STREAKING

Since their 3-22 start, the Reds are 41-41... went 6-1-1 in their last 8 completed series while winning 6 of their last 8 games (.750) and 16 of their last 25 games (.640)...the 2022 Reds are 1 of just 3 teams in modern Major League history to begin a season with as few as 3 wins over the first 25 games (1988 Orioles, 2-23 & 2003 Tigers, 3-22).

IN THE STANDINGS

The Reds enter tonight's games in third place alone for just the second time since they were 2-2 on 4/11...also were in third place alone following Tue's 2-1 win at Mia...from 4/13-7/30 were in fifth place for 106 of 109 days, including a season-high streak of 64 straight days in fifth snapped on 6/16 (T4th).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Samantha Brown's Mets and Game 7 (4-2) of an 11-day, 10-game, 4-city road trip that concludes with Thu's Field of Dreams Game in Dyersville, Iowa vs Cubs (2-1 at Mia, 2-1 at Mil, 0-0 at NYM, 1g vs Chi)...the Redlegs will be the "home" team in Iowa...following this road trip and Fri's off day will return to Great American Ball Park to finish the series vs the Cubs, followed by a 3-game series vs the Phillies before hitting the road again for another 10-day road trip (3g at Pit, 4g at Phi, 3g at Wsh)...after playing 21 home games in July (12-9), their most in a month since August 1984 (21 home games), in August the Reds will play just 8 games at Great American Ball Park...also played just 8 home games in April...prior to this 2022 season, the Reds last played 8 home games or fewer in a calendar month of at least 20 games in April 1992 (8 of 21g)...courtesy @EliasSports.

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today recalled from Louisville RHP Justin Dunn (#38) and placed on the 15-day injured list, retroactive to Saturday, RHP Robert Dugger (right shoulder pain).

7/28, acquired from the Mets RHP Jose Acuña and CF Hector Rodríguez for OF Tyler Naquin and LHP Phillip Diehl.

7/29, acquired from the Mariners IF Noelvi Marte, IF Edwin Arroyo, RHP Levi Stoudt and RHP Andrew Moore for RHP Luis Castillo.

8/1, acquired from the Red Sox a PTBNL or cash for OF Tommy Pham.

8/2, acquired from the Twins IF Spencer Steer, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand and LHP Steven Hajar for RHP Tyler Mahle; acquired from the Padres IF Victor Acosta for IF Brandon Drury; acquired from the Cardinals C Austin Romine for cash.

SERIES NOTES:

Beginning 9/24/13, the Reds are 15-35 vs NYM, including a 14-game losing streak from 9/7/14 - 9/7/16 that ranks as Cin's longest ever vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a 16-game skid vs Ari from 5/8/01 - 8/13/03...dating back to 1962, the 7-0 series win by the Mets in 2015 was the first season series sweep by either team, followed by NYM's 6-0 series win in 2016.

BIG CITI LIGHTS: From 7/30-8/1, 2021 the Reds went 2-1 vs NYM for their first series win at Citi Field from 5/20-5/22, 2013...are 1-5-1 in their last 7 completed series and 7-16 in their last 23 games at Citi Field (2-1 in July 2021, 2-2 in April/May 2019, 1-2 in August 2018, 1-3 in September 2017, 0-3 in April 2016, 0-3 in June 2015, 1-2 in April 2014).

CATCH YOU LATER: In Sat's 7-5 win at Mil, Austin Romine became the sixth catcher to appear for a game for the Reds this season (Tyler Stephenson, Aramis Garcia, Mark Kolozsvary, Chris Okey, Michael Papierski)...for only the eighth time in their history, the Reds have employed at least 6 catchers in a season, most recently in 1992...the 1909 club holds the club for number of catchers used in a season with 8, followed by 7 Reds teams with 6 catchers...last season, for only the third time since 1882, the Reds finished a season using only 2 catchers (Tucker Barnhart, Stephenson)...they also did it in 1959 (Ed Bailey, Dutch Dotterer) and 1979 (Johnny Bench, Vic Correll).

