FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals conclude their season-opening six-game homestand this afternoon with the finale of a three-game series against the Los Angeles Angels at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals began their 134th season of play in the National League by handing the Minnesota Twins a three-game series sweep over the weekend ... St. Louis enters today in first place in the National League Central Division, a half game in front of the Chicago Cubs.

SWEEP OR BE SWEEPED: With a win today, the Cardinals would avoid a series sweep for the first time since Sept. 13-15, 2024 at Toronto and first time in St. Louis since April 19-21, 2024 vs. division-rival Milwaukee.

- The last time St. Louis swept any series and followed it up by getting swept was **2018** at Busch Stadium: Sept 21-23 vs. Giants (3-0) and Sept 24-26 vs. Brewers (0-3).
- The last time the Redbirds opened a season by sweeping an opponent and then getting swept was the **2006** World Series Championship season: April 4-6 at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park (3-0) and April 7-9 at Chicago's Wrigley Field (0-3).

- The only year St. Louis opened a season at home by sweeping an opponent and then were swept was **2003**: sweeping the Brewers (March 31-April 3) and then dropping two straight to Houston (April 4-5) before the homestand finale was postponed due to rain.

I SEE DEAD PEOPLE: Since the ghost runner was instituted by MLB in 2020, the Cardinals have allowed multiple runs in extra innings 13 times at home, tied for 7th-most in MLB (Toronto leads with 21 multi-run innings in extras at home) ... Since 2020, the Cardinals boast the 10-best winning percentage (.547, 29-24) in extra innings (10-16 at Busch Stadium III). - Elias

FORGIVE ME IF I DON'T SHAKE HANDS: All-Star closer **Ryan Helsley** has made back-to-back appearances in games which he did not factor in the decision (win/loss/save) for the first time since Sept. 5 & Sept 8, 2023, a span of 76 appearances.

I'M YOUR HUCKLEBERRY: **Sonny Gray** today marks the 300th start of his career which ranks 10th among active pitchers ... St. Louis is 18-11 (.621) in Gray's starts since becoming a Cardinal last season, with wins in each of his last five starts (Aug. 29, 2024-present).

NOOT NUGGETS: **Lars Nootbaar** ranks among Major League leaders in batting average (.421, 6th), on-base pct. (.560, 4th), times on base (14, T-3rd), walks (5, T-9th), average exit velocity (97.0 mph, 10th) and fWAR (0.6, T-5th).

- Nootbaar has reached base safely 14 times over the first five games of the season, most by a Cardinal since **Fernando Tatís** (14 in 2000) ... The Cardinals record for reaching base safely in the first six games of a season is 16 shared by **George Fisher** (1930), **Red Schoendienst** (1955), **Ken Boyer** (1956), and **Mark McGwire** (1998).
- Nootbaar has reached base safely in all five games, longest season-opening stretch by a Cardinals leadoff hitter since 2B **Tommy Edman** (first 14 games of 2021).

MOONLIGHT MIKE: OF/PR **Michael Siani** is only the 3rd Major League position player (since 1901) to appear in each of the first five games of the season without a plate appearance, joining Indians 1B **Jerry Kindall** (1964) and Twins 3B **Ron Clark** (1968) ... CF/PR **Curt Flood** (1961) and PR/OF **Ray Blades** (1924) each played in the first three Cardinals games of their respective seasons before Siani broke their shared record.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING: **Nolan Arenado** extended his hitting streak to 11 games (Sept. 20-2024-present) last night with his game-tying RBI single in the 10th inning, tying **Michael Conforto** (Sept. 20, 2024-present) for MLB's longest active hitting streak ... **Jordan Walker** (8 games) ranks T-5th in MLB.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (April 2, 2017): **Randal Grichuk** delivers a two-out walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the 9th in a 4-3 win over the defending champion Chicago Cubs on Opening Night at Busch Stadium, televised on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball ... The youngest pitcher to make an Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1989, **Carlos Martínez** joined **Bob Gibson** (twice) as the only two Cardinals to throw 7.0 innings with 10 or more strikeouts on Opening Day.

