RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (0-1, two

are fourth in the AL East for the 25th consecutive day, a season-high 11.0 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 5.5 GB the Mariners for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot... including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 55 in fourth and four in fifth.

* The Rays opened the scoring with a sacrifice fly in the opening frame, but yielded multiple runs in the 2nd and 3rd frames en route to last night's series-opening, 5-1 loss. It marked the third time this season they scored in the 1st inning and were shut out the rest of the way, joining May 30 at HOU (1R) and May 24 vs. TOR (3R).

* Ian Seymour closed the game with 2.1 scoreless frames in relief...the Rays bullpen has a 182 ERA (34.2IP 7ER) in the last nine games, striking out 39 against seven walks. Tampa Bay was held to 1-for-9 (.111) with RISP and is 2-for-24 (.083) in scoring situations over the last four games...the Rays have scored five runs in that stretch, matching their fewest in any four-game span this season (3x, last: April 30-May 2).

* The Rays are 1-11 in their last 12 road games and 3-16 in their last 17, their worst 19-game stretch away from home since June 29-Aug. 4, 2007 (3-16).

* Tampa Bay is 46-15 when scoring four runs or more (20-8 on the road) compared to 9-44 with three runs or fewer since its last such win on June 25 at KC (3-0).

* Under Kevin Cash (2015-pres.), the Rays are 165-111 (.598) in August, second best in the majors, trailing only the Dodgers (187-93/.668).

* The Rays need to win each of the next two games to avoid their fifth straight series loss, which would match their longest streak this season along with June 27-July 13...it would also mark their seventh straight road series defeat, which would be their longest skid since June 15-July 26, 2007 (7).

W(ALL)S IN—Taylor Walls is 9-for-27 (.333) with 4 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI, 1 BB and 4 R during an eight-game on-base streak, tied for the third longest of his career behind runs of 13 (June 5-22 2025) and 11 (July 6-23, 2022) games...he is hitting .262/.299/.421 (38-for-145) with 12 2B, 1 3B 3 HR and 27 RBI over 48 games across the last two months since June 5, leading the Rays in doubles while ranking third in RBI behind Junior Caminero (33) and Yandy Diaz (31)...Walls is batting .333/.356/.538 (13-for-39) with runners in scoring position over that span.

**His 18 defensive runs saved lead the majors and are more than 16 clubs have as a team...he has 68 DRS since breaking into the majors in 2021, tied for third most in baseball behind CIN KeBryan Hayes (88) and TOR Daulton Varsho (73).

HEART & HUSTLE—This morning, the MLB Players Alumni Asociation announced team winners for the 2025 Heart and Hustle Award, with Jake Mangum earning the nod for the Rays...in its 20th year, the award is presented annually to the active players who "exemplify a true passion for the game and who best embody the values, spirit and tradition of the game"...each team's winner is selected by a committee of alumni, with the overall winner being chosen from the pool of team winners by a combination of alumni and fan votes.. this season's overall winner will be announced in mid-November on MLB Network.

**No Ray has ever won the leaguewide award...Richie Palacios was the Rays nominee last season, and Randy Arozarena was tabbed in 2023.

TWO-FOR-ONE SPECIALS—The Rays have turned multiple double plays in three straight games, matching their longest streak of the season (3x, last: May 21-24)...it falls one game shy of their single-season franchise-record four-game streak set from July 23-27, 2004... the Rays have turned a double play in five of their last six games, and their 110 double plays on the season are third most in the majors behind the Angels (119) and Rockies (116). their 12.7 pct. GIDP percentage (the pct. of times a double play is turned relative to total batters faced with an opportunity to hit into a GIDP) is the highest in MLB and would surpass 2012 (12.5%) for their highest full-season mark in club history.

The Rays have gone four straight games without committing an error and have six errors in their last 23 games since July 8, fewest in the AL.

Tampa Bay's 33 defensive runs saved rank third in the AL (TEX - 71; BOS - 47).

B-LOWE BLASTS—Brandon Lowe is 1 HR shy of his third consecutive 20-homer season and the fourth of his career...he would become the fifth active second baseman with four (or more) 20-homer seasons (min. 50% of games at 2B), joining HOU Jose Altuve (6), ATL Ozcie Albies (4), AZ Ketel Marte (4) and TEX Marcus Semien (4)...as it stands, Lowe is responsible for three of the seven 20-HR seasons by second basemen in Rays history—Ben Zobrist (2009 & 2011), Jorge Cantú (2005) and Logan Forsythe (2016) have the others...his 108 HR since 2021 are tied with Marte for third most among primary second basemen, trailing Semien (136HR) and Altuve (114HR)...he has achieved this despite appearing in only 521 games in that span compared to Semien's 757, Altuve's 639 and Marte's 593.

