# NEW YORK METS [85-51] TIED FOR FIRST PLACE, NL EAST, -.- GA

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Pirates, 8-2... The Mets are 68-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 30-9-3 in 42 series this year...The Mets are on the road for a seven-day, six-game trip to Pittsburgh (three games) and Miami (three games)

LET'S PLAY TWO: New York is set to play its ninth doubleheader of the season today. The Mets are 12-4 (.750) this season in doubleheaders, the most wins in baseball in twin-bill games...The Mets and Buccos last played a twinbill last year on July 10 in New York with the two teams taking a game each...The last time the Mets and Pirates played a doubleheader in Pittsburgh was on June 7, 2016...The Mets were swept, losing both games by a score of 3-1...Only Cleveland with 10 has played more doubleheaders this year...It will be the club's 23rd double dip since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 22 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 22 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...New York has swept five of their last nine doubleheaders, including four DH sweeps this season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost three straight games...The three-game losing streak matches their longest of the season...They lost three games from June 26-29 and from July 17-23...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a threegame losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games.. The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

**THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE:** Since 2018, Jacob deGrom owns a 1.94 ERA in 97 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP)...He has 305 strikeouts in 33 starts since 2020...He and Dwight Gooden are the only Mets pitchers ever to fan 300 or more in a span of 33 games...See the chart below for an overview of his 2018 and 2019 Cy Young Award-winning seasons compared to his last three seasons combined:

THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS: Through six starts, deGrom has yielded just 17 hits and three walks while striking out 55 batters...It's the second straight year he has allowed fewer than 20 hits and fewer than 10 walks with 50 or more strikeouts in his first six outings...All other pitchers in MLB history have combined to do that one time, and it also happened last year (Trevor Bauer - 19 hits, eight walks, 51 strikeouts).

HISTORY LESSON: With a win in his last start, deGrom tied David Cone for eighth in Mets history with 81 victories...With a win tonight, he will move into a seventh-place tie with Jon Matlack.

DAY TRIPPER: The Mets have won nine of their last 11 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 34-17 in day games this season...The team's .667 winning percentage in the sunlight is tied for the second-best in the majors and the tied for the best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.02 ERA with 137 walks and 492 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.02 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Over his last 13 starts, Chris Bassitt has gone 8-3 with a 2.41 ERA (23 earned runs/86.0 innings) with 17 walks and 69 strikeouts...He is 7-1 with a 2.44 ERA (15 earned runs/55.1 innings) with 14 walks and 46 strikeouts in nine starts during the day this season...His seven wins during the day are tied for the most with San Francisco's Logan Webb in the National League...In 53 career day starts, Bassitt is 20-14 with a 3.27 ERA (108 earned runs/297.1 inings) with 90 walks and 266 strikeouts...His 3.27 ERA is 14th among active leaders.

EDUARRRDO ESCOBARRR: Eduardo Escobar is a lifetime .405 (32-79) hitter against the Pirates...That is the second-highest average against the Buccos all-time (min, 75 AB). The Cubs' Nico Hoercer has a .416 (32-77) average...Escobar has reached base at a .449 clip against Pittsburgh...Only 10 players have a higher OBP vs. the Pirates.

X MARKS THE SPOT: Pete Alonso has hit a home run in 14 of the 15 current National League ballparks...All three of his home runs against the Pirates have come at hom PNC Park is the last remaining NL ballpark at which he's not gone deep…If Alonso hits a home run in this series, *Elias* says he will become the 23rd active player to hit at least one long ball in all 15 NL venues.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Mets are playing the Pirates for the first time this season... According to Elias, they first played a fellow National League team on September 5 or later just once before, in 2001 when they also faced Pittsburgh on September 17...Last year, the Mets played the Pirates in seven straight games, including four games at Citi Field before the All-Star break and three games at PNC Park after the break

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .304 with 51 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 35 RBI, 31 walks with a .398 OBP and a .498 SLG in 66 road games this season...This compares to a .222/.297/.342 slashline with 20 extra-base hits, 13 RBI and 21 walks in 61 games at Citi Field...He has safely reached base in 32 of his last 33 road games, batting .331 (45-136) with 28 runs, eight doubles, seven home runs, 18 RBI, 14 walks with a .410 OBP and a .544 in that span that started on June 12...His .305 average on the road ranks sixth in the National League.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 29-36 at PNC Park since the ballpark opened in 2001.

