WHAT'S BREWING?

On the Mend

RHP Nick Mears is set to begin a rehab assignment this afternoon with Triple-A Nashville as the Sounds visit Gwinnett....Mears has been on the injured list recovering from an illness he experienced in Spring Training.

Patrick's Day

Chad Patrick is making the first start of his career tonight....he made his Major League debut out of the bullpen on Saturday at Yankee Stadium....the 2024 International League Pitcher of the Year went 14-1 with a 2.90 ERA in 26 games/24 starts last season at Triple-A Nashville....he led the league in wins, ERA, strikeouts [145] and WHIP [1.09] and was an IL All-Star.

Tough Start

The Brewers have started 0-4 for the sixth time in franchise history and first time since 2015....the team looks to avoid its third 0-5 start all time.

In Need of a Win

The Brewers were the only team in the Major Leagues last season not to have a losing streak of at least 4 games.....prior to this season, the team had not dropped 4 in a row since 7/28-7/31, 2023....their last 5-game streak came 6/8-6/14, 2023 (6g).

March Sadness

The Brewers have allowed 43 runs over the last 3 games, which marks the second-highest total in a 3-game period in franchise history.....the team allowed 45 runs over 3 games from 9/4-9/6, 1986....the Brewers have allowed double-digit runs (20-12-11) in 3 straight games for just the third time in franchise history....this also occurred from 9/3-9/6, 1986 over 4 games (11-15-13-17) and over 3 games from 9/11-9/13. 1998 (11-15-11).

Roval Rumble

The Brewers faced the Royals in the home opener for the second time..... the team also played Kansas City in the first home game of the season on 4/15/83 at County Stadium (lost 4-3).

They're Out of Our League

The Brewers begin the 2025 season with six consecutive games against American League teams....Milwaukee has gone 74-42 (.638) since 2022 in Interleague Play, trailing only the Dodgers (78-37, .678).....the team has lost its last five Interleague games.

Better Call Sal

Sal Frelick has reached base safely at least twice in all 4 games this season while batting .429 (6-for-14) and posting a .529 on-base pct.

THIS EVENING'S GAME: Is game 2 (0-1) of a 7-game homestand against Kansas City (0-1) and Cincinnati (4g).....following this homestand and an off day next Monday, the team takes a 6-game road trip to Colorado (3g) and Arizona (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: LHP Aaron Ashby (right oblique), RHP Aaron Civale (left hamstring), LHP Robert Gasser (left elbow), LHP DL Hall (left lat), RHP Nick Mears (illness), RHP Tobias Myers (left oblique), OF Blake Perkins (right shin) and RHP Brandon Woodruff (right shoulder) are on the injured list.....Gasser and Hall are on the 60-day injured list.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....Murphy was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after guiding the team to a 93-69 record and the NL Central division championship.....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

CDACHES: Returning from the 2024 coaching staff is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

<u>2024 IN REVIEW</u>: The Brewers went 93-69 and finished in first place in the NL Central, 10.0 games ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs.....they tied the Padres for the fourth-best record in baseball behind the Dodgers (98-64), Phillies (95-67) and Yankees (94-68)..... the Brewers lost to the Mets, 2 games to 1, in the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee.

<u>BREWING SUCCESS</u>: The Brewers have made the postseason six times over the last seven seasons (missed in 2022) and have won the NL Central in four of the last seven seasons, three of the last four, and two straight.....the Brewers are one of just five teams to qualify for the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons.....they are joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include the shortened 2020 season.....the Brewers have 666 wins since 2017, which ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League.....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight consecutive seasons, missing out by just a game in both 2017 and 2022.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #39 - RHP CHAD PATRICK (1g, 0-0, 18.00)

PATRICK AT A GLANCE: Chad Patrick, 26, made his Major League debut on Saturday in relief at Yankee Stadium (1jp, 2h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 1k, 1hr, 22 pitches).....Patrick was added to the 40-man roster on Nov. 19 after he went 14-1 with a 2.90 ERA in 26 games/24 starts last season at Triple-A Nashville to earn International League Pitcher of the Year honors.....the 2024 International League All-Star led the league in wins, ERA, strikeouts (145) and WHIP (1.09) while ranking second in opponent batting average (.215)..... Patrick was acquired from Oakland for INF Abraham Toro on 11/15/23.

SPRING TRAINING: Patrick went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in 4 games/1 start in Spring Training (8.1ip, 13h, 5r, 5er, 1bb, 10k, 1hr).....he was optioned to Triple-A Nashville on March 9.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Patrick has gone 23-14 with a 4.06 ERA in 68 games/60 starts while pitching in the Arizona (2021-23), Oakland (2023) and Milwaukee (2024) organizations.....he has produced 334 strikeouts in 312.1 innings pitched.....Patrick was selected by Arizona in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft.....he was traded by Arizona to Oakland on 7/31/23 in exchange for INF Jace Peterson, who is now a consultant to the Brewers' performance psychology department.
