TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 17, 2010: Trailing 9-7 heading into the bottom of the ninth, Alex Rodriguez ties the game with a two-run homer off Red Sox closer Jonathan Papelbon before Marcus Thames wins it with a two-out, two-run, "walk-off" homer for an 11-9 Yankees win.

May 17, 2002: Jason Giambi hits a "walk-off" grand slam, giving the Yankees a 13-12 victory over Minnesota. The clubs combine for 40 hits (20 each) in a game that lasts 5 hours and 45 minutes, as Bernie Williams homers from both sides of the plate.

May 17, 1998: David Wells tosses the 14th regular season perfect game in Major League history (and first by a Yankee), defeating Minnesota, 4-0, at Yankee Stadium. He throws 120 pitches and records 11 strikeouts.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 18, 1969: Joe Pepitone leads off the bottom of the 9th with a solo blast off Angels' reliever Hoyt Wilhelm breaking a scoreless tie and giving the Yankees a 1-0 "walk-off" win over California at Yankee Stadium.

May 18, 1956: Mickey Mantle hits home runs from both sides of the plate for the third time in his career in an 8-7, 10-inning win at the White Sox. Mantle and Yogi Berra each go 4-for-4 with 3 RBI in the game.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game homestand today with the second game of a three-game Subway Series vs. the Mets (1-0 thus far)...will also play a three-game set vs. the Rangers (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 4-2 on their recent road trip, going 2-1 in both their series against the Athletics and Mariners.

- Have won seven of their last nine games (since 5/6) and each of their last three completed series (since 5/5).
- Are a season-high eight games over .500.
- Their 26-18 (.591) record is the second-best in the AL and tied for fifth-best in the Majors.
- Their +85 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+87).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won the opening game of the Subway Series vs. the Mets, 6-2, on Friday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (5.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 4BB, 5K, 0HR) started and earned his fifth win of the season...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-4, 1R, 2RBI) recorded a go-ahead RBI single in the third inning and an RBI single in the fourth inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double) recorded a season-high-tying 3H...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1BB) reached base three times...**SS Anthony Volpe** (0-for-3, 1RBI, 1SF) recorded a sac fly in the third inning... **DH Jasson Dominguez** (0-for-2, 1RBI, 2BB, 1SB) walked twice and drove in a run in the fourth inning...**RHP Jonathan Loáisiga** (1.0IP, 1H) made his season debut, tossing a scoreless sixth inning... **RHP Mark Leiter Jr.** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) and **RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP, 3K) were both scoreless in relief... **RHP Luke Weaver** (0.1IP) recorded his fifth save of the season, retiring his only batter faced in the ninth inning.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged **41,999 fans per home gate this season, their highest average attendance through their first 21 gates of a season since Derek Jeter's last season in 2014 (42,203).**

- **Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors**, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (50,788) and San Diego (42,395).
- Friday's paid attendance of 47,700 marked the fourth sellout of the season at Yankee Stadium and the highest paid attendance this year...was the highest paid attendance at Yankee Stadium since 7/24/24 vs. New York-NL (48,760).

GOOD AS GOLD: **INF Paul Goldschmidt** recorded a go-ahead RBI single in the third inning and an RBI single in the fourth inning on Friday vs. the Mets.

- Has hit .444/.500/.600 (20-for-45) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 19RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, leads the Majors in hits, ranks seventh in BA (fifth in AL) and eighth in OBP (fourth in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 35 of his 44 games this season, batting .349/.398/.506 (58-for-166) with 28R, 11 doubles, 5HR, 24RBI, 12BB/2IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B.
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (20, second in AL), is tied for second in hits (tied for second in AL), third in BA (second in AL) and 10th in OBP (third in AL).

SAVED BY THE BELL: **INF/OF Cody Bellinger** recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Friday vs. the Mets (also 3H on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee)...has hit safely in each of his last 11 games (since 5/3), batting .340/.392/.532 (16-for-47) with 9R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SB over that span...his 11-game hitting streak is tied for the fourth-longest of his career, trailing only a 13-game streak from 6/24-7/7/23 and 12-game streaks from 5/24-6/5/19 and 8/5-19/18 (also had an 11-game streak from 10/1/18-4/7/19).

NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC: The Yankees are 81-66 (.551) all-time vs. the Mets...**their 81 wins are tied with the Tampa Bay Rays' 81 wins over the Florida/Miami Marlins (81-61, .570) for the most wins against a single opponent in Interleague games.**

DREAM WEAVER: **RHP Luke Weaver** retired his only batter faced in the ninth inning on Friday vs. the Mets to earn his fifth save of the season (and second in as many games)...has not allowed a run in 17-of-18 appearances this year, going 0-1 with five saves, a 0.44 ERA (20.1IP, 1ER) and 22K.