FEELING O-K: Jeff McNeil has not struck out in his last nine games...That's the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 10-game streak from August 6-16, 2018, his first month in the big leagues...It's the second time this season he has gone at least eight games without punching out once (also, May 18-25)...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just two strikeouts in his last 63 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks eighth among gualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.6 percent strikeout rate

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil leads the majors with a .349 (74-212) batting average on the road...Overall, he has recorded 21 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 18 RBI, 12 walks with a .395 OBP and a .500 SLG...Overall, McNeil ranks third in the majors with a .315 (138-435) batting average

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 39-28 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .582 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in MLB and third-best in the NL...New York is batting .258/.327/.414 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average is the second-best in the NL and forth in the majors and their .326 OBP on the road ranks fourth in the majors and in the NL.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 50-84 Pirates today...Each of their next 12 games and 20 of the their 26 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 46-21 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .687 winning percentage...Their .687 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 27 second-half wins.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 85 games this season, tied for the second-most in the NL and tied for the third-most in the majors...Their .625 winning percentage is tied for third in the majors and is tied for the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 85-51 record through the team's first 136 games...Only the 1986 (92-44) team posted a better record through the first 136 games of the season.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 appearances. He has tossed 11.0 innings in that span, allowed eight hits, four walks, struck out 15 and posted a 0.82 ERA (one earned run/11.0 innings)...In 17 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts...Lugo ranks ninth in Mets history with 319 strikeouts as a reliever

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,277 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,307 have struck out more...The team's 1,277 strikeouts are already the eighth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.50 K/9 IP, a rate... Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.4 percent), the secondhighest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Diaz leads major league relievers with 101 strikeouts...That is 14 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.83 ERA (three earned runs/32.2 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 63 strikeouts in 32 appearances since the start of June.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.8% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 53 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.04 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.52 ERA (nine earned runs/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 17 walks...The Mets are 47-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves... John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

### BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Tied a career-high with his 12th win of the season, a feat that has him tied for eighth in the NL in that category...Earned his 16th quality start of the season after 6.0 innings of two-run ball...Bassitt struck out four batters and walked three on 103 total pitches marking the 10th time this season he has reached 100 or more pitches in a start, the most such games by a Mets starter this season and the most of his career.

**COME SAIL AWAY:** Bassitt's seven road wins are tied for fourth in the NL and tied for seventh in MLB...His last road start came on August 19 against the Phillies allowing two runs on seven hits through 6.0 innings...He struck out four batters and did not allow a walk...Across his last five road starts, Bassitt owns a 2.81 ERA (10 earned runs/32.0 innings) with 21 strikeouts and seven walks...In his career, Bassitt is 25-13 with a 4.30 ERA on the road (164 earned runs/343.1 innings) with 305 strikeouts and 127 walks.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Bassitt has won five of his last six decisions, his most wins through a six-game span in his career...With his 12th win in his previous start, Bassitt tied a career-high set in 2021...Bassitt's five wins since the All-Star Break are the fourth-most in the NL among starters in that span, and ranks tied for fifth in the majors...The Mets join the Dodgers, Astros, Braves and Giants as the only teams with two players who have 12 or more wins this season...Bassitt will look to help the team snap their three-game losing streak after leading the Mets to victory in 17 of his 25 starts thus far this season, the most among Mets starters.

**AHOY MATES:** This will be Bassitt's second career start against the Pittsburgh Pirates...His last start against the Buckos came on May 4, 2019 at PNC Park, when he allowed three earned runs through 5.0 innings...Bassitt struck out six batters in the start and walked two...This season, Bassitt is 3-0 with a 1.27 ERA (four earned runs/28.1 innings) against the NL Central, with 24 strikeouts, six walks and a .214 (22-103) opponents batting average...His 2.40 career ERA against the NL Central is his lowest against any division.

