### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 14, 1996:** Dwight Gooden throws the eighth no-hitter in franchise history, defeating the Seattle Mariners, 2-0, at Yankee Stadium. He tosses 134 pitches in the contest (74 for strikes), walking six and striking out five.

**May 14, 1967:** Mickey Mantle hits his 500th career home run in the seventh inning off Baltimore's Stu Miller, providing the margin of victory in a 6-5 win at Yankee Stadium.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 15, 1941:** Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak begins with a single off Eddie Smith in a 13-1 loss vs. Chicago-AL at Yankee Stadium.

### FRIDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 16, 2006:** The Yankees overcome a nine-run deficit vs. Texas to win, 14-13, in nine innings. Jorge Posada hits a two-run, "walk-off" home run off Akinori Otsuka.

**May 16, 1932:** The Yankees shut out their opponent for the fourth consecutive game, defeating Cleveland, 8-0, at Yankee Stadium.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees conclude their six-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set at Seattle (1-1 thus far)...are 3-2 on the road trip after winning two-of-three games against the Athletics this past weekend and splitting their first two games at Seattle...following this road trip, will return home for a six-game homestand featuring three-game sets vs. the Mets (Fri.-Sun.) and Texas (5/20-22).

- Have won five of their last seven games (since 5/6).
- Their 24-18 (.571) record is the third-best in the AL.
- Their +80 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+85).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees fell to the Mariners in a 2-1 "walk-off" loss in 11 innings on Tuesday at T-Mobile Park...**LHP Max Fried** (5.0IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 0HR) started and did not record a decision...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-5) recorded the club's only multi-hit game...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1BB) and **SS Anthony Volpe** (0-for-3, 2BB, 1SB) each reached base twice...**LF/1B Cody Bellinger** (1-for-5, 1 double) doubled in the first inning to extend his hitting streak to nine games (since 5/3)...**RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.0IP, 3K), **RHP Mark Leiter Jr.** (1.0IP, 2K), **RHP Luke Weaver** (2.0IP, 3K) and **RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP) were all perfect in relief...**LHP Tim Hill** (0.0IP, 2H, 1R/0ER) took the loss after surrendering a "walk-off" single to J.P. Crawford in the 11th inning.

**LAND OF THE FRIED:** **LHP Max Fried** allowed only 1R/ER over 5.0IP in a no-decision on Tuesday at Seattle...**is 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA (56.2IP, 7ER) in nine starts this season...his 1.11 ERA is the lowest by a Yankee through his first nine starts of a season** (since 1913 when ER became an official stat).

- **Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his nine starts this season...is one of three pitchers in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first nine starts of a season** (since ER became an official stat in 1913), joining Michael Pineda (first nine starts in 2014) and Lefty Gomez (first nine starts in 1937)...Chad Green also did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- Leads the Majors in ERA and pickoffs (four), is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' OPS (.520, fourth in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.270, fifth in AL), eighth in WHIP (0.94, sixth in AL), ninth in opponents' BA (.190, sixth in AL) and 10th in opponents' OBP (.250, eighth in AL).

**MERRY GRISHMAS:** **OF Trent Grisham** recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game on Tuesday at Seattle...is hitting .294/.374/.651 (32-for-109) with 23R, 1 double, 1 triple, 12HR, 22RBI, 13BB and 1HP in 35 games this season...has 12HR in 35 games this season after hitting 9HR in 76 games in 2024.

- Has 4HR in his last seven games (since 5/5) and 8HR in his last 17 games (since 4/19).
- **Nine of his 12HR this season have either tied the game (three) or given the Yankees the lead (six).**
- Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL), tied for fifth in HR (third in AL) and tied for ninth in go-ahead RBI (eight, tied for second in AL).

**SAVED BY THE BELL:** **INF/OF Cody Bellinger** has hit safely in each of his last nine games (since 5/3), batting .316/.381/.500 (12-for-38) with 7R, 1 double, 2HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SB over that span.

- Is hitting .322/.388/.576 (19-for-59) with 13R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 12RBI, 7BB and 1SF in 15 career games vs. Seattle.

**CRUZ CONTROL:** **RHP Fernando Cruz** struck out all 3BF on Tuesday at Seattle...has struck out 34-of-82BF this season...leads Major League relievers in strikeouts, ranks third in strikeout rate (41.5%, second in AL) and fifth in K/9.OIP (14.34, fourth in AL).

