Friday the Redlegs were eliminated from NL Central Division title contention...last season, were eliminated on 9/10...were trying to become the first team ever to win a division after losing at least 100 games the season before (62-100).

FROM 100 TO POSTSFASON

The Reds are trying to become the **third team** ever to make the playoffs following a **100**loss season (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the fourth Postseason team with a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; 2020 Marlins, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds finished 62-100 (.383) in 2022 and are 79-77 (.506) so far this season...among all Major League teams from 2022 to 2023, the Reds rank second to the Rangers for the largest increase in wins (+17, Tex +18) and largest increase in winning percentage (+.123, Tex +.138)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ROLLER COASTER

From 4/24-7/31 the Reds went 52-34 (.605), the second-best record in the **Major Leagues** behind the **Braves** (53-29, .646)...through games of July 31, the Reds led the NL Central by 1.5 games over the Brewers and by 5.0 games over the third-place Cubs...since then are 20-28, including 10-17 in August and 10-11 in September...lost their last 4 games.

- The Reds held a 9-0 lead through the third inning of last night's 13-12 loss to the Pirates...entering yesterday's games, this season teams were **205-0** when trailing by 9 or more runs at any point in a game.
 - Dating back to a 10-9 loss in 10 innings on 4/28/2004 at Mil (led 9-0), the
- Reds had **won 111 consecutive games** when leading by at least 9 runs. Was the biggest comeback win in Pirates history...they entered last night's game 0-819 when trailing by at least 9 runs...courtesy @EliasSports.

- ls Game 3 (0-2) of a 3-game series vs Jimmy Trdinich's Pirates and Game **6** (1-4) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series loss** to the Twins and Thu's day off.
- This afternoon the Pirates are looking for their first series sweep of the Reds
- at Great American Ball Park since 9/12-9/14, 2022 (4g). Beginning Tuesday, the Reds will finish the season with a 5-game road trip to Cle's Progressive Field (2g) and StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g).

BIG ROAD MACHINE

- The Reds are trying to become fourth Postseason team with a losing home record during the regular season (1981 Royals, 19-28; 2001 Braves, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports
- Beginning 5/26 the Reds are 35-19 (.648) over their last 8 road trips covering 17 road series...is the best road record in the Major Leagues during that span.
- The Reds have won 12 of their last 17 road series, including a streak of 7 straight road series wins snapped by the Brewers in the last series before the All-Star Game break
- From 5/26-7/6, the Reds won at least 7 straight road series for only the third time in their history (1923, 1976).

- Rookie pitchers have made 57 starts for the Reds, including 15 of the Reds' 21 games so far in September...rookie pitchers are projected to start 19 of the Reds' 27 games in September/October.
 - LHP Brandon Williamson (21gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, is 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts in September. **LHP Andrew Abbott** (20gs), who began the season at Class AA
 - Chattanooga, is 0-1, 5.40 in 4 starts in September.
 - RHP Connor Phillips (4gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 1-0, 5.66 in 4 starts in September. RHP Lyon Richardson (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona,
 - went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September. RHP Carson Spiers (2gs), who began the season at Class AA
 - Chattanooga, went 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
- RHP Fernando Cruz (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started Tue's 7-0 loss vs Min.
 Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson and Phillips made their Major League debuts this season, along with fellow starter RHP Levi Stoudt (2gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville.

ROSTER NOTES

- 65 players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues this season and ${\bf 1}~{\bf player}$ shy of the single-season club record established in 2022.
- 40 pitchers, including position players C Luke Maile (4 times) and IF Jason Vosler (twice), have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, a new single-season club record (38 pitchers, 2022).
- 17 pitchers have started at least 1 game for the Reds, tying the singleseason club record (2003, 2022)...17 starters tie the Dodgers for most in the National League...the Athletics lead the Major Leagues with 24 starters. The Reds have 9 rookies on today's roster.
- RHP Fernando Cruz, IF Elly De La Cruz, IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand, IF Noelvi Marte, IF/OF Spencer Steer, LHP Andrew Abbott, RHP Daniel Duarte, RHP Connor Phillips and LHP Brandon
- Williamson. Had a season-high 12 rookies on the 27-player roster for the 8/23 day/
- night doubleheader at LAA.
 - 16 Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, the most of any team in the majors 23 rookies played in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues and tied for fourth-most in club history (26 in 1909, 25 in 2016, 24 in 1914 & 2017, 23 in 2022)...courtesy @EliasSports.

