METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 13-3, last night... New York has lost three straight games...New York is in a stretch of 10 straight games (0-2) before the All-Star Break...The Mets are in the midst of a seven-game, eight-day road trip (1-4) in Toronto (1-2) and Atlanta (0-2)...Following this series, the Mets return home for their final homestand before the All-Star break, a six-game homestand against the Kansas City Royals (three games) and Boston Red Sox (three games).

ROUGH STRETCH: The Mets have lost 12 of their last 14 games... During this period, the team has posted a 6.17 ERA (83 ER/121.0 IP) in that span, while batting .218/.299/.390...They have been outscored 93 to 46 during the stretch.

HOW NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Yesterday, MLB announced that outfielder Juan Soto was named to the National League All-Star team. The 96th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 14 in Philadelphia...Soto was selected by the fans and will make his second career All-Star starting nod...He also started the 2024 All-Star Game for the AL...Soto was named to his fifth overall All-Star team and first as a member of the Mets.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 262 career home runs...That is tied for the 11th-most in MLB history prior to turning 28 with Frank Robinson...Giancarlo Stanton s next with 267...His 262 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265.

THE BENGE: Carson Benge is on a 16-game on base streak and an nine-game hitting streak...Over the last 16 games, Benge is batting .290/.329/.478 with eight runs, two doubles, one triple, three homers, eight RBI, four walks, one steal and an .807 OPS...He is batting .275 (11-40) with two runs, one double, one homers and one walk over the eight-game hitting streak...His 84 hits are tied for the fourth-most by a rookie this season, while his .259 average is the sixth-best.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 17-28 on the road in 2026....Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 4.20 ERA on the road, which is seventh in the National League.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 24.0 innings (22 G)...Since May 1, is the only relief pitcher in the majors with 21.0 innings pitched and zero runs allowed...During the same stretch, has held opposing batters to a .122 (10-82) average and has pitched to a 0.63 WHIP...Among relievers since May 1, second third in WHIP and fourth in opponents' batting average (min. 50 batters faced).

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets fell to the Astros, 2-1, in front of 50,939 fans at Shea Stadium...Bob Ojeda allowed one run on six hits with one walks and seven strikeouts, but did not factor in the decision.... Roger McDowell took the loss, his first of the season...The Mets took an early lead thanks to a Keith Hernandez homer, but the Astros tied it in the seventh and went ahead in the top of the ninth to win it...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions..The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 10-14 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 4.47 ERA against the division, while batting .244/.313/.490..

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fifth win of the season after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings and striking out seven on June 30 at Toronto (6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 BB, 7 K)...Was his second start of this season that was at least 6.0 innings while not allowing an earned run (also: 6/17 at CIN)...Recorded at least six strikeouts for his fourth consecutive start.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 5-5 with a 3.78 ERA (40 ER/95.1 IP) with 113 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .205 batting average (71-347)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks tied for third in opposing batting average, seventh in strikeouts and 13th in WHIP (1.12)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, third in innings pitched, fourth in batting average against, sixth in WHIP, and 10th in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 11.7% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,307 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.4% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .109 (6-55) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the eighth-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 25 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .098 (8-82) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.2% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 34.7% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 17-run value, which is tied for the fourth-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .168 (25-149) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

AGAINST ATLANTA: Has faced the Braves twice in his career...He is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts against Atlanta...Has allowed two or fewer runs with six+ strikeouts in both his starts against Atlanta...His last start against Atlanta came on June 12 of this season and he allowed two runs over 4.0 innings.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 25 career starts, McLean is 10-6 with a 3.20 ERA (51 ER/143.1 IP) and 170 strikeouts...His 170 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 25 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 202, Matt Harvey's 185, Kodai Senga's 176 and Noah Syndergaard's 175...Per *Elias*....He is one of nine pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 170+ batters and allow 51 or fewer earned runs through their first 25 appearances.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
