BREWERS-METS NOTES: This marks the first time the Mets and Brewers will play on Opening Day...Dating back to September 21, 2022, the Mets have lost seven of their last eight games against the Crew.

A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: The Mets have recorded 10 shutouts on Opening Day... Before 2021, the Mets won back-to-back Opening Days via shutout, a 2-0 win at Washington in 2019 and a 1-0 win against the Atlanta Braves in 2020...The Mets have been shut out only once (7-0, April 9, 1963 vs. St. Louis) on Opening Day... Research courtesy of Elias.

OPENING DAY: After losing their first eight Opening Day contests, the Mets have won 41 of their last 54 Opening Day games (.759)...New York took nine straight openers from 1975-1983 to tie a major league record...The Mets have won 14 of their last 18 openers, including six of the last seven.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

NEW NUMBER, WHO THIS?: Infielder Zack Short has changed his number to 21, while Carlos Mendoza will now wear #64, and Mike Sarbaugh will wear #88.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joey Wendle; trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramírez and OF Tyrone Taylor as well as waiver claim INF Zack Short

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Today will mark the first Opening Day for Catcher Francisco Alvarez, INF Brett Baty and INF Zack Short.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 at after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

INVADER NIM: Last season, Brandon Nimmo established career highs in many offensive categories including, games played (152), hits (162), homers (24), XBH (60) and RBI (68)...Nimmo's six triples were tied for eighth in the NL and his 13 triples since 2022 are tied for the most in the NL during that span... Since 2018, Nimmo has sported a .382 OBP, the fifth-highest mark in the NL and the 10th-highest mark in the majors during that time frame (Min. 2000 plate appearances)...His 24 home runs from the lead-off spot were the tied with Tommie Agee (1970) for the second-most by a Met in a single season.

HIP, HIP, JOSE: On March 13, manager Carlos Mendoza named LHP Jose Quintana the Mets' 2024 Opening Day starter...The 35-year-old will make his second career Opening Day start (Also: 2017 w/Chicago-AL)...The southpaw will be the first left-handed pitcher to start Opening Day for the Mets since Jon Niese in 2013.

TWO AWAY: Pete Alonso is two RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 498 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Today is the eighth time the Mets have opened the season at Citi Field...New York is 6-1 when starting the year at Citi Field...The Mets begin their season at home for the first time since 2020... The team was slated to start the season on March 26 vs. Washington, but began the season on July 24 vs. Atlanta...This is the first time the team will open at home with fans in attendance since 2018...Overall, the Mets are 23-8 when opening the season at home.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets have had three walk-off wins on Opening Day...Joe Torre delivered an RBI single off Steve Carlton to beat the Phillies on April 8, 1975...Gary Carter slugged a 10th-inning walk-off home run in his first game with the Mets to beat the Cardinals, 6-5 on April 9, 1985 and Alberto Castillo had a 14th-inning RBI single to lift the Mets over the Phillies, 1-0, on March 31, 1998.

30-FOR-30: Francisco Lindor became the fourth player in franchise history to collected 30 stolen bases and 30 home runs in a season...He joined join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991, 1989, 1987) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)... He joins Barry Larkin (1996), Alex Rodriguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007) and Hanley Ramirez (2008) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...In addition, joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramírez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.

STARTING OFF WITH A BANG: The Mets have only had one player to record a leadoff home run on Opening Day...Kaz Matsui began the first game of the 2004 season with a home run off Russ Ortiz on April 6 in Atlanta.

GRAND SLAMS: Collin Cowgill and Todd Hundley are the only two Mets to hit a grand slam on Opening Day...Cowgill went deep on April 1, 2013 off San Diego's Brad Brach...Hundley's slam came on April 26, 1995 at Colorado off Billy Swift.

TWO HOME RUNS: Robin Ventura, Bobby Bonilla, Cleon Jones, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds are the only five players in club history to hit two home runs in an Opening Day tilt...Ventura was the last to accomplish the feat on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

EXTRA, EXTRA ON OPENING DAY: The Mets have played seven extra-inning games on Opening Day...They are 5-2 in those contests...The last extra-inning affair was in 2014, a 9-7 loss to the Nationals...The last Mets Opening Day win in extras was a 6-4, 10-inning victory on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

- In 2023, ranked second in the majors in RBI (118) and third in homers (46)...His 46 homers were the second the second most in a single season in Mets history, behind only his record-setting, 53-homer 2019 campaign...His 118 RBI were the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...Became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.
- Reached the 40-home run mark for the third time in five big league seasons...Only one player (Ralph Kiner) has had more 40-HR seasons through his first five career seasons...His three seasons with 40+ homers are tied with Nolan Arenado and Mike Trout for the most such seasons by an active player, while his two seasons with 45+ homers are tied with Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber for the most such seasons among active players.
- Was named an All-Star for the third time in his career.
- His 192 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the majors...Tied with Howard Johnson for fourth on the Mets all-time home run list...Mike Piazza (220) is next...Are the fifth-most by a player through their first five big league season behind only Kiner (215) and Albert Pujols (201).
- Has 498 career RBI are the 10th-most in Mets history...Cleon Jones and José Reyes (521) are next...They are also the most in the majors since his debut year in 2019.
- Led the NL and ranked second in the majors with 21 HBP.
- Ranked 12th in the NL with a .504 slugging percentage...Tied for 15th in the majors and ranked eighth in the NL with 69 extra-base hits...Ranked tied for 13th in the NL with 286 total bases.

Ended the season on a 10-game hitting streak, during which he hit .390 (16-41) with a .457 OBP, .610 SLG and 1.067 OPS after tallying four doubles, a triple, a homer, eight RBI and five walks...From August 28 to the end of the season, slashed .339/.398/.625/1.023 with 10 doubles, two triples, six homers, 17 RBI, 18 runs scored and 10 walks...Tied for 12th in the NL in games with three or more hits with 12...Tied for 14th in the NL with 45 multi-hit games.

- Was acquired by the Mets along with RHP Adrian Houser from Milwaukee in exchange for RHP Coleman Crow on December 20, 2023.
- Spent his first five major league seasons (2019-2023) with the Brewers and appeared in 331 games with the club...Batted .234 (54-231) with 10 home runs, 35, RBI, 17 doubles and nine stolen bases over 81 games in 2023...Made his season debut on May 2 after beginning the season on the IL with a right elbow sprain... Suffered a second right elbow sprain and was on the IL from June 3 - July 14...Batted .317/.338/.683 over his final 18 games of the season.
- Established career bests in games (120), hits (87), home runs (17) and RBI (51) during the 2022 season.
- Has never committed an error and his 508 total chances to begin a career are the most by an outfielder since Jacoby Ellsbury had 554 errorless chances from 2007-2009.
