**Sept. 24, 2015:** Alex Rodriguez becomes the eighth player in Major League history to score 2,000 career runs, touching the plate in the third inning of a 3-2 win over the White Sox at Yankee Stadium.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees begin their final regular season homestand with the first game of a three-game set vs. Chicago-AL (through Thurs.)...will also face Baltimore this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 7-3 on their final road trip of the regular season after winning each of their series at Boston (2-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Baltimore (3-1).

► **Their 88-68 (.564) record is the second-best in the AL and tied for the fourth-best in the Majors.**

► Have won 10 of their last 12 series (since 8/11).

► **Are 19-8 in their last 27 games (since 8/24), 24-11 in their last 35 games (since 8/15) and a Major League-best 28-14 in their last 42 games (since 8/6).**

► Their +144 run differential is the highest in the AL and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (+180).

► **Are a season-high 20G over .500.**

► Are 44-31 at home this season...**marks their 34th straight winning season at home (since 1992)**...according to *Elias*, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.

**WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** The Yankees clinched a series win over Baltimore with a 7-1 extra-inning win on Sunday at Camden Yards...

**RHP Cam Schlittler** (5.1IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 6K, 1HR) started and did not record a decision after allowing only 1R/ER over 5.1IP...**1B/C Ben Rice** (4-for-5, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 5RBI) recorded a career-high-tying 4H and drove in five of the Yankees' seven runs, hitting a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning and a go-ahead grand slam in the 10th inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) hit his 31st home run of the season with a solo shot in the 10th inning...**PR/SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-2, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the 10th inning...**LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP, 1K), **RHP Fernando Cruz** (0.1IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K), **RHP Luke Weaver** (0.1IP, 1BB), **RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP, 3K), **RHP David Bednar** (W, 1.0IP, 1BB, 1K) and **RHP Camilo Doval** (1.0IP, 2BB, 1K) combined to toss 4.2 scoreless innings of relief.

**WIN AND THEY'RE IN:** **The Yankees can clinch a postseason berth tonight with a win against the White Sox**...would mark their 60th playoff appearance in franchise history (123 seasons, would be 48.8%)...would mark the Yankees' eighth postseason appearance in the last nine seasons (since 2017) and 26th trip to the postseason in the last 31 years (since 1995)...their 26 trips to the postseason since 1995 would be the most in the Majors in that span, five more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21)...the next highest AL teams are Boston and Cleveland who entered this season with 14 trips over that span.

► Would be one of only three teams to make the playoffs in at least eight of the last nine years (since 2017)...would join the Dodgers (nine: 2017-25) and Astros (eight: 2017-24).

► **Manager Aaron Boone** would be the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as manager (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...would be the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of his first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10).

**WINNING WAYS:** **The Yankees have clinched their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL),** behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.

**FAN-TASTIC:** **The Yankees have drawn 3 million fans at home for their Major League-record 25th straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-24).**

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 263HR this season, 31 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 232HR)**...their 263HR this season are their third-most in a single season in franchise history and the eighth-most by any team in Major League history.

► Have hit a Major League-leading 47HR in the first inning...are tied with the Atlanta Braves' 47HR in 2023 for the most first-inning home runs in a single season in Major League history.

► Have scored in the first inning in a Major League-best 61 games this year...are 42-19 (.689) in those games.

► The Yankees' nine grand slams this year are tied with Arizona for the most in the Majors...marks only the ninth time in franchise history the Yankees have hit at least nine grand slams in a single season...also 10 in 1987, 2010, '11, '12 and '22, and nine in 1998, 2003 and '04.

**ALL THAT JAZZ:** **INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** hit his career-high 31st home run of the season with a solo shot in the 10th inning on Sunday at Baltimore...marked his first career extra-inning home run...has 2HR in his last three games (since 9/19)...his 12HR in his last 38 games (since 8/11) are tied for the third-most in the Majors in that span, trailing only the Mets' Juan Soto (14HR) and Seattle's Cal Raleigh (13HR).

**PEN PALS:** **Yankees relievers** have posted a 0.57 ERA (15.2IP, 1ER) and 20K over their last five games (since 9/17).

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** reached base twice on Sunday at Baltimore...has reached base multiple times in 10 of his last 11 games (since 9/11), including at least three times in six of those games...has reached base in 30-of-52PA over that span (15H, 13BB, 2HP), batting .429/.577/.886 (15-for-35) with 15R, 1 double, 5HR, 7RBI, 13BB/2IBB, 2HP, 2SF and 1SB over that stretch.

