RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals embark on a six-game road trip to Houston and Miami with the first of a three-game series against the Houston Astros tonight at Daikin Park. The Cardinals have won two in a row and are a half game back of Cincinnati and Pittsburgh for first place in the National League Central. The entire N.L. Central is separated by 1.5 games in the standings with all five teams posting a .500 record or better.

WORKING FOR THE WEEKEND: The Cardinals and Astros are playing a weekend series in Houston for the first time since they were division rivals in the National League Central, with the last time, May 4-6, 2012. Since the Astros joined the American League in 2013, St. Louis and Houston have split their series 10-10 and with the Cardinals posting a 4-3 mark at Daikin Park.

WE'RE GOING TO PLAY: This road trip is comprised of two opponents who have retractable roofs where weather cannot complicate the game being played. In Cardinals franchise history, they have a 457-470 record when playing in retractable roof or domed stadiums. The last time the Cardinals posted a winning record on a road trip of two cities or more with guaranteed playing conditions was May 4-9, 2012; playing at Houston (1-2) and then then at Arizona (3-0). In 2015, St. Louis was 14-2 in stadiums with domes/roofs.

POD SQUAD: The Cardinals are playing the second of their four Gold Coast pod teams from Spring Training. March 30-April 1, they played the New York Mets (Port St. Lucie), then at the Washington Nationals (West Palm Beach) Apr. 6-8, and will cross off the Houston Astros (West Palm Beach) this weekend before going to Miami (Jupiter) to complete this road trip.

SHUSTER CLEARS WAIVERS, ASSIGNED TO MEMPHIS: On Thursday, Cardinals LHP Jared Shuster cleared waivers and was assigned to Memphis (AAA).

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE BEST KIND: Through 18 games, the Cardinals have the 2nd-best record in MLB in games decided by two runs or less at 8-1, trailing only the Cincinnati Reds (8-0). When the Cardinals score first, they are a perfect 6-0, the only unblemished mark in the league (six teams with one loss). **THIS STAT ISN'T DONE YET...:** St. Louis is tied for the MLB lead in walk-off wins (3) with San Diego and come-from-behind wins (8) with Arizona and Los Angeles-NL.

0.00'BRIEN: Cardinals relief pitcher Riley O'Brien is off torrid start in 2026 without allowing an earned run in his first five appearances (10.1 IP) and would all be scoreless if Major League Baseball did not allow free baserunners in extra inning games. O'Brien has closed down all five save opportunities and is tied with three other pitchers, including teammate JoJo Romero, as the only National League qualifying relievers with a 0.00 ERA. O'Brien has not allowed a hit since April 1 and has compiled an 0.39 WHIP ranking 2nd only to Padres' Mason Miller 0.21 for the league lead.

HIT MAN: Jordan Walker extended his hitting streak to 11 games on Wednesday with an 8th inning double. The streak currently ranks T-2nd in MLB for actives behind Arizona's Ildemaro Vargas for the 2026 season (Vargas extends to 15 back to 9/26/25). Walker double-digit hit streak marks the 4th of his career and first since 2023 when he posted three different streaks of 10 games or more as a rookie and was the only player in MLB to have three different double-digit marks that season. Walker's longest streak is 17 games (June 6-29, 2023).

WALKER'S WORLD: Jordan Walker leads the National League and is tied with the Yankees' Aaron Judge for the Major League lead with eight home runs. The last season the Cardinals had the Major League home run leader was Albert Pujols with 47 in 2009. Walker also leads the National League in slugging pct. (.710) and total bases (49). The only player to match him in the lead in the American League is in the other dugout in Yordan Alvarez of the Astros (.731 slugging & 49 total bases).

TAI'S THE GUY: Cardinals 20-year old minor league OF Tai Peete (acquired from Mariners in three-team trade for Brendan Donovan), hit for the cycle and went 4-for-7 with four runs scored and four RBI with Peoria (A) last night at Wisconsin.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Tonight marks his 4th start of the season (5th career) and 102nd career appearance.
- Drew back-to-back starting assignments in nationally televised games on Easter Sunday on NBC/Peacock Sunday Night Baseball in Detroit and April 11 vs. Boston on FOX.
- Gained his lone win of the season on April 5, allowing 2 runs over 5.0 IP in the Cardinals 5-3 over the Tigers. He threw a career-high 97 pitches as he earned the winning decision as a starter for the 1st time - all while helping to prevent a series sweep by Detroit.
- His first 97 appearances were as a relief pitcher following his Major League debut on July 7, 2023. First start came at Chicago's Wrigley Field on Sept. 28, 2025.
- Started 72-of-89 games over his first four professional seasons (2018-19, 2021-22).
- Has allowed 11 home runs in his 101 career outings, the fewest by a Cardinal through his first 101 career games since **Génesis Cabrera** allowed eight homers from 2019-21 and fewest by a St. Louis right-hander since **Jordan Hicks** gave up three HRs from 2018-19.
- Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinals pitcher since Jordan Hicks (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.**

LAST TIME OUT (Saturday, April 11 vs. Boston): W, 5-3: 5.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 3 BB, 4 SO; 97 pitches.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

EASTER DELIGHT: Gained his 1st win of the season on April 5, allowing 2 runs over 5.0 IP in the Cardinals 5-3 Easter win over the Tigers. He threw a career-high 97 pitches as he earned the winning decision as a starter for the 1st time - all while helping to prevent a series sweep by Detroit.

