SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

VS. PADRES: Last season, the D-backs took the season series vs. Padres 7-6 (3-4 @ home, 4-2 on the road), outscoring them 26-16 (+10 run differential).

♦ The D-backs won 5 of their last 6 games vs. Padres.

LAST GAME: The D-backs fell to the Padres 7-1 last night.

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** hit safely in his fifth straight game.
- ◆ **Joc Pederson** hit safely in his third consecutive game.
- ◆ Eugenio Suárez collected his third RBI in his last 5 games.
- Justin Martinez tossed 2.0 scoreless innings with 4 strikeouts.

SEEING IT WELL VS. SD: Since 2022, **Christian Walker**'s 8 homers vs. Padres are third most among all players (min. 100 PA), behind Mookie Betts/LAD (11; .720 SLG) and Ryan McMahon/COL (9; .603 SLG).

◆ Since 2022, **Ketel Marte**'s 23 strikeouts in 121 PA vs. Padres are tied for fourth fewest among all players (min. 100 PA) [also: Freddie Freeman/LAD (23 in 164 PA)], behind Wilmer Flores/SF (19 in 113 PA), Will Smith/LAD (21 in 147 PA) and Mookie Betts/LAD (22 in 159 PA).

WALKER CREATING A BUZZ: Since April 22, **Christian Walker**'s 4 homers are tied for the most in the NL (also: Nick Senzel/WSH) and 9 RBI are fifth, behind Alec Bohm/PHI (13), Francisco Lindor/NYM (11), Willy Adames/MIL (11) and Jake Cronenworth/SD (11).

- ♦ Walker has reached base safely in 9 of his last 10 games...in the span, he boasts a 1.057 OPS with 1 double, 4 homers, 9 RBI and 6 walks.
- ♦ Defensively, Walker boasts a 33-game errorless streak this season, tied for the second-longest (also: 3 others), behind Teoscar Hernández/LAD (34) and Juan Soto/NYY (34).

JOC POP: Since April 22, **Joc Pederson**'s .600 BABIP (Batting Average on Balls in Player) ranks atop the NL while his .452 OBP ranks fourth in the NL, behind Alec Bohm/PHI (.490), Mookie Betts/LAD (.458) and Jurickson Profar/SD (.457).

DUEL OF SPEED: Arizona's team average of 29.0 ft/sec and 5.36 second Home-to-1st average ranks best in the NL West. Comparison with San Diego:

GOLDEN BACKSTOPS: D-back backstops' 7 stolen bases allowed and 13 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

- ◆ Gabriel Moreno's 55.6 caught-stealing pct. (5-for-9) leads the Majors.
 - **Moreno** leads active catchers with a 41.0 caught-stealing pct. (34-for-83) and **Tucker Barnhart** is 11th with a 30.7 CS pct. (171-for-557).

ATTENDANCE BOOST: The D-backs 544,481 total home attendance in 17 openings is currently the seventh largest in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (827,052), Padres (772,923), Phillies (649,741), Rangers (585,190), Braves (573,206) and Astros (571,394).

♦ It is the first time Chase Field has welcomed 540,000+ fans thru the first 17 openings since 2004 (565,686).

LIMITING THE STRIKEOUT: The D-backs' 19.2% strikeout rate is the lowest in the NL, ahead of the Mets (19.8), Padres (20.1), Marlins (20.5) and Dodgers (21.1), while their 2.02 strikeout-to-walk ratio is the second lowest to the Dodgers (1.94).

bWAR RANKINGS: Ketel Marte's 2.4 bWAR is second among all players (pitcher or position), behind Mookie Betts/LAD (3.1) while his 0.9 defensive bWAR is second, behind Marcus Semien/TEX (1.2).

HARD HITTING: The D-backs' 336 hard hit balls (No. of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) rank fourth in the NL, behind the Dodgers (407), Padres (359) and Braves (359).

◆ Ketel Marte's 55 hard hits are tied for fourth among NL players (also: Mookie Betts/LAD), behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (64), Fernando Tatis Jr./SD (57) and William Contreras/MIL (56).

SAVING RUNS [courtesy fieldingbible.com]: Ketel Marte and **Christian Walker's** 8 defensive runs saved (DRS) are tied for second in the Majors (also: Daulton Varsho/TOR), behind Marcus Semien/TEX (10).

♦ The D-backs' 20 DRS are fourth in the Majors, behind the Royals (31), Rangers (26) and Blue Jays (23).