**DREAM WEAVER:** **RHP Luke Weaver** tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief on Tuesday at Seattle, striking out 3-of-6BF...has not allowed a run in 15-of-16 appearances this year, going 0-1 with three saves, a 0.47 ERA (19.0IP, 1ER) and 19K...among Major League relievers this season, ranks second in opponents' BA (.097, first in AL), third in opponents' OPS (.303, second in AL), is tied for third in ERA (tied for third in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.129, third in AL), fifth in opponents' OBP (.174, fourth in AL) and sixth in WHIP (0.63, fifth in AL).

**SEA-ING CLEARLY:** The Yankees have won or split 13 of their last 15 completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 16 of their last 19 completed series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 34-16 in the last 50 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- **The Yankees have won 12 of their last 13 completed series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11) and 13 of their last 15 completed series (since 7/8/10)...their 29-11 (.725) record at T-Mobile Park since 2012 is the third-best by any team (min. 30G) at any stadium in that span,** trailing only Tampa Bay's 24-7 (.774) record at loanDepot park and Los Angeles-NL's 28-9 (.757) record at Citi Field.

**ALL RISE:** **OF Aaron Judge** reached base twice on Tuesday at Seattle...**has reached base in 40 of his 42 games this year**, batting .410/.497/.770 (66-for-161) with 39R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 14HR, 40RBI, 27BB/7IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 47 points, OBP by 68 points, SLG by 141 points and OPS by 233 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 27 of his last 33 games (since 4/7), 30 of his last 37 games (since 4/3) and 32 of his 42 games this year...** his 32 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

- With 14HR and a .410 BA, is one of just five players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 42 games of a season, joining Colorado's Larry Walker (14HR and .410 BA in 1997), Chicago-NL's Billy Williams (14HR and .422 BA in 1964), the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (20HR and .414 BA in 1956) and Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (17HR and .413 BA in 1932).

- **Is one of three Yankees (sixth time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 32 of the club's first 42 games of a season**, joining Babe Ruth (4x: 34G in 1927 and 32G in 1923, 1924 and 1928) and Lou Gehrig (33G in 1936).
- **Has hit 6HR in his last 13 games (since 4/29) and 7HR in his last 15 games (since 4/27-G2).**

- Over his last 33 games (since 4/7), has hit .435/.520/.734 (54-for-124) with 25R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 23RBI, 22BB/5IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.
- Has hit .484/.585/.839 (15-for-31) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 8BB/6IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.

- **Has hit 13HR in his last 28 games vs. the Mariners (since 6/21/18) and 15HR in his last 36 games against Seattle (since 7/21/17).**...has 10HR in his last 20 games at T-Mobile Park (since 7/21/17)...since 2017, has hit .355/.485/.842 (27-for-76) with 18R, 7 doubles, 10HR, 24RBI, 20BB/6IBB, 1HP, 35B and 2SF in 21 games at T-Mobile Park.

**GOOD AS GOLD:** **INF Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base safely in 33 of his 42 games this season, batting .344/.394/.488 (55-for-160) with 26R, 11 doubles, 4HR, 21RBI, 12BB/2IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 35B.

- Had his season-opening 20-game road hitting streak snapped on Tuesday at Seattle...was one of only three Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 20 road games of a season, joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007) and Jack Levitt (21G in 1912)...has hit .418/.454/.560 (38-for-91) with 15R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 11RBI, 5BB, 1HP and 2SB in 21 road games this year.
- Has hit .429/.490/.595 (18-for-42) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 17RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for first in the Majors in hits, tied for seventh in BA (tied for fifth in AL) and tied for 10th in OBP (fourth in AL).
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (19, second in AL), third in BA (third in AL) and is tied for third in hits (tied for third in AL)...also ranks fifth in the AL in OBP.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters** scored only 1R on Tuesday at Seattle after scoring 56R in their previous six games (5/6-12).

- **Have hit a Major League-leading 74HR this year, their most home runs through their first 42 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 69HR in 2009).
- Lead the Majors in HR (74), OBP (.348), SLG (.480), OPS (.828), runs scored (247), runs per game (5.88), walks (171), total bases (692), times on base (575) and XBH (159), and ranks fourth in BA (.263, second in AL).