- Among Major League relievers this season, ranks first in opponents' BA (.091), second in opponents' OPS (.286, first in AL), third in ERA (third in AL) and opponents' OBP (.164, second in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.121, third in AL) and fourth in WHIP (0.59, third in AL).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.88 ERA (156.0IP, 50ER) over their last 29 starts (since 4/14)**... have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of their last 29 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 21 of those starts and one-or-zero ER in 15 starts...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.205), rank second in ERA (2.88, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.275, second in AL), opponents' SLG (.332, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.607, second in AL), and third in WHIP (1.10, third in AL).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times on Friday vs. the Mets...**has reached base in 42 of his 44 games this year**, batting .414/.500/.775 (70-for-169) with 42R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 41RBI, 28BB/7IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 56 points, OBP by 63 points, SLG by 85 points and OPS by 169 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 29 of his last 35 games (since 4/7), 32 of his last 39 games (since 4/3) and 34 of his 44 games this year**... his 34 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- **Is one of three Yankees (fifth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 34 of the club's first 44 games of a season**, joining Babe Ruth (3x: 35G in 1927 and 34G in 1923 and 1924) and Lou Gehrig (34G in 1936).

- With 15HR and a .414 BA, is one of just three players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 44 games of a season, joining Boston's Manny Ramirez (15HR and .414 BA in 2001) and the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (20HR and .421 BA in 1956).

- Over his last 35 games (since 4/7), has hit .439/.522/.742 (58-for-132) with 28R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 24RBI, 23BB/5IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.
- **Has hit 7HR in his last 15 games (since 4/29) and 8HR in his last 17 games (since 4/27-G2).**
- Has hit .469/.581/.813 (15-for-32) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 9BB/6IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Has hit .322/.415/.767 (29-for-90) with 19R, 4 doubles, 12HR, 22RBI, 12BB, 3HP, 1SF and 1SB in 26 career games vs. the Mets...

has 7HR in his last 11 games against New York-NL (since 9/11/21).

OUT OF THIS WORLD: OF Jasson Domínguez walked twice and drove in a run in the fourth inning on Friday vs. the Mets... is hitting .273/.390/.606 (9-for-33) with 9R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI, 7BB, 1SF and 1SB over his last 10 games (since 5/4).

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have allowed just 1ER in their last 14.0 innings (since 5/12)...have posted a 1.35 ERA (20.0IP, 3ER) and 26K over their last five games (since 5/11).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have scored 256R this season, their most through their first 44 games of a season since 2003 when they scored 258R over their first 44 games.

- Despite not hitting a HR on Friday, **have hit a Major League-leading 76HR this year, their most home runs through their first 44 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 72HR in 2009)...are just the 11th team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to hit as many HR through their first 44 games of a season.
- The Yankees have a Major League-best eight players with at least 20RBI this season.
- Lead the Majors in HR (76), OBP (.347), walks (180), XBH (165), runs per game (5.82) and times on base (601), rank second in SLG (.477, first in AL), OPS (.825, first in AL) and total bases (719, first in AL), third in runs scored (256, first in AL) and fourth in BA (.263, first in AL).

HIGH VOLTAGE: **INF Anthony Volpe** recorded a sac fly in the third inning on Friday vs. the Mets...is hitting .288/.372/.485 (19-for-66) with 11R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 9BB, 1HP, 2SF and 45B over his last 18 games (since 4/25).

BANNER EVENING: On Sunday, Yankee Stadium will celebrate the **2024 WNBA Champion New York Liberty** as team captain and four-time NCAA champion with UConn **Breanna Stewart** throws out the ceremonial first pitch...fans purchasing a **Special Event Ticket** for the game will receive a co-branded Yankees + Liberty cap...media interested in covering may apply for credentials at [credentials.mlb.com](https://www.mlb.com/credentials)...today, the Liberty will open their season vs. Las Vegas and raise their championship banner.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (1-1, 4.73 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his sixth start of the season today vs. the Mets...the 29-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...made his fifth start of the season on Monday at Seattle, earning his first win of the season after allowing 3R/ER over a season-high-tying 6.0IP (3H, 2BB, 6K, 2HR)...missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list from 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24) to 4/16 with right rotator cuff tendonitis...in 16 starts with the Yankees in 2024, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 39 of his last 44 starts (since 5/19/23)...has pitched over parts of six Major League seasons with the Yankees (2020-25)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his fifth start of the season on Monday at Seattle, earning his first win of the season after allowing 3R/ER over a season-high-tying 6.0IP (3H, 2BB, 6K, 2HR).
✦ **Along with his 6.0IP on 5/6 vs. San Diego, marks the second time in his career he has tossed at least 6.0IP in consecutive starts (also 2GS from 5/10-16/24).**

