METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were rained out the last two days...On Friday, the Mets fell to the Braves, 4-0, in a five-inning, rain-shortened contest...The Mets have lost five of their last six games...The Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-3) against the Nationals (1-2) and Braves (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets travel to Detroit for a three-game series.

ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Stephen Nogosek has been activated from the IL...Had been on the 15-Day IL with a left elbow bone bruise...The Mets made a series of roster moves the past few days...On Saturday, LHP Brooks Raley was placed on the 15-day IL, retroactive to April 28, with left elbow inflammation and RHP John Curtiss was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Adam Ottavino was reinstated from the paternity list and LHP David Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...Yesterday, RHP José Butto was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

DOUBLE DARE: The Mets are set to play their first doubleheader of the season today...New York played 10 doubleheaders in 2022...The Mets went 16-4 (.800) last season, the most wins in baseball in twin-bill games...The Mets have played 24 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 24 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 24 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...According to sportradar, the streak is tied for the second-longest in the expansion era...Only the Yankees (30 in a row from 1996-2006) have had a longer streak since 1961...New York has swept seven of their last 11 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps last season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

BASEBALL IS LIFE: Denyi Reyes will make his second career start in game one of today's twinbill...The 26-year-old signed a minor league contract with New York on November 23, 2022...This season with the Mets, he has thrown 6.1 scoreless innings in five appearances, allowing three hits with two walks and seven punchouts...He has posted a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) with 10 strikeouts and three walks in eight career major league outings (one start)...His first career start came last season with the Orioles at Boston on May 28...He threw 3.2 innings, allowed one run on four hits, walked one and struck out one.

JUST PEACHY: The Mets and Braves played two doubleheaders last year, on May 3 in New York and again on August 6 in New York...The Mets swept both twinbills...Prior to that, the Mets and Braves have split each of their previous three doubleheaders...The Mets have not been swept by the Braves in a doubleheader since they dropped both games on September 8, 2011 in New York.

ONE SHINING MOMENT: Prior to today's first game, the Mets will honor UConn's men's basketball team for their 2023 national championship...Head Coach Danny Hurley, a native of Jersey City, NJ will be in attendance and Andre Jackson Jr., a native of Amsterdam, NY, who averaged 18.8 points, 10.1 rebounds and 5.1 assists during his senior season will throw out the first pitch.

TYLOR THE CREATOR: Tylor Megill is slated to make his sixth start of the season in game two against the Braves...He is 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (11 ER/25.0 IP) with 12 walks and 19 strikeouts...It will mark his third start at Citi Field this year where he is 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) with five walks and six strikeouts...Megill has faced the Braves six times in his career (five starts) and is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11 ER/25.2 IP) with eight walks and 33 punchouts.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is on a seven-game on-base streak, batting .409 (9-22) with two runs, a double, one home run, two RBI and two walks in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games.

JEFF McHITS: Over his last 12 games, Jeff McNeil is batting .405 (17-42) with seven runs, two doubles, a home run, a triple, four RBI, five walks with a .490 OBP and a .571 SLG...Since April 16, he has raised his batting average from .212 to .298 and his OBP from .359 to .416...His .416 OBP is the eighth-best in the majors and sixth-highest in the National League.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded multiple hits in three of his last five games...He has 171 multi-hit game of his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 61 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette and Freddie Freeman who each have 65 multi-hit games since 2022.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: Going back to last season, the Mets have lost five straight and seven of their last eight to the Braves...New York is 56-71 against the Braves all-time at Citi Field.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: The Mets are fifth in the NL with 23 steals this season...Starling Marte is tied for ninth in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with eight steals...He ranks third among active players with 322 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (338) and Billy Hamilton (324) have more.

METS ON THE MOVE: Mets on the Move, presented by the Hospital for Special Surgery, is a fitness program dedicated to keeping kids active and healthy...This year, the Mets will work with 1,000 students at two local elementary schools...The program launches today and will run throughout the month to coincide with National Physical Fitness and Sports month...Participating students received pedometer watches to track their physical fitness...The more steps they accumulate, the more Mets prizes they can earn...Earlier today, Mets front office staff, members of the HSS Sports Safety Team, and Mr. Met visited one of the program's participating schools, P.S. 110 in Queens, and hosted a rally to introduce the program and get students excited to move!

