**RAYS REPORT**—The Rays open their final road trip before the All-Star break today at Target Field, a three-city, 10-day trek through Minnesota (3G), Detroit (3G) and Boston (4G)...are coming off a brief three-game homestand against the Athletics (1-2)...have lost three of their last four games, but have still won 12 of 19, 18 of 28, 27 of 40, 29 of 45, and 39 of their last 64 games following a 9-14 start...have lost consecutive series for just the second time in 2025, joining April 14-20 vs. BOS/NYY...are 3-3-1 in their last seven series after going 7-1-1 in their previous nine (May 9-June 8)...are tied with the Astros and Dodgers for the best record in the majors since May 20 (all clubs are 27-13)...are third in the AL/fifth in MLB in run differential (+69)...this marks their fourth straight series vs. an opponent that entered below .500—they are 25-24 against teams that currently have a losing record (25th in MLB) and 23-15 vs. .500 or better teams (1st in MLB)...are 0.5 GB the first-place Blue Jays and Yankees (both 49-38) in the AL East and have been within 1.5 games for 10 straight and 12 of the last 13 days...have been in second or third for the last 41 days...on the season, they have spent two days in first, 34 in second, 28 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays plated five runs in the 6th frame and survived the Athletics three-run rally in the 9th on Wednesday in Tampa, salvaging the finale of the three-game set with a 6-5 win...they have played in consecutive one-run games for the first time since June 4-8 (5G) after a streak of 17 straight games decided by multiple runs, their longest since Aug. 29-Sept. 21, 2004 (20G).
- ✦ The five-run 6th inning marked the 30th time the Rays have scored four runs or more in a frame this season, the most in the AL...they had 22 such innings all of 2024.
- ✦ Rays pitching struck out a season-high 17, their most since Aug. 27, 2024 at SEA (17SO)...they have recorded 15 SO or more in back-to-back games for the fifth time in club history, first since Sept. 20-21, 2019...they have never had a three-game streak.
- ✦ Tampa Bay has homered in a season-high seven straight games (15HR total), its longest streak since Aug. 23-31, 2024 (8G)...the Rays have hit 3 HR (or more) in back-to-back games for the first time since July 20-21, 2024...their last longer streak was three games from April 7-9, 2023.
- ✦ The Rays are an MLB-best 20-14 on the road, going 7-2 in their last nine games...having played the most home games (53) and fewest road games (34) to this point, 17 of 23, 29 of 38 and 35 of their next 49 games will come on the road.
- ✦ Tampa Bay has dropped consecutive series openers after winning 10 straight...its 17-11 record in openers is tied with Houston for second in the AL behind Detroit (22-6).

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Yesterday, the Rays reinstated **INF Ha-Seong Kim** (recovery from right shoulder surgery) from the 60-day IL and optioned **INF Curtis Mead** to Triple-A Durham...Kim, who is slated to make his Rays debut this afternoon, signed a two-year contract with Tampa Bay on Feb. 3, with a player option for 2026...he hit .208 (15-for-72) with 3 2B, 6 RBI, 15 BB, 11 R and 6 SB over 21 rehab games with Triple-A Durham, making starts at shortstop (9G), second base (5G) and designated hitter (7G).

✦ A 2023 Gold Glove recipient, Kim's 15.3 bWAR from 2021-24 ranked second among Padres behind **Manny Machado** (17.7), and his 48 defensive runs saved were third in the NL behind **PIT Ke'Bryan Hayes** (72) and **COL Ryan McMahon** (59).

**HAPPY 4TH!**—The Rays are 10-16 on Independence Day, going 6-11 on the road and 4-5 at home...they are 6-5 in their last 11 games on the holiday after dropping 11 of their first 15...this marks the fourth time in the last five seasons and sixth time in eight seasons since 2017 (no game in 2020) the Rays are on the road for the Fourth of July...last season, they defeated the Royals, 10-8, at Kauffman Stadium in a game in which all nine Tampa Bay starters hit safely, including three by **Brandon Lowe** (3-for-5, 2B, HR, BB)...the Rays are looking to win back-to-back Independence Day games for the third time in team history, which would join 2016-17 and 2013-14.

