LHP Shota Imanaga (6-8, 3.91 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (9-8, 3.43 ERA)

THE PIRATES: began this six-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (0-1, Friday-Sunday) and Arizona (July 27-29) with a 3-2, 10-inning loss on Friday vs. the Cubs...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1, July 18-19) and New York-AL (1-2, Monday-Wednesday)...Are in the second game of a stretch of 20 straight games against National League opponents (11 of their 14 games from Friday-August 6 are vs. the National League Central), with their next interleague game scheduled for August 14 vs. Boston...Are in the second day of a stretch of 17 straight days with a game, with their next off day scheduled for August 10...Have hit 132 home runs after hitting 117 home runs last season...Have hit 71 home runs at home (their single-season record at PNC Park [since 2001] is 81, set in 2003)...Have the most hits (941) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the second-most runs (545) in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Washington (569), after scoring 583 runs last season...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (954) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Philadelphia (1016), Milwaukee (1005) and Cleveland (960)...Have the sixth-best run differential (+50) in Major League Baseball.

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE: The Pirates are 17-13 (.567) against the National League Central this season, having won or split seven of their first nine series against the division...Pittsburgh won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Cincinnati, won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago, won two of three games from April 24-26 at Milwaukee, swept a three-game series from May 1-3 vs. Cincinnati, won two of three games from May 19-21 at St. Louis, split a four-game series from May 25-28 vs. Chicago and swept a three-game series from July 11-12 vs. Milwaukee (the team was swept in a four-game series from April 27-30 vs. St. Louis and lost two of three games from June 26-28 vs. Cincinnati)...The Pirates won or split only seven of their 16 series against the National League Central during the 2025 campaign...They have finished with a .500 or better record against the division in a season three times since it formed in 1994, coming in 1997 (.500, 24-24), 2013 (.592, 45-31) and 2018 (.566, 43-33).

STARTING YINZ UP: Mitch Keller (5.0 innings, Wednesday [G1] at New York-AL), Bubba Chandler (6.1 innings, Wednesday [G2] at New York-AL) and Jared Jones (6.0 innings, Friday vs. Chicago-NL) have become the first trio of Pittsburgh starters to pitch at least 5.0 innings while allowing three hits or fewer and one or zero runs in three straight team games since Mike Burrows, Andrew Heaney and Paul Skenes (July 25-27, 2025 vs. Arizona)...The Pirates' rotation last did that in at least four straight games from September 22-26, 2020 (five straight games), when Steven Brault (September 22 vs. Chicago-NL), Trevor Williams (September 23 vs. Chicago-NL), Chad Kuhl (September 24 vs. Chicago-NL), Keller (September 25 at Cleveland) and Joe Musgrove (September 26 at Cleveland) did it...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Chandler and Jones became the first pair of Pittsburgh starters since at least 1893 (when the mound moved to its current distance) to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs and one or zero walks in back-to-back team games...The Pirates' 2.70 rotation ERA (33.1ip/10er) in seven games since the All-Star break is the best mark in all of Major League Baseball (Chicago-NL, 2.79 ERA, ranks second on that list).

PITTSBURGH LEFT: The Pirates will face a left-handed starter (Shota Imanaga) for the eighth time in their last 10 games (since July 11 [G2] vs. Milwaukee) tonight vs. Chicago (NL)...Pittsburgh also faced Shane Drohan (July 11 [G2] vs. Milwaukee), Robert Gasser (July 12 vs. Milwaukee), Logan Allen (July 18 [G2] at Cleveland), Joey Cantillo (July 19 at Cleveland), Ryan Weathers (July 20 at New York-AL), Max Fried (Wednesday [G2] at New York-AL) and Matthew Boyd (Friday vs. Chicago-NL)...The Bucs' .287 average (50-for-174) vs. lefthanders since July 11 ranks seventh in Major League Baseball.

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 1-for-5 with an RBI on Friday vs. Chicago (NL) and has now hit safely in eight straight games (since July 12 vs. Milwaukee)...He has gone 13-for-36 (.361) with four doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a 1.000 OPS and eight runs scored during the streak...It is Gonzales' third hitting streak of at least eight games this season...He also had a career-high, 10-game hitting streak from April 19-29 and an eight-game hitting streak from May 29-June 6...Gonzales' .312 average (115-for-369) ranks fourth in all of Major League Baseball, behind Miami's Otto Lopez (.330), Houston's Yordan Alvarez (.327) & San Francisco's Luis Arraez (.324).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 25, 1956: Roberto Clemente hit the only walkoff, inside-the-park grand slam in Major League history, giving the Pirates a 9-8 win over the Cubs at Forbes Field. Pittsburgh led, 4-0, after seven innings, but Chicago responded with seven runs in the eighth inning and had an 8-5 lead heading into the bottom of the ninth inning. Bill Virdon was 4-for-5 with a double and a run scored in the Pirates' win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes won a 7-1 decision after allowing one run over 7.0 innings on July 19 at Cleveland...He is 3-0 with a 2.45 ERA (18.1ip/5er) over his last three starts (also July 7 vs. Atlanta and July 12 vs. Milwaukee) after going 0-6 with a 5.36 ERA (47.0ip/28er) over his nine starts from May 17 vs. Philadelphia to July 1 at Philadelphia.

AGAINST THE CUBS: Skenes is 2-3 with a 2.77 ERA (39.0ip/12er) in eight career starts against Chicago (NL)...He has a 4.70 ERA (23.0ip/12er) in five career starts against the Cubs at PNC Park...Skenes made his Major League debut here on May 11, 2024 vs. Chicago...He lost a 7-2 decision after allowing three runs (one earned) over 5.1 innings of work in his lone start against the Cubs this year, which came on May 28 at PNC Park.

CENTRAL PERK: Skenes is 10-10 with a 2.45 ERA (154.0ip/42er) in 28 career starts vs. the NL Central since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024 vs. Chicago (NL)...His 10 wins vs. the division in that time lead Major League Baseball (Chicago-NL’s Jameson Taillon and New York-NL’s Freddy Peralta are tied for second with nine each).

WE WERE ON A BREAK: Skenes has a 1.92 ERA (140.1ip/30er) in 25 career starts after the All-Star break, including a 1.89 ERA (66.2ip/14er) in 12 such starts last season.

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Skenes has received a combined 29 runs of support when he has been in the game in his last three starts (July 7 vs. Atlanta , July 12 vs. Milwaukee & July 19 at Cleveland)...He received 19 total runs of support over 11 starts from May 6-July 1.

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes was named to his third straight National League All-Star team on July 4...Per Sarah Langs, he was one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star Game in at least each of his first three career seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) and Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)...He became only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three consecutive All-Star teams, joining Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Elroy Face (1959-61) on that short list.

THE 500 CLUB: Skenes’ fourth-inning strikeout of Elly De La Cruz during his start on June 26 vs. Cincinnati was the 500th of his Major League career (it came in his 72nd start)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

DON’T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)’s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)’s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego’s Mat Latos (2010).
