RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a five-game, six-day, rain-shortened road trip against the Yankees (1-1) and Orioles (three to play) today in Baltimore...have owned the best record in the majors for each of the last seven days, their first time leading MLB since June 30, 2023 (57-28)...have won five of six, nine of 12, 16 of 20, 22 of 27, and 29 of their last 38 games...since Opening Day, have boosted their postseason odds from 28.9 pct. to 92.2 pct., an MLB-leading 63.3 pct. increase (FanGraphs)...have the easiest remaining schedule in MLB (.472 opp. winning pct.), and, including this series, each of their next six opponents are currently below .500...have led the AL East for 15 consecutive days (May 9-pres.), their longest reign since a club-record 113-day streak in 2023 (Opening Day-July 19)...have spent 22 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...are 13-4 on a stretch of 20 games (May 4-27) that includes 17 meetings with divisional opponents.

★ The Rays saw their five-game winning streak halted with a 2-0 loss in yesterday's series finale at Yankee Stadium after Aaron Judge's walk-off homer broke a scoreless tie and snapped Kevin Kelly's scoreless streak at 15.1 innings, the longest active streak by an AL reliever entering the game.

★ It marked the Rays second shutout loss (also: 2-0 on May 8 at BOS), tied with the Brewers, Dodgers, and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...it was also their third walk-off defeat, two of which have come in their last nine games...they were also walked off on May 13 at TOR (grand slam) and March 28 at STL (single)...the Rays, Rockies (3), Tigers (3), and Pirates (2) are the only clubs to lose multiple games on walk-off homers...each of their last three losses have come in the final at-bat, but their nine last at-bat wins are still tied for the most in MLB, matching the Braves and Cardinals.

★ Despite the loss, the Rays 16-4 (.800) record in May remains the best in the majors...it ties June 2004 for their third-best start to a calendar month, trailing April 2023 and July 2013 (both 17-3), per Stats Perform...their .800 winning pct. this May would mark the second-highest in a calendar month behind July 2013 (.21-5/.808).

★ The Rays 14 comeback wins are tied with the Athletics and Guardians for the most in the AL...they have come from behind in each of their last three wins and four of their last five (May 17-pres.)...they trailed in only three of their previous 17 victories entering that stretch (April 22-May 15).

★ The Rays 34-16 record ties 2010 for their second-best start through 50 games, trailing 2023 (35-15)...from 2007-25, 11 MLB teams won 34 or more of their first 50 games...each of those clubs finished with 95 wins or more (excluding 2020), and five went on to win the World Series.

★ Since April 22, the Rays have gone 22-5, tied for their second-best stretch in franchise history behind June 29-July 30, 2013 (23-4), and have not lost consecutive games...the 27-game streak without back-to-back losses is the fifth longest in franchise history...six games shy of the club record (33G) established from Aug. 18-Sept. 24, 2018 (33G).

★ The Rays have committed seven errors over 20 games in May, tied with the Guardians for the fewest in the AL, and have gone four consecutive games without a miscue...their 25 errors in March/April (30G) were second most in the majors behind the Nationals (28).

★ The Rays are 9-14 on Memorial Day (4-9 on road), including 5-2 in their last seven games dating back to 2017 (no game in 2024 & 2020)...last season, they beat the Twins, 7-2, on May 26 at Steinbrenner Field after Jonathan Aranda hit a go-ahead three-run homer in the 6th inning...this marks the second time the Rays and Orioles will meet on the holiday, joining 2000 (L, 5-1 at Tropicana Field).

QUALITY IN QUANTITY—Baltimore native Shane McClanahan is 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0IP, 7ER) in four career starts at Oriole Park, all of which were quality...it marks the longest streak of quality starts to begin a pitcher's career as a starter at this venue since LAA/OAK Trevor Cahill (4QS) from 2009-19...only five pitchers have recorded quality starts in each of their first five career starts at Oriole Park: BOS Pedro Martinez (9QS, 1998-2004), DET Justin Verlander (7QS, 2006-13), CWS/NYY/SEA Freddy Garcia (7QS, 1990-2011), BAL/NYY/TOR Jimmy Key (7QS, 1992-97), and OAK/WSH Gio Gonzalez (5QS, 2009-15)...McClanahan's three career wins in this ballpark are tied with Gavin Floyd and Jeff Nelson for third most by a Maryland-born pitcher, trailing Bruce Zimmermann (6) and Steve Johnson (5)...with a victory today, he would become the second Rays pitcher to win four of his first five career starts at Oriole Park, joining Wade Davis (4-0, 2009-11).

