METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Reds, 7-4, last night...The Mets have won two in a row and three of their last four games...The Mets improved to 39-9 when scoring first this season...The Mets are seeking their 19th series victory of the season... New York is 18-5-2 in 25 series this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (3-1) to finish out the first-half...The Mets continue a quick three-game road trip against the Reds (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head home for a four-game series against the Marlins.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Buck Showalter has recorded 1,601 career managerial wins...The win places him 22nd on the all-time win list, surpassing Tommy Lasorda...Fred Clarke is next with 1,602 wins...His 1,601 wins rank fourth among active managers.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Max Scherzer is set to make his return today...He has been on the 15-Day IL since May 19 with a left oblique strain...The Mets will need to make a corresponding roster move...He is 5-1 with a 2.54 ERA (14 earned runs/49.2 innings) with 11 walks and 59 strikeouts in eight starts this year...He has posted a 6-2 record with a 1.84 ERA (12 earned runs/58.2 innings) with 17 walks and 84 strikeouts in nine career starts against the Redlegs...This includes a 4-0 record with a 0.33 ERA (one earned run/27.0 innings) with eight walks and 42 strikeouts in four starts at Great American Ball Park.

STRIKEOUTS ARE SEXY: Scherzer's 30.6 percent strikeout rate is the fourth-highest ever by a Met in his first eight starts for the team...Only Pedro Martinez (32.1 percent), Nolan Ryan (31.2 percent) and Dwight Gooden (31.2 percent) have had a higher strikeout rate in their first eight starts in a Mets uniform.

HOW PATRIOTIC: The Mets 7-4 win on July 4th was the 36th time in major league history a team won by a score of 7-4...It was the first time since 2018 when the Reds and Angels each did it...It's the second time in Mets history, also winning 7-4 in 1990... Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

NIFTY FIFTY: New York has won 50 games this season, tied for the most in the National League...Their .625 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 50-30 record through the team's first 80 games... Only the 1986 (55-25) and the 1988 (51-29) teams posted a better record through the first 80 games of the season.

HALF WAY: Tonight is New York's 81st game, the mid-way point of the season...The best mark in team history after 81 games is 56-25 (1986), followed by 52-29 record in 1988...Regardless of tonight's outcome, this year's team will rank third.

NO MINOR THING: Congrats to Alex Ramirez who was named the Florida State Player of the Week for June 27-July 3...This is his second Player of the Week Award of the year, also winning the week of May 2-8...He was promoted to Brooklyn (A) after Sunday's game...In five games last week, Ramirez hit 7-18 (.389) with five runs, a double, a triple, a home run, seven RBI, five walks, with a steal, a .522 OBP, a .722 SLG and a 1.244 OPS...In 67 games this year, the outfielder is hitting .284/.360/.443 with 40 runs, 13 doubles, six triples, six home runs, 37 RBI, 17 steals and an .802 OPS...He leads the league in triples, ranks second in hits, fourth in average, tied for fourth in RBI, tied for sixth in extra-base hits, seventh in SLG, eighth in OPS and 10th in OBP.

DINGERS! The Mets have hit multiple home runs in three straight games...It's the longest streak with multiple home runs in a game this year...Their longest streak in 2021 was four straight game with multiple home runs, from June 5-9...New York has homered in five straight games at Great American Ball Park...The have socked 16 home runs in that span that dates to September 22, 2019...It's the second-longest streak by the Mets at the ballpark...From September 25, 2015 - September 7, 2016, the team homered in six straight games at the yard.

TOTAL DOMINATION: Since he was recalled from Triple-A, Dominic Smith has appeared in nine games and is hitting .333 (7-21) with a run, four doubles and two RBI...He is on a three-game hitting streak, going 4-9 with three doubles and two RBI in that span.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo went 2-4 with a run, a home run, a walk and three RBI last night...Over his last 12 games, he is batting .320 (16-50) with seven runs, four doubles, two home runs, six RBI, two walks with a .340 OBP, a .520 SLG and an .860 OPS...He is batting .296/.392/.487 with 15 extra-base hits in 40 games on the road this year...He has safely hit in seven straight road games, batting .379 (11-29) with five runs, two doubles, two homers, six RBI, two walks with a .424 OBP and a .655 SLG in that span.

IT'S GREAT! Luis Guillorme is 5-10 (.500) with a run, a double, a home run, three RBI and a walk in three career games in Cincinnati...Francisco Lindor is a lifetime .358 (24-67) hitter with 16 runs, three doubles, six home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks with a .434 OBP and a .672 SLG in 15 career games here...Ender Inciarte has hit .319 (29-91) with 12 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 14 RBI, eight walks with a .356 BP with a .429 SLG in 25 career games at the ballpark.

DOMINATING DIAZ: Edwin Diaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with eight saves, a 0.66 ERA (one earned run/13.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 29 strikeouts over his last 14 appearances since May 27...Overall, he has recorded 18 saves this season, the fifth-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 63 strikeouts...His 17.54 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 63 of the 130 batters he faced, good for 48.5%...He is 2-1 with 18 saves, a 1.95 ERA (seven earned runs/32.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 30-3 when Diaz appears in a game this year.

