### TIGERS DROP GAME 4 TO FORCE DECISIVE GAME 5

The Tigers lost to the Guardians, 5-4, on Thursday to even the best-of-five series at two and force a decisive Game 5 today. Wenceel Pérez had two hits with a RBI, while Zach McKinstry added a solo homer. Riley Greene added two hits and Jace Jung and Trey Sweeney each drove in a run. On the mound, Reese Olson started and threw 4.0 innings, giving up a run on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

**IN THE POSTSEASON:** Detroit is in the postseason for the 17th time in franchise history and for the first time since 2014. The Tigers earned a Wild Card berth for the second time in franchise history (other, 2006) and are the No. 6 seed in the American League. Detroit is 61-64-1 all-time in the postseason, including a 30-35-1 record on the road. In the Division Series, the Tigers have an all-time record of 14-12, including a 7-8 mark on the road.

**TIGERS IN WINNER-TAKE-ALL GAMES:** The Tigers will play their 10th postseason winner-take-all game this afternoon in Cleveland. Detroit is 5-4 all-time in winner-take-all games, including a 5-1 record on the road. The Tigers have won three straight winner-take-all contests with the last coming in the 2013 ALDS, a 3-0 win at Oakland.

**WALK IN THE PARKER:** Parker Meadows led off the bottom of the first on Thursday with a double. Meadows has recorded a hit in each of his first six postseason games, which is the longest active streak in this year's playoffs. Meadows' current streak is tied with Al Kaline for the second-longest by a Tigers player to start his postseason career.

**ZACH ATTACK:** Zach McKinstry launched a game-tying solo homer in the fifth inning of Thursday's game. It marked his first career postseason homer and was the first Tigers homer at Comerica Park in a playoff game since Victor Martinez in Game 4 of the 2013 ALDS vs. Oakland. All three of McKinstry's hits this postseason have gone for extra bases.

**J-HEN STAYS HOT:** Justyn-Henry Malloy came off the bench in the ninth inning of Thursday's game and had a pinch-hit double. Malloy has reached base safely in seven of his nine postseason plate appearances and has recorded a hit in every game where he's had at least one at-bat.

**PACKING THE PARK:** The Tigers established another postseason attendance record on Thursday as 44,923 fans packed Comerica Park. It surpassed the previous record of 44,885, which was set on Wednesday.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** The Tigers will face Guardians LHP Matthew Boyd in today's game. Detroit is 23-12 against lefthanded starters during the regular season and postseason, including winning 10 straight games against lefty starters. During the regular season, the Tigers offense averaged 4.76 runs/game against southpaw starters, which ranked third in the American League, compared to an average of 4.07 runs/game against righthanded starters.

**ONE-RUN GAMES:** The Tigers played their first one-run game of the postseason on Thursday. Detroit finished the regular season with a 31-24 record in one-run games. The Tigers 55 one-run games were tied with Seattle for the most in the Majors and were the most in a season for Detroit since also playing 55 in 1976.

**ABOUT THE DIVISION SERIES ROSTER:** The Tigers 26-man roster for the American League Division Series includes 12 pitchers and 14 position players. Of the 26 players on the ALDS roster, 14 of them were on Detroit's Opening Day roster. Prior to the Wild Card series, Matt Vierling was the only player on the 26-man roster who had previous postseason experience. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last playoff team to have one-or-fewer players with previous playoff experience was the Angels in 2002.

**SECOND-HALF SURGE:** The Tigers posted a Major League best 31-13 record from August 11 until the end of the season. It was the team's best record over the final 44 games of a season since 2011, when Detroit went 32-12. The Tigers led the Majors with a 2.72 ERA (401.0IP/121ER) from August 11 until the end of the season, while also ranking first with a +62 run differential.

**TIGERS AND GUARDIANS:** After playing more than 2,300 regular season games, the Tigers and Guardians will conclude their first postseason series today. Cleveland has won nine of the 17 meetings from Detroit this season between the regular season and postseason. In the all-time series, the Tigers have a 1,161-1,157-12 advantage (includes regular season and postseason).