★ Rays starters have yielded one or zero runs in each of their last four outings, pitching to a 1.23 ERA (22.0IP, 3ER) in that span...it ties their longest streak this season (4x, last: May 12-16), and they haven't had a longer streak since going five straight starts from June 21-26, 2025.

★ The rotation, which has yielded three runs or fewer in 26 of its last 27 starts (April 22-pres.) and in 43 of 50 starts this season, owns an MLB-best 2.96 ERA (246.1IP, 81ER)...the Rays have completed a season leading baseball in starter ERA once previously, when the 2012 rotation anchored by Cy Young-winner David Price turned in a 3.34 ERA.

A SERIES OF FORTUNATE EVENTS—The Rays are undefeated (8-0-1) over their last nine sets, tied for the sixth-longest streak of unbeaten series in club history and their longest since a 7-0-2 run from May 14-June 11, 2021...their last longer streak was 10 consecutive sets from Aug. 4-Sept. 4, 2020 (8-0-2), and the club record is 13 straight (2x: 11-0-2 from June 20-Aug. 2, 2013 & 12-0-1 from July 18-Aug. 29, 2008)...the Rays are 3-0-1 in their last four road series and 5-1-1 in their previous seven since losing their first two...they have won nine of 10 series against opponents that entered with a losing record, including eight straight wins since the lone loss from April 6-8 vs. CHC...they lead the majors with six series sweeps, tying 2023, 2021, and 2010 for the most in team history before the end of May...they swept seven series in 2025.

★ The Rays have won nine consecutive series openers, tied with July 25-Aug. 22, 2023 for the third-longest streak in franchise history...it trails only streaks of 11 (April 21-May 26, 2023) and 10 openers (May 23-June 24, 2025)...their 13-4 record in openers is the best in the majors.

★ They have recorded four winning streaks of five games or more, tallying runs of seven (May 1-7), six (2x: April 10-16 & April 22-28), and five wins (May 17-22)...no other club has more than two streaks.

BRINGING THE BATS—Yandy Diaz has reached base safely in nine straight games, batting .361 (13-for-36) with 4 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI, and a 1.161 OPS in that span...Junior Caminero is 10-for-25 (.400) with 2 2B, 2 HR, and 8 RBI during a seven-game hitting streak, tied with three other players for the second-longest active streak in the AL behind BOS Willson Contreras (8G) and tied for the third-longest of his career (longest: 10G from April 15-25, 2026)...Cedric Mullins is batting .341 (15-for-44) with 1 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, 4 BB, 8 R, and 4 SB over his last 13 games, raising his average from .131 to .192.

★ Ryan Vilade has reached base safely in 10 of his last 16 PA (.625 OBP - 3 1B, 3B, HR, 5BB)...two of the six outs he has made in that span were sacrifice flies...he is batting .351/418/544 (20-for-57) with 6 XBH, 14 RBI, 8 BB, and 8 SO over his last 24 games (April 7-pres.), ranking second in the majors (min. 50PA) in average over that span behind AZ Ryan Waldschmidt (.353) and sixth in OPS (.962).

★ AL RBI leader Jonathan Aranda is batting .329/.417/.429 (23-for-70) with 5 XBH, 13 RBI, 10 BB, and 11 R over 20 games in May...the .329 average ranks third in the AL behind DET Riley Greene and ATH Nick Kurtz (both .350)...according to Stats Perform, only two Rays have paced the Junior Circuit in RBI later into a season than Aranda: Austin Meadows in 2021 (latest date: June 10) and Evan Longoria in 2009 (latest date: June 9).

