METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rockies, 5-2, yesterday at Citi Field...New York is 3-7 in its last 10 games and 3-10 in its last 13 contests...Today, the Mets finish a three-game set against the Rockies (1-1)...The Mets are off on Monday before hitting the road for a seven-game road trip to Cincinnati (three games) and Washington D.C. (four games).

RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD: The Mets are 2-0 in rubber games this year and 20-4 in rubber games dating to the start of 2022.

THE IMPOSSIBLE HAS HAPPENED: On this day in 2016, 42-year-old Bartolo Colón became the oldest MLB player to hit his first home run...Today, the Mets will welcome the right-hander back to throw a ceremonial pitch to honor the occasion...Colón spent three seasons with the Mets where he went 44-34 with a 3.90 ERA, 86 walks and 415 strikeouts.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely hit in four straight games, going 6-15 with two runs, two doubles, a home run, one RBI, one walk with a 1.171 OPS in that span...Over the last 21 games, Nimmo is batting .349 (30-86) with 13 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, nine RBI, six walks with a .940 OPS...He ranks fifth in the majors and third in the NL with a 1.7 fWAR.

EN FUEGO: Joey Lucchesi is set to make his fourth start of the year today and his second at home...The lefty has posted a 1-0 record with a 3.86 ERA (7 ER/16.1 IP) with four walks and 13 strikeouts...Lucchesi has made 11 previous starts against the Rockies and is 1-4 with a 4.47 ERA (26 ER/52.1 IP) with 18 walks and 49 strikeouts.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 13 games and has allowed one run in 14.1 innings of work, good for a 0.63 ERA...He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 18 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .154 (4-265) batting average this season...He has converted all seven save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 17 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 13-41 (.317) with three runs, three doubles, one home run, nine RBI, six walks with a .404 OBP and a .463 SLG...He has posted a .397 OBP in 26 games this season, which is second on the team.

ATTABOY ÁLVAREZ: Over the last 12 games, Francisco Álvarez is hitting .281 (9-32) with four runs, a double, one home run, three RBI, two walks with a .324 OBP and a .406 OPS.

AND THEY'RE OFF: The Mets are second in the National League with a 83.9% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are tied for fourth the NL with 26 steals this season...Starling Marte is tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with nine steals...He ranks third among active players with 323 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more.

LORD BRANDON OF WYOMING: Brandon Nimmo, who grew up less than 100 miles from Coors Field has hit .330 (29-88) with 19 runs, two doubles, six home runs and 15 RBI and 13 walks in 25 games against the Rockies...He has safely hit in 17 of his last 19 games against the Rockies, batting .365 (27-74) with eight extra-base hits in that span that started on June 18, 2018.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won nine of their last 12 games against the Rockies at Citi Field...Overall the Mets are 27-21 against Colorado at Citi Field.

LONG LIVE QUEENS: The Mets are 7-7 at Citi Field this year...The team's 14 home games are tied for the third-fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

ON THE ROX: Luis Guillorme is .556 (5-9) with two runs and two walks in 10 games against Colorado...Starling Marte has hit .343 (74-216) with 47 runs, 10 doubles, four triples, seven home runs, 33 RBI and 11 walks in 55 career games against the Rockies...Pete Alonso has hit .328 (22-67) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, four walks and a .582 SLG in 18 games against the Rockies.

BRETT THE MET: Over the last 14 contests, Brett Baty is batting .304 (14-46) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, three RBI and five walks in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded nine multi-hit games this season...He has 172 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 62 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is tied for the third-most during that span behind Freddie Freeman (68) and Bo Bichette (68).

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 17 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 13-41 (.317) with three runs, three doubles, one home run, nine RBI, six walks with a .404 OBP and a .463 SLG...He has posted a .397 OBP in 26 games this season, which is second on the team.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 38 infield hits this season, which is the third-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

RUNS: New York has scored four total runs over its last four games...The Mets have scored two runs or fewer in 13 of their 34 contests this season.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 20 times this season...That is tied for the fourth-most in the majors and tied with the San Francisco Giants for the most in the National League.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: With the expected large crowd at Citi Field today and the 5 Boro Bike Tour scheduled to take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. traveling through the five NYC boroughs, the Mets encourage fans to avoid delays due to various local street closings by taking mass transit.

LUCCHESI NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on May 3 at Comerica Park, allowing four earned runs on five hits...Fanned one Tigers batter in the Mets' 6-5 loss.

ON THE ROCK(IE)S: Lucchesi has faced the Colorado Rockies eleven times in his career, the most against any one opponent in his career...In those eleven starts, Lucchesi has pitched to a 2-4 record and a 4.47 ERA (26 ER/52.1 IP)...He last faced Colorado on May 27, 2021 at Citi Field in the second game of a 7-inning doubleheader, during which he allowed one earned run on two hits in 3.2 innings...When facing the Rockies at home, Lucchesi holds a 1-1 record with a 3.04 ERA (9 ER/26.2 IP) and has fanned 23 Colorado batters.

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU: Lucchesi holds a 2-4 record in 14 appearances and 12 starts in the month of May...Has pitched to a 4.45 ERA (32 ER/64.2 IP) in those games, while fanning 58 batters...This will be his fourth start in May against the Rockies, his second as a Met...During those appearances, Lucchesi has thrown 14.0 innings, pitching to a 3.57 ERA (5 ER/14.0 IP) with eight strikeouts.

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi—who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college—made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi made three starts this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a .196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Last season, Lucchesi made his return to the mound after recovering from Tommy John surgery in June of 2021...Made eight rehab appearances across three minor league affiliates, posting a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP)...He allowed 12 hits in eight appearances—four of which were starts—while tallying three walks and fanning 12 batters.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his curve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (2-2, 5.56)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.1 innings in Detroit against his former team on May 3 in the second game of a doubleheader, allowing six earned runs on eight hits and one walk while fanning three Tigers batters...Was his first start since serving a 10-game suspension for violating MLB's foreign substance policy.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
