BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals play the second game of a three-game series with the Colorado Rockies tonight at Coors Field. St. Louis rallied with three runs in the 9th inning on an **Iván Herrera** 3-run home run to win 7-6 in the opener. Colorado is the second stop on a three-city road trip through the National League West. The Cardinals opened the nine-game N.L. West road trip taking 2-of-3 at Los Angeles and are 3-1 through the first four games. The Cardinals will finish their road trip in San Francisco over Labor Day (Sept. 7-9).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 17.0 games behind first place Milwaukee and nine games behind 2nd place Chicago. The Cardinals are 3.5 games out of the 3rd Wild Card position held by San Diego (STL holds tie-breaker) and still have Arizona in their path. St. Louis has 11 road games remaining and nine home games.

GETTING SERIES-OUS: With a win tonight or tomorrow, the Cardinals will have won 5 of their last 6 road series with only a sweep disrupting the streak at Citizens Bank Park (8/21-23).

C-NOTE GOAT: **Jordan Walker** tallied his 100th RBI on a sacrifice fly last night becoming the first Cardinals outfielder with 100 RBI since **Matt Holliday** (102) in 2012 and first homegrown outfielder since **Ray Lankford** (103) in 1998. Walker currently leads the team in home runs (28), hits (156) and runs (89). He is looking to become the 18th instance a Cardinals player has 30 HR, 100 RBI, 30 doubles and 150 hits since 2000. **Albert Pujols** claims 10 of those seasons with **Jim Edmonds** (2), **Nolan Arenado** (2), **Paul Goldschmidt** (1), **Ryan Ludwick** (1) and Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** (1) rounding out the list.

THREE DAYS GRACE: Cardinals relief pitcher **Riley O'Brien** pitched three consecutive days earning the save last night and had a save on Wednesday with a blown save on Thursday. O'Brien becomes the first Cardinals pitcher to throw three consecutive days with multiple saves since **Jordan Hicks** recorded a save over three straight days in 2023 (June 17-18 at NYM & June 19 at WSH). -*Elias Sports Bureau*

20/20 VISION: Cardinals All-Star OF **Jordan Walker** (28 HR/18 SB) needs one stolen base to become the 11th instance a Cardinals player has achieved 20 HR and 20 SB in a single season and the first since **Tommy Pham** in 2017. Walker would join a Cardinals list that includes Pham, **Ray Lankford** (5x), **Lou Brock** (1967), **Brian Jordan** (1995), **Fernando Tatis** (1999), **Reggie Sanders** (2004). Lankford ran off four consecutive seasons (1995-98).

10-OUT-OF-10: Cardinals rookie OF **Nathan Church** stole his 10th base of the season and joins **JJ Wetherholt** (17 HR/14 SB) as Cardinals rookies with a 10 HR/10 SB season. Church became the 10th Cardinals rookie with a 10/10 season all-time.

DEJA VU ALL OVER AGAIN: **Iván Herrera** clubbed a 3-run home run (#15) to give the Cardinals a 7-6 lead in the 9th inning and eventually the win. Herrera was the last Cardinals player with a multiple RBI go-ahead hit with the Cardinals trailing by multiple runs in the final inning, a walk-off two-RBI double vs. Chicago (NL) in the 10th inning on July 29 at Busch Stadium in a 3-2 win. Last night's home run was Herrera's second homer in the 9th inning or later to put the team into the lead (5/19 vs. PIT, walk-off) and the only Cardinals batter this season. He is the first Cardinal to have multiple homers in the 9th inning or later that put the team in the lead in the same season since **Nolan Gorman** and **Nolan Arenado** in 2023

ROOKIE ROCKETS: With **Leo Bernal** connecting on his home run Wednesday night, the Cardinals rookies have hit 46 home runs this season coming from seven different players. The 46 home runs from rookies are the most home runs in the National League and trailing only the Chicago White Sox for the most in MLB with 61.