IT'S COLDER IN BOULDER: The Colorado native worked in game time temps of 42 degrees on Easter Sunday in Detroit, his third career MLB appearance in temperatures 45 degrees and below, two shy of matching Cardinals announcer **Brad Thompson** (5) for T-3rd among Cardinals in the frosty temps.

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED...: Took the loss in his first career home start vs. NYM (3/30) allowing four runs over a then career-high 5.0 innings and 79 pitches.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

NL Reliever Ranks: Innings Pitched (85.0, 1st), Batters Faced (354, 1st), Strikeouts (79, 8th).

MULTI-INNING MAGIC: Spent the entire season with St. Louis and led MLB with 32 relief appearances of at least 1.1 innings, the most by a Cardinals reliever since **John Frascatore** had 32 such appearances in 1998.

INNINGS EATER: Pitched an NL-high 85.0 innings as a reliever, the most by a Cardinals relief pitcher since **Manny Aybar** tossed 93.1 innings of relief in 1999. His 61 relief appearances were also the most among Cardinals right-handed pitchers.

TAKE A WHIFF: Became the first Cardinals reliever since **Tyler Lyons** (2017) to strike out at least seven batters in 3.2 IP or fewer on 7/22 at Colorado and the 6th to do so in franchise history, along with **Dave LaPoint** (1983), **Doug Bair** (1982), **Bobby Shantz** (1963) and **Dizzy Dean** (1934). His seven K's were tied for the third most among NL relievers in 2025, behind only CHC's Ben Brown and ATL's Chris Sale, who both had nine.

SPECIAL TRIBUTE: His career-high 7 strikeout performance on 7/22 at Coors Field came on the same day he learned of the passing of his grandmother. Kyle often-times attended Rockies games as a child with his grandparents.

LET'S GET STARTED: Made his first career MLB start in the season finale on 9/28 at CHC, working 3.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, no walks and one strikeout, his first start since 7/29/23 with Triple-A Memphis vs. Iowa (Cubs).

VERSATILITY: Became the first Cardinals pitcher to make at least 62 appearances and at least one start since **Jeff Fassero** (62 G, 6 GS) in 2003 and the first Cardinals right-hander to do so since **Manny Aybar** (65 G, 1 GS) in 1999.

OUT OF THE GATE: Allowed a combined three runs through his first 15 appearances across March/April for a 1.47 ERA (3 ER/18.1 IP) that led the team (min. 10.0 IP) and led all NL relievers with a .086 opp. batting average (5-58) in March/April that was the lowest by a Cardinals pitcher since **Todd Worrell** posted a .059 mark (2-34) in 1992.

STREAKING: Compiled a career-high, 14.0-inning scoreless streak from April 21-May 20 that was the second-longest streak of the year by a Cardinals reliever, trailing only **Matt Svanson** (15.2 IP, 7/29-8/21).

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE: Generated eight double plays as a relief pitcher (9 total) to lead the St. Louis relief corps. and T-8th among NL relievers.

UNDER THE HOOD: Ranked in the 96th percentile in extension at 7.2 ft., and in the 93rd percentile with 9 runs prevented via breaking ball run value, which measures the effectiveness of a pitch by calculating the run impact of every event, factoring in count, runners on base, and outs.

CAREER:

- Graduated from Erie (Colo.) High School. Named Boulder County Player of the Year and was selected to play at the High School Futures Game at Coors Field.
- Played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction, Colo., going 22-2 with a 3.13 ERA (204.1 IP), 188 strikeouts and six complete games.
- Allowed nine home runs to 852 total batters faced while pitching in high altitude (Grand Junction is 4,583 ft above sea level).
- Posted a 13-0 record with a 1.41 ERA during his sophomore season, earning First Team All-American, First Team Academic All-American, and was the South Central Regional Tournament MVP.
- Pitched two summers for the Waterloo Bucks of the collegiate summer Northwoods League (2016-17).
- His father, Tim Leahy, played college basketball at Kansas State University.
- His uncle, Thomas Leahy, pitched in the Braves organization (1991-93) advancing to Durham (High-A).

LEAHY VS. HOUSTON:

- Makes his first career Major League start and 4th appearance against Houston tonight.
- Previously faced the Astros in three relief outings (2024-25), going 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (5.2 IP) and five strikeouts.
- Made three Grapefruit League starts vs. Houston in 2026, going 1-0 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0ip) and 14 strikeouts.
- Tonight marks Leahy's 3rd consecutive Interleague start following April 5 at Detroit and April 11 vs. Boston.