MARTE GETS TO 1K: Wednesday's start marked career game No. 1,000 for Ketel Marte.

- ♦ Marte became the 16th Dominican-born switch-hitter to reach 1,000 career games and 1 of 2 who are currently active (also: José Ramírez/CLE).
- ♦On Wednesday, Marte and Chris Taylor/LAD both played their 1,000th career MLB game, marking the fifth time in MLB history where 2 players reached their 1,000th game in the same game and the first time the 2 were opposing players [@SlangsOnSports].

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Seventh start of the season, fourth @ home.

- Has allowed 2 or fewer runs in 3 consecutive starts and 4 of his 6 bids in 2024.
- Has tossed 5.0+ innings in 7 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 27, 2023.
- Is limiting opponents to a .143 average (6-for-42) with 9 strikeouts off his fastball.

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 6.33), walks per 9.0 innings (4th, 1.54), walks (4th, 6) and strikeouts per 9.0 innings (9th, 9.77).

LAST START: Went decisionless in his last start on April 28 @ Mariners (ND; 2 ER in 6.0 IP, 11 K).

- Struck out a career-high 11 batters...his previous career-high was 8 (3 times) in the regular season and 9 in the Postseason (Oct. 19, 2023 vs. Phillies).
- Retired his final 11 batters.

VS. PADRES: Third career start vs. Padres, second @ Chase Field.

- In 2 career starts, is 0-0 with a 2.13 ERA (3 ER in 12.2 IP, 13 K).
- In his last start vs. Padres on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Petco Park, tossed 7.0 shutout (6.0 no-hit) innings with just 1 hit allowed (Juan Soto double in 7th).

IT'S UNDER CONTROL: His 88.6 pct. competitive pitch location (pct. of pitches within the center of the zone) ranks third in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind only Martín Pérez/PIT (89.1%) and Trevor Rogers/MIA (88.9%).

- His 67.6 strike pct. ranks fourth in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind Jared Jones/PIT (72.3%), Chris Sale/ATL (71.0%) and Shota Imanaga/CHC (68.5%).
- His 4.1 walk pct. walk is the fifth in the NL (min: 25 innings)...boasts a
 3.3 walk pct. with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in
 the NL [min. 6 starts], behind 7 others who have not allowed a walk
 with runners in scoring position.

BATTERS 1-4: Is holding batters 1-4 in a lineup to a .219 average (14-for-64) with 3 walks and 17 strikeouts and 73.3% out rate.

THIRD TIME THROUGH: In his third time thru the lineup, is limiting batters to a .229 average (8-for-35) with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts.

NO-HIT FRAMES: His 4.0 no-hit innings tossed on April 22 @ Cardinals were the second longest of his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

FIRST PITCH SUCCESS: His first-pitch swing (34.0 to 42.8) and first-pitch strike (63.9 to 76.6) percentages are up from 2023.

BATTED BALL STATS: From 2023 to 2024, his groundball percentage is up to 39.8 from 32.6 while his fly ball percentage is down to 31.6 from 33.9.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts with Arizona.

- Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by The Athletic (No. 38 overall) and MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by *Baseball America*.
- Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP)...
 was the second D-backs starting pitcher to make their MLB debut @
 Rangers and first @ Globe Life Field (last: Nelson Figueroa on June 3,
 2000).
- Struck out Josh Jung in the second inning for his first career strikeout.
- Earned his first Major League win on August 25 vs. Reds (2 ER in 5.1 IP, 5 K).
- Recorded 3 career-high-tying 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox.
- Owned a 12.2 inning scoreless streak from 8/13/23 vs. SD (2nd inning) 8/25/23 vs. CIN (2nd inning).
- Appeared in 1 game in relief, the first of his career, on Sept. 10 vs. Cubs (4 ER in 6.0 IP).

- Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings in his first career start vs. Phillies @ Chase Field on Oct. 19 in Game 3 of the NLCS (2 H, 0 BB, 9 K).
- Became the first pitcher in MLB history to allow 0 runs and 0 walks in consecutive Postseason starts (source: @ESPNStatsInfo).
- Became the second pitcher in franchise history to strike out 9+ batters without a walk in a Postseason game (also: Curt Schilling, 2001 World Series Game 7) and the fourth Rookie pitcher in MLB Postseason history to record 8+ strikeouts without a walk.

HOW IT STARTED: •Selected by the D-backs in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player draft out of Bellarmine University.
