METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Atlanta Braves, 4-3, yesterday...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...They are 3-3 in that span...Yesterday, New York concluded their six-game roadtrip (3-3) against the Nationals (1-2) and Braves (2-1)...Tonight, the Mets begin a seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Marlins (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: Next week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation...Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

METS ON THE MOVE PREGAME CEREMONY: Mets on the Move, presented by Hospital for Special Surgery (HSS), is a fitness program dedicated to keep children active and healthy year-round...The program runs throughout the month of May to coincide with National Physical Fitness and Sports Month...This year, the Mets and HSS brought the program to 3,500 students across nine elementary schools in Queens...The more steps students took, the more Mets-themed prizes they earned...Before Monday's game, top-performing students from each school were honored on the field for their outstanding achievements. Altogether, participants in 2025 logged over 295 million steps.

HOME SWEET HOME: This season, the Mets are 41-24 (.631) in home games...The team is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for sixth in the majors in home winning percentage...Their 3.63 home ERA is the sixth-lowest mark in the NL and the 10th-lowest in the majors...During their last homestand, including August 17's game in Williamsport, PA, the Mets batted .330/.379/.584 with 13 home runs, 15 doubles and 41 RBI.

PHILLY SPECIAL: Including the 2024 NLDS, the Mets have won their last seven home games against the Phillies dating back to September 21, 2024...During that span, the Mets have posted an .804 OPS and have pitched to a 1.83 ERA (13 ER/64.0 IP)...A win tonight would tie the franchise's second-longest home winning streak against the Phillies (also: 8/31/14-8/31/15)...The longest home winning streak for the Mets against the Phillies was 10 games from June 20, 1984 - August 13, 1985.

BROTHERLY LOVE: In 88 career games against the Phillies, Starling Marte has a .361/.412/.531 slashline with eight home runs, 29 doubles, two triples and 43 RBI...His .361 batting average is the third-highest mark against Philadelphia in the Divisional Era (Since 1961, min. 200 at-bats)...In 83 career games against the Phillies, Juan Soto has a .976 OPS with 21 home runs...His 21 home runs against the Phillies are his second most against any opponent behind his 25 against the Braves...Jeff McNeil has a .310 batting average in 90 career games against the Phillies...He is one hit shy of becoming the 13th player in franchise history to record 100 hits against Philadelphia.

ON THE MARK: Over his last seven games, Mark Vientos has a .357/.387/.964 slashline with five home runs, two doubles and 11 RBI...His five home runs, seven extra-base hits and 11 RBI are all of his highest totals over the course of any seven-game span in his career...In his last 23 games dating back to July 19, Vientos has an .877 OPS, 12 extra-base hits and 19 RBI...He has hit safely in 20 of those games, including each of their last seven.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stole 108 bases in 120 attempts this year...Their 90% success rate is the highest in the majors...The 2024 team stole a total of 106 bases, while the 2023 team stole a total of 118...Juan Soto joins Trevor Story as the only players in the majors this season with 20+ stolen bases and a stolen base success rate of 95% or higher

LET'S GO STREAKING: Francisco Lindor is on a 12-game hitting streak, batting .471 (24-51) with 13 runs, five doubles, four homers, eight RBI, six walks, five steals, a .534 OBP and a .804 SLG in that span...His 12 game hitting streak is the second-longest active streak in the majors behind Bobby Witt Jr.'s current 13-game hitting streak...His 24 hits are the most by a Met in a 12-game span since José Reyes' 25 in 12 games from June 26 - July 24, 2011...In 31 games following the All-Star break, Lindor is batting .279/.342/.478 with an .820 OPS.

PHILS-METS NOTES: In the regular season, the Mets are 80-59 against the Phillies at Citi Field since the ballpark opened in 2009.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

RISPY BUSINESS: In 21 games in August, the Mets are batting .326 (57-175) with 11 doubles, nine home runs, 80 RBI, 30 walks, a .409 OBP, and a .554 SLG with RISP...Their .326 average is second in the majors and tops in the National League in August.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: The Mets are 7-14 in August...In 21 games this month, the Mets are batting .273/.347/.492 with 38 doubles, 40 home runs, 118 RBI and 78 walks...They rank second in the majors with an .838 August OPS and pace the NL in home runs during the month...The pitching staff has posted a 5.11 ERA during August, the sixth-highest mark in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 3-3 in that span...Overall, they are 19-16 against the division...The Mets are batting .265/.333/.467 against the NL East, while posting a 4.11 ERA.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 104 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 32 home runs and 21 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 25 home runs and 23 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded the loss on August 20 vs. the Nationals...Allowed four earned runs on five hits in 5.0 innings, while allowing two walks against four strike outs.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 20 starts this season, the right-hander has gone 7-5 with a 2.58 ERA (30ER/104.2 IP)...He has thrown at least 5.0 innings in 15 of those 20 starts and has allowed three runs or fewer in 16 of those starts...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 80.0 innings this season, he ranks fourth in ERA (second in NL)...With the same qualification, his 6.96 H/9.0 IP ratio ranks ninth, and his .211 opponent batting average (91-383) is the ninth best in the National League...Has held right-handers to a .192 average this season (34-1737 compared to a .228 average vs. lefties (47-206)

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga has picked up 66 of his 99 strikeouts on the ghost fork this season...Has held batters to a .127 average with his ghost fork this season, which is the lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the fifth-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...Has a run value of eight with his forkball this season, which is tied for the second-best among all qualified pitchers throwing a split-finger pitch...His 41.2% whiff rate is the second highest, trailing only Fernando Cruz's 60.2% whiff rate with his split-finger ball...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 43 of his 50 career starts...Has allowed three or fewer runs in 43 of his first 50 career starts, tied with Jacob deGrom and Lance McCullers Jr. for the third-most such starts in Major League history through a pitcher's first 49 Major League starts since the mound was lowered in 1968...His 43 such starts are tied with deGrom for the most in franchise history through a starters first 50 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from 6/23/23 to 7/11/25...It was the longest active streak in the majors and tied the second-longest such streak in franchise history...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 50 career starts he has posted 310 strikeouts...His 310 strikeouts through his first 50 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Gooden (418), Harvey (354), Syndergaard (350) and deGrom (333)....His 306 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 50 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (407), Hideo Nomo (397), Shohei Ohtani (345) and Masahiro Tanaka (315)...His career 2.83 ERA (88 ER/276.1 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 50 starts with the club.

VS. PHILADELPHIA/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his second career start against the Phillies tonight...Has gone 1-1 with a 1.46 ERA (2 ER/12.1 IP), three walks and 15 strikeouts in those games...Against NL East opponents, Senga is 9-3 with a 2.62 ERA (26 ER/89.1 IP) in his career...The Mets are 10-6 in games this season where Senga has started against a National League team...He has gone 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (23 ER/84.2 IP) in those games...In his career, he is 19-8 with a 2.60 ERA (62ER/214.1 IP), 94 walks and 234 strikeouts against NL teams...The Mets have gone 24-14 in those contests.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55

ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