Nolan Arenado was born in Newport Beach, Calif...graduated from El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif...resides in San Clemente.

Lars Nootbaar was born in and resides in El Segundo, Calif...graduated from El Segundo High School...played three years at USC (2016-18).

JoJo Romero was born in Camarillo, CA...graduated from nearby Oxnard (Calif.) High School.

Miles Mikolas (May 20, 2012), **John King** (Sept. 9, 2020), and **Kyle Leahy** (May 14, 2024) earned their first MLB wins against the Angels.

Andre Pallante was born in Mission Viejo, Calif...graduated from San Clemente High School...played college baseball at the University of California, Irvine (2017-19).

Hall of Famer **Ozzie Smith** graduated from Locke High School in Los Angeles...played college baseball at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo.

Cardinals AGM/Scouting **Randy Flores** was born in Bellflower...graduated from El Rancho High School in Pico Rivera...pitched at the University of Southern California (1994-97).

Michael Siani and Angels broadcaster **Mark Gubicza** are both graduates from William Penn Charter in Philadelphia...Siani is first player to make it to MLB who received scholarship established by Gubicza in his father's name for a student from Roxborough neighborhood.

Ron "Pop" Warner was born in Alhambra, Calif...graduated from Redlands High School.

Reid Detmers was born in Nokomis, Ill...graduated from Glenwood III. High School...grew up a Cardinals fan...father **Kris Detmers** pitched parts of six seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (1994-99), where he was teammates with **Stubby Clapp** and **Pop Warner**.

Jon Jay played in five games for the Angels in 2021 in his final professional season.

Cardinals broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played in eight seasons with the Angels (1998-2004) & won 2002 World Series...originally signed by the Angels as a non-drafted free agent (May 23, 1993).

Hall of Famer **Tony La Russa** served as an executive with the Angels (2019-20).

Jim Edmonds was born in Diamond Bar, Calif...drafted by the Angels in the 7th round in 1988 ...played seven seasons with the Angels (1993-99), winning two Gold Gloves (1997-98) and was a 1995 AL All-Star...became a Cardinal via trade with the Angels (March 23, 2000), exchanged for **Kent Bottenfield** and **Adam Kennedy**.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Mark McGwire** is a Pomona, CA native...graduated from Damien High School in La Verne, CA and played college baseball at USC...resides in Southern California.

Former Cardinals personnel now with the Angels include **Phil Plantier**, **Joey Prebyski**, **Tony Ferreira**, **Dann Bilardello**, **Joe Kruzel**, **Chris Carpenter**, **Jobel Jimenez**, **Mike Gallego**, and **Matt Swanson**.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Daniel Guerrero** is an Anaheim, Calif native and grew up an Angels fan...earned associates degree in journalism at Fullerton College.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Leads the starting rotation's 2nd turn thru as he is set to make his 2nd start of the young season this afternoon.
- Today marks the 300th start of his career which ranks 10th among active pitchers. Today is his 98th career start as a National Leaguer.
- Drew the Cardinals Opening Day start last Thu. (3/27) vs. MIN, the 4th Opening Day start of his career and his 1st for St. Louis.
- Was credited with the win on Opening Day with a 5-3 decision over the Twins when he worked 5.0 IP, allowing 2 runs (two-run Bader HR in 5th).
- With the Opening Day win, improved to 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (25.1 IP/3 ER) in his four career Opening Day starts.
- Will be making his 17th career start (18th appearance) against the LA Angels today and his 2nd as a member of the Cardinals.
- Opened his 2024 season with 17.0 scoreless innings (April 9-21), longest by a Cardinals starting pitcher in 2024 and longest by any Cardinals starting pitcher to open a season since Woody Williams (24.2 IP) in 2003.
- Is 18-12 with a 2.99 ERA in 41 career starts in April and had a 3-1 mark with a 1.16 ERA last April in four starts for St. Louis.
- The Cardinals are 18-11 in his 29 career starts as a Redbird and he has a 14-9 mark while wearing the Birds on the Bat; He's won 3-straight decisions dating to last season and the Cardinals have won each of his last five games started dating to 2024.

