PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (37-27) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (25-40)
June 8, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #66/Home #35
LHP Cristopher Sánchez (5-1, 3.15 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (4-6, 2.05 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won three of the first five games on this nine-game homestand (1-2 vs. Houston, 2-0 vs. Philadelphia)...Will welcome Miami to town for three games (Monday-Wednesday) to conclude the homestand...Have gone 13-14 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8...Are looking to win three straight games for the first time since winning four in a row last season from September 8-11...Have played in 13 one-run games (7-6 record) since Kelly took over.

HOW SWEEP: With a win today vs. Philadelphia, Pittsburgh would secure its first series sweep of 2025 and first since last season from September 9-11 vs. Miami...It would also mark the Pirates' first sweep over the Phillies since sweeping them here in Pittsburgh in both 2015 and 2014 (three games apiece)...Pittsburgh is 45-29 here at PNC Park (opened in 2001) against its cross-state rival.

SLICK NICK: Nick Gonzales tripled for the second straight game with his leadoff triple off Ranger Suárez in the first inning of Saturday's win vs. Philadelphia...He became the first Pirates batter to triple in back-to-back games since Cole Tucker from September 12-13, 2019...The last Pirate to triple in three consecutive contests was Starling Marte from September 15-17, 2012.

HAMMERIN' HANK: Henry Davis hit a game-winning, solo home run in the seventh inning of Saturday's 2-1 win vs. Philadelphia... Davis has gone deep in consecutive games for the first time in his career (hit a two-run shot off Alan Rangel on Friday)...The last Pirates catcher to homer in three straight games was Ryan Doumit from June 10-12, 2008...Across his last 13 games (since May 13 at New York-NL), Davis has gone 12-for-40 (.300) with two doubles, three homers, eight RBI, four walks and five runs scored.

PAUL-STAR: Paul Skenes will start for Pittsburgh in this afternoon's series finale vs. Philadelphia...Skenes gave up just one run while striking out eight batters over 8.0 innings in his last start on Tuesday vs. Houston, his second start this season of 8.0-plus innings, one or zero runs allowed and eight-plus strikeouts (also May 18 at Philadelphia)...He's the first Pirates pitcher to have two-such starts in a season since A.J. Burnett in 2012 (he's also the only Major League pitcher with two-such starts this season).

SUPERB SKENES: Paul Skenes has made four straight starts of 6.0-plus innings, one/zero runs allowed and seven-plus strikeouts, a streak that began on May 18 at Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Pittsburgh pitcher to ever do that in four straight starts (also did it in four straight from last June 11-29)...In his May 18 start in Philadelphia, Skenes tossed his first career complete game, but suffered a loss (1-0 defeat).

GO FISH: Following the finale of this series vs. Philadelphia, Pittsburgh will wrap up its nine-game homestand with three games vs. Miami...The Pirates opened the 2025 season against the Marlins at loanDepot park (March 27-30), dropping three of four games (all three losses were in walkoff fashion)...Pittsburgh swept Miami here at PNC Park in a three-game series last September 9-11.

ISIAH'S IMPACT: Isiah Kiner-Falefa singled on Saturday vs. Philadelphia and has now hit safely in 17 of his last 19 games (since May 17 at Philadelphia)... During that stretch, Kiner-Falefa has batted .354 (23-for-65) with six doubles and six RBI...His .354 average during that stretch is tied with Arizona's Ketel Marte for second-best in the National League and tied for ninth-best in MLB.

RELIABLE ROTATION: Andrew Heaney allowed just one run over 6.0 innings in Saturday's victory over Philadelphia...Pittsburgh's 19 starts of 6.0-plus innings and one or zero runs allowed this season are tied with Philadelphia and Texas for the third-most among all Major League teams...Only Kansas City (22) and Cincinnati (20) have more-such starts...The Pirates' 3.66 ERA from its starting rotation this season ranks fifth in the National League (10th in all of MLB)...Their 30 quality starts are tied with San Francisco for fourth-most in all of MLB, behind only Philadelphia (33), Tampa Bay (33) and Kansas City (32).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: Skenes will make his 14th start of the season today vs. Philadelphia...Took home BBWAA NL Rookie of the Year honors in 2024 after making his MLB debut on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...Was the first-overall pick by Pittsburgh in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft (LSU).

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes gave up just one run on three hits and one walk (eight strikeouts) over 8.0 innings on Tuesday vs. Houston, losing a 3-0 decision...It was his second start this season of 8.0-plus innings, one or zero runs allowed and eight-plus strikeouts (also May 18 at Philadelphia)...He's the first Pirates pitcher to have two-such starts in a season since A.J. Burnett in 2012 (he's also the only Major Leaguer with two-such starts this season)...Skenes has also made four consecutive starts of 6.0-plus innings, one run or fewer allowed and seven-plus strikeouts (since May 18)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Pittsburgh pitcher to ever do that in four straight starts (he also did it in four straight last season from June 11-29).

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: In his only start against Philadelphia, which came on May 18 at Citizens Bank Park, Skenes tossed a complete game, allowing one run on three hits and one walk (nine strikeouts) over 8.0 innings while losing a 1-0 decision...He was the first Pirate to lose while throwing a complete game since Ivan Nova on April 17, 2017 at St. Louis (2-1 loss) and the first to do it while allowing fewer than two runs since Todd Ritchie on May 25, 2001 at Atlanta (1-0 loss).

A MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Skenes recorded a 1.91 ERA (37.2ip/8er) in six starts last month, ninth-best in the entire National League (teammate Bailey Falter, 0.76, was second in the NL).

ALL-AMERICAN: Skenes appeared on MLB Network on May 13, where he was named as a member of Team USA for next year's World Baseball Classic by manager Mark DeRosa...It will mark the fourth time he's represented the United States, having also played for the 12U National Team in 2014, as well as the Collegiate National Team in the summers of both 2021 and 2022.

LIMITING THE HITS: Skenes has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his first 36 starts to begin his career...That's the longest-such streak (excluding openers) to start a career...In his start on May 12 at New York (NL), he broke a tie with Shohei Ohtani, who did it in 31 straight from 2018-21.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO: Skenes' 2.00 career ERA (216.1ip/48er) is the lowest of any Major League starter (minimum 30 starts, excluding openers) in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...His 2.00 ERA since May 11, 2024 (day of Skenes' Major League debut) is also the lowest in all of Major League Baseball (minimum 30 starts)...Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler (2.90) ranks 12th on the list.

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes recently partnered with New Era Cap, launching a charitable initiative to support America's veterans...For every strikeout that Skenes records throughout the rest of this season, New Era will donate \$250 to a veterans-focused charity of his choosing.

QUR ACE: Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career (May 11, 2024 to April 2, 2025), Skenes pitched to a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs were officially tracked in both leagues in 1913 to post a sub-2.00 ERA with 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League games.

OPENING DAY HONORS: Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings, but had a no-decision, on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old...Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).