2025: Is 1-1 with a 4.73 ERA (26.2IP, 22H, 14R/ER, 12BB, 25K, 5HR) in five starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in four of those starts.
✦ Has limited right-handed batters to a .167/.222/.262 (7-for-42) slash line this season.
✦ **Is 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA (17.0IP, 6ER) and 16K over his last three starts (since 4/27)...two of those starts have been quality starts.**
✦ The Yankees are 4-1 in his five starts this season.
✦ Missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list with right rotator cuff tendonitis...was originally placed on the 15-day injured list on 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24)...made two rehab starts with Double-A Somerset, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 11K, 1BK)...made his second rehab start on 4/10 vs. Reading, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (3H, 4K)...in his first rehab start on 4/5 at Hartford, tossed 3.1 scoreless innings without recording a decision (1H, 1BB, 7K, 1BK).
✦ Made his season debut on 4/16 vs. Kansas City, allowing 3R/ER over 5.2IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 2K, 0HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 15-day injured list prior to the game.
✦ Allowed just 1R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision in Game 2 on 4/27 vs. Toronto (1H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit and run on a solo HR to Anthony Santander in the third inning...marked his fewest hits allowed in a start of at least 5.0IP in his career (previous: 3H, seven times).
✦ Tossed 6.0IP without recording a decision on 5/6 vs. San Diego (7H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 4K, 0HR, 1BK)...marked his first quality start of the season.

VS. NEW YORK-NL/INTERLEAGUE: Has made two career appearances (one start) vs. the Mets, going 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7.1IP, 10H, 5R/2ER, 6BB, 2K, 1HR).
✦ His only start was on 9/12/21 at Citi Field, tossing 4.1IP without recording a decision (7H, 5R/2ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP).
✦ Made his only appearance at Yankee Stadium on 8/23/22, earning the win after tossing 3.0 scoreless innings in relief (3H, 3BB).
✦ Has made one Interleague start this season (5/6 vs. San Diego)...made three starts vs. National League opponents in 2024, going 0-1 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2IP, 10H, 6R/5ER, 8BB, 13K, 0HR)...allowed one-or-zero earned runs in two of those starts.

HOME SWEET HOME: Has made three starts at Yankee Stadium this season, posting a 3.24 ERA (16.2IP, 12H, 6R/ER, 7BB, 12K, 1HR) without recording a decision.
✦ Made eight home starts in 2024, going 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA (40.0IP, 20ER)...the Yankees went 6-2 in those starts.
✦ Since 7/4/23, the Yankees have won 14 of his last 18 home starts...has gone 5-3 with a 4.34 ERA (93.1IP, 45ER) and 90K in that span.
✦ Has tossed 5.0 innings-or-more in 19 of his last 22 home starts (since 5/25/23)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 20 of those 22 games.

ON A ROLL: Over his last 45 outings (44 starts) since 5/19/23, is 14-11 with a 3.70 ERA (231.0IP, 210H, 103R/95ER, 74BB, 219K, 29HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 39 of those 44 starts.
✦ **Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
✦ Has recorded at least 6K in 13 of his last 21 starts (since 2024) after recording just 12 such games in 37 starts from 2020-23.
✦ The Yankees are 26-11 in his last 37 starts (since 6/29/23) and 17-6 in his last 23 starts (since 9/25/23).

2024: In 16 starts with the Yankees, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 of his 16 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts and one-or-zero runs in five of those starts.
✦ Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
✦ The Yankees went 11-5 in his starts...the Yankees won each of his first five starts from 3/31-4/24 and eight of his first nine starts from 3/31-5/16.
✦ In eight road starts, went 3-3 with a 1.39 ERA (45.1IP, 7ER)...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his final seven road starts from 4/13(G1)-9/19, going 3-3 with a 0.90 ERA (40.0IP, 4ER) over that stretch...**his seven-start streak of 1ER-or-fewer on the road was tied with Al Downing's seven-start streak in 1968 for the longest single-season streak in franchise history** (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...was also tied for the third-longest single-season streak in the Majors in the last 19 years (since 2006), trailing only Dylan Cease's nine-start streak from 5/7-8/11/22 and Kevin Gausman's eight-start streak from 4/1-5/30/21.
