THE PIRATES:...had the day off yesterday...Are 2-1 on their seven-day, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...Have gone 14-12, including 5-6 on the road, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023 )...Have gone $30-3$ (. 909 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have gone 10-5 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have surrendered the fewest home runs (18) among all teams in MLB this month (the Phillies have allowed 19, which are the second-fewest)...Have not been shut out in 25 straight games, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 58 games)...Are playing their final road series against the National League East for this season (have gone 8-6 against the NL East on the road this season)...Have gone $14-12$ in series openers ( $6-7$ on the road)...Are 20-21 after their first 41 road games (were 17-24 after 41 road games in 2023)... Have gone deep in a season-high eight straight games (it's their longest streak since a nine-game streak last year from 9/16-26).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting 351 (33-for-94) with seven doubles, a triple, six home runs and 16 RBI during his current career-high 23-game hitting streak...It's the longest hitting streak in MLB this season...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since 2003...That year Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games (April 29 to May 30) while Jason Kendall also had a 23 -game streak from June 24 to July 21... Reynolds' 23 -game hitting streak is one game shy of tying Maury Wills' 24-game streak for the longest by a Pirates switch hitter since 1901.

A MILESTONE FOR MARTÍN: Tonight is Martín Pérez' 300th career appearance in the big leagues...Pérez made his big league debut on June 27, 2012, with Texas...The 33-year-old Pérez has recorded a total of 1048 strikeouts in his big league career, which ranks 12th among Venezuelan-born pitchers (Felix Hernandez is first with 2524).

FOR STARTERS: Pittsburgh's starting rotation has the third-lowest ERA (3.35) among all teams in MLB this month...The only two teams with a lower starting rotation earned run average this month are the Astros (3.03) and Mariners (3.17)...Pittsburgh's starting rotation has also surrendered the fewest home runs (nine) in MLB this month (the next two closest teams are the Braves and Giants with 12 apiece).

HOT ROWD: Rowdy Tellez is hitting . 362 (21-for-58) with five doubles, two home runs, 12 RBI, .413 on-base percentage, .552 slugging percentage and .964 OPS in 18 games this month... Tellez is also 8 -for-11 (. 727 average) with 10 RBI while batting with runners in scoring position this month...Tellez ranks fifth in the National League in batting this month and ninth in OBP and OPS.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Pirates come into today ranked fifth in MLB in batting average (.305) with runners in scoring position this month...Individually, Bryan Reynolds leads all National League players with a 615 batting average with runners in scoring position this month, while teammate Jack Suwinski ranks sixth in the league with a . 462 average with RISP in June.

HITTIN' ON THE ROAD: Pittsburgh has at least 10 hits in each of its last five road games, which is tied for the second-longest such streak in MLB this season (Cincinnati first with six straight)... The Pirates are looking to have six straight road games with 10-plus hits for the first time since 2017 (May 23-June 4)...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today one strikeout shy of tying Billy Wagner for the most punchouts (1196) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history...The 36 -yearold Chapman is tied for sixth in strikeouts (47) among all NL relief pitchers this season...Chapman is also one save shy of tying Huston Street (324) for 20th place on the MLB all-time saves list since saves became an official stat in 1969 .

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen is two walks shy of tying Ralph Kiner (795) for fifth place on the Pirates all-time base on balls list...McCutchen is also one extrabase hit shy of tying Max Carey (590) for sixth place in that category on the Pirates all-time list.

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old lefthander is in his 13th Major League season, having played for the Rangers (2012-18; 2022-23), Twins (2019), Red Sox (2020-21) and Pirates (2024)...He was named an American League All-Star with the Rangers during the 2022 season...Tonight will be his 12th start of the season for the Pirates and his 300th career appearance on a Major League mound (excluding postseason)...A native of Guanare, Venezuela, Perez was signed by the Rangers as an international free agent as a 16 -year-old on July 2, 2007.

WELCOME BACK: Perez will be making his first start since leaving the game early on May 26 (also vs. Atlanta)...He was then placed on the 15 -day injured list with a left groin strain.

He made one rehab start with Triple-A Indianapolis on June 22 vs. Iowa (CHC), allowing two runs (one earned run) on five hits with four strikeouts and no walks over 5.0 innings of work ( 63 pitches, 41 strikes).

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: At the time of his injury, Perez ranked among the NL leaders in opponents grounded into double plays per 9.0 IP (1st, 1.41), opponents grounded into double plays (T2nd, 9) and pitches per batter faced (5th, 3.62) [min. 50.0 IP...stats represent start of the season thru May 26].

REACHING A MILESTONE: Tonight will be Perez' 300th career Major League appearance... When he takes the mound tonight, he'll become the 15th active player to have made 300-plus appearances and 250 -plus starts and the sixth left-hander to do so, joining Clayton Kershaw, Chris Sale, Wade Miley, Patrick Corbin and Jose Quintana.

LAST TIME OUT: Perez' last Major League outing came on May 26 vs. Atlanta, allowing one run on four hits with two strikeouts and two walks over 3.0 innings of work...He was removed from the game after the third inning with a left groin strain.

VS. ATLANTA: Perez will be making his third career start and appearance against the
Braves and his second of the season (see above note).

- Prior to this season, his only other outing against Atlanta was on August 7, 2019 at Target Field as a member of the Twins, taking the loss after allowing seven runs on 12 hits with six strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work.

CROSSIN' THEM OFF: Tonight will be Perez' first career start in Atlanta (in either Truist Park or Turner Field), making it the 29th active ballpark he has pitched in...After today, the only ballpark he has yet to pitch in will be Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles.

GETTING IT DONE: Perez has allowed three earned runs or fewer in eight of his 11 starts this season, as well as two earned runs or fewer six times and one or fewer four times (one outing of 0 earned runs on April 27 at SF).

AGAINST THE (B)EAST: Tonight will be Perez's fifth start of the season against NL East opponents, against whom he's gone 1-0 with a 3.20 ERA (7 ER in 19.2 IP).

- In 29 career appearances ( 22 starts) against the NL East, he's gone 10-5 with a 3.89 ERA (59 ER in 136.2 IP).

Dating back to Sept. 22, 2021, Perez has gone 5-0 with a 2.04 ERA (12 ER in 53.0 IP) in 13 games (eight starts) against NL East division opponents.