** Lowe's next long ball would also make him the fourth Ray to record four seasons with 20 HR or more, regardless of position, joining Evan Longoria (9), Aubrey Huff (4) and Carlos Peña (4)....he would become the fifth Ray to hit 20 HR or more in three consecutive seasons, joining Randy Arozarena (2021-23), Longoria (2013-17 & 2008-11), Peña (2007-10) and Huff (2002-05).

20-20 VISION—After Yandy Díaz (20 HR, 20 2B) laced his 20th double last night, he and Junior Caminero (28HR, 20HR) became the fifth pair of teammates in the majors to both record 20 doubles and 20 homers, joining CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong and CHC Seiva Suzuki, DET Riley Greene and DET Spencer Torkelson, NYM Pete Alonso and NYM Francisco Lindor, and NYY Cody Bellinger and NYY Aaron Judge.

*Between Caminero, Díaz and Brandon Lowe (19HR), the Rays could potentially tie the franchise record with three players with 20 HR before the end of August, a feat accomplished six times previously: 2023 (Arozarena/Paredes/Sirij, 2021 (B. Lowe, Meadows, Zunino), 2017 (Dickerson, Morrison, Souza, Jr.), 2009 (Longoria/Peña/Zobrist), 2004 (Cruz Jr./Huff/Martinez) and 2000 (McGriff/Williams/Vaughn).

MILESTONE WATCH—Yandy Díaz is two runs from tying Kevin Kiermaier (410R) for fifth on the Rays all-time list...his 65 three-hit games are tied with Aubrey Huff (65G) for third...Christopher Morel is 4 RBI away from 200 for his career...Junior Caminero (98 RBI) and Nick Fortes (96 RBI) are both closing in on 100 career RBI....Pete Fairbanks' 291 SO as a reliever are tied for third most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 81 saves are four shy of Fernando Rodney (85SV) for third in team history.

WILD WEST—The Rays current 12-game road trip is their longest since a pair of 12-game treks in 2005: May 30-June 12 (12G, 3G each in OAK, SEA, CIN, PIT) and Aug. 2-14 (12G, 3G each in TEX, LAX, BAL, CLE)... It also marks their first four-city trip since June 2-13, 2011 (SEA, LAA, BAL, DET), which culminated with a one-game make-up in Detroit... they also had a 10-game trip from July 19-29, 2013 in which they traveled through Toronto, Boston and New York (Yankees) before returning to Boston for a make-up game to close the trip. The Rays will travel over 6,200 miles on this trip, venturing from Tampa through Anaheim, Seattle, West Sacramento and San Francisco before returning home.

HALO HAPPENINGS.—The Rays and Angels conclude a six-game season series this week, with Tampa Bay trailing, 3-1...after last night's loss, the Rays can, at best, tie the season series, snapping an eight-year winning streak in season sets (clubs did not meet in 2020)... this marks the first time the Rays have not won the season series since 2015 (3-3)...they have not lost a season set to the Halos since 2015 (5-2)...the Rays 38-21 (.644) record vs. the Angels since 2016 is their best against any AL opponent and third best by any team over Los Angeles, trailing the Guardians (40-17/702) and Astros (10-52/667)...Tampa Bay is 21-8 in its last 28 games at Angel Stadium and has won eight of its last nine series here, with the lone loss coming from May 9-11, 2022 (2-1).

TONIGHT'S START—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) will make his 24th start of the season and 11th on the road...marks the 60th start (67G) of his career and 27th away from home (31G)...is his third career start against the Angels and first in Anaheim...leads the Rays in starts (23), quality starts (14) and strikeouts (128)...is looking to snap a career-high-tying three-game losing streak, seeking his first win since July 2 vs. ATH...acquired from the Dodgers along with **OF Jonny DeLuca** for **RHP Tyler Glasnow**, **OF Manuel Margot** and cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Pepiot allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-4 loss at Yankee Stadium on July 31 (L, 4.0IP, 6H, 7ER, 3BB, 4SO, 2HR)...was tagged for three runs on three consecutive hits in the 1st inning on a sequence that went double, RBI-single, two-run homer...tied the most runs allowed in the opening frame in any start of his career (3x, last: June 4, 2024 at MIA)...issued back-to-back walks in the 2nd ahead of a three-run homer by **Ben Rice**, and permitted an additional run on an RBI-ground out in the 3rd...retired the side in order in the 4th, fanning **Paul Goldschmidt** for the 350th strikeout of his career...departed after throwing 88 pitches, second most through the first four frames of any start in his career behind Sept. 1, 2024 vs. SD (89 pitches).

He finished July 1-3 with a 5.03 ERA (34.0IP, 19ER) in six starts

(4QS), his highest ERA in a calendar month since June 2024 (5.33).

Pepiot has yielded multiple homers in two of his last three starts after doing so twice in his previous 15 outings (April 26–July 13)... his 23 HR allowed are tied for fourth most in the majors behind CIN Zack Littell (26HR), WSH Jake Irvin (24HR) and SD JP Sears (24HR).

