## FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (84), HR (30), RBI (81), batting average (.310), slugging percentage (.595) and on-base percentage (.375)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 84-47, and are 25-8 when leading after the first inning... 5 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first...3B Eugenio Suárez is hitting .351 in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with $\mathbf{1 0}$ HR that inning and is tied for the lead with 20 RBI...in 2018, Reds batters produced $\mathbf{2 2}$ HR and 77 runs in the first inning.

GENO \& DOGGIE
Eugenio Suárez leads the team with 27 home runs and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer Tony Pérez (1967, 1969-1971) as the only Reds third basemen to produce at least 25 HR in at least 3 seasons...Suárez hit 34 HR last season and $\mathbf{2 6}$ HR in 2017.

## FIRST IMPRESSION

According to @EliasSports, last Fri vs StL C Ryan Lavarnway became the first player with 2 HR in his first game with the Reds, the first player with more than 3 RBI in his first game with the Reds and only the fourth Major League player, since RBI became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least 3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI (list below). RHP Luis Castillo in his last 25 apps beginning $9 / 1 / 18$ is $12-4$ and in that span ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.09...this season Castillo ranks among the National League leaders in wins (T8th), ERA (2nd), strikeouts (7th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (5th, 10.53)...since the distance from the pitching rubber to home plate was set at 60 feet, 6 inches in 1893, only 3 times in Major League history has a pitcher made 3 consecutive starts in a season with at least 8 strikeouts and no more than 2 hits allowed in each game (list below)...Castillo's streak, to open this season, was snapped in the 4-3 walkoff loss on 4/15 at LAD (5ip, 4h, 2er, 5bb, 7k).

ONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Warren Miller's Rockies and Game 1 of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3 -game set vs the Pirates...the Redlegs are coming off a $2-1$ series win at Mil's Miller Park that completed a 4-6 stretch vs NL Central Division rivals ( $1-2$ at Chi, $1-3$ vs StL, $2-1$ at Mil)...following this homestand will visit Atl's SunTrust Park (4g) before returning to Great American Ball Park for a 7 -day, 6 -game homestand vs the Angels (2g) and Cubs (4g).

ROTATION NOTE: LHP Alex Wood is scheduled to start Sunday in his season debut....has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a lower back injury....has been on the 60 -day IL since $5 / 31 \ldots$ made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on $2 / 25$ at Sea ( $1 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 0 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )...in his 4 rehab starts for Louisville (3g) and Chattanooga (1g) went 1-1, 3.18 (11.1ip, 12h, 5r, 4er, 2bb, 11k)...most recent pitched Mon for Chattanooga at Birmingham and earned the $3-2$ victory ( $6 \mathrm{ip}, 4 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 0 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hb}$, 85 pitches)...made his 3 rehab apps for the Bats on $7 / 6$ at Columbus (1.1ip, 2h, 1er, 1bb, $2 \mathrm{k}, 31$ pitches), $7 / 12$ vs Toledo (2ip, 4h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, $2 \mathrm{k}, 51$ pitches) and $7 / 17$ at Pawtucket (2ip, 2h, Or, 1bb, $3 \mathrm{k}, 38$ pitches).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Rockies are meeting for the second time this season...coming out of the All-Star break, the Reds suffered a 2-1 series loss at Coors Field...that series included a 17-9 win in which the Reds became the first Major League team in the modern era to produce in a game at least 5 triples and at least 3 HR...beginning in 2002 and with a minimum of 40 games played, the Reds' .345 winning percentage at Coors Field (20-38) is their lowest at any current road ballpark in that span...Cin's $3-1$ series win from $5 / 30-6 / 2,2016$ is its only series win at Coors Field since 8/27-8/29, 2012.

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds are 45-46 since the bench-clearing incident on $4 / 7$ at Pit that led to the ejections of David Bell, Amir Garrett and Yasiel Puig...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field. from $3 / 31-4 / 5$ the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 \& 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

REHABBING: C Tucker Barnhart last night began a rehabilitation assignment with Class AAA Louisville vs Gwinnett, started and without issue caught 5 innings of the $5-4$ Bats loss $(1-3,12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{r})$...is scheduled to play 7 innings tonight...has been on the injured list since 6/28 with a right oblique strain...last appeared for the Reds on 6/22 at MiI...C/IF Kyle Farmer last night began a rehabilitation at Class A Dayton vs Great Lakes, started and without issue caught 5 innings of the 6-4 Dragons loss (0-2, 1bb)...since 7/18 has been on the 7-day concussion list...last appeared for the Reds on 7/16 at Wrigley Field

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) \& Farmer (concussion) - all currently are unavailable to play...Graterol left Wed's game at Mil per concussion protocol after taking several foul balls to the mask, leaving Lavarnway as the only catcher on the 25-man roster...per @EliasSports, the Reds used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 63 of the Reds' 100 games so far this season, including 42 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF ( $6 / 2 \mathrm{vs}$ Wsh), 3 times as a CF, 3 times as LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF ( $3 / 28$ vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (379.2) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for Bos in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for Tex.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...the Reds already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956 and 1961...Sun vs Col will wear replica uniforms from 1967...the Reds are 2-7 wearing throwback uniforms...as part of the season-long celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4 the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game. more than 20 anniversary park benches, featuring Reds mascots wearing the 15 throwback uniforms, are on display at locations across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: RHP Luis Castillo was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April...in 7 starts he went 3-1, 1.45 while ranking second in the National League and third in the Major Leagues in ERA, second in the NL and sixth in the majors in strikeouts (50) and third in the NL and T6th in the majors in innings pitched (43.1)...is the first Reds player to win a monthly award since 2B Scooter Gennett won it in May of last year, the first Reds pitcher to win it since LHP Denny Neagle in September 1999 and the first Reds righthanded starter recognized since Jose Rijo in September 1992.

## RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his his third Major League season at just 26 years old, is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last $\mathbf{4}$ starts is 2-1, 1.69...in Sat's $3-2$ win vs StL, allowed only a solo HR by Matt Wieters leading off the top of the sixth inning...in the third inning on $7 / 15$ at Wrigley Field allowed a 2-out, solo HR to Kyle Schwarber than snapped his career-high 14.2-inning scoreless streak....produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...selected by his peers, he joined RHP Sonny Gray as the first pair of Reds starting pitchers named to the All-Star team since Johnny Cueto and Alfredo Simon in 2014...threw a perfect fourth inning in the National League's 4-3 loss at Cle's Progressive Field (struck out Carlos Santana, struck out J.D. Martinez, Alex Bregman 4-3)...Gray did not pitch...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...through his first 7 starts of this season led the Major Leagues in ERA (1.45)...made his first career Opening Day start, but in the 5-3 win vs Pit was the victim of a blown save...became the fifth straight different Opening Day starter for the Reds (Johnny Cueto 2012-2015, Raisel Iglesias 2016, Scott Feldman in 2017, Homer Bailey in 2018)...is the longest stretch of different Opening Day starting pitchers since a 6-year stretch from 2001-2006 (Pete Harnisch 2000-2001, Joey Hamilton 2002, Jimmy Haynes 2003, Cory Lidle 2004, Paul Wilson 2005, Aaron Harang 2006)...since his Major League debut in 2017 , leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
