAVANT—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Offspeed Run Value (8) is in the 97th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (13) is in the 88th percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.

★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.3 pct. hard-hit rate is fifth lowest in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind NYY **Ryan Yarbrough** (29.3), TOR **Tyler Rogers** (29.8), LAA/ATL **Brent Suter** (30.2), and LAD **Tanner Scott** (32.2).

★ Opposing hitters have an average exit velocity of 86.8 mph since the beginning of 2023, fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 1,000BF) behind LAA **Kyle Hendricks** (85.8), NYY **Max Fried** (86.6), and SD **Michael King** (86.7).

WALK OF LIFE—Since the start of 2024, Martinez has issued only 80 walks, recording the fourth-fewest walks per 9.0 innings (1.65) in the majors during that stretch (min. 250.0IP)...the veteran right-hander trails only DET/LAD **Tarik Skubal** (1.56), SEA **Bryan Woo** (1.57), and SEA **George Kirby** (1.60) during that span...min. 100.0 IP this season, his 1.40 walks per 9.0 innings leads the majors.