2024/CAREER NOTES:

2024 NL Ranks: Wins (13, T-7th), Home Wins (9, 3rd), Decisions (22, T-7th), Strikeouts (203, 4th), Opponent BA (.228, 9th), Hits/9IP (7.68, 8th), Baserunners/9 IP (9.96, 5th), SO/9 IP (10.98, 2nd), Strikeout % (30.3, 2nd), WHIP (1.09, 6th), SO/BB (5.21, 3rd), FIP (3.20, 5th).

- Struck out 203 batters in his first season in St. Louis, 19th-most in Cardinals single-season history. Became the 9th pitcher in Cardinals single-season history (20th instance) to reach 200 strikeouts and first since **Jack Flaherty** (231 in 2019).
- His 203 strikeouts were 2nd-most by a pitcher in their first season with St. Louis behind only **José DeLeón's** 208 strikeouts in 1988.
- Established new single-season Cardinals records in strikeouts/9 IP (10.98) and strikeout percentage (30.3%) in 2024, surpassing **Jack Flaherty** (10.59, 29.9%) in 2019.
- Finished two strikeouts shy of tying his single-season career high of 205 with the Reds in 2019. Recorded a 57.1 strikeout pct. on his Sweeper (fanning 112 in 196 plate appearances), MLB's best strikeout pct. of any pitch (minimum 150 plate appearances).
- Yielded a career high 21 home runs, but only five at Busch Stadium.
- His team-leading 13 wins were his most since a career-high 14 victories in back-to-back seasons with Oakland (2014-15)
- Signed a three-year (2024-26) free agent contract with St. Louis following the 2023 Thanksgiving holiday, with a fourth year club option for the 2027 season.
- The Cardinals are his fifth Major League team, after the Athletics (2013-17), Yankees (2017-18), Reds (2019-21), and Twins (2022-23).
- Finished 2nd in the 2023 American League Cy Young Award voting behind Yankees **Gerrit Cole**, who received 30 unanimous 1st place votes. Gray received 20 2nd place votes and six 3rd place. Also ranked 18th in AL MVP voting.
- Three-time Major League Baseball All-Star, earning selections in 2015 (American), 2019 (National) and 2023 (American).
- Graduated from Smyrna (Tenn.) High School. A two-sport athlete, lettered all four years in baseball and three years in football. Played quarterback and led Smyrna to back-to-back Tennessee High School state championships. Was also Homecoming King.
- Originally selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Smyrna High School, but did not sign. Drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2011 Major League Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

2025 SPRING TRAINING:

- Made four Grapefruit League starts, the last on March 21 vs. HOU when he worked a spring-high 4.2 IP and threw 80 pitches
- Was 0-3, 12.56 ERA in his four spring starts, allowing 8 HR in 14.1 IP with 17 strikeouts.
- Made just one Grapefruit League start in 2024 when he exited game on March 4 with right hamstring injury that put him on Injured List to begin the season

GRAY vs. ANGELS

- Is making his 17th career start vs. the Angles and his 2nd as a member of the Cardinals. It's his first career meeting against the Angels at Busch Stadium.
- Is 6-5, 3.70 ERA career against the Angels, striking out 96 in 99.2 IP; 11 of his 16 career starts have been Quality Starts.
- Had lost 4-straight decisions against the Angels before posting a 7-6 win at Angel Stadium last season on 5/14/24 - it was his 1st win over the Angels since 6/14/15 while pitching for Oakland.
- Posted wins in five of his 1st six career decisions against the Halos, then lost 4-straight before his win last season.