► Needs 1HR to reach 50HR in a single season for the fourth time in his career (52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024)...would tie the Major League record for most 50HR seasons by any player and would be only the fourth player — and second Yankee — to record four such seasons...would join Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998-2001), Mark McGwire (4x: 1996-99) and Babe Ruth (4x: 1920-21, '27-28).

► Has reached base safely in 130 of his 146 games this year, batting .326/.451/.672 (170-for-521) with 130R, 29 doubles, 2 triples, 49HR, 105RBI, 117BB/32IBB, 7HP, 7SF and 12SB...**leads the Majors in BA by 11 points, OBP by 52 points, SLG by 52 points and OPS by 108 points...his 9.2 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.4 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 8.8 WAR)**...would be only the fifth player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to lead the Majors inn BA, OBP and SLG in a single season...would join Miguel Cabrera in 2013, Barry Bonds in 2002, Larry Walker in 1999 and George Brett in 1980.

► **Is hitting .354/.518/.722 (28-for-79) with 28R, 2 doubles, 9HR, 12RBI, 26BB/3IBB, 3HP, 2SF and 4SB over his last 24 games (since 8/27).**

► Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading 96 games this season.

► **Has hit .395/.545/.857 (47-for-119) with 39R, 7 doubles, 16HR, 36RBI, 42BB/6IBB, 1HP, 3SF and 2SB in 36 career games vs. the White Sox**...has reached base in 34 of his 36G against Chicago-AL...**has 12HR in his last 23G vs. the club (since 8/12/21).**

**RICE RICE BABY:** **C/INF Ben Rice recorded a career-high-tying 4H and drove in five of the Yankees' seven runs on Sunday at Baltimore,** hitting a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning and a go-ahead grand slam in the 10th inning (also had 4H on 4/17/25 at Tampa Bay)...marked his second career grand slam (also 5/11/25 at the Athletics)...**marked the 17th grand slam in franchise history in the 10th inning-or-later and the 13th go-ahead grand slam in the 10th inning-or-later...was just the fifth grand slam by a Yankee in the 10th inning-or-later in the last 42 years (since 1984),** joining Josh Donaldson ("walk-off" grand slam in the 10th inning on 8/17/22 vs. Tampa Bay), Bobby Abreu (go-ahead grand slam in the 10th inning on 9/24/08 at Toronto), Jason Giambi ("walk-off" grand slam in the 14th inning on 5/17/02 vs. Minnesota) and Tino Martinez (go-ahead grand slam in the 15th inning on 5/1/96 at Baltimore).

► His 5RBI on Sunday were his third-most in a game in his career, trailing only his 7RBI on 7/6/24 vs. Boston and 7RBI on 8/16/25 at St. Louis.

► Is hitting .301/.361/.552 (43-for-143) with 20R, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 27RBI, 14BB and 1SF over his last 39G (since 8/6).

**FAST AND FURIOUS:** **Yankees baserunners have recorded 132SB this season, their most in a single season since 2011 (147SB)...marks only the third time in the last 24 years (since 2002) the Yankees have recorded as many stolen bases in a season** (also 147SB in 2011 and 139SB in 2006)...are tied for seventh in the Majors this season in stolen bases (tied for fourth in AL) and ninth in stolen base percentage (79.0%, sixth in AL)...have recorded a Major League-leading 68SB over their last 54 games (since 7/25).

► The Yankees have six players with double-digit stolen bases this year...**marks only the fourth time in the last 109 years (since 1917) the Yankees have had at least six players record double-digit stolen bases in a single season (also six in 1976, 1998 and 2006).**

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starting pitchers** have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of their last 27 starts (since 8/24), going 15-5 with a 2.71 ERA (153.0IP, 46ER) and 137K over that span...**have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 35 of their last 43 starts (since 8/5), posting a Major League-best 2.89 ERA (239.2IP, 77ER) during that stretch** (next: Los Angeles-NL - 3.13).

**PEN PAL:** **RHP Devin Williams** struck out the side in the eighth inning on Sunday at Baltimore...has posted a Major League-best 15.94 K/9.0IP ratio (49K/27.2IP) over his last 29 games since 7/6 (min. 20.0IP)...his 43.8% strikeout rate (49K/112BF) also ranks second in the Majors over that span (min. 20.0IP).

