METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cardinals, 9-2, on Wednesday evening...The Mets have dropped two straight and three of their last four...The Mets are 7-5 over their last 12 games and 19-17 over their last 36 games...The team is in the midst of a six-game homestand (0-2) against the Cardinals (0-2) and Braves (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: The Mets have announced the following roster moves - RHP Jonathan Pintaro was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse following last night's game...RHP Daniel Duarte has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

PUT AWAY THE BROOMS: The Mets are looking to avoid their sixth sweep of the season...The Mets were last swept by the Cardinals from September 13-15, 2021 at Citi Field.

FOUR IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Through 17 career Major League starts, Christian Scott has allowed four or fewer runs in each of them...Scott is the only starting pitcher in franchise history to allow four or fewer runs in his first 17 Major League games...Five other Mets starters allowed four or fewer runs in 16 of their first 17 Major League games: Tom Seaver, Matt Harvey, Nolan McLean Kodai Senga and Zack Wheeler...Scott is only the 13th starter in Major League history to allow four or fewer runs in each of their first 17 career outings.

NO BIG FLY ZONE: Through eight starts this season, Scott has only allowed one home run...Since his season debut, April 23, Scott is one of nine pitchers in the majors to log 30.0 innings and allow one or zero home runs...Across nine starts (47.1 IP) in 2024, Scott allowed eight home runs.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have lost back-to-back games at Citi after winning four straight...They have won nine of their last 134 at Citi Field and are now 15-17 at home this season...The team has posted a 4.36 ERA, while batting .231/.300/.363 at Citi Field.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez put the Mets on the board with a two-run homer in the fourth inning last night...That marked his first home run since April 11 vs. Athletics (76 at-bats), tied for the second-longest home run drought of his career (also: 8/2-9/3/23)... He has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games and is batting .306 (11-36) during that span.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.36 ERA (102 ER/283.2 IP) as a group...That ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League...They have struck out 295 this season, the most in the NL and the second-most in The Show...RHP Huascar Brazobán (1.38) ranks seventh, while LHP Brooks Raley (1.48) ranks tied for the eighth in the NL amongst relievers.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 608 strikeouts this season, that is the fourth-most in the National League and the seventh-most in the majors...Their 609 punchies are the fifth-most in franchise history through the team's first 67 games of a season.

THE TONIGHT SHOW: In 36 games since the start of May, Carson Benge is batting .305/.364/.474 with 25 runs, seven doubles, five homers, 20 RBI, 10 walks and an .839 OPS...His .305 average is tied for ninth in the NL in that span, while his 43 hits are tied for the fourth-most...Over his last 12 games, Benge is batting .327 (16-49) with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, four homers, eight RBI, three walks and one steal with a .365 OBP and a .653 SLG.

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost four straight to the Cardinals...Tuesday's loss snapped a five-game winning streak against the Cards at Citi Field.

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing has reached base safely in each of his last seven games, batting .375 (9-24) with four runs, two doubles, three walks and three steals...In 27 games so far into his Major League career, Ewing is batting .264 (24-91) with 11 runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, six RBI, 12 walks, seven steals and a .346 OBP... Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the Mets rookie record for most steals with 24...Lee Mazilli (1977) is second on the list with 22, and Gree Jefferies (1989) is third with 21.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 15 appearances...He has tossed 17.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 19 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (8 ER/29.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in 27 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

FOREVER YOUNG: Jared Young has appeared in 13 games since returning from the IL...He is hitting .238 (10-42) with six runs, two doubles, three homers, five RBI, five walks, a .333 OBP, a .500 SLG and an .833 OPS in that span...In 24 games in 2026, Young is hitting .274/.352/.484 with seven extra-base hits and seven RBI...Young is hitting .304 (17-56) with four doubles, three homers and six walks against right-handed pitching.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 257 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 257 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic... George Bell is next with 265.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets earned their second straight win over Philly, 5-3, at Shea Stadium...The Mets got up to an early 3-0 lead thanks to RBI singles from Gary Carter and Ray Knight...Ron Darling made the start and earned the win, allowing all three runs on six hit with two walk and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings of relief on June 5 at San Diego (1.1 IP, 2 K)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 22 relief appearances, which is tied for the fifth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 45 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with nine holds, a 2.96 ERA (18 ER/54.2 IP) and 49 strikeouts.
- Has pitched to a 1.38 ERA (4 ER/26.0 IP) over 22 relief appearances this season...His 1.38 ERA as a reliever is the seventh-best mark in the NL (min. 20.0 IP)...Overall, he has pitched to a 2.18 ERA (8 ER/33.0 IP) this season.
- He hasn't surrendered an earned run in 22 of 28 appearances this season.
- Fired 2.0 innings and earned the win without allowing an earned run in extra innings on May 18 at Washington (2.0 IP, H, R, K, 2 BB)...Since the beginning of last season, he has had 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 innings in which he hasn't surrendered an earned run...His 12 such games are tied for the eighth-most in the NL over that span.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 26 of his last 32 appearances...He is 3-1 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .161 batting average (22-137) over that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Made two Grapefruit League appearances this spring and allowed three runs over 1.1 innings pitched.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.

- Earned his first win of the season after allowing two earned runs over 4.0 innings on June 7 at San Diego (4.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 3 K, BB)...Over his last six appearances, he has pitched to a 3.05 ERA (7 ER/20.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts...He has held opponents to a .216 (16-74) average while posting a 9.15 K/P over that span.
- Has thrown 43.0 innings in relief this season, which is tied for the most among all Major League relievers....His 45 strikeouts this season are the third-most among NL relief pitchers.
- Threw a season-high 5.0 innings in relief and only allowed one hit (a solo home run to Colt Emmerson) while striking out four on June 1 at Seattle (5.0 IP, H, ER, 4 K, BB).
- Is one of four relievers with multiple appearances with six or more strikeouts...Also, Chase Dollander (COL, 3x), Sean Burke (CHW) and David Peterson.
- In 47 career games in relief, Manaea is 6-5 with a 4.32 ERA (64 ER/133.1 IP) with 43 walks and 148 strikeouts.
- Recorded seven strikeouts over 3.1 innings in relief on April 24 vs. Colorado (3.1 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 7 K, BB)...Marked his third career game with seven or more strikeouts as a relief pitcher (also: 8 K, 5/22/23 at Minnesota w/San Francisco and 7/13/25 at Kansas City)...Joins Tug McGraw (5), Nolan Ryan and Skip Lockwood as the only relief pitchers in franchise history with multiple seven+ strikeout games.
- In 2025, finished the season going 2-4 with a 5.64 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 12 walks and 75 strikeouts in 15 appearances (12 starts).
- Last season was originally placed on the 15-Day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-Day IL on April 29.
- In 2024, he recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL.
- Originally signed by the Mets to a two-year contract as a free agent on January 12, 2024...Opted out of the second year of the deal on November 4....Re-signed by the Mets to a three-year contract on December 27, 2024.

- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on June 7 at San Diego (1.0 IP, H)...Hasn't allowed an earned run over 5.1 IP this season.
- Has pitched to a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) with 20 strikeouts across 19 career games with the Mets...Hasn't allowed an earned run in 18 of his 19 appearances with New York while posting a K/9 of 11.02 over those appearances...10 of his 19 appearances with New York have been hitless