✦ This marks the Rays third Fourth of July game against the Twins, joining consecutive games at Target Field in 2010 (W, 7-4) and 2011 (L, 7-0).

**THE MAN(UM), THE MYTH, THE LEGEND**—On Wednesday, **Jake Mangum** recorded the 24th inside-the-park home run in Rays history, first since **Luke Raley** on Aug. 16, 2023 at SF and the first at home since **Kevin Kiermaier** on May 24, 2022 vs. MIA...he became the second rookie in Rays history to record an inside-the-parker, joining Kiermaier on May 31, 2014 at BOS, and the first major league rookie since **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** on Aug. 23, 2024 at MIA...the Rays have recorded seven inside-the-park homers since 2021—no other club has more than three in that span (CIN, DET, PHI)...they also lead the majors in the category since becoming the Rays in 2008 (17) and since their inaugural 1998 campaign (24).

✦ Mangum is 9-for-27 (.333) over a seven-game hitting streak and has tallied a hit in 18 of his last 20 games with a PA, batting .354/.393/.468 (28-for-79) with 6 XBH and 14 RBI.

**DAWG POUND**—**Brandon Lowe's** career-best 18-game hitting streak is the longest active run in the majors and is tied for third longest in franchise history, trailing only **Yandy Diaz** (20G, 2024) and **Jason Bartlett** (19G, 2009)...Lowe, who is 27-for-71 (.380) with 3 2B, 6 HR and 14 RBI during the streak, has homered in four of his last six starts...he also has a career-best 20-game on-base streak, the third-longest active run in MLB (see table to the right).

**YANDY MAN CAN**—**Yandy Diaz's** 26-game on-base streak is the second-longest active run in MLB behind **ATL Matt Olson** (32G) and the second longest of his career, trailing a 29-game streak from May 26-June 28, 2024...over the current streak, he has hit .408/.483/.641 (42-for-103) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 6 HR, 15 RBI, 13 BB and 17 R...since the streak began on June 3, Diaz leads the majors in average (.408), hits (42) and on-base pct. (.483) while ranking second in OPS (1.124) behind **NYM Juan Soto** (1.127).

**BASH BROTHERS**—Junior Caminero's 21 HR are tied with **DET Riley Greene** for third in the AL behind **SEA Cal Raleigh** (33HR) and **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (31HR) while **Brandon Lowe's** 19 HR are tied for fifth, also trailing **LAA Taylor Ward** (20HR)...they are looking to become the first pair of Rays teammates to both reach 20 HR before the All-Star break in franchise history...only one infield duo in MLB accomplished the feat last season: **CLE Josh Naylor** (22HR) and **CLE José Ramírez** (23HR)...Caminero and Lowe lead AL infielders in homers, trailing only **AZ Eugenio Suárez** (27HR) in all of MLB.

✦ Caminero, who turns 22 tomorrow, doubled on Wednesday for his 40th extra-base hit, sixth most in the AL and the most by a Ray before the break since **Austin Meadows** (40XBH) in 2021.

✦ With 19 doubles, he is one two-bagger shy of becoming the first player in Rays history with 20 2B and 20 HR before the Midsummer Classic...only one player since 1901 has turned the trick before turning 22: **ATL Ozzie Albies** in 2018 (29 2B, 20HR).

✦ Caminero (21HR, 53RBI) and Lowe (19HR, 50RBI) are one of two sets of teammates in MLB with 19 HR and 50 RBI each, joining **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (21HR, 64RBI) and **CHC Seiya Suzuki** (23HR, 73RBI).

**TWINNING**—The Rays and Twins meet for three games this weekend, with the Rays needing two wins to earn their third straight season series win (4-3 in 2024, 5-1 in 2023)...the Rays are 5-2-1 in season series since 2016 and 11-3-3 since 2007...from May 26-28 at Steinbrenner Field, they took two of three games, pitching to a 1.67 ERA (27.0IP, 5ER) while holding Twins batters to 2-for-17 (.118) with RISP...the Rays are 12-5 in their last 17 matchups with the Twins overall, going 5-2 on the road in that span...they have won back-to-back series at Target Field for the first time since 2016-17, improving to 9-6-0 in this venue...they have had only one longer streak since the ballpark opened in 2010, winning three straight from 2012-14...each of their last five road games against Minnesota dating back to Sept. 12, 2023 have been one-run affairs, including four straight games decided in the final at-bat.