REDS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won their last two series at Great American Ball Park...The Mets are 37-21 all-time at the ballpark...Their record at GABP is their best record at any current National League venue since the stadium opened in 2003...That is also the highest win percentage by any NL team when visiting Cincinnati over that time...Courtesy of Sportradar.

ADAM EXPLAINS EVERYTHING: Adam Ottavino has allowed two runs over his last 22 appearances...He is 1-1 with a 0.87 ERA (two earned runs/22.2 innings) in that span with five walks and 18 strikeouts...Overall, he is 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA (nine earned runs/30.1 innings) with 10 walks and 35 strikeouts...In 15 road games, he is 0-1 with a 1.35 ERA (two earned runs/13.1 innings) with three walks and 14 strikeouts...Right-handed batters are hitting .149 (11-74) against him this season.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 24-17 on the road this year...Their .575 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...New York is batting .257/.322/.406 away from Citi Field...Their .257 road average ranks fourth in the majors, while their .322 OBP ranks seventh.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil ranks fifth in the majors and third in the National League with a .318 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22...He is batting .360 (41-114) with 12 doubles, a triple, two home runs, 32 RBI with a .408 OBP and a .535 SLG with runners on base this year...His .360 average ranks 10th in the majors and seventh in the National League...McNeil is batting .342/.398/.487 on the road this year...His .342 average is tied for sixth in the majors.

MARTE PARTAY: Over the last eight games, Starling Marte is 11-31 (.355) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, three RBI, two walks, a steal with a .412 OBP, a .645 SLG and a 1.057 OPS...He is one double away from 250 for his career...In 49 games since May 1, Starling Marte is batting .308 (60-195) with 38 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 10 walks, five steals with a .351 OBP, a .518 SLG and an .869 OPS.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets have struck out 10 or more in a game 40 times this year...That is the tied with the White Sox and Braves for the most in the majors...Overall, the Mets rank third in the majors with 746 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 605 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 54 times this year...The Mets have been hit 288 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 64 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 37 HBP.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader with 50 in his Mets career.

MV-PETE: Pete Alonso became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are second in the majors with a .272 average with runners in scoring position...They rank seventh in MLB with a .345 OBP...Jeff McNeil - .385 (25-65), Tomás Nido - .333 (12-36), Pete Alonso - .315 (23-73) and Dominic Smith - .310 (9-29) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the major leagues with 51 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .385 average with RISP is seventh in the majors.

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: On Saturday, July 9, 2022, the Mets will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...In anticipation of the event, the Mets are counting down 17 moments of Hernandez career with the Mets at metsheritage.com...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

THAT WAS THEN: On May 18, the day Scherzer suffered his injury, he ranked among MLB's top pitchers in wins (five, t-first), strikeouts (59, fourth), strikeout rate (30.6 percent, seventh), pitches per game (94.9, sixth), WHIP (0.95, 10th), opponent average (.203, 11th) and K/BB ratio (5.36, 11th)...Left the game in the sixth inning on May 18 vs. the Cardinals...Was diagnosed with an oblique strain and has been on the Injured List since May 19.

THIS IS NOW: Tonight, Scherzer will return from a seven-week stint on the Injured List...He made two rehab starts with Binghamton (AA), building up to 80 pitches in his final tune-up on June 29...In the two rehab starts, he pitched 8.0 innings, allowed five runs (four earned) on seven hits, walked two and punched out 14.

FIVE AWAY: Scherzer has 195 career wins, five away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (236) and Zack Greinke (221) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 195-98 in his career...If he wins five of his next six decisions, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

SEEING REDS: His 1.84 ERA against the Reds is tied for the ninth-lowest mark among all pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched against the franchise since the earned run became official in 1913...His 0.33 ERA at Great American Ball Park is the lowest among all pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched at the venue.

THE 7.0 LINE: Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings three times in seven starts this season...Each time Scherzer has thrown 7.0 innings this season, he has finished his outing with three hits or fewer allowed...Despite missing seven weeks on the Injured List, those three outings of 7.0+ innings while allowing three or fewer hits are still tied for the most in the NL and tied for fifth-most in the majors...Scherzer's 55 such outings are tied with Walter Johnson for the ninth-most all-time...Justin Verlander (58) ranks eighth and Pedro Martinez (59) ranks seventh.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He has since been passed by Justin Verlander, who has moved up to 16th on the all-time list...He currently ranks 19th on MLB's all-time strikeout list and is within striking distance of several pitchers above him this season...He needs six strikeouts to pass John Smoltz and move into 18th place and 15 to pass CC Sabathia for 17th all-time...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (5-1, 3.24)

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed his second straight quality start on July 1 vs. Texas before hitting the Paternity List two days later...Threw 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on five hits with a career-high-tying 10 strikeouts and no walks...Was the first time in his career he's gone back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

SWING AND A MISS: Peterson has generated at least 14 swings and misses in three straight starts, causing 59 whiffs total in that span...Before this stretch, he had two starts total in his career in which he made opposing hitters swing and miss 14 or more times.