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Kyle Leahy was born in and resides in Boulder... graduated from Erie High School...selected to play at the Colorado High School Futures Game at Coors Field...played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction (2016-18).

Daniel Descalso played two seasons with Colorado (2015-16).

2026 Cardinals Hall of Fame Inductee **Albert Pujols** made MLB debut at Coors Field (Apr. 2, 2001)... singled off Mike Hampton that night for his first hit.

Jose Quintana was traded from Pittsburgh to St. Louis at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline and made 12 regular season and one postseason start.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Holliday** was originally selected by Colorado in the 7th round of the 1998 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons for the Rockies (2004-08, '18) where he was a three-time All-Star and appeared in the 2007 World Series.

Jaden Hill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 38th round of the 2018 MLB draft, but did not sign Louisiana State University.

Bryan Torres played in 67 games for the 2019 Rocky Mountain Vibes (Rookie-Brewers).

Justin Bruhl pitched in seven games for the Rockies in 2023.

Cardinals Assistant General Manager **Randy Flores** pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, 2009-10) over two stints with Colorado.

National Baseball Hall of Fame outfielder **Larry Walker** played for Colorado (1995-04) and St. Louis (2004-05)...member of 2004 NL Champions.

Rockies Bullpen Coach **Matt Buschmann** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Lafayette High School in Wildwood, Mo.

TJ Rumfield's father, **Toby Rumfield**, played in 13 games for Memphis (AAA) in 2002 where he was teammates with **Stubby Clapp**.

Rockies MLB.com **Thomas Harding** covered the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) for two seasons for the Commercial Appeal (1998-99)...mentored recent Cardinals MLB.com writer **Anne Rogers**.

Rockies Special Assistant **Clint Hurdle** played in 78 games for St. Louis in 1986.

Ricky Horton pitched for the 1990 Denver Zephyrs (AAA-Brewers) and 1991 Colorado Springs Sky Sox (AAA-Indians).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old Cardinals Opening Day starter makes his team-leading 28th start of the season. It marks his 148th career Major League appearance and his 81st career start.
- Enters tonight's start on a seven-game losing skid, last earning a win on July 11 vs. Atlanta at Busch Stadium. The last left-handed Cardinals starting pitcher with a streak of that length was **Jordan Montgomery** (7-game losing streak) from April 13-June 3, 2023.
- Leads St. Louis with a single-season career high 141 strikeouts, most by a Cardinals southpaw since **Jaime García** (150 in 2016).
- Ranks 21st among left-handers in franchise history with his 80 starts.
- Is one of five Cardinals who have induced double-digit GDP this season (11).
- Tied for 3rd in the National League with four pick-offs, most by a Cardinal since **Lance Lynn** (4 in 2015) and by a southpaw since **Mark Mulder** (5 in 2005).
- Is the third Cardinals lefty with 21+ wins since 2000, joining **Jamie Garcia** (62-45) and **Mark Mulder** (22-18). His next win ties **Alex Jackson** (1966-67), **Jerry Reuss** (1969-71), **Ferdie Shupp** (1919-21), and **Mulder** (2005-08) for 34th all-time among Cardinals left-handed pitchers.
- Opponents are batting .182 (10-55) off his curveball this season. Boasts a 41.5% whiff rate and 54.2% K% (3rd in MLB) on his curve.
- The Cardinals are 19-20 in his 39 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 13-15 with a 4.52 ERA (195.0 IP) with 11 quality starts (all 11 starts with 6.0 IP or more).

LAST TIME OUT (Sunday, August 30 vs. Pittsburgh): L, 5-4: 5.2 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 BB, 9 SO - 107 pitches

- Suffered his 7th straight losing decision & his 4th straight Home defeat
- Had 9+ strikeouts for 5th time this season and 2nd time in his last three starts while throwing a career-high 107 pitches.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

POWERED UP: Has a career high 141 strikeouts, ranking 12th among MLB lefties in 2026, but he's also allowed a career high 25 HR's, 3rd most among MLB LHP's.