CHARM CITY CLASH—The Rays and Orioles continue a stretch of six meetings over a 10-day span (May 18-27) today, with the Rays taking all three matchups thus far...it ties 2022 for their second-longest season-opening streak vs. Baltimore, trailing a six-game run to open 2021...they are looking to win their first four games against a division rival to open a season series for the seventh time, joining the aforementioned 2021 season against the Orioles, this year against the Blue Jays (5G) and Yankees (4G), 2023 and 2010 vs. Boston (both 4G), and 2008 vs. Toronto (4G)...through three meetings, the Rays have outscored the Orioles, 25-10, despite being out-homered, 5-3...half (5) of the runs the Orioles have scored off Rays pitching have come via the long ball, but the Rays have gone 12-for-29 (.414) with RISP while holding Baltimore to a 4-for-28 (.143) clip...the Rays have lost nine of their last 14 games at Oriole Park (Sept. 16, 2023-pres.) and are 10-17 in their last 27 (May 22, 2022-pres.) on the heels of a 14-2 run in this ballpark (Sept. 17, 2020-May 21, 2022)...they are 1-1-7 in series play over the 10-17 stretch, with the lone win coming from Sept. 6-8, 2024...the Rays have lost the last three season series (2023-25) with the Orioles on the heels of six straight wins (2017-22).

★ The Rays 14-3 record vs. AL East opponents is tied with 14 other clubs (last: 2022 Twins) for the fourth-best intradivision start in the divisional era (since 1969) trailing the 1981 Athletics (16-2), 2016 Cubs (15-2), and 1982 Cardinals (15-2)...with a win today, their 15-3 mark would tie nine other teams (last: 2016 Cubs) for the second-best intradivision start behind the 1981 Athletics (17-1).

★ Orioles skipper and Eckerd College product Craig Albright began his coaching career in the Rays system (2015-19) following eight seasons as a Tampa Bay minor leaguer...three members of his staff are former Rays players: first base coach Jason Bourgeois (OF, 2013), infield coach Miguel Cairo (INF, 1998-2000), and bullpen coach Hank Conger (C, 2016).

★ In his last 15 games vs. the Orioles (Sept. 7, 2024-pres.), Yandy Diaz is batting .491/.569/.800 (27-for-55) with 9 XBH, 8 BB, and 7 SO...min. 35 AB, it marks the highest average by any player in the majors vs. a single team in that span...he is 10-for-22 (.455) lifetime vs. Kyle Bradish.

★ Junior Caminero is batting .400 (24-for-60) with 6 XBH and 13 RBI and 14 games against the Orioles since the start of last season, tallying multiple hits in nine of those contests.

★ This marks Cedric Mullins' first series in Baltimore since the Orioles dealt him to the Mets at last year's trade deadline...his 49 SB at this venue are fifth most in the ballpark's history.

TODAY'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 10th start of the season and fifth on the road...will be making his 84th career start and 39th career road start...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- Today's outing marks the first Memorial Day start of his career.
- A win today would give McClanahan four victories in May (5GS), making him one of three MLB arms with four wins or more this month, joining MIA Max Meyer (4-0) and PHI Zack Wheeler (4-0)...would mark the third time in his career he has recorded five wins or more through his first 10 starts of a season, joining 2022 (5-0) and 2023 (7-0)...the last Ray to post five wins or more through his first 10 starts was Taj Bradley in 2023 (5-3)...the franchise record for wins through a pitcher's first 10 starts of a season is eight, set by Matt Moore in 2013.
- Is one of 15 AL starters and one of four left-handers (min. 20.0IP) to allow four earned runs or fewer during May entering today's game.
- McClanahan ranks third among AL pitchers this season (min. 30.0IP) in opp. batting average (.183), trailing BOS Payton Tolle (.163) and HOU Spencer Arrighetti (.169).

LAST TIME OUT—Picked up his fifth win of the season despite allowing a season-high tying four runs on five hits across 5.0 innings of work in a 16-6 win on May 18 vs. BAL...gave up an RBI-single to **Adley Rutschman** in the 3rd inning, snapping his career-best scoreless streak at 23.2 innings (April 19-May 18), but then recorded his 500th career strikeout by fanning **Pete Alonso** for the final out of the inning.