**PITCHERS DON'T DIG THE LONG BALL:** Chris Bassitt has not allowed a home run in his last seven starts...His seven starts without allowing a homer is the longest such streak of his career through a single season and the third-longest active streak in the majors among starters behind only Zac Gallen (9), and George Kirby (10)...The last Met to go seven starts in a single season without allowing a homer was Matt Harvey (May 30 - July 4, 2016)...Only 16 Mets have ever had a homerless streak longer than seven games over the span of a single season... Tom Glavine was the last Met to go eight straight starts without allowing a home run (July 31 - September 8, 2007)...Currently, Sid Fernandez's 16 game-streak (1992) without allowing a homer is the longest such streak in franchise history.

**PICK SIX:** Recorded his 20th start of at least 6.0 innings, his most such starts in a single season for his career...After allowing only two runs across 6.0 innings, Bassitt earned his 16th quality start of the season tying a career-high set in 2021... Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 14 of his 25 starts, going 6.0 inning or longer in 12 of those 14 starts.

**NO RUNS FOR YOU:** Bassitt has allowed four or fewer runs in 15 of his last 16 games...His 13 consecutive starts allowing four runs or fewer is the longest streak in his career over the span of a single season...Bassitt has allowed three or fewer runs in 11 of his last 13 starts.

**LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI:** His 143 strikeouts are the ninth-most and his 1.133 WHIP is the ninth-lowest in franchise history among pitchers through their first 25 games as a Met (Min 110.0 IP)...His 12 wins are tied for the ninth-most in that span.

**STRIKE 'EM OUT:** Bassitt owns a 41.4 strikeout percentage on his four-seamer which is the highest strikeout percentage for any of his pitches...His 41.4 K% is the second-highest percentage on that pitch in the majors behind only Luis Castillo (min. 100 PA)...His cutter has a 23.8 strikeout percentage which ranks sixth in MLB (min. 100 PA).

**CAREER YEAR:** Tied a career-high set in 2021, with three starts this season going 7.0 innings or longer without allowing an earned run...Those three games are tied with teammate Max Scherzer for the second-most such games this season...The only pitcher on the Mets staff with more such games is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times.

### deGROM NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Recorded his longest outing of the season, throwing 93 pitches in 7.0 innings and allowing just one earned run on three hits with nine strikeouts and one walk as New York defeated Los Angeles (NL), 2-1...Marked his 100th start in which he allowed one or zero runs in his 204 career starts, becoming the fastest pitcher to reach that mark...Since 2014, deGrom has recorded 64 career starts of at least 7.0 innins with one or no runs allowed, the third most in that span (Max Scherzer - 71 and Clayton Kershaw - 68).

**HISTORY LESSON:** With a win in his last start, deGrom tied David Cone for eighth in Mets history with 81 victories...With a win tonight, he will move into a seventh-place tie with Jon Matlack.

**HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY:** Nearly three-quarters of deGrom's starts have lasted at least 6.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer allowed...He has recorded 151 quality starts in 204 career outings (74 percent)...Additionally, deGrom has allowed one or no runs in 100 of his 204 starts (49 percent)...No pitcher in the history of the game has more starts like that through 204 career games.

**THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS:** Through six starts, deGrom has yielded just 17 hits and three walks while striking out 55 batters...It's the second straight year he has allowed fewer than 20 hits and fewer than 10 walks with 50 or more strikeouts in his first six outings...All other pitchers in MLB history have combined to do that one time, and it also happened last year (Trevor Bauer - 19 hits, eight walks, 51 strikeouts).

**AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH:** In his first month back in over a year, deGrom finished the month of August among the MLB leaders in several categories...He led the majors in strikeouts (55), WHIP (0.55), opponent's batting average (.136), opponent's OPS (.388) and K/BB (18.33).