AND THE AWARD FOR BEST SUPPORTING CAST MEMBER ...?: Supported with 3 runs or fewer (11 total) in each of his eight starts since the All-Star Break.

JUST PEACHY: Fanned 9 batters, one shy of his career high, in a 5-3 win vs. ATL (6/30) at Truist Park to earn his 20th career win and the blanked the Braves over 6.0 IP two weeks later in a 4-1 win at Busch Stadium on 7/11.

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Had his deepest start (5.1 IP) since a 6.0 inning effort at SD (5/7) and led the Cardinals to a series win over the Cubs on NBC Sunday Night Baseball in his 5-1 win vs Chicago on 5/31.

K-CLUB: Libby notched single-game career highs for strikeouts in consecutive starts when he fanned 9 on 5/19 vs. PIT and then he bettered that with 10 K's on Memorial Day (5/25) at MIL; He and Brewers starter Jacob Misiorowski (12) combined for 22 strikeouts in the 5/25 game.

LIBBY vs. LEFTY: Recorded 38 strikeouts in May, the most by a Cardinals lefty in the month of May since Hall of Famer **Steve "Lefty" Carlton** fanned 52 in May, 1970.

LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).

LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that he was born. Became 1 of just 16 LHPs to make the Opening Day start for St. Louis since 1901 (MLB).

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Is a career 18-34 with a 5.06 ERA (387.2 IP) in his 80 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.

LIBERATORE vs. COLORADO:

- Makes his 3rd career start and 7th appearance against the Rockies. Is 0-2 with a 6.39 ERA (12.2 IP) and seven strikeouts.
- Allowed a Brenton Doyle solo homer in the 9th inning of a 5-2 win on 9/25/24 at Coors Field. Libby was removed early that outing to allow for Ryan Helsley to convert his 48th save, tying **Trevor Rosenthal** for most in franchise history.
- Pitched back-to-back relief appearances at Coors Field on Sept. 24-25, 2024, both Cardinals wins.
- Is 0-2 in his two career starts vs. COL, both at Busch Stadium
- Lifetime 2-7 with a 4.29 ERA (71.1 IP) in 27 games (10 starts) vs. the NL West Division; As a starting pitcher, is 2-5 with a 4.18 ERA (51.2 IP).

LAST START VS. ROCKIES (August 8, 2026 at Busch Stadium): L, 8-6; 5.0 IP, 9 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO., 1 HR - 94 pitches

- Was dinged for a leadoff HR on the game's 1st pitch by the Rockies Jake McCarthy among his 5 runs and 9 hits allowed in 5.0 IP.

LIBERATORE vs. PIRATES:

- Is making his 8th career start (12th app) vs. the Pirates posting a 2-3 record with a 5.72 ERA (39.1 IP) with 39 strikeouts.
- He and Michael McGreevy were the only two pitchers who missed the Pirates during their four-game sweep at PNC Park in April.
- Fired 7.0 innings allowing one run in his May 6, 2025 start vs. the Pirates, a 2-1 win at Busch Stadium opposing **Paul Skenes** while striking out a season-high 8 batters.
- Made his Major League debut vs. Pittsburgh at PNC Park on May 21, 2022 and received a no decision in a game the Cardinals won 5-4 behind a four-hit night from **Paul Goldschmidt**.
- Has yet to win at PNC Park with an 0-3 record an 8.27 ERA over four starts and five app.
- Received 3 runs or support or less in his last six starts vs. PIT.

LAST START vs. PIRATES (May 19, 2026 at Busch Stadium): ND, W 9-6; 4.2 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 2 BB, 9 SO; 77 pitches)

- The Cardinals walked-off the Pirates in the 10th inning thanks to Ivan Herrera's three-run homer off Mason Montgomery.
- Allowed all four of his runs in the 5th inning as Pittsburgh sent nine batters to the plate.