- After issuing 11 walks over this first three starts (March 31-April 14), he has permitted only six over his last six outings (April 19-pres.) with 34 strikeouts...posted a 3.43 BB/9.OIP ratio over his first three starts compared to a 1.74 BB/9.0 clip in his last six outings.

MEM-ORIOLE DAY—The Baltimore native will make his 11th career start against the Orioles today...he's 7-0 with a 3.25 ERA (55.1IP, 20ER) and 63 strikeouts in the previous 10 outings, limiting Baltimore hitters to a .239 (50-for-209) average...he has allowed 2 ER or fewer in seven of those starts, with the Rays going 6-1 in those contests...McClanahan lived in Baltimore until he was six, and some of his best memories of his childhood involve taking the train to watch the Orioles play.

- McClanahan's seven wins and 63 strikeouts against the Orioles are both his most against any opponent in his career.
- At Camden Yards, is 3-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.OIP, 7ER) and a .207 opp. average (19-for-92) through four starts in his career.
- Against AL East opponents, McClanahan owns an 18-7 career record with a 2.95 ERA (189.OIP, 62ER), 206 strikeouts, and a .222 (156-for-704) opp. average over 35 starts...among active AL southpaws, despite being sidelined from 2024-25, his 18 daytime wins vs. AL East foes rank sixth, and his strikeouts are 10th most.

FAMILIAR FOES—McClanahan has faced the same opponent in back-to-back starts six times in his career (TOR, July 3-9, 2021; BAL, Aug. 19-27, 2021; BOS, Sept. 2-8, 2021; NYY, June 15-20, 2022; CWS, April 22-27, 2023; TOR, May 6-12, 2026).

- In six instances facing the same club in consecutive outings, he has picked up the win in both games three times, last turning the trick this season vs. TOR (May 6-12).

RISE AND SHANE—In four daytime starts this year, McClanahan is 2-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.OIP, 6ER) and 21 strikeouts...for his career, is 18-6 with a 3.03 ERA (181.1IP, 61ER) and 212 strikeouts across 33 daytime starts...his 18 daytime wins since 2021 are tied for the ninth-most among AL pitchers and rank third among AL left-handers, trailing DET Tarik Skubal (27) and DET Framber Valdez (26).

UP AND AWAY—Through four road starts this season, has a 1-2 record with a 3.79 ERA (19.OIP, 8ER), 20 strikeouts, and a .181 opp. average (13-for-72)...his opp. average on the road ranks ninth among AL starters this season (min. 15.0IP), and is second among AL southpaws, trailing BOS Payton Tolle (.121)...at home this season, he has posted a 2.10 ERA (25.2IP, 6ER) and a .185 opp. average (17-for-92).

SUPPORTING OUR STARTER—McClanahan has received three runs of support or more in 43 of his 82 career appearances...in those 43 outings, he holds a 33-1 record, 2.76 ERA (241.1IP, 74ER), .212 (190-for-896) opp. average, 1.07 WHIP, and 268 strikeouts to 69 walks...in games where he receives three runs of support or more, the Rays are 39-4 and have won 19 of the last 20.

- Since his rookie season in 2021, McClanahan has the fourth-best run support average (5.47) among AL southpaws (min. 250.OIP), behind NYY Max Fried (6.69), CLE Logan Allen (5.74), and NYY Carlos Rodón (5.63).

THE ACE OF K'S—He has recorded four strikeouts or more in every start this year...with seven punchouts on May 12 at TOR, he surpassed Matt Moore (494SO) for ninth on the Rays all-time strikeout list, 23 shy of eighth-ranked Tyler Glasnow (526SO)...he ranks fourth among Tampa Bay left-handers behind David Price (1,065SO), Scott Kazmir (874SO), and Blake Snell (648SO).

- With three strikeouts or more today, McClanahan would reach 50 strikeouts through his first 10 starts to a season for the fourth season in a row (2021-23, 2026)...the last Ray to collect 50 strikeouts or more in his first 10 starts was Shane Baz in 2025, fanning 52 in that span.
