YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles defeated the Rangers, 2-1, for their third win in a row...**Albert Suárez** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, his longest outing of the year and his longest career scoreless start...**Colton Cowser** hit the 58th homer of the month by the O's, tying the franchise record for most home runs in one month set in May 1987...**Craig Kimbrel** secured his 18th save of the year, ranked third in the AL, and 435th of his career, tied with Boston's Kenley Jansen for the most among active players and two behind Francisco Rodríguez for fourth in MLB history.

ALL-STAR VOTING: MLB announced the finalists for the 2024 MLB All-Star Game on Thursday...The second phase of voting, which begins tomorrow at 12:00 p.m. ET at MLB.com/vote, features the top two vote-getters at each position in each League (and the top six outfielders in the NL; next four outfielders in the AL after leading vote-getter Aaron Judge) based on vote totals from Phase 1, which ran from June 5-27; fans can vote once per day, as opposed to five times in Phase 1...Six O's advanced as finalists at their respective positions; Baltimore has not had multiple starters in an All-Star Game since **Adam Jones** and **Nelson Cruz** in 2014.

- 🇺🇸 **Adley Rutschman** led AL catchers and ranked third in the AL with 2,791,952 votes; he will match up with Kansas City's Salvador Perez; he's seeking his second All-Star nod (2023) and first starting assignment and would become the third O's backstop to start an All-Star Game, along with **Gus Triandos** in 1958 and 1959, and **Terry Kennedy** in 1987; **Matt Wieters** was voted to start in 2014, but did not play (injury).
- 🇺🇸 **Gunnar Henderson** led AL shortstops with 2,664,120 votes; he will face Kansas City's Bobby Witt Jr.; he's vying for his first career All-Star selection and would be the first Orioles shortstop selected to the Midsummer Classic since **Manny Machado** in 2018.
- 🇺🇸 **Ryan Mountcastle** led AL first basemen with 2,296,697 votes; he meets Toronto's Vladimir Guerrero Jr.; he's seeking his first All-Star nod and would be the first O's first baseman selected to the Midsummer Classic since **Chris Davis** in 2013.
- 🇺🇸 **Jordan Westburg** ranked second among AL third basemen with 1,483,679 votes, behind Cleveland's Jose Ramirez (2,336,628); he's seeking his first All-Star nod and would be the first Orioles third baseman selected to the Midsummer Classic since Machado in 2016.
- 🇺🇸 **Anthony Santander** finished fourth among AL outfielders with 1,478,034 votes behind New York-AL's Aaron Judge (3,425,309) and Juan Soto (3,000,121), and Cleveland's Steven Kwan (1,723,074), and ahead of Houston's Kyle Tucker (1,426,948); he's looking for his first All-Star selection and would be the first fan-elected Baltimore outfielder since Jones in 2014.

WHAT'S TRENDING: The Orioles have won three in a row after dropping their previous five games, the team's longest losing streak since May 13-18, 2022 (6 G)...At 52-30 (.634), the Birds own the third-best record in MLB, behind the Guardians (.638, 51-29) and Phillies (.659, 54-28)...Since the start of 2023, Baltimore is 153-91 (.627), the best winning percentage and most wins in the majors during that time... The O's are 236-170 (.581) since the start of 2022, the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best in MLB behind the Astros (.583, 236-169), Braves (.619, 250-154), and Dodgers (.644, 262-145).

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles lead MLB with 137 home runs and are one of four clubs with 100+ homers this season, along with the Yankees (121), Dodgers (111), and Mets (100)...The Birds have homered in 26 of the last 27 games, including a club-record 22 consecutive games from June 1-23.