✦ **Jonathan Aranda** (6-for-10) and **Brandon Lowe** (5-for-12) are a combined 11-for-22 (.500) vs. Minnesota this season...**Yandy Diaz** is 11-for-27 (.9407) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI and a 1.169 OPS over his last six games at Target Field.

**DOWN ON THE FARM**—Three Rays farmhands earned monthly awards for June, tied with the Rockies for the most in baseball...Triple-A Durham swept the International League, with **OF Tristan Peters** (.385/.35-for-91, 1 2B, 5HR, 27RBI, 18BB, 22R) and **RHP Joe Boyle** (3-0, 1.80 ERA/30.0IP, 6ER, 49SO, 11BB, 0.97 WHIP) receiving Player and Pitcher of the Month honors...additionally, Class-A Charleston **OF Angel Mateo** (.349/.30-for-86), 6 2B, 1 3B, 3HR, 24RBI, 19R) was named Carolina League Player of the Month...Peters and Boyle were also tabbed as the organization's Player and Pitcher of the Month by the Rays baseball operations department.

**TODAY’S START**—Zack Littell will take the mound for his 18th start of the campaign and his second against the Twins...it marks the 65th start of his career (220G) and his fifth (7G) against Minnesota...the Rays have won nine of his last 12 starts...seven of his last 10 starts have been quality...has allowed three runs or fewer in 13 of his last 14 outings...is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023...claimed off waivers from the Red Sox on May 12, 2023.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Littell snapped a streak of three straight losing starts after tossing 7.0 innings of one-run ball in an 11-3 victory over the Orioles on June 28 in Baltimore (7.OIP, 3H, ER, HR, 2BB, 5SO)...allowed two baserunners in the 1st inning (1B, BB) before retiring 10 of his next 12 (1B, BB) faced from the 2nd through 5th frames...surrendered his only run of the game on a solo home run by Chadwick Tromp in the 5th before putting away his final seven batters.

- ✦ It marked Littell’s first start of 7.0 innings or more with one or zero earned runs allowed since Sept. 19, 2024 vs. BOS (7.OIP, OER)...he has recorded four such starts in his career...the Rays are 4-1 this season when he pitches 7.0 innings or more and 6-4 in his career.
- ✦ He has gone 5.0 IP or more in 14 straight starts and 16 of his 17 this season...is 7-4 with a 2.98 ERA (87.2IP, 29ER) in his last 14.

**TWINS TALK**—Littell holds a 1-2 record with a 3.70 ERA (24.1IP, 10ER) in six previous encounters (4GS) with the Twins, the team he began his career with from 2018-20...in four appearances (2GS) at Target Field as a visitor, he is 0-1 with a 3.21 ERA (14.OIP, 5ER)...his last outing in Minnesota came on June 20, 2024 when he tossed 5.0 innings of two-run ball in a 7-6 win (ND, 5.OIP, 5H, 2ER, HR, 2BB, 5SO)...he also faced Minnesota on May 26 of this year, allowing just one earned run over 6.1 innings pitched in a 7-2 victory at Steinbrenner Field (W, 6.1IP, 3H, ER, HBP, 4SO)...two of his four career starts vs. the Twins have been quality.

- ✦ Littell’s 28 career appearances at Target Field are tied with Tropicana Field for his second most at any ballpark, trailing only San Francisco’s Oracle Park (51G).
- ✦ He is 1-0 against the AL Central this season with a 1.59 ERA (11.1IP, 2ER) and a .184 (7-for-38) opp. average...this will mark his first road start against the division this season...he holds a 2.63 ERA (48.OIP, 14ER) in his last nine career starts against teams from the AL Central dating back to April 28, 2024.

**I’VE BEEN EVERYWHERE**—Today marks his ninth road start of the year, having gone 6.0 IP or more in seven of the previous eight...he is 5-3 with a 3.81 ERA (54.1IP, 23ER) and five quality starts away from Steinbrenner Field this season...he has allowed 12 home runs in his last five road starts (May 3–pres.), accounting for all 13 runs against him over that stretch.

**BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN**—After losing each of his first five starts, the Rays are 9-3 in his last 12, including an eight-start winning streak from April 27–June 11 that tied the fourth-longest in a pitcher’s starts in franchise history...it also ties four other hurlers for the third-longest team winning streak in a pitcher’s starts this season, trailing only HOU Framber Valdez (10GS, May 7–pres.) and SF Robbie Ray (9GS, March 30–May 13)...over the 12-start span, Littell is 7-2 with a 2.97 ERA (75.2IP, 25ER), producing a 1.00 WHIP with 50 strikeouts against six walks.

- ✦ In his last 26 starts dating back to July 27, 2024, Littell is 12-10 with a 3.04 ERA (154.OIP, 52ER)...over that span, he ranks among AL leaders (min. 100.OIP) in walk rate (2nd, 3.8%), fewest pitches per IP (2nd, 14.4), WHIP (9th, 1.02), opp. on-base pct. (10th, .269) and GIDP per 9.0 IP (10th, 0.94).

**HOMER (UN)HAPPY**—Over his last six starts, 10 of the 13 runs allowed by Littell have come via the 9 HR against him...across his last 11 starts since the beginning of May, 16 of the 23 runs (69.6%) against him have come on 15 HR...he has permitted 23 HR on the season, the most in the majors and the most before the All-Star break in franchise history, surpassing three pitchers with 20 HR: Jake Odorizzi (2017), Drew Smyly (2016) and Esteban Yan (2000)...he has allowed a homer in 12 of his 17 starts, and 27 of the 42 runs (64.3%) against him have come via the long ball.

- ✦ Of the 23 HR he has allowed, 19 have been solo shots and four have come with one runner on base.

**DIG DEEP**—Opponents are batting .205 (25-for-122) against Littell with two outs compared to .271 (74-for-273) with one or zero outs...it marks the 12th-lowest two-out average among AL pitchers (min. 100AB)...opposing hitters are 13-for-61 (.213) against him with runners in scoring position but have gone 5-for-28 (.179) with RISP and two outs.

**DON’T WALK THIS WAY**—Since his Rays debut on May 16, 2023, Littell’s 3.7 pct. walk rate ranks third in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind SEA George Kirby (3.1%) and BAL Zach Eflin (3.6%)...he has issued one or zero walks in 49 of his 60 starts with the Rays and two walks or fewer in 57 of them.

**27 OUTS**—The right-hander worked the 10th complete game in MLB this season on May 31 at HOU, the first by a Rays pitcher since Ryan Yarbrough on June 3, 2021 at NYY...before Yarbrough, the club’s last CG belonged to Matt Andriese on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...Littell ended the Rays run of 647 consecutive games without a CG, the second-longest streak in major league history, eclipsed only by Tampa Bay’s own 731-game streak from May 15, 2016–June 2, 2021...of the 106 CG in team history, only three have come over the last 10 seasons since 2016 (103CG from 1998–2015)...Littell threw a career-high 117 pitches, most by a Ray since Jake Odorizzi (118) on May 27, 2017 at MIN and most by a Ray in a CG since David Price (118) on Sept. 30, 2013 at TEX.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP TAJ BRADLEY [5-6, 4.79]

**LAST TIME OUT**—Took his first loss since June 1 at HOU after allowing five earned runs on eight hits over 5.1 innings in the 5-1 loss to the Orioles at Camden Yards (L, 5.1IP, 8H, 5ER, BB, 2SO)...has posted a 7.59 ERA (21.1IP, 18ER) with 3 HR and 9 BB over his last five starts.

**vs. TWINS**—Bradley tossed 7.0 innings of two-run ball (3R), but suffered the loss in his last start against the Twins in a 4-2 defeat on May 27 at Steinbrenner Field (L, 7.OIP, 5H, 3R, 2ER, HR, BB, HBP, 6SO)...he is 0-2 with a 4.38 ERA (24.2IP, 12ER) in four career starts against the Twins with two quality starts and 26 strikeouts.
