METSCPELLANEOUS: The Mets earned their first win of the season in game two of a twinbill against the Tigers on Thursday in New York City...The win snapped a five-game losing streak to start the season...Tonight, the Mets head out on the road for the first time in 2024, visiting Cincinnati (three games) and Atlanta (four games)...The Mets are currently in a streak of 15 games in 14-days...New York has gone 1-1 in that span.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has posted a 2.35 ERA (8 ER/30.2 IP) with 13 walks and 31 strikeouts...Their 2.35 ERA is second in the National League and fifth in the majors.

ME AND JULIO DOWN AT THE REDS YARD: The Mets have officially signed RHP Julio Teheran (no accent)...He will be active tonight and wear #49...RHP Michael Tonkin has been designated for assignment...Teheran owns a career record of 81-82 with a 4.40 ERA along with 490 walks and 1,257 strikeouts...His 81 wins by a Colombian-born pitcher are the second-most in major league history, trailing only teammate Jose Quintana (92).

PAT ZACHRY: RHP Pat Zachry died last night at age 71...Zachry was acquired by the Mets as part of the Tom Seaver trade from Cincinnati on June 15, 1977...Zachry went 41-46 with a 3.63 ERA (299 ER/741.2 IP) in 135 games, 113 starts for New York during six seasons (1977-1982).

MENDOZA LINES: Congrats to Carlos Mendoza who notched his first win as a major league manager yesterday...Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach... From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach... Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

SEEING RED AGAIN: In three games at Great American Ball Park, Francisco Alvarez is a .364 (4-11) hitter with two runs, one double, two home runs, two RBI and a walk...Francisco Lindor has hit .311 (28-90) with 17 runs, three doubles, seven home runs, 12 RBI, seven walks with a .578 SLG...Brandon Nimmo has hit .288/.397/.455 with four extra-base hits and 10 RBI...Pete Alonso has hit five home runs in 12 games at the ballpark

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .400 (8-20) with three runs, one home run, four RBI, one walks with a .429 OBP, a .700 SLG and a 1.129 OPS through six games this season.

HIP, HIP, JOSE: LHP Jose Quintana is slated to make his second start of the season tonight...In 14 career games (13 starts) against the Reds, Quintana is 5-4 with a 3.03 ERA (26 ER/77.1 IP) with 22 walks and 58 strikeouts...In six games (five starts) since June 29, 2019 against the Reds, the Colombian is 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (5 ER/35.1 IP) with four walks and 24 punchouts...He is 2-2 with a 2.93 ERA (10 ER/30.2 IP) with nine walks and 25 strikeouts in six games (five starts) at Great American Ball Park.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York begins their road schedule today...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Last night, RHP Christian Scott made his first career Triple-A Start...Scott allowed three runs on five hits, but struck out nine without walking a batter in 4.0 innings...The 24-year-old is ranked as the fifth-best prospect in the organization and the top pitching prospect according to MLB Pipeline...He was selected in the fifth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded 206 multi-hit games in his career... That places him 18th on the Mets All-Time list...Next up is Lee Mazzilli who record 207 multi-ht games, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 and Félix Millán who managed 211 such games with the Mets.

THIS IS 500: Pete Alonso hit a solo home run in the bottom of the ninth in game two of Thursday's twinbill...The home runs marked Alonso's 500th career RBI...He is the 10th player in franchise history to record 500 RBI...In recording his 500th career RBI in his 690th career game, Alonso became the fastest player in franchise history to reach 500 career RBI...Alonso's 500 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 at after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

THE GOOD DOC: On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

HERE'S THE PITCH: The Mets pitching staff has posted a 2.37 ERA (15 ER/57.0 IP) with 22 walks and 59 strikeouts...The team's 2.37 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit and the third-best in the majors.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: Overall, New York's bullpen has posted a 2.39 ERA (7 ER/26.1 IP) with nine walks and 28 strikeouts...The team's 2.39 ERA is the second-best in the National League...Only Pittsburgh's 2.15 ERA (7 ER/29.1 IP) is lower.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

SEEING RED AGAIN: LHP Jose Quintana is slated to make his second start of the season tonight...In 14 career games (13 starts) against the Reds, Quintana is 5-4 with a 3.03 ERA (26 ER/77.1 IP) with 22 walks and 58 strikeouts...In six games (five starts) since June 29, 2019 against the Reds, the Colombian is 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (5 ER/35.1 IP) with four walks and 24 punchouts...He is 2-2 with a 2.93 ERA (10 ER/30.2 IPO) with nine walks and 25 strikeouts in six games (five starts) at Great American Ball Park.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN: In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

METS DEBUT SEASON: After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

300 CLUB: In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September...It was the lowest ERA in any month in his career...Since 2022, Quintana has allowed 13 home runs, tied for the lowest total during that span (min 150.0 IP).

2023 REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (0-0, 0.00)

METS DEBUT: Severino made his first start of the season on March 30 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...After a scoring change, his final line was changed...He allowed six runs (three earned) on 11 hits with one home runs and six strikeouts.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).
