METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets defeated the Dodgers, 2-1, via walk-off in extra innings...The victory snapped a four game losing streak...New York continues the second-half with a seven-day, six-game homestand (1-2) against the Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2) and the Chicago White Sox (three games)...Following this series, the Mets hit the road for a five-game, six-day road trip to Boston (three games) and The Bronx (two games).

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, LHP T.J. McFarland and RHP Stephen Ridings were outrighted to Triple-A Syracuse...T.J. McFarland has elected free agency.

NO MINOR THING: On Sunday, Mike Vasil made his second start for Triple-A Syracuse...He tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two runs on four hits with two walks and struck out five...In 15 starts this season across Double-A and Triple-A, Vasil has posted a 2-3 record with a 4.52 ERA (35 ER/69.2 IP) with 20 walks and 80 strikeouts...Vasil was selected in the eight round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia...He is ranked as the eighth-best prospect in the Mets organization according to MLB.com.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Mets recorded their fourth walk-off win of the season on Sunday...The team improved to 6-1 in extra-inning games with a victory on Sunday...The Mets are now 16-3 in extra-inning games since 2022, the best record during that span.

THANK YOU FANS: As a thank you to our fans, anyone holding a ticket for Sunday's game will receive a digital voucher for a ticket to any remaining Monday-Thursday Mets 2023 regular season home game at Citi Field, subject to availability...For more information, visit Mets.com/rain.

JULY! JULY!: The Mets are 7-4 through 11 games in this month... The team's .636 winning percentage is tied for fourth in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.91 ERA (32 ER/99.0 IP), the lowest ERA in July...Only the Mariners (2.50 ERA) have a lower mark in July.

DROVE TO CHICAGO, ALL THINGS GO: The Mets host the Chicago White Sox at Citi Field for the first time since 2016...The Mets are 7-6 all-time against the White Sox including a 2-3 mark at Citi Field...The Mets have hosted the White Sox in a two-game series from May 7-8, 2013 and a three-game set from May 30-June 1, 2016...Starling Marte is a lifetime .270.386/.426 hitter in 14 career games against the Sox, while Omar Narvaez has hit .361 (13-36) with four runs, a home runs and three RBI in 10 career contests...Daniel Vogelbach owns a .321 (9-28) mark with five runs, two doubles, three home runs and nine RBI in 10 career games...Francisco Lindor owns a .272/.344/.450 slashline with 33 extra-base hits and 37 RBI in 90 games against the White Sox.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets tonight begin a stretch of eight consecutive games against American League opponents...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 10-10 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 245-237 record in Interleague play... The team's .508 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

WHITE SOX-METS NOTES: The Mets last faced the White Sox from July 30-August 1, 2019 in Chicago...The Mets swept the series.

ALL-AMERICAN: Starling Marte has slashed .325/.385/.538 with 47 doubles, 11 triples, 29 home runs and 93 RBI in 189 career Interleague games...Jeff McNeil has batted .320 (103-322) with 41 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs, 39 RBI, 22 walks with a .370 OBP and a .432 SLG in 87 career games against the American League...Marte's .325 average ranks third, while McNeil's .320 average ranks fourth among active players in Interleague games.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson tossed 2.0 scoreless innings on Sunday...It was the second time this season he tossed at least 2.0 innings...He is 1-0 with a save and has not allowed a run in those appearances, striking out five in the process...The veteran righthander has posted a 4-2 record with 12 saves and a 1.96 ERA (9 ER/41.1 IP) in 37 appearances this season...He has walked 11, while striking out 47...He ranks 12th in ERA among major league relievers and sixth in the $\ensuremath{\text{NL}}...\ensuremath{\text{He}}$ is tied for 21st in the $\ensuremath{\text{NL}}$ with 47 punchouts as a reliever...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .182 (14-77) average this year.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 270-239 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .531 winning percentage during that span is the fourth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.627), St. Louis (.596) and Chicago (.576).

IN THE CITI: The Mets have played 42 games at Citi Field this season, tied for the fewest home games in the majors...The Phillies have also played 42 games at home this year...New York is 21-21 at Citi Field this season, posting a 3.88 ERA.

POWER UP: Brandon Nimmo has hit 14 home runs this season... He is three away from matching his career-high of 17, which he accomplished in 2018...Nimmo has hit six home runs in his last 15 games...All 14 of his home runs have come against right-handed pitchers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 28-5 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 13-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 4-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) over 26 games...Raley has 17 holds, tied for the fourth-most in the NL and tied for the seventh-most in the majors. ..In 21 games at Citi Field this season, Raley has posted a 1.62 ERA 93 ER/16.2 IP) with four walks and 14 punchouts.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 13 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 74 steals in 81 attempts...Their 74 steals are tied for ninth in the majors and tied for fifth in the NL...The team's 91.4 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of $35\,$ consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 48 of their last 49 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 24 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 338 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 8.0 shutout innings against the Diamondbacks at Chase Field on July 6...Allowed three hits and one walk while striking out four batters in a 9-0 Mets victory.

KNOCKING THEIR SOX OFF: Carrasco will face Chicago-AL for the first time this season...Carrasco will be making his 31st appearance against the White Sox in his career, making his 27th start against the Southsiders...In his last appearance against the White Sox on September 26, 2019 at Guaranteed Rate Field while with Cleveland, he threw 1.1 innings in relief, allowing two earned runs on three hits and a walk while fanning one batter...His last win against the White Sox came on May 14, 2019, after throwing 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing six hits while striking out six...Throughout his career against Chicago-AL, Carrasco has pitched to a 4.24 ERA (75 ER/163.0 IP) and holds a 10-12 record...Carrasco holds a 7-6 record with a 3.98 ERA (38 ER/86.0 IP) on the road compared to a 3-6 record and a 4.32 FRA (33 FR/77.0 IP) when at home.

COOKIE CRISP: In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 80th percentile in curve spin.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES & MEMORIES: With 4.0 innings on June 30, Carrasco became the 21st active pitcher to reach the 1500.0 inning milestone...ls also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 295 and 248, respectively...Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one $\,$ of eight Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,500.0 career innings pitched on July 6 vs. Arizona...Carrasco is currently ranked seventh among Venezuelan-born pitchers with 1508.0 career innings pitched.

Verlander ranks 25th in major league history with 333 quality starts and is four quality starts shy of tying Walter Johnson, Jim Palmer and Rick Reuschel for 22nd all-time.
