TODAY IS THE GREATEST: The Mets are set to open their 63rd season when they take on the Brewers at Citi Field...In the history of Major League Baseball, the Mets (41-21, .661) have the best winning percentage on Opening Day... Research courtesy of Elias.

**OPENING DAY:** After losing their first eight Opening Day contests, the Mets have won 41 of their last 54 Opening Day games (.759)...New York took nine straight openers from 1975-1983 to tie a major league record...The Mets have won 14 of their last 18 openers, including six of the last seven.

NEW NUMBER. WHO THIS?: Infielder Zack Short has changed his number to 21, while Carlos Mendoza will now wear #64, and Mike Sarbaugh will wear #88.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Today will mark the first Opening Day for Catcher Francisco Alvarez, INF Brett Baty and INF Zack Short.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 at after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a twotime All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

HIP, HIP, JOSE: On March 13, manager Carlos Mendoza named LHP Jose Quintana the Mets' 2024 Opening Day starter...The 35-year-old will make his second career Opening Day start (Also: 2017 w/Chicago-AL)...The southpaw will be the first left-handed pitcher to start Opening Day for the Mets since Jon Niese in 2013.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Today is the eighth time the Mets have opened the season at Citi Field...New York is 6-1 when starting the year at Citi Field...The Mets begin their season at home for the first time since 2020... The team was slated to start the season on March 26 vs. Washington, but began the season on July 24 vs. Atlanta...This is the first time the team will open at home with fans in attendance since 2018...Overall, the Mets are 23-8 when opening the season at

WALK IT OFF: The Mets have had three walk-off wins on Opening Day...Joe Torre delivered an RBI single off Steve Carlton to beat the Phillies on April 8, 1975...Gary Carter slugged a 10th-inning walk-off home run in his first game with the Mets to beat the Cardinals, 6-5 on April 9, 1985 and Alberto Castillo had a 14th-inning RBI single to lift the Mets over the Phillies, 1-0, on March 31, 1998.

STARTING OFF WITH A BANG: The Mets have only had one player to record a leadoff home run on Opening Day... Kaz Matsui began the first game of the 2004  $\,$ season with a home run off Russ Ortiz on April 6 in Atlanta.

**GRAND SLAMS:** Collin Cowgill and Todd Hundley are the only two Mets to hit a grand slam on Opening Day...Cowgill went deep on April 1, 2013 off San Diego's Brad Brach...Hundley's slam came on April 26, 1995 at Colorado off Billy Swift.

**TWO HOME RUNS:** Robin Ventura, Bobby Bonilla, Cleon Jones, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds are the only five players in club history to hit two home runs in an Opening Day tilt...Ventura was the last to accomplish the feat on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

EXTRA, EXTRA ON OPENING DAY: The Mets have played seven extra-inning games on Opening Day...They are 5-2 in those contests...The last extra-inning affair was in 2014, a 9-7 loss to the Nationals...The last Mets Opening Day win in extras was a 6-4, 10-inning victory on April 3, 2001 at Atlanta.

BREWERS-METS NOTES: This marks the first time the Mets and Brewers will play on Opening Day...Dating back to September 21, 2022, the Mets have lost seven of their last eight games against the Crew.

A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: The Mets have recorded 10 shutouts on Opening Day... Before 2021, the Mets won back-to-back Opening Days via shutout, a 2-0 win at Washington in 2019 and a 1-0 win against the Atlanta Braves in 2020...The Mets have been shut out only once (7-0, April 9, 1963 vs. St. Louis) on Opening Day... Research courtesy of Elias.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second fulltime Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES:** The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joev Wendle: trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramírez and OF Tyrone Taylor as well as waiver claim INF Zack Short

INVADER NIM: Last season, Brandon Nimmo established career highs in many offensive categories including, games played (152), hits (162), homers (24), XBH (60) and RBI (68)...Nimmo's six triples were tied for eighth in the NL and his 13 triples since 2022 are tied for the most in the NL during that span... Since 2018, Nimmo has sported a .382 OBP, the fifth-highest mark in the NL and the 10th-highest mark in the majors during that time frame (Min. 2000 plate appearances)...His 24 home runs from the lead-off spot were the tied with Tommie Agee (1970) for the second-most by a Met in a single season

TWO AWAY: Pete Alonso is two RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 498 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

#### **QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES**

**OPENING UP:** Quintana today will toe the rubber for his first Opening Day start with the Mets, becoming the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He is the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

**PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN:** Quintana will take the mound today for the first time as an American citizen...Earlier this month, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

**METS DEBUT SEASON:** After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

**300 CLUB:** In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

**ACROSS LEAGUE LINES:** For his career, Quintana owns a 3.34 ERA (85 ER/229.0 IP) in 42 Interleague games...That is the 10th-lowest mark among active pitchers in the majors (Min. 200.0 IP)...Opened the season with four straight starts against interleague opponents, tied for the second-longest such streak in major league history...Courtesy of Elias.

**HOT STREAK:** Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

**LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS:** Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

**YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT:** Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1.2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.

**ON THE LEADERBOARD:** Since 2022, Quintana has pitched to a 2.32 ERA (18 ER/62.0 IP) in September/October, the sixth-lowest mark in the majors during that span (min 50.0 IP)...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career...Since 2022, Quintana has allowed 13 home runs, tied for the lowest total during that span (min 150.0 IP).

**2023 REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.