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 5-5 at Citi Field this year...The team's 10 home games are the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 11 games and has allowed one run in 11.1 innings of work, good for a 0.79 ERA...He has allowed five hits, three walks while striking out 14 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .100 (2-20) batting average this season...He has converted all five save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 162 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 36 infield hits this season, which is the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo is fourth in the major leagues with a 1.6 fWAR...Over the last 17 games, Nimmo is batting .382 (26-68) with 12 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, one steal with a .442 OBP and a .544 SLG...He has raised his batting average from .192 to .330 in that span...The Wyoming native is fourth in the majors with a .435 OBP, fifth in batting average (.330) and is tied for 14th in the majors with 17 walks this season.

WALK, DON'T STRIKE: The Mets are tied for fourth in the majors with 109 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out 207 times this season, the second-fewest in the majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 17 walks and struck out 16 times this season...Jeff McNeil has 15 walks and has struck out only nine times...McNeil ranks fifth in the majors in strikeout rate, whiffing in just 8.1 percent of his plate appearances.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over the last 10 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 9-25 (.360) with two runs, one double, one home run, six RBI, four walks with a .448 OBP and a .520 SLG...He has posted a .417 OBP in 20 games this season, which is only behind Brandon Nimmo (.446) for the team lead.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors with 10 home runs and is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for the NL lead with 25 RBI.. Alonso is tied for 17th in MLB and tied for ninth in the NL with 20 runs scored and is 17th in the majors and 10th in the NL with a .562 SLG.

KING OF QUEENS: Pete Alonso has hit 66 home runs at Citi Field...That is tied with Michael Conforto for the second-most in the history of the ballpark...Only Lucas Duda (71) has hit more.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-low 4.0 innings and allowed a season-high four runs on six hits, one walk and two strikeouts against the Giants on April 23 at Oracle Park...Did not factor into the decision.

BIG DRIP VS. THE BRAVES: For his career, Megill has faced the Braves six times, including five starts, the most against any one opponent in his career...Megill is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11 ER/25.2 IP) and has held the Braves to a .598 OPS in those outings...In three starts against the Braves at Citi Field, Megill is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (6 ER/15.0 IP) and 19 strikeouts.

AMAZIN APRIL: In nine April starts since 2022, Megill is 7-1 with a 2.89 ERA (17 ER/53.0 IP) and 46 strikeouts...Megill's seven wins in April since last season are the third-most during that span...Clayton Kershaw and Joe Ryan have the most wins in April since 2022 with eight...Megill has allowed three runs or fewer in eight of his 10 career April starts.

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

DOIN' THE SPLITS: This season, righties are hitting just .174 (8-46) against Megill, which is the seventh-best mark in the majors among starting pitchers (Min. 50 RHB faced)...On the contrast, left-handers have batted .333 (17-51) against Megill, tied for the fifth-highest mark in the majors among starting pitchers (Min. 50 LHB faced)...For his career, Megill owns a .197 (61-309) opponent's average against right-handed batters, the ninth-best mark among right-handed starting pitchers since his major league debut on June 23, 2021 (min. 300 RHB faced)... During that same time frame, left-handed batters have a .311 (98-315) average against Megill, the third-highest mark among right-handed starting pitchers (min. 300 LHB faced).

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Megill is 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) in two home starts this season...In three road starts this season, Megill is 1-1 with a 5.79 ERA (9 ER/14.0 IP)...In 18 career home games (16 starts), Megill is 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA (38 ER/81.2 IP) and in 20 career road games (16 starts), Megill is 5-6 with a 5.04 ERA (45 ER/80.1 IP).

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 405 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).
- Homered and drove in four runs in consecutive games, April 20-21...He is the fourth player in Mets history with back-to-back 4+ RBI games, joining Lucas Duda, Carlos Beltran and Robin Ventura.
- Hit his 150th career home run on April 7 in the Mets home opener vs. Miami...Became the second-fastest player to reach 150 career home runs (538 games).
- Logged his 15th career multi-homer game on April 5 at Milwaukee...Slugged a pair of two-run homers...Lucas Duda and Dave Kingman are tied for sixth in Mets history with 16 multi-homer games each...Mike Piazza and Carlos Beltrán each had 17.
