ON THE CLOCK—Rays Senior Vice President, Baseball Operations & General Manager Erik Neander and Senior Director, Amateur Scouting Rob Metzler will be available via Zoom video on Wednesday, June 3 at 11 a.m. to discuss the upcoming First-Year Player Draft, which begins on Wednesday, June 10...the Rays will send a media advisory early next week with Zoom info...in 2019, the Rays selected shortshop Greg Jones from the University of North Carolina Wilmington with the 22nd pick.

- + Major League Baseball announced this morning that the 2020 June Draft will air live on MLB Network, ESPN and ESPN2...the five-round draft will be split into two days, with the first round and Competitive Balance Round A starting at 7 p.m. on June 10 (MLB Network, ESPN) and the second through fifth rounds beginning at 5 p.m. on Thursday, June 11 (MLBN, ESPN2)...the five rounds of the 2020 Draft will total 160 selections...in addition, the signing deadline for the 2020 Draft has been moved from July 10 to Aug 1.
- + This year's event will mark the first time that multiple networks will provide live primetime coverage of the MLB June Draft.
- + The Rays hold the 24th selection of the first round and will make the final pick of Day 1, at No. 37 overall (from St. Louis)...the Rays have four picks on Day 2 of the draft: Nos. 57, 96, 125 and 155.
- + This will be the first time the MLB Draft is held over the course of two days since 2008...it was a three-day event from 2009-19.

WEEK IN REVIEW—Tropicana Field re-opened to players and coaches this week for voluntary, limited workouts...these workouts began on a Monday/Wednesday/Friday staggered schedule, with no more than 2-4 at a time, throughout the day...each of these days included 12-14 players running, playing catch and doing light weight work, all on the field...the clubhouse, weight room, training room and batting cage were all closed.

- + Tropicana Field has safety protocols in place for these workouts, including for entry/exit, hand-washing and social distancing.
- + According to Stats LLC on Twitter, Monday was the first Memorial Day without a Major League Baseball game since 1880.

ALL IN CHALLENGE—The Rays are participating in Fanatics.com's All In Challenge, which benefits Feeding America, Meals On Wheels, World Central Kitchen and No Kid Hungry...details of the auction, which ends tonight at 9 p.m., are available at allinchallenge.in/TBRays...the Rays package, which has a current bid of \$12,000, includes watching batting practice before a to-be-determined game, a pregame visit with Manager **Kevin Cash**, throwing out the first pitch, a luxury suite for 12 people including a basic food package, a behind-the-scenes tour with visits to the

broadcast booths, one inning with SVP, Baseball Ops & General Manager **Erik Neander** and a personalized jersey for the winner...the All In Challenge provides food to those in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

+ Lot 4 of Tropicana Field (1st Ave S and 17th St) continues to be used as a drive-thru mobile pantry for Feeding Tampa Bay's Pinellas clients, every Saturday from 9 a.m.-noon...for more details or updates to the schedule, visit feedingtampabay.org/mobile-pantries.

COMFORTS OF HOME—FOX Sports Sun will premiere a unique episode of "Rays All-Access" tonight at 6:30 p.m. ...reporter Tricia Whitaker interviewed several Rays players and coaches over the last two months to see how they were handling the COVID-19 pandemic and find out what they were doing during quarantine... "Rays All-Access: At Home" includes stories from Manager Kevin Cash, SS Willy Adames, INF/OF Brandon Lowe, OF Austin Meadows and LH Blake Snell, among others...it will re-air tonight at 10 p.m. and on several other occasions in the upcoming weeks.

- + FOX Sports Sun announced this morning the continuation of 2019 Rewinds through the first half of June...fans can tune in to FSS to watch Rays victories from last season in chronological order.
- + WDAE 95.3 FM and 620 AM is re-airing Rays wins from last season every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 7 p.m. and every Saturday and Sunday at noon...tonight, tomorrow and Sunday are the games from May 6 vs. ARI, May 7 vs. ARI and May 11 vs. NYY.