- 🇺🇸 The O's have hit 58 home runs this month, the most homers in June in club history, ahead of the 56 long balls in June 2016; that is tied with the 2022 Yankees and trailing only the 2023 Braves (61) for the most in the month of June in MLB history, and are tied for the most in any month in O's history with May 1987; besides the Braves in June 2023, the only other MLB team with more than 60 home runs in a month is the Yankees in August 2019 (74).
- 🇺🇸 The 137 homers are the most through 82 games in team history; Baltimore is the 11th MLB team since at least 1901 with 137+ home runs in the first 82 games of a season and the first since Atlanta hit 155 last season; all such occurrences in MLB have come since 1999 with eight coming since 2018.
- 🇺🇸 The O's are 45-20 this year when homering, 35-6 when hitting multiple home runs, 19-5 when hitting at least three, and 5-2 when hitting four.
- 🇺🇸 Baltimore has an MLB-best seven players with at least 10 home runs: **Gunnar Henderson** (26), **Anthony Santander** (21), **Adley Rutschman** (15), **Jordan Westburg** (13), **Colton Cowser** (12), **Ryan Mountcastle** (11), and **Ryan O'Hearn** (10); no other team has more than five such players this season.
- 🇺🇸 Henderson and Santander are one of three duos in MLB with at least 20 homers each so far this season, along with Cleveland's José Ramirez and Josh Naylor, and New York-AL's Aaron Judge and Juan Soto.
- 🇺🇸 The Birds lead MLB with nine leadoff homers this year; **Gunnar Henderson** has eight of those, the most in MLB and tied for the second-most in a single season in Orioles history with **Cedric Mullins** (2021), trailing only **Brady Anderson** (12, 1996).

TOP GUNN: **Gunnar Henderson** ranks second in MLB with 26 homers, trailing only New York-AL's Aaron Judge (30)...He's among MLB leaders in a variety of categories (see box at right).

- 🇺🇸 Henderson owns a career-best 35-game on-base streak since May 22, the longest active streak in MLB; marks the longest on-base streak by an O's batter since **Nick Markakis'** 38-game streak from July 5 to August 18, 2009.
- 🇺🇸 Since May 28, he's slashing .342/.438/.667 (40-for-117) with 11 doubles, nine homers, 32 runs, 21 RBI, 19 walks, one hit-by-pitch, and six stolen bases in 29 games while recording a hit in 26 of those; he leads MLB during that time in extra-base hits (20) and runs.
- 🇺🇸 He leads MLB with 72 runs scored this season, the most runs through the first 82 team games of a season in O's history; the only players in team history to lead the AL in runs are **Frank Robinson** in 1966 (122) and **Cal Ripken, Jr.** in 1982 (121); Robinson is the only player in Orioles history to lead MLB in runs, when he tied with Atlanta's Felipe Alou.
- 🇺🇸 Had a career-long 14-game hitting streak from June 6-21, the longest hitting streak by an O's batter since **Anthony Santander** had a 16-game streak from July 16 to August 6, 2022.

SUMMER SLUGGER: **Anthony Santander** leads MLB with 12 home runs this month, tied for the most in the month of June in Orioles history with **Boog Powell** (1964), **Rafael Palmeiro** (1998), **Albert Belle** (2000), and **Chris Davis** (2013)...He is the first Oriole with at least 12 home runs in a month since **Manny Machado** in August of 2017 (also 12)...Trails only **Jim Gentile** (15 in August 1961), **Nelson Cruz** (13 in May 2014), and **Frank Robinson** (13 in July 1966) for the most home runs hit in a single month by an Orioles batter.

- 🇺🇸 Santander's 82 home runs since the start of 2022 are the most by a switch hitter, third in the AL, and tied for 11th in MLB; the only AL players to hit more in that span are Houston's Yordan Alvarez (84) and New York-AL's Aaron Judge (129).

MONTHLY DUES: The Orioles have clinched a winning record in June, the team's ninth consecutive winning month (min. 10 games played) since the start of 2023, the longest streak by the O's since May 1982 through September 1983 (11), per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...The current stretch is the longest active streak in the majors; Atlanta had its streak of 11 straight winning months since June 2022 snapped with a 13-14 record in May.

FEELS GOOD TO BE HOME: The Orioles continue a seven-game homestand with the third game in a four-game series against the Rangers...The final two games will be nationally televised, with tonight on FOX's *Baseball Night in America* and Sunday on ESPN's *Sunday Night Baseball*...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, this will be Baltimore's 35th appearance on *Sunday Night Baseball* (15-19)...The Birds lost two of three against the Guardians to open the homestand.

AGAINST TEXAS: The Orioles and Rangers continue their four-game series with game three tonight at Camden Yards...It's the first meeting between the teams since the 2023 ALDS, which Texas swept on its way to the franchise's first World Series title...Baltimore travels to Arlington for a three-game set after the All-Star break from July 19-21...

- 🇺🇸 Since the start of 2021, the O's are 15-6 (.714) against the Rangers during the regular season, including a perfect 6-0 in 2022.
- 🇺🇸 Baltimore is 276-221-1 all time against the Rangers since the Washington Senators moved to Texas in 1972; the .555 winning percentage is the best among current AL teams and the second-best behind the .558 mark against the Brewers during that time (min. 100 G).

QUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his fifth career start tonight against the Rangers...Became the first Oriole pitcher to make his Major League debut this season and fourth Oriole overall, joining INF Jackson Holliday, C David Bañuelos, and INF/OF Connor Norby...Became the first Oriole to throw at least 100 pitches in his MLB debut since Wei-Yin Chen on April 10, 2012 vs. New York-AL; is the third MLB player to do so since the start of 2019, joining Chicago-AL's Dylan Cease on July 3, 2019 (G1) vs. Detroit (101) and Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott on June 5, 2023 vs. Milwaukee (105)...On June 12 vs. Atlanta, he became the 11th Oriole in team history to throw at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his first career MLB home start and first since Mike Wright Jr. on May 17, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-AL (7.1 IP); at 24 years, 61 days old, became the youngest O's left-hander to toss 6.0+ shutout frames since Zack Britton (23y-249d) on August 28, 2011 (G1) vs. New York-AL (7.0 IP)...Acquired by the Orioles along with RHP Yennier Cano, LHP Juan Rojas, and RHP Juan Nuñez from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for RHP Jorge López and cash considerations on August 2, 2022...Originally selected by the Minnesota Twins in the third round (No. 98 overall) of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Nebraska.

LAST TIME OUT: Dealt the loss on June 24 vs. Cleveland after allowing three runs on seven hits (1 HR) and one walk with five strikeouts across 5.2 innings...José Ramirez broke a 2-2 tie with a solo home run in the sixth inning...The seven hits are the most he has allowed in his four career MLB starts...Threw 95 pitches, 62 strikes.

HOME SWEET HOME: Across his two career starts at Oriole Park, he has gone 0-1 with a 2.31 ERA (3 ER/11.2 IP)...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his first career start at home on June 12 vs. Atlanta.

NIGHT OWL: Owns an 0-1 record with a 2.20 ERA (4 ER/16.1 IP) across three night starts this season compared to an 0-1 record with a 10.13 ERA (6 ER/5.1 IP) in his lone day start on June 6 at Toronto, his MLB debut.

REVERSE SPLITS: Lefty hitters are slashing .250/.382/.393 (7-for-28) off Povich in his four starts compared to the .208/.271/.340 (11-for-53) against righties.

HIGH TIDE: Has gone 5-1 with a 3.18 ERA (20 ER/56.2 IP), a 1.11 WHIP, and 75 strikeouts against 21 walks in 11 starts for the Tides this year...At the time of his promotion, he ranked among International League leaders in strikeouts (2nd), opponent average (3rd, .203), ERA (4th), WHIP (4th, 1.11), and wins (T-4th); only trailed teammate RHP Chayce McDermott (82) in strikeouts...His 75 strikeouts were tied for fifth among all minor league pitchers.

PROSPECTING: Currently ranked as the No. 5 Orioles prospect and No. 99 overall by *Baseball America*...He is ranked as the club's top pitching prospect...At 24 years, 78 days old, he is currently the youngest pitcher on the O's and second-youngest player overall behind Gunnar Henderson (turning 23 today).

APRIL SHOWERS: Named the International League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 2-1 with a 1.03 ERA (3 ER/26.1 IP) and a league-best 40 strikeouts in five starts...Also named the Orioles Minor League Pitcher of the Month after leading O's minor leaguers (min. 20 IP) in ERA, WHIP, and strikeouts...Named International League Pitcher of the Week for April 1-7 after going 1-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER/11.0 IP), three hits, three walks, and 14 strikeouts in two starts at Charlotte during the week.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Spent the season between Double-A Bowie and Triple-A Norfolk...Combined to go 8-10 with a 5.04 ERA (71 ER/126.2 IP) and 106 hits (18 HR), 76 total runs, 66 walks, five hit batters, and 171 strikeouts in 28 games, all starts...Named an *MiLB.com* Organization All-Star...Finished third among all minor leaguers in strikeouts; his 12.15 K/9 ranked third among full-season minor leaguers...Selected as Eastern League Pitcher of the Week three times (5/1, 5/15, & 6/19)...Fanned 10 on April 29 (G1) vs. Richmond and May 11 at Harrisburg...Struck out a career-high 13 batters on June 15 vs. Richmond; struck out the first six batters of the game and retired the first 18 hitters of the game; pitched 7.0 innings for the first time and surrendered just one hit...Completed at least 6.0 innings in five starts.