LET THE KIDS PLAY

- Reds rookies have produced 60 HR, 216 RBI and 73 stolen bases...are the most HR and RBI by any Major League team's rookies and second-most stolen bases total by any team's rookies...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Have established a single-season club record for **HR by rookies**...have produced the Reds' second-most **RBI** (260 in 1935) and second-most **stolen bases** (74sb in 1982) in a season **by rookies**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- With 60 HR the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (Spencer Steer 22, Matt McLain 16, Elly De La Cruz 11, Christian Encarnacion-Strand 10, Noelvi Marte 1)...the 2008 team recorded 54 home runs by rookies (Joey Votto 24, Jay Bruce 21, Chris Dickerson 6, Ryan Hanigan 2, Paul Janish 1). The Reds are the first team in Major League history with 3 rookies, in a single season, with at least 10 HR & 10 stolen
- bases each (Elly De La Cruz, Matt McLain, Spencer Steer).
 - For the first time since 1890, when Cincinnati joined the National League, 4 Reds rookies have produced at least 10 HR...prior to this season, never had more than 2 rookies in the same season with 10 HR...courtesy @EliasSports.

RED HOTS

- Turned 25 years old on the fourth day of the season.
- Today is making the 22nd start of his Major League career, his third since a 10-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/2-9/11)
 - In his 2 starts since he came off the COVID-19 IL went 0-1, 9.00 (8ip, 13h, 8er, 3bb, 6k, .371baa).
- Twice picked runners off second base, KC's Bobby Witt Jr. (PO/CS 145) and SD's Fernando Tatis Jr. (PO/CS 165).
- Once was called for a pitch timer violation, on 5/22 vs StL (Paul Goldschmidt batting).
- Twice was called for disengagement violations, on 8/7 vs Mia (Jorge Soler batting, Jon Berti to second on the balk) and on 8/29 at SF (Paul DeJong batting, J.D. Davis to second and Patrick Bailey scored on the balk).
- On 6/26 at Bal walked his second batter, Adley Rutschman, to snap at 10.0 his consecutive innings streak without issuing a walk.
- On 5/16 at Col, became only the 10th visiting pitcher to make his Major League debut with a start at Coors Field, the first since Hou's José Urquidy on 7/2/19.
- Became only the fourth Reds pitcher to make his Major League debut with at least 5.2 innings, 2 hits or fewer allowed and at least 6 strikeouts, joining Tom Carroll (7/7/1974 vs StL, 7ip, 2h, 6k), Mo Sanford (8/9/1991 at SD, 7ip, 2h, 8k) and Johnny Cueto (4/3/2008 vs Ari, 7ip, 1h, 10k).
- Became only the fourth Reds pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) to retire at least 14 consecutive batters in his Major League debut, joining Wayne Simpson (16, 4/9/1970 at LAD), Rob Bell (16, 4/8/2000 vs Cubs) and Johnny Cueto (15, 4/3/2008 vs Ari).
- In that 3-1 win on 5/16 at Col, allowed a single to Charlie Blackmon, his first career batter faced, but didn't allow another hit until Ezequiel Tovar's solo HR in the sixth inning snapped the scoreless tie...Williamson retired 14 consecutive batters leading up to Tovar's home run.
- Began the season at Class AAA Louisville (8gs, 2-4, 6.62, 34ip, 44h, 20bb, 27k, 7hr, 1.88whip, .310baa).
- Was selected by the Mariners in the second round (59th overall) of the 2019 first-year player draft...was an MiLB.com Mariners Org All-Star in 2019 and 2021.
- On 3/14/22 was acquired from the Mariners, along with RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley and a player to be named, for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker.
 On 3/29/22 the Reds completed the trade by acquiring minor league RHP Connor Phillips as the player to be named.
- In 2016 graduated from Martin County West High School in Sherburn, MN...spent 2 seasons (2017-2018) at North Iowa Area Community College...prior to the 2019 season transferred to Texas Christian University, where he was a teammate of fellow 2019 draftee and current injured Reds starter LHP Nick Lodolo.

RED HOTS

- Tue at Cle will make his fourth start since a 9-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/1-9/9)...will be his first career appearance vs the Indians.
- Was confirmed with COVID-19 following his start on 8/30...remained isolated in San Francisco for 5 days before returning to Cincinnati on 9/5...came off the COVID-19 injured list just prior to his start on 9/10 vs StL.
 - In his 7-1 win on 9/10 vs StL recorded his seventh career start of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer...4 Reds pitchers held the Cardinals to 1 hit, an RBI-single off Greene by Andrew Knizner in the fourth inning.
 - His 7 starts of at least 6.0 innings and no more than 2 hits allowed are the most by a Reds pitcher in his first 42 career starts.
 - In the 5-3 win on 9/15at NYM took a no-hitter into the sixth inning before allowing a 3-run HR to Pete Alonso that tied the game at 3-3.
 - In Wed's 5-3 loss vs Min recorded a career-high 14 strikeouts, the most by a Reds pitcher since LHP Ron Villone had 16 strikeouts on 9/29/2000 at StL and the most by a Reds righthander since Mario Soto had 14 strikeouts on 9/30/1985 at SF...was his seventh 10-strikeout game in 44 career starts.
