**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed the day off on Monday... On Sunday, the Mets defeated the Padres, 7-3, in San Diego...New York is 19-15 over their last 34 games...Tonight the Mets return to Citi Field for a six-game homestand against the Cardinals (three games) and Braves (three games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to today's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - Catcher Francisco Alvarez has been returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from the 10-Day Injured List...Catcher Hayden Senger was optioned to Triple-A yesterday.

**HANG 10:** The Mets are 7-3 over their last 10 games...They have posted a 2.62 ERA (26 ER/89.1 IP) in that span...They have struck out 81, while walking 37 over the last 10 games...The Mets are batting .250/.305/.467 in that span outscoring their opponents 55-29.

**THE TONIGHT SHOW:** In 34 games since the start of May, Carson Benge is batting .316/.377/.497 with 25 runs, seven doubles, five homers, 20 RBI, 10 walks and an .873 OPS...His .316 average ranks seventh in the NL in that span, while his 42 hits are tied for the third-most...Over his last 10 games, Benge is batting .366 (15-41) with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, four homers, eight RBI, three walks and one steal with a .409 OBP and a .756 SLG.

**HOME COOKING:** The Mets have won four straight and nine of their last 12 at Citi Field and improved to 15-15 at home this season...They have posted a 4.13 ERA, while batting .237/.306/.372 at Citi Field.

**ON THE MARCUS:** Over his last 12 games, Marcus Semien is batting .279 (12-43) with eight runs, one double, five homers, seven RBI, four walks, a .340 OBP, a .651 SLG and a .992 OPS...He has homered in back-to-back games.

**CARDS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won five straight games against the Cardinals at Citi Field.

**DREAM WEAVER:** Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 15 appearances...He has tossed 17.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 19 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (8 ER/29.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in 27 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

**FOREVER YOUNG:** Jared Young has appeared in 11 games since returning from the IL...He is hitting .257 (9-35) with six runs, one double, three homers, five RBI, five walks, a .366 OBP, a .543 SLG and a .909 OPS in that span...In 22 games in 2026, Young is hitting .291/.375/.509 with six extra-base hits and seven RBI...Young is hitting .327 (16-49) with three doubles, three homers and six walks against right-handed pitching.

**A.J. STYLES:** A.J. Ewing has safely hit in each of his last five games, batting .389 (7-18) with three runs, one double, two walks and three steals...In 25 games so far into his Major League career, A.J. Ewing is batting .259 (22-85) with 11 runs, one double, one triple, one home run, six RBI, 11 walks, seven steals and a .340 OBP...Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the Mets rookie record for most steals with 24... Lee Mazilli (1977) is second on the list with 22, and Gree Jefferies (1989) is third with 21.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.24 ERA (101 ER/280.2 IP) as a group...That ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League...They have struck out 288 this season, the most in the NL and the second-most in The Show.

**JUAN OF A KIND:** Juan Soto has 257 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 257 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic... George Bell is next with 265.

**STRIKE THAT:** Mets pitchers have tallied 595 strikeouts this season, that is the fourth-most in the National League and the fifth-most in the majors...Their 595 punchies are the fifth-most in franchise history through the team's first 65 games of a season.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets fell to the Phillies, 3-2, in 10-innings at Shea Stadium...Rick Anderson made the start, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing an unearned run...The Phillies scored twice in the eighth to tie it and again in the top of the 10th to win it...Lenny Dykstra led the offense, going 4-4 with one run, one walk and two doubles...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

**PREVIOUSLY ON:** Earned his fourth win of the season on June 3 at Seattle...Allowed one run over 6.0 innings, surrendered six hits, issued two walks and recorded six strikeouts...The lone run Peralta allowed came on a lead-off home run from J.P. Crawford...The outing marked Peralta's fourth quality start of the season and his first since May 12 vs. Detroit...Allowed one or zero runs in a start for the fourth time this season and for the first time since May 6 at Colorado...Has allowed six or more hits in three straight starts, tied for the longest such streak of his career (also: 5/26-6/6/23 and 9/2-13/24).

**THE GAME OF RISP:** So far this season, opposing batters are 9-62 (.145) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta ranks eighth in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Peralta ranks eighth in the majors in opponents' OBP (.227) and 10th in opponents' SLG (.226) with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .202 (106-526) average with RISP, the second-best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

**HOUSE OF CARDS:** In 21 career appearances (17 starts) against St. Louis, Peralta is 5-6 with a 4.50 ERA (46 ER/92.0 IP) and 98 strikeouts...Over his last six starts against the Cardinals dating back to September 18, 2023, Peralta is 2-1 with a 2.04 ERA (9 ER/39.2 IP) and 39 strikeouts...Today marks Peralta's second start of the season against St. Louis...On April 1, Peralta allowed one run over 5.1 innings and struck out seven in the Mets' 2-1 loss at Busch Stadium.

**DAY AND NIGHT:** Today, Freddy Peralta will make only his fifth night start of the season...Through his first four night starts of the season, Peralta is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (8 ER/21.1 IP) through his first four night starts of the season...Peralta's nine day game starts are the second-most in the majors behind Kyle Bradish's 10 such starts...In 132 career night games (97 starts), Peralta is 45-26 with a 3.60 ERA (229 ER/572.1 IP)...In 92 career day games (78 starts), Peralta is 29-20 with a 3.53 ERA (169 ER/430.2 IP).

**NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE:** On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

**2025 RECAP:** Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

**OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE:** On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The

last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

**KEEPIN' IT 200:** In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

**REVERSE, REVERSE:** For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .205 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

**EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL:** In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%...This season, Peralta has thrown his fastball 53.6% of the time and his changeup 23.9% of the time...Peralta has held opposing batters to a .236 (33-140) average with his fastball and has struck out 31 batters with the pitch.