THE MOST MAGICAL BALLPARK ON EARTH—Pepiot will be making his first career start at Angel Stadium, the 22nd ballpark he has started in in his career and 13th AL venue...he has made two previous home starts opposite the Halos, earning the win in both while pitching to a starts opposite the Halos, earning the win in both while pitching to a 3.27 ERA 11.0IP, 4ER)...earlier this season on April 8 at Steinbrenner Field, he worked five innings after the Rays pushed across four runs in the opening frame en route to a 5-4 win, overcoming a career-high-tying three homers (W, 5.0IP, 6H, 3ER, 3BB, 5SO, 3HR).

He is 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA (64.1IP, 24ER) in 11 career starts against AL West opponents, seven of which were quality...since being tagged for six runs in his debut vs. the division on April 1, 2024 vs. TEX, he has a 2.76 ERA (58.2IP, 18ER) in his last 10.

TIME FOR A TURNAROUND—The Rays have lost each of Pepiot's last five starts, their second-longest skid in a pitcher's starts this season behind an active six-game streak in **Shane Baz's** outings...Pepiot is 0-3 with a 5.46 ERA (28.0IP, 17ER) during the streak, but has allowed 3 ER or fewer in three of five outlings...he has received two runs of support or fewer in four of five starts...the Rays have also been defeated in each of his last nine road starts dating back to May 2 at NYY, tied with three other pitchers (last: J.P. Howell, 2006-07) for the third-longest road losing streak in a pitcher's starts in franchise history trailing an 11-start streak in **Mark Hendrickson's** outings as a visitor (2004-05) and a 10-game drought in road games started by **Dewon Brazelton** (2004-05).

GOTTA BE OUICKER THAN THAT—Pepiot's four pickoffs are tied with TEX Merrill Kelly, CHC Colin Rea and CLE Gavin Williams for the most by any right-handed pitcher in the majors...including southpaws, only CHC Matthew Boyd (8), NYY Max Fried (8) and SF Robbie Ray (5) have more... it marks the most pickoffs by a Rays pitcher since Blake Snell had five in 2019...Pepiot is one of five Rays right-handers (6x) to record four pickoffs (or more) in a season, joining James Shields in 2011 (13) and 2006 (4), Alex Chb is 2007 (6) and Tale Clarate (2010) (2010) Cobb in 2017 (5), Gerami Gonzalez in 2003 (5) and Tyler Glasnow in 2018 (4).

BUILT DIFFERENT—Pepiot, who is making his team-leading 24th start, became the fourth Rays pitcher and third traditional starter to make 20 starts before the All-Star break, joining **Blake Snell** (2018, 20GS), **David Price** (2014, 20GS) and **Ryne Stanek** (2019), who started 25 games as an opener before the break...after tonight's outing, he will be on pace for 33 starts, which would mark the highest total by a Rays pitcher since Charlie Morton (33GS) in 2019 and fall one start shy of the single-season Charlie Morton (33GS) in 2019 and fall one start sny of the single-season club record shared by Chris Archer (2017 & 2015), Price (2011) and Scott Kazmir (2007)...he has anchored a Rays rotation that ranks among MLB leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 623.2IP), fewest pitches per inning (2nd, 15.8), quality starts (4th, 51) and WHIP (5th, 1.22).

Pepiot was the first Rays pitcher to start on Opening Day and in the club's last game before the All-Star break since Chris Archer in 2017.

THINK FAST-Across his last 13 starts dating back to May 25 vs. TOR, opponents are batting .174 (25-for-144) in at-bats ending with Pepiot's fastballs (four-seamer, cutter, sinker), the fourth-lowest mark on any AL pitcher's fastballs in that span (min. 150AB), trailing TEX **Jacob DeGrom** (.183), TOR **Eric Lauer** (.188) and SEA **Bryan Woo** (.189)...over half (43) of his 81 strikeouts in that span have come on his four-seamer (33) and cutter (10).

REVERSE PSYCHOLOGY—Pepiot has limited left-handed hitters to a .193 (38-for-208) average, the fourth-lowest mark among qualified AL right-handers behind CLE Gavin Williams (.136), TOR Kevin Gausman (.184) and HOU Hunter Brown (.184)...right-handed hitters are batting .257 (67-for-261) against Pepiot, but this includes a 29-for-139 (.209) clip across his last 13 starts (.321 in first 10GS).

TOP HEAVY—The first three spots in opposing lineups are batting 290/351/541 (53-for-183) against Pepiot, but 4-9 hitters have produced a .189/.267/.365 (56-for-296) line...this includes a .151 (8-for-53) average against cleanup hitters, fifth lowest among qualified major league pitchers behind NYM David Peterson (.113), TOR José Berríos (.140), KC Kris Bubic (.143) and DET Tarik Skubal (.150).
