**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Phillies, 7-2, in Game 3 of the NLDS...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild Card Series...A potential Game 5 would take place on Friday, October 11 at Citizens Bank Park.

**WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING:** Happy birthday to Starling Marte who turns 36 today...Overall, 16 different Mets have homered on their birthday...The last player to do so was Jeff McNeil in 2022...McNeil is one of three players to hit a home run on his special day multiple times, joining Jim Hickman (also twice) and Mike Piazza, who accomplished the feat three times...The Mets have not had a player hit a home run on their birthday in the Postseason.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** With capacity crowds expected, the Mets encourage fans to take mass transit or rideshare services and arrive early to enter the ballpark...Parking will be limited and available parking spaces will run out quickly. Citi Field is just a short subway ride from Midtown Manhattan and most NYC points on the 7-train, including extra trains back to Manhattan after the game...Mass transit is the fastest way to Citi Field.

**TO THE POST:** The Mets are 56-42 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .571 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (245-179, .578) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the fourth-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.24 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80), Athletics (3.14) and Reds (3.23) have a lower ERA.

**IN A CLINCH:** The Mets are 12-9 in clinching games, including 1-0 this year... New York is looking to clinch a spot in the NLCS for the first time since 2015... The Mets have never clinched a Postseason series at Citi Field.

**CONNECT FOUR:** The Mets are 9-6 all-time in Game 4 of a Postseason series.

**IN THE CITY:** The Mets are 6-6 during the Postseason at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets are 32-19 at home in the Postseason...Their .627 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors.

**DIVISION BELL:** The Mets are playing in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...Overall, it's their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 14-5 all-time in the series...Their .737 winning percentage in the series is the best in the National League...Only the Blue Jays (.750) have a better mark...This includes an 8-1 record at home in the Division Series.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Mark Vientos is the third-youngest player (24 years, 300 days) with 10+ total bases in a playoff game, doing so in Game 2 of the NLDS...He was only older than Carlos Correa (21y, 20d) in Game 4 of the 2015 ALDS and Manny Ramirez (23y, 134d) in Game 2 of the 1995 ALCS...Vientos is now the third Mets player with three extra-base hits in a playoff game, joining Lucas Duda in Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS and Gary Carter in Game 4 of the 1986 World Series.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are facing the Phillies in the Postseason for the first time in franchise history...The Mets are 4-5 against the NL East in the Postseason...The last time the Mets faced off against a divisional opponent was in 1999, when they faced the Atlanta Braves in the NLCS.

**ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS:** J.D. Martinez has appeared in 38 Postseason games, batting .295 (38-129) with 15 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 20 walks, a .388 OBP and a .566 SLG.

**SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD:** There have been 12 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each.

**AIN'T IT GRAND:** The Mets have had one grand slam in Postseason history...Edgardo Alfonzo cleared the bases in the top of the ninth in Game 1 of the 1999 NLDS in Arizona...Alfonzo gave the Mets an 8-4 lead with one swing of the bat with two outs in the top of the inning.

**BACK-TO-BACK:** The Mets have hit back-to-back home runs twice in the Postseason...On October 21, 2015 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Lucas Duda and Travis d'Arnaud hit back-to-back home runs in the first inning...On October 9, 1988 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds went back-to-back in the fourth inning.

**HAPPY TRAILS:** According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason...After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins).

**BACK-TO-BACK:** The Mets won Game 3 of the NLWCS and Game 1 of the NLDS after trailing entering the eighth inning...According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

**HIGH FIVE:** The Mets have scored five or more runs in an inning twice this Postseason (In Game 1 of the NLDS and in Game 1 of the Wild Card Series)... It's the first time they've done so multiple times in a single Postseason in franchise history...Courtesy of Brent Maguire at MLB.com

**NOTHING EXTRA:** The Mets scored six runs without recording an extra-base hit in their NLDS Game 1 win against the Phillies...It marks the second time in franchise history that the team scored six runs without an extra-base hit in a Postseason game...The only other coinurance was Game 6 of the 1986 World Series...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

**SAVE ME:** In Game 3 of the NL Wild Card Series, David Peterson became the first pitcher in franchise history to record his first career save in the Postseason...He became the 19th pitcher to have earned their first career save in the playoffs...Courtesy of Elias.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are the first team in MLB history to clinch a postseason spot in a win and win a playoff series BOTH via games in which they faced a deficit in the ninth inning or later...Courtesy of Sarah Langs and Elias.

**TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE:** Ryne Stanek has appeared in 27 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (7 ER/24.1IP) with seven walks and 24 strikeouts in the playoffs.

**IN IT TO WIN IT:** New York improved to 4-5 in winner-take-all Postseason games, including a 2-3 record at home and 2-2 on the road.

**WILD OUT:** The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS...The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

**POSTSEASON BOUND:** The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

**POSTING UP:** Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year...Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

**ON THE RECORD:** New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

**DANCING IN SEPTEMBER:** The Mets went 17-9 in September...Their .654 winning percentage was third in the majors and the second-best in the National League...Their 3.21 ERA in the month was the third-best in the National League.

**A LEADING MAN:** Francisco Lindor hit 26 home runs when batting first this season...That tied a record for the most in franchise history...He joined Curtis Granderson (26 HR/140 Games, 2015) as the franchise leader...In 109 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Lindor batted .303/.374/.552 with 82 runs, 31 doubles, one triple, 26 home runs, 71 RBI, 42 walks, 23 steals with a .926 OPS...The Mets went 64-43 when Lindor bated first this season.

**30-FOR-30:** Lindor recorded his second 30 home run/30 double season as a Met and the fifth of his career...Only six players in Mets history have recorded multiple seasons with 30 home runs and 30 doubles - Lindor (2023-24), Pete Alonso (2024 & 2019), David Wright (2007-08), Carlos Beltrán (2006-07), Carlos Delgado (2006 and 2008) and Howard Johnson (1989 and 1991).

**OMG:** Jose Iglesias recorded a hit in both games of the team's doubleheader on the final game of the season...He ended the year with a 22-game hitting streak...It is the longest hitting streak of his career and it is the longest streak by a Mets player this year...His previous high was an 18-game streak from May 27-June 18, 2013 with the Red Sox...The last time a Mets player had a longer streak was Wilson Ramos, when he recorded a 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2019...Iglesias batted .395 (34-86) over that span with 14 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk, two steals, a .429 OBP and a .477 SLG.

**FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Francisco Lindor finished the season with a 7.6 fWAR...That was the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...Only Shohei Ohtani (9.1 fWAR) had a higher mark...Lindor's 17.4 defensive fWAR was third in the majors.

**ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US:** The Mets stole 106 bases out of 128 attempts this year, giving them a 82.8% success rate...It is the second-highest in franchise history...Last year, the team was successful in 88.7% (118-133) of stolen base attempts, the highest in team history...Brandon Nimmo was not caught in 15 stolen base attempts this year...His 15 steals were a career-best...Francisco Lindor stole 29 bases this year...That is two shy from his career-best 31, accomplished last year.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo hit .241/.344/.419 with 44 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI and 39 walks in 74 road games...This compared to a .207/.310/.379 slashline with 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs and 38 walks in 75 games at home in 2024...Overall, Nimmo hit 23 home runs this year, one short of his career-best 24 he accomplished last season...His 90 RBI were a career-best...He recorded 77 walks this year...That's three short of his career-best 80 he recorded in 2018.
