METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets dropped the series opener to the Toronto Blue Jays, 2-1, last night...New York has dropped two straight and nine of their last 10...The Mets are in the midst of a seven-game, eight-day road trip (0-1) in Toronto (0-1) and Atlanta (four games)...New York is in a stretch of 10 straight games (1-7) and 20 games in 21 days (1-7) to finish the first-half of the season...The Mets are 13-17 over their last 30 games and 25-29 over their last 54 games.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 16-26 on the road in 2026.... Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 3.89 ERA on the road, which is fifth in the National League.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets continue their Interleague schedule with a three-game set against the Blue Jays... Eight of New York's 12 final games before the All-Star Break are against American League foes...In 2026, the Mets are 10-9 against the AL, including 7-4 over their last 11 games against the league... Overall, the Mets are 312-309 against the AL.

BLUE JAYS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won five of their last seven games against the Blue Jays since 2024...The Mets are 17-5 against Toronto at home compared to 10-13 against the Jays on the road.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 261 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in MLB history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 261 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265.

DREAM WEAVER: On Saturday, Luke Weaver retired the side in the eighth...He has not allowed a run over his last 23.0 innings (21 G), tied with Roger McDowell (5/11-6/1/85) for the sixth-longest scoreless streak in franchise history by a relief pitcher...Courtesy of Elias...Since May 1, is the only relief pitcher in the majors with 20.0 innings pitched and zero runs allowed...During the same stretch, has held opposing batters to a .127 (10-79) average and has pitched to a 0.65 WHIP...Among relievers since May 1, ranks third in WHIP and sixth in opponents' batting average (min. 50 batters faced).

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing is slashing .317/.400/.512 with three home runs, seven doubles, 13 RBI, nine runs, 11 walks, four stolen bases and a .912 OPS over his last 25 games dating back to June 2.

MINTY FRESH: A.J. Minter fired 1.2 scoreless innings on Saturday vs. Philadelphia...It was his longest outing since a 2.0 inning relief appearance on October 2, 2021 vs. Mets with Atlanta...Has not allowed an earned run in each of his last 24 appearances dating back to April 4, 2025, tied with John Franco (6/24-9/5/00) and Francisco Rodriguez (4/27-6/16/09) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets blanked the Cardinals, 7-0...Bob Ojeda tossed a complete game shutout, allowing seven hits, three walks and striking out six...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

WELCOME BACK BO: INF Bo Bichette returns to Toronto for the first time as a visitor...Bichette was drafted by the Blue Jays in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut on July 29, 2019...In seven seasons with the Blue Jays, batted .290 with 121 home runs, 203 doubles, nine triples, 483 RBI and 482 runs...Led the American League in hits in both 2021 and 2022...Became the first player in Blue Jays history to lead the league in hits twice...Was named an American League All-Star in 2021 and 2023...Batted .348 (8-23) in seven World Series games for Toronto in 2025...Hit a three-run homer off Shohei Ohtani in the third inning of Game 7.

RED SOTO CUP: Over his last 39 games dating back to May 14, Juan Soto has a .328/.442/.657 (45-137) slashline with 18 extra-base hits, 28 RBI, 28 walks and a 1.099 OPS...His 1.099 OPS during that span ranks second in the majors (min. 100 plate appearances)...In 24 career games against the Blue Jays, has a .296/.463/.593 slashline with a 1.056 OPS.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his fifth loss of the season after allowing six runs over six innings on June 24 vs. Chicago-NL (G1) (6.0 IP, 7 H, 6 ER, 2 BB, 2 HB, 9 K, 2 HR)...He threw a career-high 104 pitches in the start...He recorded nine+ strikeouts for the second consecutive start, and it marks the first time he has done so in his career...After pitching to a 2.92 ERA (17 ER/52.1 IP) through his first nine starts, he has recorded a 5.59 ERA (23 ER/37.0 IP) over his last seven dating back to May 19.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 4-5 with a 4.03 ERA (40 ER/89.1 IP) with 106 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .204 batting average (66-324)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks fourth in opposing batting average, ninth in strikeouts and 13th in WHIP (1.12)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks tied for first in strikeouts, third in innings pitched, fifth in batting average against, sixth in WHIP, and 10th in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 11.7% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,296 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 42.0% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .104 (5-48) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the seventh-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 24 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .093 (7-75) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 46.0% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 34.6% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 15-run value, which is tied for the third-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .164 (23-140) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

AL WHO?: Is set to make his first career start against Toronto and his seventh career Interleague start...In his first six career starts against the American League, he is 3-0 with a 2.83 ERA (11 ER/35.0 IP) and 45 strikeouts...He has a K/9 of 11.57 against AL opponents.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 24 career starts, McLean is 9-6 with a 3.34 ERA (51 ER/137.1 IP) and 163 strikeouts...His 163 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 24 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 193, Matt Harvey's 172, Noah Syndergaard's 166 and Kodai Senga's 164...Per *Elias*...He is one of nine pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 163+ batters and allow 51 or fewer earned runs through their first 24 appearances.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilar's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
