THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY
On this date in 1990, brothers **Billy Ripken** and **Cal Ripken, Jr.** each homered in the same game...This marked the first of two occasions in which the brothers each hit home runs in the same game... Despite the Ripken homers, the Orioles fell to the Blue Jays, 4-3, following a walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning by **Kelly Gruber** at Toronto.



14-KARAT GOLD: The O's 14-1 win on Monday over the Atlanta Braves ended their five-game losing streak...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the win marked the second-largest margin of victory in Orioles history (since 1954) that ended a losing streak of at least five games...The only larger margin of victory occurred when the 1967 Orioles routed the New York Yankees 14-0, ending a six-game skid.

- 👉 The O's 14 runs scored marked a season-high, tied a season-high with four home runs as a team, and improved the club to 10-8 in Interleague play.
- 👉 Over their last five games, the O's final scores were 6-0 (L), 10-1 (L), 2-1 (L), 3-1 (L), and 14-1 (W)...According to STATS, LLC., the Orioles became the first team in AL history to score one-run-or-less in four-straight games, then score at least 14 runs in their next game.
- 👉 The O's nine-run bottom of the third inning marked the first time they scored at least nine runs in an inning since April 15, 2016, when they scored nine in the top of the seventh at Texas in an 11-5 win (source: @SlingsOnSports).
- 👉 RHP **Jorge López** earned the win after allowing one run on five hits with three strikeouts over a season-high 7.0 innings...The outing marked the longest start by an O's pitcher this year.

FOUR-WHEEL DRIVE: SS **José Iglesias** went 4-for-4 in Monday night's win while driving in four runs...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Orioles starting shortstop to be perfect at the plate with at least four RBI in a regular-season game since August 16, 1969, when **Chico Salmon** went 4-for-4 and knocked in six runs in the O's 15-3 victory over the Seattle Pilots...**Kiko Garcia** also accomplished the feat after going 4-for-4 with four RBI during Baltimore's Game 3 win in the 1979 World Series.

- 👉 Iglesias is hitting .370 (44-for-119) through his first 31 games with the Orioles...Among players with at least 100 at-bats, Iglesias' .370 average leads the majors...**Tim Anderson** of the Chicago White Sox ranks second with a .369 mark (min. 100 AB)...The last player in the majors to hit over .390 in a season was San Diego's **Tony Gwynn**, who hit .394 during 110 games of the strike-shortened 1994 season.

ONE, TWO, THREE, AND TO THE FOUR...: Monday night's 1-4 hitters in the lineup of **Cedric Mullins** (2 hits, 2 RBI), **José Iglesias** (4 hits, 4 RBI), **DJ Stewart** (2 hits, 4 RBI), and **Ryan Mountcastle** (2 hits, 3 RBI) each notched at least two hits and two RBI in the O's win over the Braves...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the sixth time in franchise history that the top four batters in the lineup each had two hits and drove in at least two runs.

- 👉 The last such game occurred on September 28, 2000 when **Brady Anderson** (2 hits, 4 RBI), **Jerry Hairston, Jr.** (2 hits, 2 RBI), **Delino DeShields** (3 hits, 5 RBI), and **Albert Belle** (2 hits, 2 RBI) combined to do so over the Toronto Blue Jays in a 23-1 win.

WAKE ME UP WHEN SEPTEMBER ENDS: The Orioles are now 6-7 during the month of September, including 5-2 at home during the month.

- 👉 During the month of September, O's hitters rank fourth in the AL in OPS (.788), rank fourth in batting average (.266), and rank third in home runs (21).
- 👉 **OF DJ Stewart's** seven home runs lead the AL lead in September and **INF/OF Ryan Mountcastle** is tied for sixth in the majors with 14 RBI, Stewart is tied for sixth in the AL with 12 RBI, and **INF Rio Ruiz** is tied for 13th in the AL with 10 RBI during the month.
- 👉 The O's 4.02 ERA (48 ER/107.1 IP) during September ranks fifth-best in the AL...Orioles pitchers have allowed 48 earned runs during the month to rank fifth-fewest in the AL.
- 👉 According to *teamrankings.com* the O's remaining strength of schedule (as of September 15) ranks as the toughest in the AL and fourth-toughest in the majors.

IF YOU AIN'T FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: The Orioles rank first in the majors in batting average (.424), and lead the AL and ranks third in the majors in OPS (1.134), and rank sixth in the majors in extra-base hits (28) on the first pitch of an at-bat...The O's are tied for second in the AL and are tied for fourth in the majors in doubles (17), and first in the AL and fifth in the majors in hits (72) as a team on the first pitch.

SMALL BALL FOR ALL: The O's lead the majors with 14 bunt hits this season...**OF Cedric Mullins** leads the majors with eight bunt hits, while **INF Hanser Alberto** is tied for third in the majors with four bunt hits and **INF/OF Andrew Velazquez** is tied for seventh in the majors with two bunt hits.

THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW: Since the start of the 2019 season, **INF Hanser Alberto** leads the majors with 101 hits off of left-handed pitching...In that time, he leads the majors with a .393 (101-for-257) average against lefties...This season, Alberto ranks 11th in the AL with a .299 (52-for-174) average against all pitchers.

