METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the team fell to the Padres, 5-0...The Mets have dropped three straight after winning seven straight...Today, the Mets starts a six-game homestand on Friday against the Giants and Guardians.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: The Mets acquired three players since the start of their last game...On Wednesday, the Mets acquired RHP Tyler Rogers (#71) from the Giants and RHP Ryan Helsley (#58) from the Cardinals...On Thursday, the Mets acquired OF Cedric Mullins (#28) from the Orioles...Rogers ranks third in the majors with a 2.1% walk rate, fifth with a 64.4% ground ball rate and 12th with a 0.86 WHIP (min. 100 batters faced)...Helsly ranks fifth in the National League with 21 saves and tied for eighth with 29 games finished...Since the start of 2024 season, he ranks second in the majors with 70 saves...In 23 games in July, Mullins has hit .290/346/522 with seven doubles, three homers, 10 RBI, six steals and an .868 OPS. He owns an .866 OPS vs. southpaws, the sixth-highest mark in the majors by a left-handed hitter (min. 80 PA).

THE DAVID: David Peterson will be making his 21st start of the season tonight, matching his career high (also: 2023 and 2024)...With his first out, Peterson will also have a new career high in innings pitched (previous: 121.0 in 2024)...He made four starts in the month of July, going 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP)...His July ERA was his lowest in a single calendar month of his career (min. 15.0 IP) and the sixth-best all-time by a Mets pitcher in the month of July (min. 20.0 IP)...He has allowed one or zero earned runs in a career-high four consecutive starts and has recorded four straight quality starts for the second time this season (also: 4 GS from 5/6-24)...His longest quality start stretch came in a five-start span from 8/14-9/3/24.

KING OF QUEENS: The Mets are 10-0 in Peterson's home starts this season...The team's 10 consecutive wins in Peterson's starts is the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history (longest: 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season)...Courtesy of *Elias*...The southpaw has gone 5-0 with a 1.91 ERA (13 ER/61.1 IP), 16 walks and 49 strikeouts at home this year.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 37-16 record at home...Their .698 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors...Their home record is tied with the 1986 for the best through the club's first 53 home games of a season in franchise history...Their 37 wins are tied for the most in The Show...New York has posted a 3.19 ERA at home this year, which is the third-best in MLB and second in the NL.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 28 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single-season since Milwaukee recorded 29 consecutive steals from September 15-28, 2024...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with an 89.7% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the NL and second-fewest in the majors (Detroit, 10)...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 15 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

METSIES GO WEST: The Mets are in the midst of nine straight games against the NL West (3-3)...They faced the Giants in San Francisco for three games (3-0), the Padres in San Diego for three (0-3) and head home to Citi Field to face the Giants for three games...The Mets are 16-9 against the NL West this season...New York went 17-15 against the NL West in 2024.

20/20 VISION: The Mets are one of three teams to feature three players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor and Juan Soto)...The Cubs and Diamondbacks also feature three players with 20+ homers...Brandon Nimmo has 19 homers...The Mets have had six seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Pete Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets earned their first series victory last weekend in San Francisco since they went 2-1 from August 31-September 2, 2018...The Mets are 23-27 against the Giants all-time at Citi Field.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his last start on July 26 at San Francisco and earned his seventh win of the season after allowing just on earned run over 6.0 innings (8 H, 3 BB, 4 K)...Struck out Wilmer Flores swinging in the fourth to mark his 562nd career strikeout, passing Al Jackson for the ninth-most strikeouts by a lefty in in franchise history.