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 8-2 in their last 10G vs. the White Sox (since 2024) and 10-4 in their last 14G (since 6/8/23-G2).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (4-1, 3.33 ERA)

**RHP Luis Gil** will make his 10th start this season in tonight's series opener vs. Chicago-AL...the 27-year-old will make the start on extended five day's rest due to Monday's team off day...made his ninth start of the season on Wednesday at Minnesota, allowing 5R/4ER in 4.2IP and did not record a decision (9H, 2BB, 2K, 1HP, 0HR)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven of his last eight starts (since 8/9), going 4-0 with a 2.53 ERA (42.2IP, 12ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in seven of those starts...in nine starts this season, has gone 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (46.0IP, 40H, 19R/17ER, 29BB, 36K, 2HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list on 8/3...made four combined rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, posting a 5.65 ERA (14.1IP, 11H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 24K, 4HR)...missed the first 111 games of the season on the 60-day injured list (3/24-8/3) with a right lat strain...was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year in 2024 after going 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...**was the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to be named the AL Rookie of the Year**...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 29 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 18 of his starts and one-or-zero runs in 17 of his starts (including six scoreless starts)...**his 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed were the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (18 starts in 1904), Whitey Ford (18 starts in 1964) and Ron Guidry (18 starts in 1978)...*Elias* notes his 17 such starts were the second-most in Major League history by any rookie pitcher in a single season (since 1893 when current mound distance was set, excluding openers), trailing only Philadelphia-NL's George McQuillan's 21 starts in 1908...**his 171K were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 209K in 1910**...in 45 career Major League starts, has gone 20-9 with a 3.51 ERA (231.0IP, 169H, 94R/90ER, 127BB, 250K, 24HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 34 of his first 45 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 24 of those starts...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his ninth start of the season on Wednesday at Minnesota, allowing 5R/4ER in 4.2IP and did not record a decision (9H, 2BB, 2K, 1HP, 0HR)...his 9H marked a career high.

**KING OF THE GIL:** **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven of his last eight starts (since 8/9), going 4-0 with a 2.53 ERA (42.2IP, 12ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in seven of those starts.

- ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer from 8/9-9/12, matching the longest such streak of his career (also owned a seven-start streak from 5/1-6/4/24).
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in seven of his nine starts and 1R-or-fewer in four starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 1HR-or-fewer in each of his nine starts this season and has not allowed a HR in seven starts, posting a 0.39 HR/9.0 ratio.
- ✦ Made his eighth start of the season on 9/12 at Boston, earning his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 hitless innings (4BB, 4K, 2WP, 1BK)...was the second Yankees pitcher this season to toss at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start, joining Clarke Schmidt (7.0IP/0H) on 6/21 vs. Baltimore.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Will be making his fifth home start of the season tonight...in four starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 2-0 with a 2.11 ERA (21.1IP, 5ER) and 16K...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in three home starts.

- ✦ In 15 home starts last season, went 6-4 with a 3.57 ERA (75.2IP, 51H, 31R/30ER, 38BB, 93K, 11HR)...posted a .184/.294/.361 (51-for-277) slash line at Yankee Stadium in 2024...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 home starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of those starts (three scoreless starts)...11 of his 31R were allowed in two starts (7R on 6/20 vs. Baltimore and 4R on 7/2 vs. Cincinnati).
- ✦ In 25 career home starts, is 9-5 with a 3.21 ERA (126.1IP, 89H, 48R/45ER, 71BB, 147K, 16HR)...has held opponents to a .192/.307/.350 (89-for-463) slash line...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of his 25 home starts and one-or-zero runs in 14 of those starts (six scoreless)...has recorded six-or-more strikeouts in 14 of his 25 career home starts and eight-or-more strikeouts in seven of those starts.

**VS. CHICAGO-AL:** Will be making his fifth career start vs. the White Sox tonight and his second this season...in four career starts vs. Chicago-AL, is 1-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1IP, 11ER) and 29K.

- ✦ Made the start on 8/31 at Rate Field this season, allowing 2R/ER in 5.1IP and did not record a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR).
- ✦ Has made one start against the White Sox at Yankee Stadium, earning the win on 5/18/24 after striking out a career-high 14 batters over 6.0 innings on (5H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 0HR)...his 14K are the most in a game by a Yankees rookie in franchise history, surpassing Orlando Hernández's 13K on 8/13/98 vs. Texas.

**2024:** Was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year after going 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...opponents batted .189/.297/.345 (104-for-550, 18HR); LH .210/.314/.393 (55-for-262, 10HR); RH .170/.282/.302 (49-for-288, 8HR).

- ✦ **Was the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to be named the AL Rookie of the Year**...joined Aaron Judge (2017), Derek Jeter (1996), Dave Righetti (1981), Thurman Munson (1970), Stan Bahnsen (1968), Tom Tresh (1962), Tony Kubek (1957), Bob Grim (1954) and Gil McDougald (1951)...**was the fifth Dominican-born player and the second pitcher to be named AL Rookie of the Year**, joining Julio Rodríguez (2022), Neftali Feliz (2010), Angel Berroa (2003) and Alfredo Griffin (1979).
