TODAY'S GAME 1:

- Makes his 6th start of the season (188th career) today against Cincinnati.
- Started against the Reds in doubleheaders in 2019 (Sept. 1 at Busch) and 2021 (Sept. 1 at GABP)
- Has not yet allowed a HR in 2025 over his 23.2 IP; He's one of three MLB starting pitchers (min. 23.2 IP) with no HR's allowed also Clay Holmes-NYM and Tyler Mahle-TEX.
- Cardinals have furnished him with three runs of support or less in each of his five starts. His 2.66 RSA would rank 7th-lowest among National League pitchers if he had the qualifying innings.
- Has yet to earn a win this season or pitch in a game the Cardinals won. Since joining the Cardinals has not recorded a win in one of his first five starts twice previously (2021 & 2023).
- Today's start will be the 178th in his Cardinals career, passing Howie Pollett (1941-51) for 19th all-time among Cardinals. He's one of just 3 MLB pitchers to have made as many as 175 starts exclusively with one team since he joined the Cardinals in 2018; also Aaron Nola, PHI - 214 (274 career starts w/PHI) & Kyle Freeland, COL - 178 (206 career starts w/COL).
- Has dropped his first two decisions (4/6 [2] at BOS & 4/12 vs. PHI) and is trying to avoid his first 0-3 start to a season; the Cardinals are 0-5 in his games started
- Tallied eight of his 10 wins in road starts last season, tying for the 2nd-most road wins in the NL; 1st-Michael King-SD, 9.
- At age 36 (turns 37 on August 28), Miles is the oldest player on the team's active roster.
- Has entered his 8th season (was injured for all of 2020) with the Cardinals in 2025; Leads active pitchers in innings pitched (1,022.1), wins (60) and games started (176) as a Cardinal and is 2nd to Michael Wacha (759) in strikeouts with 744.
- The Cardinals are 95-82 in his 177 career starts with St. Louis and he holds a 60-60 mark as a Cardinal.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas leads MLB in first strike percentage (68.0) and lowest walk percentage (0.43).

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 scoreless innings scattering six hits with two walks vs. Atlanta at Truist Park and left with a 1-0 lead. Cardinals fell late 4-1. Mikolas' longest scoreless start since Aug. 22, 2024 vs. Milwaukee.

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Fired 6.0 scoreless IP of six-hit ball at ATL (4/23). His longest scoreless start since 8/22/24 vs. MIL (6.0 IP, 0, R, 2 H).
 Fanned a season-high 6 batters in his 4/12 start vs. PHI over 5.0 IP. Allowed two 1st inning runs and then retired 12-straight before allowing a walk in the 5th. Was tagged with the 4-1 loss as the Cardinals grounded into a record 5 double plays.
- Started Game 2 of 4/6 doubleheader at BOS on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball; Lasted just 2.2 IP in the 18-7 loss, his shortest start since going 2.0 IP on 9/8/24 in 10-4 loss to Seattle.
- Miles was the Cardinals' Opening Day starter in 2019, 2023 & 2024.
- Posted his fifth season with 32-or-more starts in 2024 and is one of three MLB pitchers with 32+ starts in at least five seasons since 2018 (Jose Berrios & Aaron Nola - 6).
- Led MLB with 15 starts without a walk in 2024, his single-season career-high, the 3rd-most by a Cardinal all-time, trailing only Bob
- Tewksbury's 19 in 1992 and 16 in 1993, and the most by a NL pitcher since Bartolo Colón (15 in 2015) for the Mets. Has registered 32-or-more starts in every season in which he was not injured or sidelined by COVID-19 protocols. One of three pitchers
- with at least three 200+ IP seasons since 2018 (Gerrit Cole 4, Aaron Nola 3).
- His 171.2 IP last season were his fewest as a Cardinal; has had three seasons (2018, 2022, 2023) of 200+ IP as a Cardinal.
- His nine road starts without issuing a walk in 2024 tied Bob Tewksbury (1992) for the most in a single season by a Cardinal.
- Led MLB with a 1.31 walks per 9 IP rate in 2024 that was the lowest in a single season by a Cardinals pitcher since his 1.30 rate in 2018, while his 1.57 rate since joining St. Louis in 2018 is the lowest in MLB.
- Two-time National League All-Star (2018 and 2022). Finished 6th in the 2018 NL Cy Young Award voting and was a finalist for NL Comeback Player of the Year by MLBPA Player's Choice Awards, in a voting by his peers.
- 2018 Darryl Kile Award recipient, voted on by his teammates.
- Pitched 3 seasons for the Yomiuri Giants in the Japanese Central League (2015-17) and was 31-13 w/ 2.25 ERA in 62 starts .