YOUNG GUNS:

- In 43 combined starts this season, Reds rookie starting pitchers RHP Hunter Greene, LHP Nick Lodolo and RHP Graham Ashcraft are 12-17, 4.63 (225.2ip, 116er)...all 3 made their Major League debuts this season.
- 6 times this season the Reds started rookie pitchers in 3 straight games (last, 7/31-8/2, Lodolo, Greene, Ashcraft).
- In Sanmartin (Game 2), Greene (Game 4) and Lodolo (Game 6), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the first 6 games of a season for only the second time in their history...the 1902 Reds staff used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookie pitchers (Bob Ewing 2 starts, Len Swormstedt, Martin Glendon)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- This year's Reds became the fourth Major League team since 2000 to use 3 different starting rookie pitchers in the first 6 games of a season, joining the 2020 Royals (Brady Singer, Ronald Bolanos, Kyle Zimmer), 2018 Marlins (Caleb Smith, Dillon Peters, Trevor Richards) and 2009 Athletics (Trevor Cahill, Brett Anderson, Josh Outman).

RED HOTS:

- 33 Reds players have accounted for 44 apps on the injured list (list on Page 6)...today's injured list includes 13 players... on 7/16 & 7/17 the Reds had 18 players listed on the injured list, their single-day season high...every day from 5/1-8/1, between 13-18 players held a spot on the Reds' injured list.
- The Reds went 12-16-7 in 35 completed series (6-8-4 home, 6-8-3 road)...swept 2 series (2g at Cle, 5/17-5/19 & 3g vs TB, 7/8-7/10) and were swept 9 times (last, 2g at StL, 7/15-7/16).
- The Reds went 3-1-1 in their 5 series vs American League East teams (1-2 at Tor, 1-1 at Bos, 3-0 vs TB, 2-1 at NYY, 2-1 vs Bal)...have one more 2-game series vs the Red Sox in September at Great American Ball Park.
- Per @EliasSports, the Reds have played the fifth-toughest schedule in the Major Leagues...in games already played, their opponents have posted a winning percentage of .513...the winning percentage for the teams remaining on the Reds' schedule is .476, the sixth-easiest schedule in the majors.
- The 10-game losing streak at Great American Ball Park from 6/8-7/2 was the Reds' longest since at home an 11-game skid at Riverfront Stadium from 4/9-5/5, 1986...their 0-6 homestand from 6/17-6/23 (0-3 vs Mil, 0-3 vs LAD) was their first winless homestand of at least 6 games since 7/11-7/17, 1991 (0-4 vs Pit, 0-3 vs StL).
- The Reds' 11.5-game deficit on May 1 was their largest ever on that date.
- The Reds began the season 0-4 at Great American Ball Park, their first 0-4 home start since the 1955 club began 0-4 at Crosley Field.
- Over 11 games and 99 innings from 4/12-4/23 the Reds failed to hold a lead through the end of a full inning, including a 6-game, 54-inning stretch from 4/12-4/17 in which they never led at any point.

ROSTER NOTES:

- Eight Reds players made Major League debuts this season, including RHP Daniel Duarte, RHP Alexis Diaz, RHP Hunter Greene (starter), LHP Nick Lodolo (starter), C Mark Kolozsvary, RHP Jared Solomon, RHP Graham Ashcraft (starter) and C Chris Okey.
- 14 rookies, including 9 pitchers, have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds.
- 55 players have appeared in at least 1 game for Reds, 2 shy of the club record for number of players in a season (57, 2003).