CATCH THIS: The O's catching corps of **Pedro Severino**, **Chance Sisco**, and **Bryan Holaday** ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories...O's catchers ranks (while catching):

INTERLEAGUE INFO: The O's will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season, including contests with the Miami Marlins (0-4), Washington Nationals (4-2), Philadelphia Phillies (3-0), New York Mets (2-2), and Atlanta Braves (1-0)...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the O's are 207-234...The O's went 7-13 in Interleague Play last season... Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history.

INJURED LIST: Six players are on the Injured List...RHP **Shawn Armstrong** (left SI joint inflammation), **INF Chris Davis** (left knee patellar tendinitis), and **OF Anthony Santander** (right oblique strain) are on the 10-day Injured List...LHP **Wade LeBlanc** (left elbow stress reaction), **INF/OF Trey Mancini** (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment), and **INF Richie Martin** (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL.

LAST START: Made his seventh Major League start (third of the season) on 9/4 vs. NYY (G1)...Did not factor in the decision after allowing a season-high four runs (two earned) on three hits (one home run) and three walks with one strikeout through 2.1 innings of work, marking the shortest start of his career...Since his last start on 9/4, he has made one appearance out of the bullpen, working 2.0 innings in relief on 9/11 at NYY (G1), allowing one run on two hits and two walks with a pair of strikeouts...He is currently working a career-high four-game winning streak.

UNFAMILIAR FACES: Eshelman will be facing the Atlanta Braves for the first time in his career...Has faced NL East opponents just four times (two starts) in his career, with all four outings coming in the 2020 season...His last start against an NL East opponent came on 8/13 at PHI when he tossed a season-high 5.0 innings and allowed two runs on four hits with two strikeouts en route to his first win of the season.

START IT UP: Eshelman has started seven career games, with his other 12 career outings coming in relief...In his career starts, Eshelman has posted a 1-2 record with a 6.37 ERA (21 ER/ 29.2 IP), 10 home runs allowed, nine walks, and 20 strikeouts...Has gone 1-0 with a 4.76 ERA (6 ER/11.1 IP) and five strikeouts in his three starts this season.

HOME NOT-SO-SWEET HOME: Eshelman has pitched in 11 games (three starts) at Oriole Park in his career, posting a 3-2 record and 5.97 ERA (21 ER/31.2 IP) with 18 strikeouts through these outings, compared to a 1-0 record and 4.91 ERA (16 ER/29.1 IP) in eight games (four starts) on the road.

OH, THE RELIEF: As a reliever, he has held opponents to a .156 (7-for-45) clip in his 13.2 IP this season...Did not allow a run or a hit in his outing on 8/23 vs. BOS (earned his third career win); was the longest scoreless outing of his career (in a start or relief) at 4.1 innings...Nine of his 12 career appearances out of the bullpen have been 2.0-or-more innings.

LEFT IS RIGHT: In 2019, he held opposing left-handed batters to a .241 (14-for-58) average with two doubles and four home runs with the Orioles, while right-handers batted .359 (33-for-92) with four doubles and eight home runs against him...Between Triple-A Norfolk and Triple-A Lehigh Valley, Eshelman held International League left-handed batters to a .237 average (31-for-131) in 2019.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut with the Orioles on 7/1 at TB, taking a no-decision (5.0 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, BB)...He did not record a strikeout in his debut, making him just the third pitcher in Orioles history (since 1954) with at least 5.0 innings pitched in their Major League debut without a strikeout...Struck out his first career batter on 7/14 vs. TB, striking out INF Willy Adames in the second inning and set a career-high with seven strikeouts in the start...Earned his first career win on 8/4 vs. TOR, tossing 5.0 innings in relief...Made 10 appearances for Baltimore, pitching to a 1-2 record with a 6.50 ERA (26 ER/ 36.0 IP) and 22 strikeouts...Made 17 appearances (16 starts) across three different minor league affiliates (Double-A Reading, Triple-A Lehigh Valley, and Triple-A Norfolk), going 3-5 with a 4.65 ERA (48 ER/ 93.0 IP).

QUICK HITS: Was acquired by the Orioles from Philadelphia in exchange for International Signing Bonus Slots on 6/9/19...Was acquired by Philadelphia from Houston along with RHP Vince Velasquez, RHP Mark Appel, LHP Brett Oberholtzer and RHP Harold Arauz in exchange for SS Harold Arauz and RHP Ken Giles on 12/12/15...Was originally selected by the Houston Astros in the 2nd round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Cal State Fullerton.

Akin will be making the fourth start (sixth appearance) of his career...In his last outing on 9/11 at NYY (G2), Akin was dealt his first career loss after making his shortest start of the season, tossing just 0.2 innings and allowing four runs on three hits and one walk with one strikeout...Akin has never faced the Atlanta Braves, and it will be just the second time that he has faced an NL East opponent, with his first coming in his Major League debut on 8/14 vs. WSH when he tossed 3.0 innings in relief and allowed three runs on two hits and one walk with one strikeout.