MIKOLAS vs. CINCINNATI:

- Is 5-8 with a 5.80 ERA in 19 career starts (21 app.) vs. the Reds. Made two relief appearances with SD in 2012-13.
- Is 5-8 with a 5.74 ERA in 19 career starts as a member of the Cardinals vs. Cincinnati. Has surrendered 22 HR, his most among any opponent with St. Louis.
- His 10 HR allowed at Great American Ballpark since 2018 is tied with Kyle Hendricks as the only two pitchers who did not appear with the Reds in the ballpark to allow double-digit home runs.
- Had his toughest start vs. CIN in last start at Busch (June 27, 2024). Reds scored in each of the first 5 IP in 11-4 loss.
- Is 5-0 when he pitches 7.0 IP vs. the Reds and 0-8 in the 14 starts when he threw 6.2 innings or less (Cardinals 6-8).
- Faced the Reds once in Monterrey, Mexico (Apr. 14, 2019) and received a no decision in a 9-5 Cardinals win. Exited in a 4-4 tie after 5.0 innings.

- Returns to the rotation as the Cardinals switch back to the six-man rotation.
- Making his 2nd start of the season and 9th appearance. Career start 172 and appearance 202.
- As a starter is 55-59 with a 4.33 ERA and 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA and one save in 30 relief appearances.
- Ranks 9th among National League pitchers with 15.0 innings pitched in relief.
- Last start was vs. Houston on April 16 and spun a two-hit gem over 5.0 innings allowing just two hits with five strikeouts in a 4-1 getaway day win.
- Since joining the Cardinals in 2022, has gone 12-12 with a 4.22 ERA in 60 appearances (35 starts).
- Earned a win vs. HOU (4/16) as a starter and then got the win in relief at ATL (4/22) in his 200th career appearance. Was the first time by a Cardinals pitcher since Michael McGreevy won his MLB debut vs. TEX (7/31/24) and got the relief win in his next appearance vs. PIT (9/18/24).
- Began the 2025 season working out of the bullpen where he made 5 relief appearances, the last on Sat. (4/12) vs. PHI when he logged 2.1 IP (46 pitches).

- Suffered his 1st Blown Save as unearned run scored to tie game at 1-1 in the 12th inn. last Wed. (4/9) at PIT.
- Earned his first career save with 4.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball 3/30 vs. MIN; first game appearance in 11 days. It was his first save in 284 appearances of professional ball (193 MLB & 91 MiLB).
- Was the Cardinals first four-inning save since 6/3/22 at CHI (*Zack Thompson*) and in a home game since 6/3/1985 vs. HOU (*Ken Dayley*).

2024/CAREER NOTES:

- Began the 2024 season in the Cardinals five-man rotation and appeared in 12 games, making seven starts.

- Appeared in just six regular season games prior to starting Game 4 of the World Series, which tied for the fewest career regular season games at the time a pitcher made his 1st World Series start. Marty Bystrom also had six regular season appearances before starting Game 5 of the 1980 World Series for the Phillies.
- Matz's six regular season starts in 2015 were the 3rd-fewest before his 1st World Series start, behind Joe Black's two starts in 1952 for Brooklyn and Bystrom's five career starts in 1980.
- 2023 Darryl Kile Award recipient, voted on by his Cardinals teammates.
- Has logged five career seasons of 20 or more appearances and 100.0 innings or more (2016, 2018-19, 2021, 2023).
- His wife, Taylor Cain, is a Christian Rock music singer with the band Cain.

MATZ vs. CINCINNATI:

- Made his Major League debut vs. Cincinnati on June 28, 2015. Threw 7.2 innings (110 pitches) allowing two runs on five hits with six strikeouts for the win (7-2). Went 3-for-4 at the plate with a double and four RBI. Rated as the 2nd-best Major League debut all-time by *Baseball Digest*.
- Making his 6th career start (7th app.) vs. the Reds. Is 4-1 with a 4.40 ERA. Threw a scoreless inning in his only relief appearance (9/17/22 at STL) earning the win.
- Went nearly seven years between starts against the Reds, making his first two with the Mets in 2015 and his next in 2022 with St. Louis.
- Is 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA in 4 starts (5 app). vs. Cincinnati as a member of the Cardinals.