RED HOTS

- Earlier today was promoted from Louisville to make his Reds debut at Citi Field vs his former team...filled the roster spot vacated by RHP Robert Dugger, who went on the 15-day injured list with right shoulder pain.
- Is taking the spot in the rotation vacated by RHP Hunter Greene, who on Friday went on the 15-day injured list with a right shoulder strain...at last week's trade deadline, the Reds also lost starting pitchers RHP Luis Castillo (to Mariners) and RHP Tyler Mahle (to Twins).
- Tonight will become the 56th player to appear in a game for the Reds...the club record for number of players in a season is 57 (2003).
- Will be his first appearance in the Major Leagues since 6/17/21 for Sea vs TB, started the 6-5 Mariners win (2ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 1k, 30 pitches)...the next day went on the Mariners' injured list for the rest of the 2021 season with right shoulder inflammation.
- On 3/14 was acquired from the Mariners, along with OF Jake Fraley, minor league LHP Brandon Williamson and a player to be named (RHP Connor Phillips, 3/29), for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker.
- Did not make an appearance in spring training for the Reds or Mariners because of a right shoulder injury.
- On Opening Day went on the Reds' 60-day injured list with a right shoulder strain.
- From 6/26-7/23 made 6 rehabilitation apps for Dayton (1gs) and Louisville (5gs)...in the 6 rehab starts overall went 0-2, 5.40 (20ip, 22h, 18r, 12er, 10bb, 18k, 2hbp, 3hr, 1.60whip, .275baa) before he was reinstated from the 60-day IL and optioned to Louisville on 7/24.
- After his 7/24 option to Louisville and prior to today's promotion made 2 more starts for the Bats (0-1, 10.13, 8ip, 12h, 9er, 7bb, 6k, 1hr, 3hbp).
- Originally was selected by the Mets in the first round (19th overall) of the 2016 first-year player draft.
- In 2018 was the Mets' Organizational Pitcher of the Year.
- Was acquired by the Mariners, along with RHP Gerson Bautista, OF Jay Bruce, OF Jarred Kelenic and RHP Anthony Swarzak, from the Mets for IF Robinson Cano, RHP Edwin Diaz and cash, December 3, 2018.
- In 2021, made a career-high 11 starts for the Mariners surrounding 2 stints on the 10-day injured list for right shoulder inflammation (6/1-6/10, 6/18-remainder of the season)...on 8/19 was transferred to the 60-day injured list.

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow will make his 12th start of the season, his 14th career start vs the Mets.
- In Wed's 3-0 loss at Mia, opposing starter Sandy Alcantara threw his sixth career complete game and third career shutout (6h, 1bb, 3k, 105 pitches)...time of game was 2 hours, 9 minutes.
- On 3/16 was acquired by the Reds from the Royals, with cash, for LHP Amir Garrett....did not appear in a 2022 spring training game for either team.
- Missed the last 18 games of the 2021 season while on the 10-day injured list with a left shoulder impingement...was his first stint on the injured or disabled list since he missed the 2016 season following 5/13/15 surgery to repair the torn labrum in his left shoulder.
- Began this season on the Reds' 10-day injured list with a left shoulder strain...made his Reds debut on 6/3 vs Wsh.
- Following a rehab appearance on 4/13 for Class AA Chattanooga vs Birmingham, felt soreness in his left shoulder and didn't pitch again until 5/10.
- From 5/10-5/27 made 4 more rehab apps, all for Class AAA Louisville (1-2, 3.38, 16ip, 15h, 7r, 6er, 1bb, 20k, 3hr, 1.00whip, .234baa).
- In his final rehab start, a 4-2 Bats win on 5/27 vs Omaha, threw an immaculate third inning by striking out on 9 pitches Jacoby Jones, John Rave and Jose Briceño.

Road Trip: 4-2, 2.72, .204baa

- Among Major League team leaders rank 29th in ERA (4.98; Wsh 30th, 5.32), second in walks allowed (403bb, 941ip) and sixth in highest opponents' batting average (.252).
- At 5.01 through Wed's game at Mia, the team's ERA was its best since the fourth game of the season (3.71 on 4/10).
- In the first 25 games of the season, through 5/5, went 3-22 with a season-high 6.86 ERA...in the last 82 games beginning 5/7 are 41-41, 4.44 (731ip, 361er, .243baa).

REDS STARTERS

Road Trip: 2-2, 3.18, .189baa

- Among National League team rotation leaders rank 13th in ERA (4.96), fourth in walks allowed (214bb, 549.2ip) and fifth in highest opponents' batting average (.254).
- At 4.94 through Wed's game at Mia, the starting staff's ERA was its best since Opening Day (0.00).
- After failing to complete 6.0 innings in any of the first 31 games of the season through 5/11 (3-21, 8.19), Reds starting pitchers threw at least 6.0 innings in 41 of the last 76 games beginning 5/12 (21-27, 4.01, 424.1ip, 189er, .236baa).