SUMMER HEAT: Made four starts in the month of July, going 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP)...His July ERA was his lowest in a single calendar month of his career (min. 15.0 IP) and the fifth-best by a Mets pitcher in the month of July in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP)...His ERA was also the eighth-best in a single calendar month by a left-hander in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP), trailing only Jerry Koosman's 1.04 ERA in April 1968, Koosman's 0.72 ERA in June 1969, Jon Matlack's 0.86 ERA in 1972, Frank Viola's 0.86 ERA in April 1991, Al Leiter's 0.92 ERA in April 2002, Tug McGraw's 0.64 ERA in September 1973, Jose Quintana's 0.72 ERA in September 2024...Courtesy of *Elias*...Among pitchers in July (min. 25.0 IP), he ranked fourth in ERA (second in NL), eighth in opponents' SLG (.283, fifth in NL) and ninth in groundball percentage (54.8, seventh in NL)...He has allowed one or zero earned runs in a career-high four consecutive starts and has recorded four straight quality starts for the second time this season (also: 4 GS from 5/6-24)...His longest quality start stretch came in a five-start span from 8/14-9/3/24.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Mets are 10-0 in Peterson's home starts this season...The team's 10 consecutive wins in Peterson's starts is the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of *Elias*...The southpaw has gone 5-0 with a 1.91 ERA (13 ER/61.1 IP), 16 walks and 49 strikeouts at home this year...Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of those 10 games and two runs or fewer in nine...His 13 earned runs allowed in his first 10 home starts are tied for the seventh lowest in franchise history...The Mets are 16-3 in his 19 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 41-17 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over 20 starts this season, has gone 7-4 with a 2.83 ERA (38 ER/121.0 IP), 41 walks and 101 strikeouts...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 18 of his 20 starts this season and in 19 of his last 21 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is tied for the third in opponent GIDP (16, tied for second in NL), fourth in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.52, second in NL) and sixth in groundball percentage (55.6, fourth in NL)...Is also sixth in the NL in opponents' SLG (.336) and seventh in ERA.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 34 of his 41 starts, going 17-7 with a 2.86 ERA (77 ER/242.0 IP), 87 walks and 202 strikeouts...25 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 27-14 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just five runs in the first inning, which is tied with Paul Skenes for the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is third in HR/9.0 IP (0.56, second in NL), sixth in groundball percentage (53.0, fourth in NL), seventh in ERA (third in NL) and eighth in opponents' SLG (.342, fourth in NL).

VS. GIANTS/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his fifth career start against San Francisco tonight, his last coming just six days ago on July 26 (W, 6.0 IP, 8 H, ER, 3 BB, 4 K)...Has made 16 starts against National League opponents this season, the Mets going 11-5 in those games.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: With his first out tonight, Peterson will have a new career high in innings pitched (previous: 121.0 in 2024)...He is also making his 21st start of the season, tying his career high (also: 2023 and 2024)...Has 565 career strikeouts, the ninth-most by a franchise southpaw...John Franco is next on the list with 592...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .225/.275/.294 slash line (20-96) and has allowed just one home run to 110 batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is fourth in groundball percentage (66.2) and is tied for eighth in strikeouts (31)...Among NL southpaws facing lefties, he is seventh in opponents' SLG, eighth in opponents' OPS (.569) and opponents' OBP and ninth in opponents' BA...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: David Peterson has used his slider 20.4% of the time this season...Of his 101 strikeouts, 53 have come using this pitch...Has recorded a 30.8% put away rate and a 35.2% whiff rate with the pitch this season, both rates the highest among pitches in his arsenal.

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded 13 quality starts in 20 total outings this season, including 11 of his last 14 starts...Has recorded four straight quality starts for the second time this season (also: 4 GS from 5/6-24), which is tied for the second-longest such streak in his career...His longest quality start stretch came in a five-start span from 8/14-9/3/24....Peterson has recorded 25 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 23 of them coming in his last 36 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of six pitchers (one of three in NL) to record at least 23 quality starts and one of three left-handers to do so.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: On July 10, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He is the first Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of seven (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is the best in the majors...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 31 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen is next on the list at 22...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

SOUTHPAW SHUTOUT: On June 11 vs. the Nationals, Peterson tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career (6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

CAREER NOTES: With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts and was the first to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010...This season, had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 35-28 with a 3.82 ERA (244 ER/575.0 IP), 238 walks and 565 strikeouts in 121 games (105 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