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers have won three of their four road games this postseason. During the regular season, Detroit went 43-38 on the road. The Tigers 43 road victories were their most in a season since winning 45 in 2014. Detroit finished the season by winning eight of their last 10 games away from Comerica Park.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** A.J. Hinch is leading a team to the postseason for the fifth time in his managerial career. Hinch has posted a 32-24 (.571) record in the playoffs, including a 4-2 record in winner-take all games. In his four seasons as the Tigers manager, Hinch has a 307-341 (.474) record, while his all-time managerial record stands at 877-793 (.525). His 877 victories ranks fourth among active managers.

### Today's start at Cleveland

- Skubal will make his third career postseason start this afternoon at Cleveland...started Game 2 vs. the Guardians, pitching 7.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed, no walks and eight strikeouts...is the only pitcher in franchise history to have a postseason outing of 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing zero walks and no more than three hits.
- Has thrown 6.0-or-more shutout innings in each of his first two postseason starts...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the first Tiger and sixth pitcher in MLB history to do so, joining Corey Kluber (2016), Steve Avery (1991), Dave Righetti (1981), Joe Niekro (1980-81) and Christy Mathewson (1905).
- Has faced the Guardians nine times in his career and has a 2-2 record with a 2.96 ERA (48.2IP/16ER) and 52 strikeouts...in six career starts at Progressive Field, Skubal is 2-1 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP/9ER) and 34 strikeouts.
- Has made 46 career appearances, including 44 starts, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 16-16 record with a 3.98 ERA (240.OIP/106ER) and 258 strikeouts...started 10 games against AL Central teams during the 2024 regular season, posting a 7-2 record with a 3.03 ERA (59.1IP/20ER) and 67 punchouts.

### 2024 Regular Season

- Started 31 games during the regular season and went 18-4 with a 2.39 ERA (192.OIP/51ER) and 228 strikeouts...his 2.39 ERA was the lowest by a Tigers pitcher since Mark Fidrych's 2.34 ERA in 1976, while his 18 wins were the most since Max Scherzer also won 18 in 2014.
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- In addition to leading the AL in the Triple Crown categories, he also ranked first in FIP (2.51), fWAR (5.9), bWAR (6.3), opponent slugging percentage (.311) and opponent OPS (.558), while ranking second in WHIP (0.92), opponent on-base percentage (.247), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (10.69) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.51) and fourth in opponent batting average (.201), walks per 9.0 innings (1.64) and home runs per 9.0 innings (0.70).
- Recorded his 200th strikeout of the season on August 31 vs. Boston...became just the fourth lefthanded pitcher in franchise history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season, joining Mickey Lolich (seven times), Hal Newhouser (twice) and Matthew Boyd (once)...Skubal finished the season with 228 strikeouts, which ranks as the seventh-most by a southpaw in franchise history.
- Earned a spot on the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career this season after being voted on the team through the player balloting...was the first hometown Detroit starting pitcher to be selected to the All-Star Game since Justin Verlander in 2013...threw a perfect second inning in the game, retiring Christian Yelich, Alec Bohm and Teoscar Hernández.
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters over 7.0 innings on July 7 at Cincinnati, allowing one run on three hits...became just the second pitcher in franchise history to have a game with 13-or-more strikeouts, zero walks and no more than one run allowed, joining Mickey Lolich on July 1, 1968 vs. California.
- Threw the fastest pitch of his career on June 9 against the Brewers, firing a 101.7 MPH fastball...ranked as the second-fastest pitch this season by any Major League starting pitcher (not counting openers), trailing only Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes, who reached 101.9 MPH on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...was also tied for the fastest pitch by any Tigers pitcher in the Statcast Era (since 2015), equaling Bruce Rondón, who threw a 101.7 MPH pitch on July 18, 2015 vs. Baltimore.

### In the Community

- Was selected as the Tigers nominee for the 2024 Roberto Clemente Award, baseball's most prestigious individual honor for Major Leaguers...Tarik and his wife, Jessica, generously donated in support of Alternatives for Girls, an organization that seeks to empower homeless and at-risk young women by providing critical interventions and support...in addition to his work with Alternatives for Girls, Tarik has made an unrestricted donation to the Tigers Foundation and has been involved in the Tigers Autographs for a Cause program.
