D-BACKS, MARTE AGREE ON 6-YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION: Wednesday, the D-backs agreed with INF Ketel Marte to a 6-year contract extension through 2030 (beginning in 2025) with a player option for 2031.

DOMO IN GRAND FASHION: Geraldo Perdomo last night recorded his second career grand slam (also: June 7, 2022 @ Reds)...joined Nick Ahmed, Jay Bell and Tony Womack as the only D-back shortstops with 2 grand slams.

MÁS PERDOMO: Geraldo Perdomo's 11 RBI through the team's first 7 games this season are tied for the second most in club history (also: Eugenio Suárez in 2025, Luis Gonzalez in 2001), behind Chris Young's 12 in 2010.

TRENDING BATS:

- Ketel Marte has hit safely in 6 of his 7 games and is batting .320 (8-for-25)/.852 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 RBI and 6 walks.
- Geraldo Perdomo, in 7 games, is hitting .320 (8-for-25) with 1 double, 1 homer, 11 RBI, 1 walk and 1 stolen base...has hit safely in 6 of his 7 games.
- Gabriel Moreno, in 6 games, is hitting .375 (6-for-16) with 1 RBI and 3 walks.

FACING THE NATS: Since 2022, the D-backs have gone 14-5 vs. Nationals (7-3 on the road), including 8-1 in their last 9 meetings.

- The D-backs have won 7 of their last 8 games @ Nationals Park since April 20, 2022...as a team, Arizona is hitting .304 (85-for-280)/.366 OBP and owns a 5.88 run/game AVG in that span.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit in 10 straight games vs. Nationals dating back to August 18, 2021... is batting .500 (19-for-38)/1.337 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 6 RBI and 3 walks in that span.
- Ketel Marte, in his last 8 games vs. Nationals, is hitting .382 (13-for-34)/.1.095 OPS with 2 doubles, 3 homers, 10 RBI and 1 walk.
- **Alek Thomas**, in 9 career games vs. Nationals, is hitting .346 (9-for-26)/.970 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 5 RBI and 1 walk.