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.90 ERA (146.0IP, 47ER) over their last 27 starts (since 4/14).**...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 22 of their last 27 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 19 of those starts...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.207), rank second in opponents' OBP (.274, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.615, second in AL), third in WHIP (1.10, third in AL) and opponents' SLG (.341, second in AL), and fourth in ERA (third in AL).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (2-2, 4.75 ERA)

**RHP Will Warren** will make his ninth start of the year in today's series finale at Seattle...the 25-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Friday at the Athletics, earning the win after allowing just 1R/ER over a career-high 7.1IP (4H, 1BB, 7K, 0HR)...retired 15 of his first 17BF (1H, 1BB)...is 2-2 with a 4.75 ERA (36.0IP, 19ER) and 41K in eight starts this year...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in five of those starts...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...spent the majority of last season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts...following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect...over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2022-24), has gone 25-18 with a 4.31 ERA (367.2IP, 342H, 209R/176ER, 140BB, 410K, 44HR) in 76 career appearances (74 starts)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Last pitched on Friday at the Athletics, earning the win after allowing just 1R/ER over a career-high 7.1IP (4H, 1BB, 7K, 0HR)...retired 15 of his first 17BF (1H, 1BB).

- ✦ Marked his first career road win and the second-longest start by a Yankee this season.

**2025:** Has gone 2-2 with a 4.75 ERA (36.0IP, 19ER) and 41K in eight starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in six of his eight starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in five of those starts...has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 4/6).

- ✦ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all four of his starts with at least 5.0IP this season.
- ✦ Is holding right-handed batters to a .189/.214/.321 (10-for-53) slash line.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 4/1 vs. Arizona and did not record a decision...allowed only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (1H, 4BB, 4K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit on a two-run HR to Corbin Carroll in the third inning.
- ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-4 loss in extra innings on 4/6 at Pittsburgh (4.0IP, 6H, 4R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...retired his first 8BF...allowed a two-run double to Bryan Reynolds in the third inning and two runs in the fourth inning on a sacrifice fly to Tommy Pham and an RBI double to Isiah Kiner-Falefa.
- ✦ Earned his first Major League win on 4/12 vs. San Francisco after allowing only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (2H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR)...after allowing a two-run HR to Wilmer Flores in the second inning, retired his next 10BF and 11 of his final 12BF.
- ✦ Recorded the shortest start of his career on 4/17 at Tampa Bay (ND, 1.2IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 1K, 0HR).
- ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 3-2 loss on 4/22 at Cleveland (5.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...after allowing a leadoff single in the first inning, did not allow a hit to his next 17BF (1BB)...exited the game with two runners on...Mark Leiter Jr. came on in relief and allowed both inherited runners to score.
- ✦ Took his second loss of the season on 5/4 vs. Tampa Bay after allowing 5R/3ER in 4.2IP (7H, 3BB, 8K, 1HR)...both his 8K and 102 pitches marked career highs...also set season highs in hits and runs allowed.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Will make his sixth road start of the season and eighth of his career today at Seattle...has gone 1-1 with a 5.12 ERA (31.2IP, 18ER) in his seven career road starts.

**2024:** Saw his first Major League action with the Yankees last season, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...opponents batted .340/.404/.608 (33-for-97, 5HR); LH .349/.442/.581 (15-for-43, 2HR); RH .333/.368/.630 (18-for-54, 3HR).

- ✦ Recorded at least 6K in three of his five starts.
- ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/30 at Philadelphia and did not record a decision (5.1IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...struck out Bryce Harper (swinging) in the first inning for his first Major League strikeout...retired 12 of his final 14 batters faced (1H, 1HP).
- ✦ Spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts.
- ✦ Over his final 13 starts with the RailRiders from 6/1-9/18, allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 10 of his 13 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in nine of those starts and one-or-zero earned runs in six starts...posted a 2.91 ERA (21.2IP, 14H, 9R/7ER, 6BB, 30K, 2HR) in four starts with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre during the month of July.
- ✦ Following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect.

**VS. SEATTLE:** Will be making his first career appearance vs. Seattle today.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Has made 14 career Major League appearances (13 starts), going 2-5 with a 6.90 ERA (58.2IP, 66H, 48R/45ER, 26BB, 70K, 9HR).

- ✦ Over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2022-24), has gone 25-18 with a 4.31 ERA (367.2IP, 342H, 209R/176ER, 140BB, 410K, 44HR) in 76 career appearances (74 starts)
- ✦ Did not pitch in 2021.
- ✦ Was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University (2018-21), going 13-10 with two complete games, four saves, a 3.90 ERA (205.1IP, 89ER) and 193K in 98 games (30 starts).
